# International Symposium on Macrocyclic & Supramolecular Chemistry

## Oral abstract deadline - 28 January 2011

The 6th International Symposium on Macrocyclic and Supramolecular Chemistry (6-ISMSC) will cover all aspects of macrocyclic and supramolecular chemistry. It will bridge the traditional core areas of chemistry and interface with biological, nanotechnological and materials arenas. The meeting will include a mix of established and younger speakers and will offer the chance for students to present their work in the form of short oral presentations and posters.

#### International Izatt-Christensen Award

This award bears the names of the founders of the first International Symposium on Macrocyclic Chemistry. It is awarded annually to a leading macrocyclic chemist at the International Symposium on Macrocyclic and Supramolecular Chemistry.

#### **Bob Hay Lectureship**

This lectureship is awarded by the RSC Macrocyclic and Supramolecular Chemistry Group in memory of Bob Hay, one of the pioneers of macrocyclic chemistry in the UK. This prestigious lectureship is given to a younger chemist working in the area of macrocyclic and/or supramolecular chemistry in its widest sense.

#### Cram Lehn Pedersen Prize - Sponsored by ChemComm

The International Organising Committee of the International Symposium on Macrocyclic and Supramolecular Chemistry is pleased to announce the inauguration of a new annual international prize for young supramolecular chemists. The Cram Lehn Pedersen prize, named in honour of the winners of the 1987 Nobel Prize in Chemistry, will recognise significant and original work in supramolecular chemistry conducted independently by a supramolecular chemist.

# The winner of the Supramolecular Chemistry Award 2010 is Professor Neil Champness, University of Nottingham, UK

Professor Champness will deliver his award lecture at 6-ISMSC. This biennial award is presented by the RSC in recognition of studies leading to the design of functionally useful supramolecular species.


