

MEETINGS OUTSIDE LONDON.

LECTURE AT BANGOR, MARCH 6th.

A joint meeting of the Society with the Chemical Society of the University College of North Wales, Bangor, was held in the Chemistry Lecture Theatre of the College at 5.30 p.m. on March 6th, with Professor J. L. Simonsen in the Chair. Mr. C. R. Bury, M.Sc., B.A., discussed the remarkable properties of soap as a detergent and as a colloid in a most interesting lecture on "Soap and Allied Colloids." A cordial vote of thanks by Mr. J. G. T. Brown, seconded by Mr. W. P. Davies, was enthusiastically carried.

LECTURE AT CARDIFF, FEBRUARY 27th.

A meeting of the Society was held jointly with the Cardiff Section of the Institute of Chemistry and the South Wales Section of the Society of Chemical Industry at 5.30 p.m. on Friday, February 27th, in the Chemistry and Physics Lecture Theatre, University College, Cathays Park, Cardiff, with Mr. S. Dixon in the Chair. Professor H. V. A. Briscoe delivered a lecture on "Chemical Methods of attacking Certain Biological Problems," during which he described his investigations into the effects of inorganic dusts on the grain-weevil.

An interesting discussion followed, in which Messrs. S. Dixon and V. Rawson, and Drs. D. P. Evans, V. R. Sharma, and W. T. H. Williamson participated. A hearty vote of thanks to the lecturer was proposed by Dr. Williamson, seconded by Mr. F. S. Kernick, and enthusiastically carried. There were 68 persons present.

LECTURE AT EDINBURGH, MARCH 6th.

A meeting of the Society was held jointly with the local sections of the Institute of Chemistry and the Society of Chemical Industry at 7.30 p.m. on Friday, March 6th, in the North British Station Hotel; Dr. W. M. Ames in the Chair.

Mr. S. Ellingworth, M.Sc., gave a stimulating lecture on "Chemotherapy" to a large and appreciative audience. The lecturer discussed the chemotherapy of trypanosomiasis, malaria, and bacterial infections, with special reference to the development and mode of action of many synthetic chemotherapeutic agents. Drs. A. E. Cameron, Mitchell, Nisbet, Kermack, and Messrs. Bolton and Dodds participated in the discussion which followed, and the proceedings concluded with the adoption of a vote of thanks proposed by Professor Marrian.

MEETING AT LEEDS, MARCH 10th.

A joint meeting of the Leeds Area Local Section and the University of Leeds Chemical Society was held at the Medical School, Leeds, on Tuesday, March 10th. A discussion on "The Enzymatic Breakdown of Tryptophan to Indole" was opened by Drs. F. C. Happold, H. A. Krebs, and J. W. Baker. During the first session the Chair was taken by Professor M. G. Evans, President of the University Chemical Society: Dr. Happold discussed "The Enzyme System responsible for the Tryptophan—Indole Reaction," Dr. Krebs, "o-Aminophenylacetaldehyde as an Intermediate in Bacterial Indole Formation," and Dr. Baker, "Structural Evidence."

After an interval for coffee, the second session, held under the Chairmanship of Professor F. Challenger, was devoted to general discussion. A large number of the 54 members present took part in an interesting interchange of ideas, a more detailed report of which it is hoped to publish elsewhere. The meeting was closed with a cordial vote of thanks to the openers, proposed from the Chair.

LECTURE AT LIVERPOOL, MARCH 12th.

A joint meeting of the Society with the Liverpool University Chemical Society was held in the Muspratt Lecture Theatre of the University on March 12th at 4 p.m., when Professor M. G. Evans delivered a lecture on "Some Problems in the Chemistry of Macro-molecules."

