Applewhite receives Bailey award

Thomas H. Applewhite, director of research services for Kraft Inc. R&D, received the 22nd Alton E. Bailey Award from the North Central Section of the AOCS during a February dinner meeting.

Dr. Applewhite, who served as president of the AOCS during 1977, spoke on "Two Decades of Fat Research: Selected Topics." He was introduced by John C. Cowan, who was the recipient of the third Bailey Award in 1961.

The award is presented by the section to recognize research and/or service in the field of fats and oils. It is named for Alton E. Bailey, a noted fats and oils researcher and the first author for Bailey's Industrial Oil and Fat Products, now a standard reference in the field.

Dr. Applewhite joined Kraft in 1969 as manager of the edible oil products laboratory and in 1979 he was named to his present assignment. He previously had been a research chemist at the USDA's Western Regional Research Center and research director of Pacific Vegetable Oil on the West Coast.




Daniel P. French

AOCS member Daniel P. French has been elected president of the French Oil Mill Machinery Company. French is the third generation in his family to serve as president of the company, which has supplied equipment to vegetable oil mills since 1900. Alfred W. French, an AOCS member since 1942, will continue as chairman of the board and chief executive officer. The elder French pioneered the development of the mechanical screw press in the vegetable oil industry, and later participated in the commercial introduction of solvent extraction equipment for vegetable oil mills in the United States. The French Oil Mill Machinery company designs and manufactures complete solvent extraction systems, mechanical screw presses, cracking and flaking rolls, and ancillary equipment for the vegetable oil mill industry.

Andrew M. Cowan has been appointed assistant director at the USDA's Northern Regional research Center in Peoria, IL. Dr. Cowan will serve as assistant director for technology transfer at the NRRC and will coordinate similar programs at the agency's three other research centers in Philadelphia, New Orleans, and Albany, CA. 

AOCS has been informed of the death last fall of Chester M. Gooding, a retired researcher and administrator with CPC International and the 1973 Alton E. Bailey Award winner. Dr. Gooding also served as AOCS representative to the Fats and Oils Committee of the Codex Alimentarius Commission.

He was a 1934 graduate of the University of Michigan. Dr. Gooding served on AOCS administrative committees and on national meeting committees. He became an emeritus member in 1974 when he retired from CPC.



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
