MEETING OUTSIDE LONDON.

LECTURE AT SWANSEA, JANUARY 18th.

A meeting of the Society was held jointly with the Local Section of the Institute of Petroleum and the University College of Swansea Chemical Society at 3 p.m. on Saturday, January 18th, in the Chemistry Lecture Theatre, University College, Swansea, with Professor J. E. Coates, Local Representative, in the Chair. Mr. A. R. Ubbelohde delivered a lecture on "The Combustion of Gaseous Hydrocarbons." Confining himself to the low-temperature oxidation of straight-chain aliphatic hydrocarbons—e.g., n-pentane—the lecturer outlined the experimental methods, including the study of reaction products, reaction kinetics, and spectroscopy, of obtaining evidence as to the nature of the intermediate oxidation compounds and of the reaction chain mechanism, which was shown to involve aldehydes and peroxides as important stages. Reference was made to pro- and anti-knock agents, and to experiments with the internal-combustion engine. The lecture was fully illustrated by experiments. A short discussion followed in which Messrs. F. G. Willson, W. S. Nathan, and G. E. Coates took part. A cordial vote of thanks to the lecturer was proposed by Dr. J. W. T. Jones, seconded by Dr. E. Roberts, and carried with acclamation.

MEETINGS OUTSIDE LONDON.

LECTURE AT DUNDEE, JANUARY 24th.

A meeting of the Society was held in University College, Dundee, at 4.30 p.m. on Friday, January 24th, with Professor W. F. K. Wynne-Jones in the Chair. Principal Sir James C. Irvine, C.B.E., F.R.S., gave a lecture, illustrated by lantern slides, on "The Teaching of Chemistry in the University of St. Andrews." The lecturer gave a historical description of the development of Chemistry in the University, and an account of the various occupants of the chairs of Chemistry in St. Andrews, and in University College, Dundee. This was much enjoyed by a large audience, and a cordial vote of thanks to the lecturer was proposed by Professor Alex. McKenzie, F.R.S., and carried with acclamation.

LECTURE AT EDINBURGH, JANUARY 27th.

A joint meeting of the Society with the Local Sections of the Institute of Chemistry and the Society of Chemical Industry was held in the North British Station Hotel on Monday, January 27th, at 7.15 p.m., with Professor James Kendall, F.R.S., in the Chair. Professor J. Masson Gulland delivered a lecture on "Nucleic Acids."

The lecturer began by mentioning briefly the recent developments which have demonstrated the rôle of nucleic acids in the structures of various biologically important substances. The salient features of the organic chemistry of the nucleosides and nucleotides were then outlined, and an account was given of some of the methods by which these substances have been synthesised. Then, having explained the conception of the tetranucleotide unit, the lecturer discussed in some detail the evidence—organic, physico-, and bio-chemical—on which the polytetranucleotide structures of ribonucleic and deoxyribonucleic acids are based, and by which light is thrown on the nature of the linkages between the constituent nucleotides of a tetranucleotide unit. He concluded by referring to the importance of nucleic acids, as they play a fundamental part in the structures of the most elementary reproductive bodies known, the chromosomes and viruses.

An interesting discussion followed, in which Dr. J. Hewart, Dr. Ludlam, Dr. Wightman, and Dr. Percival took part, and the meeting carried with acclamation a hearty vote of thanks proposed by Dr. Neil Campbell.

ADVISORY RESEARCH COUNCIL OF THE CHEMICAL SOCIETY.

Preparation of Fine Chemicals.

The Advisory Research Council of the Chemical Society in collaboration with the Association of British Chemical Manufacturers is putting into operation a scheme for organising the preparation of Fine Chemicals by part-time volunteer workers in the laboratories of Universities, Technical Colleges, and other Institutions. It is essential to the scheme that compounds so prepared must be required for work of national importance and be not available commercially, and that the Manufacturers of Fine Chemicals are themselves unable, or do not find it convenient, to meet the demands. It is intended that preparations should be carried out on a cost-price basis which would include charges for materials, gas, electricity, etc., but not for the workers' services. No profits of any kind will be permitted.

