James P. Hughes, an emeritus member of the American Oil Chemists' Society, died Aug. 18, 1982. Mr. Hughes had retired in 1975 from the USDA Southern Regional Research Center in New Orleans where he was technical assistant to the center director. Prior to joining USDA, Mr. Hughes had been with The Cudahy Packing Company and also with Mrs. Tucker's Foods, the predecessor firm to Aderson Clayton. He was a 1929 graduate of the University of Missouri. Mr. Hughes served on local committees for AOCS national meetings held in New Orleans and had been a member of AOCS since 1943.

Charles Sutter, of Alexandria, Virginia, an emeritus member of the AOCS since 1971, died Dec. 12, 1983. Mr. Sutter was a control chemist with the Colgate Palmolive Peet Co. when he first joined AOCS in 1935.


