Metal clusters are an area of science bridging inorganic synthesis, gas phase reactions, solid state structures, colloidal metals and heterogeneous catalysts. This meeting seeks to bring together scientists from these different fields to discuss the current and future potential of cluster science. There will be four topics:

- Molecular cluster complexes
 - Gas phase clusters
 - Clusters in the solid state
 - Colloids and catalysts

This is the first Dalton Discussion Meeting and it is to be organised on similar lines to those of the successful Faraday Discussion series. In this series each topic will be introduced by a review lecture, with the remaining papers chosen from the submitted abstracts. Those papers chosen will be published in a special issue of Dalton Transactions, and all must be primary publications of the form of a Dalton full paper. Preprints of all these papers will be distributed to attendees prior to the meeting. The author will give a short presentation based on this paper, but the majority of the meeting will be devoted to discussion of the contributed papers. There will also be a poster session, open both to those authors whose paper is not chosen for oral presentation and also for those who wish to submit a poster abstract nearer to the meeting date. The poster papers will not be published in the Dalton Transactions special issue, which should be published in April 1996.