The General Secretary will be glad to hear from those who have not already volunteered and who would be willing to allow their names to be added to the list of volunteer helpers in connection with this scheme. Enquiries for Fine Chemicals which fall within the scope of the scheme as set out above may also be made to the General Secretary, from whom further information can be obtained.

MEETINGS OUTSIDE LONDON.

SOUTH WALES.

In Cardiff.

A meeting of the Society was held jointly with the local sections of the Institute of Chemistry and the Society of Chemical Industry at 3.15 p.m. on Saturday, February 15th, at the University College of South Wales and Monmouthshire, Cathays Park, Cardiff. Mr. N. Berry, B.Sc., A.I.C., Dean of the College of the Pharmaceutical Society, delivered a lecture entitled "Disinfectants." In the course of an interesting survey of this wide field attention was directed both to the direct coal-tar products and to the numerous substances of synthetic origin. The lecturer dealt further with the possibilities of detergent antiseptics and stressed the need for studies directed towards aerosols. A lively discussion followed, in which Dr. Cullinane (the Chairman), Mr. Crofts, and Dr. D. P. Evans took part. A hearty vote of thanks to the lecturer was proposed by Dr. H. B. Watson, seconded by Mr. S. Dixon, and carried with acclamation. There were 66 members and visitors present.

EDINBURGH.

The Tilden Lecture, on "Some Problems in Macromolecular Chemistry," was delivered in the North British Station Hotel at 7.15 p.m. on Monday, February 24th, by Professor H. W. Melville, with Dr. E. G. V. Percival in the Chair. After a brief summary of the achievements of Sir William Tilden by the Chairman, the lecturer gave a masterly account of the present state of our knowledge of polymerisation reactions, in which he dealt with polymers of the "nylon" type, polymerised methyl methacrylate, chloroprene, vinyl esters and related substances, and the formation of three-dimensional polymers. Particular attention was paid to the mechanism of polymerisation and the structure and molecular weight of the products. Mr. A. M. Cameron and Drs. Beevers, Ludlam, Kermack, Mowbray Ritchie, Bolam, Nisbet, and others participated in the interesting discussion which followed, and the meeting concluded with the enthusiastic adoption of a vote of thanks to Professor Melville, on the motion of Professor James Kendall, F.R.S.

GLASGOW.

A meeting of the Society, in co-operation with the Local Sections of the Institute of Chemistry and the Society of Chemical Industry, was held at 7 p.m. on Friday, February 21st, in the Royal Technical College, with Professor F. J. Wilson in the Chair.

Professor J. W. Cook, F.R.S., delivered a lecture on "Correlations among Cancer-producing Compounds." The Lecturer outlined the rather well-defined relationships between constitution and carcinogenic properties in substitution products of 1:2-benz-anthracene and in some related polynuclear substances, and suggested that the general shape and dimensions of the molecules influenced their biological activity. Physical properties—solubility, fluorescence, ultra-violet absorption—are not easily correlated with carcinogenic potency; and the same applies to the susceptibility to oxidation or diazo-coupling which is exhibited by many cancer-producing hydrocarbons. Finally reference was made to the histological changes observed after application of a carcinogenic agent,

and to the observation that such compounds actually inhibit the growth of existing tumours.

A discussion followed, and a vote of thanks, proposed by Professor T. S. Patterson, was carried with acclamation.

LEEDS.

A joint meeting of the Leeds Area Section of the Chemical Society and the Leeds University Chemical Society was held in the University of Leeds on Monday, March 11th, 1941. Professor R. Whytlaw Gray, F.R.S., occupied the Chair. The first session of a discussion on "Some Aspects of Adsorption," was opened by R. S. Bradley, Esq., M.A. (University of Leeds), who discussed "Adsorption on Simple Ionic Crystals."