The lecturer discussed the types of motion of long chain molecules and attempts to obtain expressions for the entropy contributions for these various types of motion. These ideas were then applied to some simple equilibrium and rate processes showing, for example, that in the melting of a long-chain solid the complete internal randomness of the molecule was not fully operative in the liquid state. It was shown, however, that the large increase in the possibilities of internal randomness which accomplish the melting of solids of macro-molecules accounts for the shape of the curve of melting point against chain length and for the asymptotic approach of the melting point to a constant value as the chains become longer. Under the application to kinetic problems the lecturer discussed the entropy change which accompanies the formation of the activated complex in a polymerisation step, and reached the conclusion that the steric factor did not increase indefinitely as polymerisation proceeds, but would rapidly reach a constant value as the chain length of the polymer increased. It was also shown that in a depolymerisation reaction occurring entirely in the gas phase or in solution the greatest probability of breakdown is, if all the bonds are of equal strength, in the middle of the polymer molecule, yielding equal fragments. Depolymerisation of a solid polymer, on the other hand, will most probably occur to yield a gaseous monomer.

Lastly, some problems in the field of the activation energy of polymerisation reactions were discussed, chiefly from the point of view of the stabilising influence of resonance energy upon free radical endings and the influence of the resonance energy in the transition state in lowering the activation energy for such reactions.

LECTURE AT NOTTINGHAM, MARCH 5th.

A joint meeting of the Society with the University College Physical and Chemical Society was held in the Chemistry Lecture Theatre, University College, University Park, Nottingham, at 4.30 p.m. on March 5th, with Professor J. Masson Gulland, D.Sc., in the Chair. Professor R. D. Haworth, D.Sc., delivered a lecture on "The Propylbenzene Unit in Biosynthesis." After drawing attention to the very frequent occurrence of the propylbenzene unit in certain naturally occurring compounds, the Lecturer proceeded to a discussion of the analytical and synthetic methods which have been applied to such compounds, and finally greatly interested his audience by speculating on the possible courses of relevant biosyntheses. A vote of thanks proposed by Mr. G. R. Barker, President of the University College, Nottingham, Physical and Chemical Society, was carried with acclamation.

LECTURE AT SHEFFIELD, FEBRUARY 27th.

A joint meeting with the Sheffield University Chemical Society was held in the Chemistry Department of the University at 5.30 p.m. on February 27th, 1942, with Professor R. D. Haworth in the Chair. There was a large attendance, and Professor E. L. Hirst, F.R.S., delivered a lecture on "The Constitution of Starch."

After a general account of earlier data bearing on the structure of starch, the lecturer showed how recent developments had led to an understanding of why the very large starch molecule behaved in certain respects as if constituted of chains each of about twenty-four glucose units, and to the expression of the known facts in a more exact structural picture, and explained the relationship between the synthetic starch recently obtained from glucose phosphate and the main components of natural starch. A vote of thanks proposed by Dr. A. W. Chapman and seconded by Mr. T. Wathen was carried with acclamation.

DEATHS.

The death of Sir William H. Bragg, O.M., F.R.S. (Honorary Fellow), was reported to the Council at their meeting on March 19th. The following resolution was passed and has been conveyed by the President to the members of the family:

The President, Officers and Council of the Chemical Society learned with profound sorrow at their meeting on 19th March, 1942, of the death of Sir William H. Bragg, O.M., F.R.S., who was elected an Honorary Fellow of the Society on October 17th, 1929.

Sir William Bragg's outstanding researches on the X-Ray Analysis of the Structure of Crystals placed him among the pioneers in physical science. He will ever be remembered, not only as an experimentalist but as a great teacher, and as one whose graciousness and genius for friendship endeared him to all those with whom he came into contact. By his death, Science in this Country, and throughout the world, has suffered an irreparable blow.

The Council mourn the loss of their distinguished Honorary Fellow and desire to express their deep sympathy to Sir Lawrence Bragg and Mrs. Alban Caroe in their sorrow.

MEETINGS OUTSIDE LONDON.

LECTURE AT CARDIFF, MARCH 27th.

A meeting of the Society was held jointly with the local sections of the Institute of Chemistry and Society of Chemical Industry in the University College, Cardiff, at 6.45 p.m. on Friday, March 27th, 1942, Mr. F. Kernick, Chairman of the South Wales Section of the Society of Chemical Industry, in the Chair.

