














Introduction

Oleochemical specialists from more than 30 nations gathered during the week of Sept. 18-23, 1983, in Montreux, Switzerland, for the World Conference on Oleochemicals. The event was a milestone in that it was the first time such an international meeting had been held. Delegates from all parts of the globe attended, representing leading firms in production and use of oleochemicals, as well as academic and governmental research institutions whose work is important to the industry.

During the week, these international delegates heard presentations on the latest technological and economic information available about oleochemicals. Conference chairman William Link of Sherex and his European counterpart, Edward Munnig-Schmidt of Akzo Chemie, recruited an outstanding conference committee that developed the program and selected the speakers.