After an interval for light refreshments, Dr. R. M. Barrer (Bradford Technical College) opened the second session with an account of "Sorption on Zeolites." Both contributions evoked interesting and valuable discussions a short account of which is being published.*

SHEFFIELD.

A joint meeting with the University Chemical Society was held at 5.30 p.m. on Friday, February 28th, in the University, with Professor R. D. Haworth in the Chair.

Professor J. Kenner, F.R.S., gave a lecture on "Diazotisation." After a historical and general survey of the reaction, the properties of the diazo-compounds were considered from the electronic point of view. Various implications were discussed, including some interesting suggestions regarding the reactivity of diazo-ketones, nitrosyl chloride, and acyl diazo-compounds.

Many of Professor Kenner's former students and colleagues were able to be present, and a vote of thanks, proposed by Emeritus Professor W. P. Wynne and seconded by Dr. T. B. Smith, was carried with acclamation.

CHEMICAL SOCIETY.

MEETINGS OUTSIDE LONDON.

LECTURE AT LIVERPOOL, FEBRUARY 13th.

A meeting of the Society was held jointly with the Liverpool University Chemical Society in the Lecture Theatre of the University, at 4 p.m., when Professor H. D. Wright delivered a lecture on "Recent Research on the Nutrition of Bacteria."

The lecturer began by stating that owing to their minuteness, bacteria cannot be identified by appearance alone, but also by their chemical and physiological activities.

Pasteur, although able to grow non-pathogenic bacteria easily in solutions of known chemical composition, was unable to cultivate pathogenic bacteria except in extracts of the organs of animals which the disease could attack. Later it was found that similar extracts from any animals would suffice, sometimes accompanied by blood, yeast, etc. A few bacilli, notably those causing leprosy and syphilis, have not been cultivated.

Light only began to be shed on the problem of bacterial nutrition when skilled chemists and skilled bacteriologists began to collaborate. Gradually the various essential factors required to grow different bacilli emerged. Professor Wright conceived the idea that bacteria might fail to grow because of an inhibitory factor in the medium, and not because it was inadequate. A substance could induce growth either as a nutrient or by neutralising something which prevented growth: thus peptone failed because it contained copper, but succeeded in the presence of blood. p_{π} and oxidation-reduction potential were found to be important. Many bacteria would only thrive in an atmosphere containing CO_2 .

Fildes stressed the necessity of employing very pure reagents, since $0\cdot 1-1$ per cent. of amino-acids is sufficient to lead to erroneous conclusions. He showed that some bacteria have remarkable synthetic power, whilst the parasitic bacilli must be supplied with enzymes and other complex substances essential to their life. The parasitic bacteria may gradually be caused to acquire greater synthetical ability, and their nutritive needs resemble those of animals, thus affording a glimpse of evolutionary processes.

Since the discovery of the therapeutic action of the sulphanilamides it has been found that chemotherapeutic compounds may act either by removing some essential nutrient or by competing successfully with such a nutrient for an essential enzyme. Fildes accordingly suggested the use of substituted essential factors in chemotherapy. In this way a directive influence has been given to the study of this problem.

SOUTH WALES.

LECTURE AT SWANSEA, MARCH 20th.

A meeting of the Society was held jointly with the University College of Swansea Chemical Society at 5.30 p.m. in the Chemistry Lecture Theatre, University College, Swansea, with Professor J. E. Coates, Local Representative, in the Chair.

Professor C. S. Gibson, O.B.E., M.A., Sc.D., F.R.S., delivered a lecture on "The Life and Work of Sir William Jackson Pope," in the course of which he stressed mainly the development of Pope's great researches in stereochemistry, including his classical discovery that optical activity could be produced by asymmetric atoms other than carbon, and the outstanding advance which he made in this field when he prepared compounds of which the optical activity could not be ascribed to the asymmetric configuration of any one atom, but only to the asymmetry or dissymmetry of the molecule as a whole. The way

in which Pope's life-long interest in crystallography influenced his researches was also clearly brought out. Speaking of him as teacher, colleague, and friend, Professor Gibson showed his audience a man of strong character and withal of deep human sympathy and understanding, who lived a full life, by no means narrowly academic.

