Lela Vines of Woodson-Tenent Labs in Gainesville, Georgia, has won the 1985 Smalley Award for best analysis of oilseed meal, and Edward R. Hahn of Hahn Laboratories in Columbia, South Carolina, has won the 1985 R. T. Doughtie Jr. Award for best analysis of cottonseed in the AOCS Smalley Cooperative Check Sample Program.

It is the first Smalley Award won by Vines. The Smalley Award, named for Frank Smalley, founder of the AOCS check sample program, is presented for best analysis of oilseed meal for combined nitrogen, oil and moisture. It is the seventh time Hahn has provided the best analysis of cottonseed for foreign matter, moisture, free fatty acids, oil and ammonia. Hahn previously has won in 1965, 1968, 1971, 1972, 1974 and 1977. The Doughtie Award is named for Richard T. Doughtie, a long-time chairman of the Smalley Program, and previously was known as the Barrow-Agee Award.

The Smalley Program each year distributes more than 7,000 samples of oilseed and fats and oils materials to subscribing chemists who analyze the samples using specified methods. Participants' results are analyzed statistically to determine who has performed the best analysis; participants receive reports which enable them to determine their proficiency compared to other participants. Chemists whose results are significantly awry know that either their instruments or lab technique may be faulty. First place and honorable mention certificates are awarded for each category. Certificate recipients attending the AOCS annual meeting in Philadelphia were among the AOCS Award winners cited during the opening plenary breakfast.

Vines received a total of six certificates, three for first place and three for honorable mention. Hahn received three honorable mention certificates in addition to his Doughtie Award. Mike Valletta of SGS Control Services in Carteret, New Jersey, and Paul Thionville of Thionville Labs in New Orleans, Louisiana, each received seven certificates. Three teams of researchers each received six certificates: T. J. and G. E. Moore of Woodson-Tenent Labs in North Little Rock, Arkansas; J. Ledin and A. Backous of Woodson-Tenent Labs in Des Moines, Iowa, and J. W. Thomas, B. Butler and M. Haider of SGS Control Services in Kenner, Louisiana,

Three first place awards were won by chemists outside the United States. Al Webber of CSP Foods in Nipawin, Saskatchewan, Canada, won in gas chromatography; E. Tarter of Health and Welfare Canada, Scarborough, Ontario, Canada, won in corn aflatoxin, and M. Caerour of Prodl Control Laboratory in Monfort-Sur-Risle, France, won the peanut aflatoxin first place certificate for the second straight year. Relatively recent more stringent aflatoxin regulations overseas have increased interest in accurate analysis, with the net result that five of the six certificate recipients in peanut aflatoxin analysis this year were from outside the United States.
