## Inside AOCS

#### **Budget approved**

The AOCS Governing Board has approved a 1985 operating budget of approximately \$1.5 million for the society.

Estimated operating income is \$1,487,700, with estimated operating expenses of \$1,454,100. Approximately one-third of the budget involves society publications, with the next largest segment involving meetings.

Operating budget figures for 1984 were for income of \$1,440,100 and expenses of \$1,430,900. Actual income and expenses for 1984 were not available at press time in mid-November.

At its October meeting in Chicago, the board also heard a report on the possibility of changing AOCS' annual national meeting from its traditional April-May timing to some other time period to avoid conflicts with other organizations' meetings. The consensus was that there would be conflicts regardless of what time period was selected and there was no strong sentiment for a change. The board voted that AOCS continue its present scheduling pattern for annual meetings.

Also in regard to meetings, the board confirmed the appointments of Thomas Applewhite as chairman for the 1987 world conference on biotechnology and of Lambert Princen as chairman for a 1987 world conference on jojoba.

AOCS was asked by the U.S. Jojoba Growers Association to help organize the VII International Jojoba Conference scheduled to be held in the United States during 1987.

Education Committee Chairman Applewhite reported on tentative short course offerings for 1986 and 1987. During 1986, AOCS will sponsor at least three short courses in conjunction with its joint meeting with the Japan Oil Chemists Society. Topics for these short courses will be hydrogenation; physical chemistry of fats and oils, and food uses of whole oil and protein seeds. For 1987, four topics are being considered: production and use of vegetable food proteins; prostanoids; fatty acids, and food lipids.

The governing board also was told that topics being considered for future world conferences include liposomes, vegetable food proteins, fats and oils processing and quality control methodology.

The board was told seven long-time members of AOCS have applied for and were granted emeritus member status because of their tenure in the society. These members include Oscar W. Johnson Jr., Noel W. Myers, Biffle Owen, Deropha J. Porter, Logan C. Roots, B.S.K. Shastry and Faye Smith.

The Governing Board also reviewed progress in organization of future AOCS annual meetings and world conferences and considered reports on several continuing programs.

#### Symposium to be March 19


