Be persistent and positive in that what you want, believe it and you will succeed.



What do you think of the magazine?

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






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Interview: Photographer Yves Bosmans (Belgium)


Wat zoek je in de modellen waar je met samen werkt?

What do you think of the magazine?



I am a architect with a passion for portraiture. I love to capture feelings and moods on somebody's face, the single moment, what we call hic et nunc !

How and when did you get into photography?

I started to love photography 3 years ago after discovering Jack Olson, an American photographer. His portraits opened the door to this world and gave me the key to reinterpret with a new language my passion

What does photography mean to you?

Photography is the way to express with a "cold" technical mean the never-ending variety of human beings' feelings

Please briefly describe your photography style for our readers.

portraiture is basically an experience of life: an attitude, a look through which I would like to capture the essence of all forms of life

Where do you get inspiration from?

experiences of life are the prime inspiration. a homeless in the streets of a big city, the rising sun on the sea, pensive eyes "stolen" by accident.....the multiple aspects of this way of taking photos fascinated me in the art of masters like Annie Leibovitz, Eugenio Recuenco, Katerina Plotnikova, Monia Merlo, Anka Zhuravleva , Marta Bevacqua and Alessio Albi.

Think you in advance what you want in the picture?

I have an image already set on my mind. starting from that, I look for the subject and the background corresponding to that image and I immediately think of the post production activities in order to express the mood of the image

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
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Interview: Model Dionisia Bouloukou (Greece)

What are some of your favorite experiences so far?



Everyday that I do what I enjoy is the best gift for me and the best experience.

Interview: Model Alena Alexandrovna Mayuk (Italy)

Can you tell us a little about you?

I come from Belarus (Pinsk), but in 2009, when I was 19, I moved to Italy.

First I have been living in Milan, where I studied in Milan State University and got my Bachelor Degree in Foreign Languages and Literatures in 2013. Meanwhile I started some modelling experience, working for fashion shootings, showrooms, presentations, events. In 2013 I moved to Florence, city I am actually living in and I hope to stay for long – because I find it really a magic place, and as says my best friend, place for "peace for senses". Here in Florence I started to work on a higher level, collaborating with professional photographers and best Florentine and Tuscan model agencies and actually working for last 3 years as a full-time model.

If you could change anything about yourself, what would it be?

I would like to be maybe more self-confident on moments.. Sometimes I am a too severe critic of myself. :)

How did you start modelling?

I started in Belarus when I was 14 – first I attended a course of modelling for young aspirant models, and in the age of 19 when I moved to Italy I just began to do it on a professional way.

What do you think of the work as a model?

I have never had career ambitions in this field, since ever I see this job only as a transitional period of my life (even if it last already 7 years, but as a proverb says it – there is nothing more constant as temporary), as a way to have fun and at the same time to travel, to know a lot of people and to discover a many-sided world of fashion, and not to undervalue - to earn money in order to be economically independent...

But all this till I will graduate and find a real possibility to have a different, high qualified job (I dream so will happen). Obviously, I can always continue to make shootings or inte-resting events, but more for personal enjoy than for job.

What are your personal qualities which distinguish you from others?

I am little bit stubborn, when I decide something I will try thousand times but will continue to pursue my goal (but it does not leave out the possibility to change my goal as much often)... And I think to be at the same time a dreamer and a rational person.

What is your beauty regimen?

Can you believe me, but actually none! Never made any diet (and hope won't need it in the future :-), I eat actually everything (and in big amounts) and I adore cooking, especially all caloric Italian dishes as pasta and lasagne! I don't use particular beauty treatments – just use the simplest cosmetics, and try to use minimum make-up during the day.

What about sport, I am moving my lovely Florence mainly by bike or by walking, and 3 times a week I am going to swim. Swimming is helping me not only to be fit but it brings me a psychological relaxation.

What are your plans for the future?

Actually I am attending an annual course in Digital Communication in Cappiello Academy in Florence.. My plans are all linked to my future profession in this field.

What are some of your favourite experiences so far?

I love to do non-commercial shootings, where I have freedom to express myself - the centre of the picture is not clothes or shoes or something else that we have to do advertisement for, but the emotions of the person, face, eyes, expressions, feelings, the mood of the place, situation and capture of the moment. My favourite photographer is Gabriele Rigon who always manages to pull out the real me during the shootings. And in front of his camera I always feel beautiful (and not always in other situations I do).

Do you have any advice for those who want to start modelling?