After the lecture Mrs. W. G. Palmer spoke in personal appreciation and reminiscence of Pope at Cambridge. A vote of thanks to Professor Gibson for a notable memorial lecture which will be remembered by his hearers was proposed by Mr. B. Walters, seconded by Dr. L. E. Hinkel, and cordially carried.

LECTURE AT CARDIFF, MARCH 21st.

A joint meeting of the Society with the local sections of the Institure of Chemistry and the Society of Chemical Industry was held at 5.45 p.m. in the Physics Lecture Theatre, University College, Cardiff, with Dr. N. M. Cullinane in the Chair.

Professor C. S. Gibson, O.B.E., M.A., Sc.D., F.R.S., delivered a most interesting lecture on "More Recent Investigations on the Organic Chemistry of Gold," in which he dealt with the structures of the dialkyl gold derivatives of amines and of aliphatic and aromatic dibasic acids, and also discussed the most probable constitution of tetraethylsulphatodigold. In the discussion which followed Dr. N. M. Cullinane, Dr. D. P. Evans, and Dr. J. F. J. Dippy took part. A cordial vote of thanks to the lecturer was proposed by Mr. H. Ll. Bassett, seconded by Mr. S. B. Watkins, and enthusiastically received.

MEETINGS OUTSIDE LONDON.

LECTURE AT BRISTOL, JUNE 5th.

A Joint Meeting of the Chemical Society with the Local Sections of the Society of Chemical Industry and of the Institute of Chemistry was held in the Department of Chemistry, The University, Bristol, on June 5th, when a lecture-demonstration on "Liquid Crystals" was given by Professor G. M. Bennett. The chair was taken by Dr. E. B. Maxted; and a vote of thanks to the lecturer, proposed and seconded, respectively, by Professor E. L. Hirst and Dr. F. W. Rixon, was carried unanimously.

LECTURE AT LIVERPOOL, MAY 1st.

On Thursday, May 1st, 1941, Dr. F. J. Brislee delivered a lecture before the Liverpool Section of the Chemical Society and the Liverpool University Chemical Society at the University.

Dr. Brislee defined research as "work done for the discovery of truth and extension of knowledge, that is fundamentals," and said that the term was too frequently used to cover less dignified work. As an example of a fundamental industrial research, Dr. Brislee described the methods of wire-drawing by passing heated copper bars through three series of rollers, resulting in $\frac{1}{4}$ inch copper rod, which is then drawn through dies to the desired diameter of the wire. Trouble arose through breaks in the wire during drawing, and, on examination, these breaks were found to include a metal shown to be iron or steel by its emission spectrum. The lecturer emphasised the great value of the spectrograph in industrial investigations.

The source of these steel fragments was finally traced to the "roughing" or first rollers, since traces of molybdenum were present. The fault was reduced but not eliminated by working the rollers less severely and cleaning their surfaces frequently.

Dr. Brislee then turned to the problem of suitable dielectrics, pointing out that its attack by ozone, oil, heat, etc., rendered rubber a faulty dielectric for cable manufacture. He described and showed sections of paper-insulated, oil-filled, lead-covered cables capable of being used up to very high voltages. The lecturer stressed the very large amount of research which the development of this method of insulation has entailed.

He next turned to the resins formed by the polymerisation of organic compounds. The earlier plastics had good dielectric but inferior mechanical properties. The more modern substances such as polyethylene (molecular weight 15,000—30,000) appear to be more suitable.

