Alcohol-diesel work at NRRC

AOCS member Everett Pryde and coworker Arthur Schwab at the USDA's Northern Regional Research Center were cited in *C&E News* of Dec. 15, 1980, for their work on microemulsification systems that permit blending of alcohol and diesel fuel. Even trace amounts of water can cause alcohol-diesel fuel blends to separate, but the techniques developed by Pryde and Schwab, according to the *C&E News* article, have proved stable to ~18C with more than 0.5% water. Engine tests have been performed at the University of Illinois. Such fuels would be 30-80% more expensive than diesel fuel at current prices, but can be made from farm products, Pryde noted in the news article.

IUPAC unit marks 50th anniversary

The IUPAC Commission on Oils, Fats and Derivatives marked its 50th anniversary during 1980, having developed from efforts by Prof. Fachini of the Experimental Station for the Oil and Fat Industry in Milan. Fachini had invited experts from several nations to a meeting in Milan during 1924 to discuss establishment of uniform analytical standards. This eventually led, in 1930, to a meeting in Geneva arranged by Dr. Fachini which representatives of various nations attended.

These representatives organized the International Commission for the Study of Fat Products, which eventually linked with IUPAC in 1946 and in 1952 was named the Oil and Fats Division of the IUPAC's applied chemistry section.

On behalf of AOCS President Frank Naughton, congratulations on the 50th anniversary were extended to the IUPAC Commission by David Firestone. Naughton's comments praised the Commission for its work in development of international methods and said, "The AOCS looks forward to many more years of active participation, association and collaboration with the Commission in programs for development of uniform methods of analysis for fats and oils and related materials."
