

Springer and AOCS: New Publishing Arrangement

Dear Readers,

As many of you may already know, this issue marks a major new direction for this journal as AOCS embarks on a joint publishing arrangement with Springer, the second largest STM journals publisher in the world. Under the terms of this agreement, AOCS will maintain ownership and content control over *Journal of the American Oil Chemists' Society (JAOCs)* while Springer becomes responsible for production and lends significant marketing resources to promote our journal. At Springer, all marketing activities are tailored to reach the various target audiences: readers and authors, libraries and subscription agents, directly. Springer's online platform, SpringerLink, currently serves 600 international consortia comprising over 35,000 institutions, thereby boosting the visibility of *JAOCs* enormously.

This publishing arrangement will result in significant upgrades to electronic delivery of *JAOCs* content. Springer's Online First capability will ensure speedy availability of articles ahead of your print subscription. Springer will also make available the entire legacy content of *JAOCs* back to issue #1 in 1917, published as *Cotton Oil Press*. Another electronic upgrade is the Manuscript Central peer review system. This software tool will enable more thorough and faster communication between the *JAOCs* editors while enhancing the submissions process for contributing authors.

While we embrace modern electronic delivery systems for *JAOCs* content, we remain dedicated to

the science. As such, the *JAOCs* editorial team will retain full authority over subject matter, peer review, and final accept-revise-reject status of each submitted manuscript.

On behalf of the American Oil Chemists' Society and *JAOCs*, I salute this publishing arrangement with Springer. I fully expect that we will continue to fulfill the journal's mandate of offering the highest quality research papers for the fats and oils industries from our six specialized interest areas:

Analytical and physical chemistry
Biotechnology and biocatalysis
Food, feed science, and nutrition
Nonfood or industrial applications
Nutraceuticals and functional foods
Processing and engineering technology
