Introduction

THE Symposium on Immunopharmacology includes contributions representing many different research areas from expert scientists who are currently working on immunological problems or are applying immunological methods to their investigations. Thus the aim of the Symposium is to illustrate what is going on; it is not a meeting to teach the principles of immunology to non-immunologists, nor to demonstrate immunological techniques as new research methodology.