An interesting problem connected with polymerisation arose when an experimental cable, after two years' use, was found to contain solid matter in place of the original thin oil. This solid closely resembled a brown stain often noticed in old condensers but never previously obtained in quantity. After solvent treatment of the brownish solid a pale yellow powder remained, which, after many unsuccessful attempts at combustion, proved to be a hydrocarbon $(CH_2)_n$. The molecular weight could not be ascertained by the Staudinger viscometer method, since the polymer was insoluble in all solvents. Its X-ray spectrum revealed its analogy to polyethylene, thus confirming the deduction made from combustion results.

Films of oil spread on a glass surface were exposed to electrical discharges *in vacuo*, when a white, solid material appeared, which rapidly turned yellow or brown with increase of temperature, and was shown to be identical with the solid obtained from the cable. Since this material had not failed in the cable, it evidently possessed good electrical properties, but it has not yet been plasticised.

Polymerisation affords the most fertile field for investigation.

Mills has accepted the invitation to give the Eighth Pedler Lecture in April 1942, and that Dr. H. J. Emeléus and Professor R. D. Haworth have accepted the invitation to give the Tilden Lectures during the forthcoming session.

PROVISION OF FINE CHEMICALS FOR WORK OF NATIONAL IMPORTANCE.

The Advisory Research Council of the Chemical Society has inaugurated a scheme to facilitate the supply of fine chemicals needed for work of national importance, but which are not available commercially.

The Sub-committee organising this work particularly desires to draw the attention of all users of fine chemicals to the existence of this scheme, in order that the greatest possible use may be made of the generous offers of help which have been received from numerous chemists in Universities, Technical Colleges and Schools, who have suitable laboratory facilities at their disposal.

The scheme, which works in close collaboration with the Association of British Chemical Manufacturers, is an attempt to use to the best possible advantage both the laboratory facilities and the skilled manpower in teaching institutions and other laboratories which may not at present be fully harnessed to the war effort.

Before a chemical can be accepted for preparation under this scheme, the Committee must be satisfied that the chemical is unobtainable from any British manufacturing firm and that it is required for urgent work of national importance within the British Empire. The scheme provides for the manufacture of approved items at basic charges which represent only the cost of raw material and such overheads as gas, electricity, etc. There is no charge for the chemist's services.

HARRISON MEMORIAL PRIZE.

DEATHS.

The loss sustained by the Society through the death of the President, Professor James C. Philip, was announced in the Proceedings for August. At their meeting on September 18th, the Council passed the following resolution, which has been communicated to Mrs. Philip:

"The Officers and Council of the Chemical Society have heard with profound sorrow of the death, on the 6th August, of their distinguished President, Professor James Charles Philip. Throughout the past 30 years he had a unique record of faithful service to the Society having been successively Member of the Council, Honorary Secretary, Vice-President, Chairman of the Publication Committee and Chairman of the Bureau of Chemical Abstracts.

"They desire to express their grateful admiration of his achievements not only as a scientist and as a tireless worker for education and in the Government Service, but also as a man much loved and respected by all who came in contact with him.

"They recognize that his death will be felt as a grievous loss by everyone who has the welfare of the Society and of the science of Chemistry at heart.

"The Council offer their deepest sympathy to Mrs. Philip."

The Council regret to announce the death on August 14th of Professor Paul Sabatier (Honorary Fellow). They have passed the following resolution:

"The Officers and Council of the Chemical Society have learned with profound sorrow of the death on August 14th of Professor Paul Sabatier, who was elected an Honorary Fellow of the Chemical Society in March 1920. They deplore the loss of their distinguished colleague.

"They record their high appreciation of the signal services which he, as one of the founders of the modern developments of catalysis, has rendered to the Science of Chemistry, services to which he devoted a life-long study and for which he was awarded in 1912 the high honour of the Nobel Prize.

"They regret that circumstances do not at present permit them to convey to his relatives and colleagues in France their deep sympathy with them in the irreparable loss which they, in common with Chemists throughout the world, have sustained."

To meet the need of Fellows who are engaged in research work and require microanalyses to be carried out, the Council have decided to prepare a list of those willing to undertake such professional work and to supply this list to Fellows who make application to the General Secretary. SUPPLIES OF LABORATORY CHEMICALS AND REAGENTS.