Mr. L. T. Lowe, of the Usk Agricultural Institute, delivered a lecture on "The Chemistry of Soils," in which he paid particular attention to the classification of soils. The lecture was followed with great interest, and gave rise to a lively discussion in which Drs. D. P. Evans and J. F. J. Dippy, and Messrs. H. F. Adams, F. Bird, and P. H. Griffiths took part. A vote of thanks was proposed by Mr. F. Bird, seconded by Mr. D. Hicks, and enthusiastically carried. There were 48 persons present.

LECTURE AT MANCHESTER, MARCH 21st.

A joint meeting of the Chemical Society and the Institute of Chemistry was held at Manchester University on Saturday, March 21st, 1942, at 2.15 p.m., when Dr. J. M. Robertson read a paper on the application of X-ray diffraction methods to problems of molecular structure.

Electron and X-ray deflection methods were contrasted as regards the type of information which they yield about structures of atomic dimensions. The X-ray diffraction method as applied to crystalline materials was then discussed in more detail, with special reference to organic structures. Illustrations of recent results were given in the form of contour maps of electron density distribution. The results obtained from such work were compared with the theoretical calculation of density distribution and of bond length. In conclusion, it was pointed out that the subject of X-ray analysis is an essential connecting link, a sort of half-way house, between the experiments of pure chemistry and the more recent advances in theoretical chemistry.

Minutes of a SCIENTIFIC MEETING

held at Burlington House, London, W.1, on Thursday, October 15th, 1942, at 2.30 p.m.

The PRESIDENT, DR. W. H. MILLS, M.A., F.R.S., was in the Chair, and welcomed the visitors present.

The minutes of the Scientific Meeting on May 21st, 1942, were taken as read, and were confirmed and signed.

The President referred to the loss sustained by the Society, through death, of Professor Dr. Richard Willstätter, Honorary Fellow, of Professor G. G. Henderson, Past-President, and of Mr. F. W. Clifford, Librarian, and stated that the Council had passed the following resolutions:

The Officers and Council of the Chemical Society deeply regret the death on the 3rd August, 1942, of Richard Willstätter, who was elected an Honorary Fellow of the Society in April 1937.

His researches on the Structure and Synthesis of Cocaine and of Atropine at the early age of 30 singled him out as a chemist of outstanding ability, and his later researches, particularly his work on the Chlorophylls, on the Anthocyanins and on the Constitution of the Enzymes placed him among the great Organic Chemists of the age.

The Council record their high appreciation of the eminent services he has rendered to the progress of Science, and are proud that his name has been inscribed on the list of Faraday Lecturers of the Chemical Society.

They express their sincere sympathy to his daughter in the irreparable loss she has sustained.

The Officers and Council of the Chemical Society learn with profound regret at their meeting on the 15th October of the death on the 28th September, 1942, of their distinguished Past-President, George Gerald Henderson.

They express their high appreciation of the services he has rendered to the Science of Chemistry by his original investigations in Organic Chemistry and also by the far reaching influence he exerted as a great Teacher of Chemistry in his native City of Glasgow, over a period of 53 years.

Henderson had the distinction of serving as President of each of the three Chartered Chemical Bodies representing the Science and Practice of Chemistry in this Country, and the Council record with gratitude the wisdom and sagacity he manifested in guiding the affairs of this Society.

The Council experience a sense of deep personal sorrow in the loss of a revered and beloved colleague, and desire to convey their sympathy to his sister in her great loss.

The Council learn with deep regret at their meeting on 15th October, 1942, of the death on September 21st of Mr. F. W. Clifford, who was appointed Librarian to the Society in 1903.

Throughout the 39 years Mr. Clifford has held this office, his intimate knowledge of the Library has ever been placed freely at the disposal of Fellows and others using the Library and has been of inestimable value to all those engaged in the profession and practice of Chemistry.

The Council record their high appreciation of the outstanding services he has rendered not only to this Society but to all Chemists and give grateful thanks for his devotion to the duties of his office.

They desire to convey their sincere sympathy to Mrs. Clifford and her son in the irreparable loss they have sustained.
