ISF-OTAI Congress Rescheduled

The 17th World Congress of the International Society for Fat Research, to be hosted by the Oil Technologists' Association of India, has been rescheduled to February 3-8, 1985, in New Delhi, India. The congress, originally scheduled for November 4-9, 1984, was postponed following the assassination of Prime Minister Indira Gandhi. Hotels originally booked for delegates to the meeting were used instead by the Indian government to house foreign dignitaries attending Mrs. Gandhi's funeral.