Rigorous economy in the use of all laboratory chemicals in Universities and Institutions and by all industrial users and consultants is an urgent necessity. Manufacturers are maintaining supplies to the fullest extent in the prevailing circumstances, but production adequate to meet all demands is handicapped by the scarcity of raw materials and many other factors.

To ensure regular supplies of essential laboratory chemicals a scheme has been discussed with the Raw Materials Department of the Ministry of Supply. In order to facilitate the operation of the proposed scheme, the Association of British Chemical Manufacturers, through its Assistant Secretary and Manager, Mr. Murdin Drake, has undertaken to collate records of the total quantities of the various chemicals required, so that the Ministry of Supply may be informed of these requirements.

A form, on which estimated requirements for the six months ending 31st March, 1942, are to be stated, can be obtained from the General Secretary of the Chemical Society. It covers the materials which experience shows are specially in demand, and space is provided for additional items likely to be needed in substantial quantities.

The quantities should be given as nearly as can be estimated and, if these quantities exceed to any appreciable extent the quantities purchased during the corresponding period in 1940–1941, consumers should state the reason for the increased demand. Chemists who do not purchase their own supplies should obtain these particulars from their purchasing organisations, or ensure that the organisations make a comprehensive return.

The information asked for is statistical; it will be regarded as strictly confidential and it will not bind any institution or individual to buy only the estimated quantity. It must be clearly understood that requirements of materials used in the manufacture of

any product for sale are not to be included in the estimates.

The operation of this scheme will not in any way modify the procedure which may be in force from time to time under Statutory Rules and Orders relating to the supply and consumption of various chemicals. Usually, however, such Orders relate to quantities much in excess of those required in individual laboratories.

It will greatly assist the operation of the scheme if consumers will state the names of their usual suppliers.

MEETINGS OUTSIDE LONDON.

LECTURE AT BANGOR, NOVEMBER 7th.

A joint meeting with the Chemical Society of the University College of North Wales, Bangor, was held in the Chemistry Lecture Theatre of the College at 5.15 p.m. on November 7th, 1941, with Mr. D. J. Bennett in the Chair.

Prof. A. R. Todd discussed "The Hemp Drugs," including a description of the hemp plant, and dealt with the chemistry of cannabinol and cannabidiol.

A cordial vote of thanks, proposed by Prof. J. L. Simonsen, seconded by Mr. E. Macdonald, was carried with acclamation.

LECTURE AT CARDIFF, NOVEMBER 1st.

A meeting of the Society was held jointly with the Cardiff Section of the Institute of Chemistry and the Food Group and South Wales Section of the Society of Chemical Industry at 3.15 p.m. on Saturday, November 1st, 1941, in the Physics Lecture Theatre, University College, Cathays Park, Cardiff, with Mr. F. S. Kernick, Chairman of the South Wales Section of the Society of Chemical Industry, in the Chair. Dr. Magnus Pyke delivered a lecture on "The Chemical Determination of Vitamins." With the aid of a number of striking experimental demonstrations, the lecturer showed that the principal vitamins, like most other chemical compounds, were amenable to chemical determination. Valuable details of procedure were described, and stress was laid on the need for employing these readily accessible methods as a means of estimating more adequately the nutritional value of foods.

After an interesting and instructive discussion, in which Messrs. S. Dixon, Williamson, Minor, and Lowe participated, a vote of thanks was proposed by Dr. Amos, seconded by Mr. S. Dixon, and enthusiastically carried. There were 98 persons present.

LECTURE AT EDINBURGH, NOVEMBER 11th.

