Role of Fats in Food and Nutrition, by M.I. Gurr (Elsevier Applied Science Publishers Ltd.; Ripple Road, Barking, Essex, England, 1984, 170 pp. \$44.50).

The aim of the author is to cover the whole range of the subject of fats, food and nutrition in one volume. For the non-specialist reader, Gurr has succeeded in doing this. In the first part he deals with the nature, occurrence and characterization of biologically important fats. This part includes a brief chapter on "What are fats?," "Types of Fats in the Body and Their Functions," "Fats in Foods," and "Determination of the Amounts and Types of Fats in Foods."

Part II is concerned with the metabolic and nutritional role of fats. This includes discussions of why we eat fat, basic fat metabolism, the essential fatty acids and fat soluble vitamins, and fats in health and disease.

In this book references to research literature are not included. Each chapter ends with a short bibliography which consists mainly of books and chapters in books. This book is, therefore, essentially the author's interpretation of the literature and, as one would expect, specialist readers will find themselves in disagreement with Gurr on some points. Overall, however, Gurr has made an effort to give a balanced view in such controversial areas as trans fatty acids and dietary cholesterol.

Many readers of the JAOCS who are specialists in lipid chemistry can gain little from this book. For the nonspecialist, however, the book provides a very good overview of fats in nutrition.
