Inside AOCS

Proposed GPO policy opposed

The AOCS Governing Board has agreed to oppose a U.S. House of Representatives bill that would require papers prepared by federally employed scientists to be published initially by the U.S. Government Printing Office.

The provision is part of a general reorganization proposal for the GPO.

Governing Board members noted that reputable scientific publications would not reprint the scientists' papers and that the information would be less available to the scientific community.

The Governing Board asked President N.O.V. Sonntag and Executive Director James Lyon to mail a letter stating AOCS' position to appropriate members of the House of Representatives. The bill in question is House Resolution 5424, scheduled for committee mark-up in January.

In other action during its November meeting in Chicago, the Governing Board approved appointment of Jess Covey of Anderson Clayton Foods', Clayton Research Center in Richardson, Texas, to be general chairman for the 1984 national meeting to be held in Dallas. The board also voted to have the AOCS National Program Planning Committee have responsibility for developing the technical program for the meeting. The NPPC will operate with a technical program chairman, but the chairman need not be a person from the Dallas area.

The board also received a letter from the USDA's Science and Education Administration requesting AOCS participation in determining priority research programs for SEA. Sonntag, Frank White and E.G. Perkins were named as an ad hoc committee to participate.

The board also approved AOCS' becoming a sustaining

member of the American National Standards Institute, with David Firestone as AOCS liaison. The value of membership is to be evaluated after one year. The board also agreed to include information from the Association of Official Analytical Chemists (AOAC) in one AOCS mailing.

Revised by-laws for the AOCS Foundation were approved to include an honorary board of not less than five persons and an action board of not more than six persons. The honorary board will recommend policy; the action board will direct activities and manage funds for the foundation. □

Applications for certification or recertification in the AOCS Referee Chemist program must be returned to AOCS Headquarters, 508 S. Sixth St., Champaign, IL 61820, by no later than March 28, 1980, or the applicant will be ineligible to be listed in the 1980-81 official list of Referee Chemists.