A joint meeting of the Society with the Edinburgh University Chemical Society and the Edinburgh and East of Scotland sections of the Society of Chemical Industry and the Institute of Chemistry was held at 6.30 p.m., on November 11th, in the Biochemical Lecture Theatre, the University, Teviot Place, with Mr. J. W. Minnis, B.Sc., in the Chair. Professor H. L. Riley, D.Sc., gave a very interesting account of the structure and formation of "amorphous" carbon, with special reference to the graphite crystal lattice. Numerous X-ray photographs enhanced the value of this lecture on "The Crystallisation of Graphite," and after tributes to the lecturer by Dr. C. A. Beevers and Professor James Kendall, F.R.S., a hearty vote of thanks proposed by Mr. A. C. Docherty was carried with enthusiasm.

LECTURE AT GLASGOW, NOVEMBER 7th.

A meeting of the Society, in co-operation with the Local Sections of the Institute of Chemistry and the Society of Chemical Industry, was held at 7 p.m. on Friday, November 7th, in the Royal Technical College, with Professor J. W. Cook, F.R.S., in the Chair. Professor T. S. Patterson delivered a lecture entitled "Forty Years of Optical Activity." After referring to the investigations of Professor P. F. Frankland, to whom he was indebted

for his introduction to the subject, the Lecturer showed that tartaric esters exhibit a definite type of temperature-rotation curve which is displaced in a continuous manner by constitutional changes or alterations in solvent or wave-length. The persistence of regularities, especially the accommodation of the data by H. E. Armstrong's "characteristic diagram," suggests that in compounds having more than one asymmetric centre these do not act independently.

A discussion followed, and a vote of thanks, proposed by Dr. T. Ewan, was carried with acclamation.

LECTURE AT LEEDS, OCTOBER 13th.

A meeting of the Leeds Area Local Section was held in the University of Leeds on Monday, October 13th, when Dr. J. Monteath Robertson delivered a lecture entitled "The Analysis of Molecular Structure by X-ray Methods." The Chair was taken by Prof. M. G. Evans, D.Sc. The lecturer indicated the earlier impact of X-ray methods in the elucidation of the atom arrangements in inorganic molecules, and then showed how its application to the known structures of organic chemistry adds precision to the picture and enables bond distances and electron distributions to be accurately mapped out. The subject thus provides an essential link between pure organic chemistry and the more recent advances in theoretical chemistry. Examples of recent analyses were given. An interesting discussion followed, and a cordial vote of thanks to the lecturer, proposed from the Chair, was carried with enthusiasm.

LECTURE AT LIVERPOOL, NOVEMBER 13th.

A meeting of the Society was held in the Muspratt Lecture Theatre of the University at 3 p.m. on November 13th, 1941, when Professor T. P. Hilditch delivered a Lecture entitled "Some Recent Developments in the Experimental Study of Animal Fats." The lecture was devoted mainly to a discussion of the specific characteristics of stearic-rich animal storage fats as represented by those of oxen, sheep, and pigs. Seven such fats (two from a sheep, two from a pig, and three from oxen or cows) have been investigated in detail during the past few years by a procedure in which the fats are first separated into three or more fractions of differing solubility in acetone, each fraction being then separately studied with regard to the proportions of its component acids and of fully-saturated glycerides and tri- C_{18} glycerides which may be present. A comparatively detailed statement of the chief component glycerides of the whole fat is then reached.

The results in question give additional support to the suggestion, previously put forward from the Liverpool laboratory, that in the "stearic-rich" group of animal depot fats the characteristic glyceride structure is the result of hydrogenation of mixed oleo-glycerides pre-formed in the animal. In the group of seven fats under discussion a consistent series is obtained, irrespective of the particular animal concerned, if the fats are arranged in increasing order of stearic acid content. In this series the fats of lowest stearic acid content are richest, for example, in palmitodiolein; and, whilst this mixed glyceride and oleopalmitostearin are the predominating constituents of all the fats, the proportions of oleopalmitostearin and the completely saturated palmitodistearin progressively increase as the proportion of stearic acid in the whole fat is augmented. A similar relationship holds between the relative proportions of oleodipalmitin and dipalmitostearin throughout the group of fats of varying total unsaturation.

