The Canola Council of Canada will hold its 1989 annual convention March 20-22, 1989, at The Drake International in Chicago, Illinois.

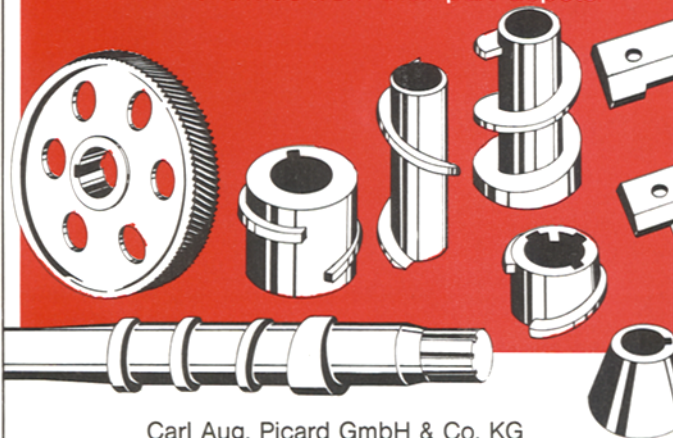

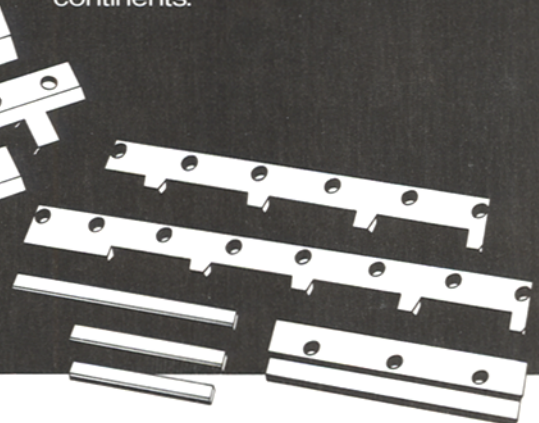