To define in a precise way, what do you expect from the model job. It's important to have clear ideas, is it your hobby or your future profession, and to not have too many expectations or even illusions, but just letting it go as it will. Fashion business is a little bit as a lottery.

What do you think of the magazine?

Modellenland for me is a refined magazine that makes a kleen selection of fresh fashion material. It's also a friendly place, made actually for everybody, where to know news about interesting and real people around the world who have passion in photography and in fashion.

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Interview: Photographer Jeremy Gibbs (Londen, England)

Tell us something about yourself

I am a Feature Film Editor by trade, but my passion is now photography. Maybe I started too late, I started to really be interested in it in my mid-fifties, but at a younger age, when I had my first SLR I enjoyed taking photographs but lacked in confidence. I could never have taken pictures of beautiful women when I was their age.

How and when did you get into photography?

I was doing a foundation art course (which incorporated photography) in the mid-1970's and I spent the whole of the first terms grant on a Pentax Spotmatic.

Then in 1976 along came the Punk explosion and I started to frequent the gigs in and around London and I used to take photographs at as many gigs as I could afford to go to. Life would never be the same again. I was sacked from my job in advertising, for not dressing well enough and having 'an attitude', but Fuck them! ;) ahahaha

What does photography mean to you?

Right now it is very important, I am passionate about it. But it started off as a hobby and now in the past 6 years I have compiled 6 photography books, four of them being my own pictures and only now am I starting to try to make it at least pay for itself. It gets expensive! I travel a lot, I drive through Europe with a van full of dresses and props and a head full of ideas.

Please briefly describe your photography style.


I guess that's up to your readers to figure out. I was once told by a good friend that he didn't appreciate my pictures because he found them 'too dark', it was only after this conversation that I realised he was probably right. I have just self-published a book that shows mainly 'nude' models in abandoned and decaying buildings around the world. Now I hope to do more 'sexy' 'dark' fashion with attitude and concealed nudes but still in abandoned or the more unusual locations. To me the background is just as important as the foreground (the model), neither should stand out more than the other, they should become one.

Think you in advance what you want in the picture?

Yes of course. That's not to say it won't change completely once we are there on location but yes, I always visit the location the day before shooting to see where the light falls best and always send inspiration shots to the model beforehand just to give her an idea of the mood I hope to capture.

Of course that all changes once we start shooting but that's usually how the best shots evolve.

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Where do you get inspiration from?

Everywhere! We are surrounded by inspiring things. I try not to look at too many pictures of other contemporary photographers, though, but more into the past masters of the art. But I get much inspiration working with my amazing models that really push themselves to the limit to get that one great shot! One will notice on my FaceBook page that I very often use the same models again and again. It takes a long time to find the right model for the locations I already have in mind then when I find that I enjoy working with the model I look for other locations that will suit their style.

Studio, on location or both?

Location all the time! I use a quote from Helmut Newton on one of the opening pages of 'All is not lost' he says "It's not that I don't like white paper backgrounds. A woman does not live in front of white paper.

She lives on the street, in a motor car, in a hotel room" That sums it up for me. I have done a couple studio shoots in the past but I just didn't feel at home in them. I don't use lights at all on my location work either, only ever just natural light.

Would you consider yourself a hobbyist or a paid professional?

Definitely a hobbyist. I would like to be a professional but it is so hard to make a living out of being a fine art photographer without having to do weddings or pictures of babies which I have no wish of doing.

What has been your most memorable session and why?

I couldn't single out any one particular session. There are occasional times when you just know that you have just taken a wonderful picture, then you just want to embrace the model. You both know that some magic has just happened. But other times those moments come when you are working on the picture in post. There are far more times when you know the picture has really come alive in the post or simply by turning a picture on its side, which I do quite often.

What has been the biggest source of inspiration in your work?

The models are my inspiration. If you choose a great model then wonderful things can happen. It is always a collaboration with the models I work with, it takes two people to make the picture. Some of my very best shots are ideas my models have come up with.

What is one piece of advice you would like to offer a new photographer looking to start their own business?

I don't have my own business so I'm not the ideal person to give that advice.

What do you think of our new magazine?

What I've seen so far has been very good. But maybe change the questions for each interview to make them more relevant to that person.

Interview: Model Rico Mallee (Nederland)

Kun je ons iets vertellen over jou?