Reference was also made to the relative paucity of information as to the component acids of animal fats as compared with that on vegetable fats. Apart from fats of the more common domestic animals, little detailed information over a wide range of animal species is yet available. A small beginning has recently been undertaken in this field by determination of the component fatty acids of a few scattered species, including those of the kangaroo, wild cat, lion, giant panda, bear, and baboon. The data obtained were briefly discussed, and it was shown that on the one hand there were close resemblances in some cases (kangaroo, cat, lion) to the "stearic-rich" domestic animal type and, on the other hand, instances (panda, bear, baboon) in which a common animal fatty acid

was relatively deficient or in which unusually high proportions of certain normally minor component acids were observed. The chief value of these fragmentary results was considered to be the clear indication that study of fats from a much larger number of selected wild species will certainly lead to further generalisation of the relationship of depot fat composition with biological factors.

LECTURE AT MANCHESTER, NOVEMBER 8th.

A joint meeting of the Chemical Society, the Institute of Chemistry, and the Society of Chemical Industry was held at the Chemistry Lecture Theatre, Manchester University, on November 8th, 1941, at 2.15 p.m., when a joint lecture was delivered by Dr. H. Hunter and Mr. T. Howlett, on "Long Molecules." There was an excellent attendance. The lecture was devoted to a survey of the most recent original work on the molecular weight and associated physical properties and constants of such molecules as cellulose, and synthetic resin fibres, and it was illustrated by statistical tables. A lively discussion ensued, and afterwards votes of thanks were given to the lecturers. Sir Robert H. Pickard was in the Chair.

LECTURE AT NOTTINGHAM, NOVEMBER 15th.

The Eighth Hugo Müller Lecture entitled "Some Aspects of Algal Chemistry," by Prof. I. M. Heilbron, was held on November 15th at 3 p.m., under the Chairmanship of Prof. J. Masson Gulland. The Chairman recalled the life and work of Hugo Müller, and expressed the pleasure of all present that Prof. Heilbron had been willing to come to Nottingham to deliver the lecture. The meeting was well attended, and the Society was pleased to welcome the presence of a number of biologists. A vote of thanks proposed by Dr. Short and seconded by Dr. Hunter was received with acclamation.

MEETINGS OUTSIDE LONDON.

LECTURE AT DUNDEE, NOVEMBER 12th.

A meeting of the Chemical Society was held in the Chemistry Department of University College, Dundee, at 5 p.m., on November 12th, with Professor W. F. K. Wynne-Jones in the Chair. Professor H. L. Riley, D.Sc., lectured on the "Crystallisation of Graphite." He gave an interesting account of the structure of "amorphous" carbon, with special reference to the crystal lattice of graphite. The lecture was illustrated by lantern slides, and reproductions of X-ray photographs. A hearty vote of thanks to the Lecturer was proposed by Mr. H. L. Parsons, and carried with acclamation.

LECTURE AT SHEFFIELD, NOVEMBER 21st.

A joint meeting with the Chemical Society of the University of Sheffield was held in the Chemistry Lecture Theatre of the Univerity at 5.30 p.m. on November 21st, 1941, with Professor R. D. Haworth in the Chair, when Professor H. W. Melville, F.R.S., delivered a lecture on "Polymers." The Lecturer showed how macromolecules could be divided into two classes according to their mode of formation, namely of those formed with elimination of small molecules (e.g., water) and of those formed without elimination, in which case some unsaturation must be present in the parent substance. Experimental study of the kinetics of the latter type of process was described and it was concluded that the formation of linear polymers depended on a chain reaction, the active monomer being considered, at least in some instances, to be a diradical. The lecture concluded with a discussion of the more difficult problems presented by the formation of three-dimensional macromolecules.

A cordial vote of thanks to the Lecturer proposed by Dr. A. H. Lamberton and seconded by Mr. R. C. Brian was carried with acclamation.
