


Hazards in the Chemical Laboratory: 2nd Edition

In the five years since the first edition was published, *Hazards in the Chemical Laboratory* has become established as a vital handbook in all types of laboratory environment. However, over this period many developments have taken place which justify changes in scope and emphasis.

This second edition contains completely new chapters on the Health and Safety at Work etc. Act 1974, Reactive Chemical Hazards, and Chemical Hazards and Toxicology. The authors of the chapters in the original volume have also brought their contributions up-to-date in the light of changing attitudes and legislative changes that are in progress. The section dealing with hazardous chemicals has been greatly expanded so as to provide detailed information on the properties, warning phrases, injunctions, toxic effects, hazardous reactions, first aid treatments, fire hazards and spillage disposal procedures for all common laboratory chemicals, together with short notes on the hazardous properties and reactions of several hundred other less common chemicals.