Ik ben van origine muzikant en heb mijn opleiding gevolgd aan de school voor jong talent aan het koninklijk conservatorium in Den Haag met als hoofdvak contrabas. Later heb ik ook nog een opleiding personal trainer gevolgd maar met beide opleidingen doe ik weinig meer. Op het moment doe ik model-len werk en figuratie voor televisie.

Als je iets over jezelf zou kunnen veranderen, wat zou het zijn?

Als ik iets aan mezelf zou kunnen veranderen dan zullen het gewone kleine fysieke dingen zijn zoals wat meer borst, kuiten etc. Voor de rest ben ik tevreden hoe ik ben en ik vind dat iedereen ten alle tijden happy met zichzelf moet zijn maar je kan wel altijd streven naar beter.

Wat zijn je goede eigenschappen, en je minder goeie?

Mijn goede eigenschap is tevens ook mijn slechte eigenschap. Ik kan namelijk als ik iets wil mij er echt in vastbijten en niet meer loslaten totdat ik mijn doen bereikt heb. Dan zet ik alles op alles om dat doel te bereiken en ben ik er 24-7 mee bezig. De keerzijde hiervan is dat ik dan soms andere dingen die ook wel redelijk belangrijk zijn hiervoor laat liggen.

Hoe ben je begonnen als model?

Het was eerst nooit mijn bedoeling om model te worden en ik heb een keer "voor de lol" een fotoshoot gedaan en die op facebook geplaatst. naar aanleiding hiervan werd ik benaderd door andere fotografen die ook met me wilde shooten. De fotografen werden steeds beter en mijn foto's ook en zo is het in een keer heel snel gegaan. Ik ben er als het ware ingerold en nu vind ik het het mooiste wat er is.

Wat denk je van het werk als model?

Het werk als model is in mijn optiek een enorm gave bezigheid omdat je altijd prestatie gericht moet werken. Je moet elke keer presteren om tot een goed resultaat te komen. Het is daarom ook uitdagend werk en je kan non stop eraan blijven werken om elke keer weer beter en beter te worden.

Wat is uw schoonheid regime?

Mijn schoonheid regime is vrij simpel. Ik ben van mening dat als je een goed clean en gezond dieet volgt en elke dag alleen maar water drinkt dat aan je huid weinig hoeft te doen.

Slecht eten en drinken slaat namelijk op je huid. S'ochtends en s'avonds reinig ik altijd mijn gezicht en gebruik ik dag en nacht creme.

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Tevens Gebruik ik naast mijn hoog gedoseerde vitamine en mineralen complex extra biotine om mijn haar huid en nagels mooi en gezond te houden.

I shoot Nikon but I have also used Canon. I don't think there is much difference. It's me that takes the picture, not the camera.

Lens: it used to be 85mm/1.4 but now it is my 50mm/1.4.

Interview: Designer/styliste Elly Schraven (Netherlands)


Vertel eens wie ben je in het dagelijks leven?

Hoe begon je er aan?

Vandaaruit werd ik steeds meer en meer gevraagd voor styling bij fotos, maar ook voor modeshows en theater met mijn eigen creaties.


Heb je al leuke projecten mogen uitwerken en vanwaar komen de ideeën?

Hebben fotografen en modellen eigen ideeën en vind je dit dan een uitdaging

Ik doe heel graag freestylen, dus lekker mezelf uitleven, maar vind t zeker belangrijk dat je als team werkt, dus overleggen wat is t plaatje wat iemand in zijn hoofd heeft. Samen hetzelfde doel voor ogen hebben en dat uitwerken. Dus ja als een fotograaf of een model mij een idee aangeeft, vind ik dat zeker een uitdaging om dat samen uit te werken

Werk je zelf veel met moodboards of ben je iemand die liever toch haar eigen ding doet?

Dat is afhankelijk van de mensen waar je mee werkt. Ik heb ook fotografen die me gewoon de vrije hand geven omdat ze dan vinden dat er t beste werk wordt geleverd maar overleg dan meestal toch wel, welke kant ik op wil. Maar werk ook met teams waarin vantevoren wordt bepaald welk plaatje er ongeveer uit moet komen, dan werk je vaak wel met een moodboard.

Hoe gaat een styliste juist te werk?

