The 17th International Liquid Crystal Conference was held in Strasbourg, France from 19 to 24 July 1998. We are indebted to the members of the Local Organizing Committee and many students and staff volunteers who worked very hard for several months towards the success of this conference. Their efforts were rewarded by an extremely successful and enjoyable conference.
