Abstracts

The killing of Micro-organisms on solid surfaces. M. Lonein. Tenside Deterg. 16(4), 197-9 (1979). A method of investigating the killing of micro-organisms, especially spores, on solid surfaces has been developed. It consists of applying droplets of a suspension to aluminum foil, drying them, and exposing them to a stream of gas at a certain temperature and gas velocity. Killing with hydrogen peroxide and peracetic acid solutions with and without additional heat treatment was also studied.

The use of phosphoric acid esters in disinfectant cleaners. H.D. Nielen and G. Sorbe. Tenside Deterg. 16(4), 199-202 (1979). Short-chain alkyl phosphoric acid esters are used especially in acid cleaners for solid surfaces. Their manufacture and properties are described. For special applications, however, cleaning itself is insufficient for in certain cases it is also necessary to disinfect the cleaned surface. Here, one observes very interesting combination effects between phosphoric acid esters and disinfectants.

HYGIENIC ASPECTS OF LAUNDERING AND CLEANING. L. Grun. Tenside Deterg. 16(4), 171-4 (1979). The term hygiene in connection with laundering and cleaning encompasses two different aspects: as used to express visual cleanliness, and as used to express prevention of illness and maintenance of health. Lack of hygiene and the associated danger to health

is closely linked with bacteria.

CHEMICAL ASPECTS OF LAUNDERING AND CLEANING. P. Berth and M.J. Schwuger. Tenside Deterg. 16(4), 175-84 (1979). Modern detergents and cleaners meet all the practical demands made on them as regards cleanliness and hygiene. The chemical aspects involved are discussed in relation to the chemical constitution of the active substances, with the help of physicochemical experimental results. Discussed are the resultant findings as regards the mechanism involved in detaching soil from substrates during laundering and cleaning.

Fundamental aspects relating to the hygiene of solid surfaces. E. Kanz. Tenside Deterg. 16(4), 185–90 (1979). Wherever the spreading of germs is a hygienic risk, solid surfaces such as working tops, instruments, floors, furniture, and possibly, walls, must be almost or completely free from germs in order to prevent the spread of disease. The characteristic of germs to adhere to surfaces enables examination of the various materials used in solid surfaces to find out to what extent germs adhere to them and to scientifically quantify this question. As far as practical hygiene is concerned, this means that materials with a high degree of germ adhesion can be freed from germs only with difficulty by normal cleaning technics. Here, the germ-killing effect of chemical surface disinfectants is generally the only solution to the problem.

INFLUENCE OF ORAL POLYUNSATURATED AND SATURATED PHOSPHOLIPID TREATMENT ON THE LIPID COMPOSITION AND FATTY ACID PROFILE OF CHIMPANZEE LIPOPROTEINS. M. Rosseneu, B. Declercq, D. Vandamme, R. Vercaemst, F. Soctewey, H. Peeters, and V. Blaton (Algemeen Ziekenhuis Sint Jan, Ruddershove, B-8000 Brugge, Belgium) Atherosclerosis 32, 141–53 (1979). The influence of treatment with polyunsaturated lecithin (EPL) and with saturated lecithin on the lipoprotein composition and fatty acid profile was investigated in 4 male chimpanzees. The animals were successively given 3 isocaloric diets containing the same amount of fat with a degree of saturation varying from 1 in the control diet to 0.2 in the diet enriched with polyunsaturated

lecithin, to 4 in the diet enriched with saturated lecithin. The saturated lecithin treatment increases the plasma VLDL and LDL concentrations and the triglyceride levels and increases mostly the saturation ratio of the cholesterol esters. These effects are likely to enhance the progression of atherosclerosis.

13C-12C ANALYSIS OF VEGETABLE OILS, STARCHES, PROTEINS, AND SOY-MEAT MIXTURES. J. Gaffney, A. Irsa, L. Friedman, and E. Emken (Chem. Dept., Brookhaven Nat'l. Lab., Upton, NY 11973) J. Agric. Food Chem. 27(3),475-8 (1979). The 13C-12C ratios for a number of vegetable oils, starches, and proteins have been determined. As expected, the values for animal proteins reflect