Wat is juist? Ik denk dat eenieder zijn eigen werkwijze heeft daarin. Als ik gevraagd word voor een opdracht ga ik eerst kijken waar t voor is. Voor een show is toch weer anders dan voor een shoot. Maar in eerste instantie overleg ik met t team wat ze willen en kijk ik naar t model of ga op zoek naar een geschikt model. Dan ga ik kijken wat ik aan kleding en accessoires heb, evt shoppen ervoor. Of zelf een eigen ontwerp maken. Belangrijk daarbij is dat t voor een show draag- en loopbaar moet zijn, voor een shoot kun je ter plekke een creatie maken waar t model ook niet in hoeft te lopen en die na de shoot ook weer in lappen stof veranderen.

Zijn er nog dingen die je echt nog wil realiseren?

Ja ik heb zo nog wel een aantal doelen staan, dat vind ik ook wel belangrijk anders heb je geen uitdaging en je moet jezelf blijven uitdagen. Ik ben op t moment bezig met een project voor vrouwen en daar wil ik echt veel vrouwen mee bereiken omdat er nog veel vrouwen zo in hun schulp zitten. Niet tot bloei komen, capaciteiten laten liggen omdat ze t zichzelf niet gunnen om te stralen. Ik praat dan ook vanuit mijn eigen ervaring, heb flink wat hindernissen op mijn weg gehad en daardoor mijn leven laten leiden, terwijl ik pas tegen mijn 50ste ben gaan realiseren dat ik zoveel meer kan dan ik deed. Uit die comfortzone komen en zelf je leven in handen nemen. Een eigen modeshow staat nog zeker wel op mijn lijstje van doelen!


What are your personal qualities which distinguish you from others?

Interview: Photographer Jonas Eklöf (Sweden)

Tell us something about yourself

I'm a photographer from Gothenburg, Sweden. I also run a production company together with a friend, so nowadays I'm mostly producing film material.

How and when did you get into photography?

-My dad had a darkroom for developing B/W pictures in the cellar of our house, that's where my interest started when I was a child. But I didn't start to shoot professionally until maybe 10 years ago.

What does photography mean to you?

Photography is an outlet for creativity. A way to adapt the world to my vision.

Please briefly describe your photography style.

I go mostly by feeling. I like natural light and capturing moments, not preparing for hours. I always photoshop my pictures in a somewhat "dirty" way. It just happens haha, that's how I like them.

Where do you get inspiration from?

Well, from anywhere really. I don't consume that much photography, so when shooting I am more inspired by the situation or a feeling than a certain style or something like that.

Do you think in advance what you want in the picture?

That depends. With commercial work you often have to decide beforehand how the picture will look. But when I have artistic freedom I prefer to just put myself in a situation and then see where it takes me.

Studio, on location or both?

Both, even if I prefer location. I'm not really that interested in the technical side. Some people love to build with light to perfection, but I don't work like that.

Would you consider yourself a paid professional?

Since it's what I do for a living 100% I guess it's not a hobby anymore. But I also do a lot of private unpaid projects, just for fun.

What has been the biggest source of inspiration ?

People are always my biggest inspiration. I almost exclusively shoot people, and it's the meeting that inspires me. And in post it's the ability to enhance the feeling of that meeting that has me hooked.

Nikon or Canon? Favorite lens?

When shooting stills I always use Nikon if I'm not shooting medium format. I use either a D800 or a D5. As for most people who use their camera as a work tool, the 24-70mm f2.8 gets the most use.

But my favorite lenses right now are Nikon 85mm f1.4 and Sigma Art 24mm f1.4.


What is one piece of advice you would like to offer a new photographer looking to start their own business?




















Interview: Model Shelley Baptiste (Netherlands)

How did you start modeling

Getting spray tanned nude and guys setting up shoots was no problem for me. In the past 5 years I found out there was a market in Nude photography where I am from.

But dear let me wake you up, it's not that easy as everybody thinks...as a example nature shoots are chal-lenging, no one sees what goes on when shooting like the scratching stones or bugs biting you in a corn field while working.

What is your beauty regimen?

what are your personal qualities ?

I always come prepared and I'm very dependable and willing to work hard. many who work with me say i'm bubbly and fun to work with.

My book made with Jan Heemskerk (playboy, FHM etc) and Raquel Ottens is one of my highlights, Raquel is one of the best i worked with so far!

Do you have any advice for those who want to start modeling?

Get loose of people's opinions, everybody has something to say. In the beginning of my career, nude modeling was just "not done". I live in a small town and now everybody knows of it. It doesn't bother me and I am an open book so questions can be asked but yet sometimes people can be very hard. You need to get loose of those opinions because at the end of the day they don't pay your mortgage.
