## Deaths

### Arthur N. Wrigley

Arthur N. Wrigley, an active member of the AOCS since 1955, died Dec. 17, 1981. Dr. Wrigley had been particularly active in the Northeast Section and had served on committees that helped organize several national AOCS meetings. He was a past recipient of the Northeast Section's Achievement Award.

He was internationally known for his work on carbohydrates and fatty acids at the USDA's Eastern Regional Research Center, doing some of the early work that helped speed development of biodegradable detergents.

Before he joined the staff of the ERRC in 1943, he was associated with the Manhattan Project at Princeton University. He was a graduate of Haverford College and Temple University, where he received his doctorate.

He was a member of the AAAS, American Institute of Chemists (Fellow), Sigma Xi, Catalysis Club of Philadelphia and Philadelphia Organic Chemists club. □

### Robert M. Kelley
