## Plant visits offered

Registrants for the World Conference on Processing of Palm, Palm Kernel and Coconut Oils, to be held Nov. 11-16, 1984, in Kuala Lumpur, will have two opportunities to visit palm and palm kernel processing facilities.

Arrangements have been made for visits to local processing sites on Thursday, Nov. 15, and also on Saturday, Nov. 17.

Visits to Palm Oil Research of Malaysia (PORIM) facilities on Thursday also may be arranged.

The conference is being sponsored by PORIM and the American Oil Chemists' Society to spotlight the latest available information on economics, characteristics, processing and uses of the three oils. Palm oil's share of international world trade is expected to rise during the next two decades, continuing a remarkable climb since the Malaysian government began encouraging oil-palm plantations.

The full program is scheduled to be published in the May issue of *JAOCS*. Session topics include a general overview, including potential of biotechnology; properties of the oils; processing of the oil-bearing materials; processing of the oils; industrial uses; modification processes; edible products; and quality assurance.

The accompanying exposition will be limited to approximately 60 exhibit booths. Companies wishing to participate should contact J. Patrick Graham, AOCS, 508 S. Sixth St., Champaign, IL 61820 USA. The meeting and exposition will be held in the Kuala Lumpur Hilton.
