THE BEHAVIORAL TERATOLOGY SOCIETY ANNUAL STUDENT RESEARCH AWARD

The Behavioral Teratology Society will present a yearly award to the student submitting a manuscript published or accepted for publication in the preceding calendar year. The award shall go to the student whose work is judged the year's best by a committee appointed by the Society's president. The award will be an all-expense-paid trip to the Society's annual meeting, where the winner will read the paper and be honored with a plaque recognizing his/her achievement. In the event that the winner lives in the immediate area of the meeting, expenses and a \$100.00 cash gift will be awarded. The 1984 meeting of the Behavioral Teratology Society will be held in Boca Raton, Florida.

Eligibility: A student is defined as any person registered at an accredited institution of higher learning (U.S.A.) in a degree program (undergraduate, graduate, professional). Behavioral Teratology will be defined in its broadest sense to include methodological papers as well as those investigating particular behavioral teratogens.

Nominations: The paper must be submitted by both the student author and a sponsor who is a member of the Society. The sponsor should submit a cover letter commenting on the merits of the work. Four (4) reprints or clean manuscript copies of the paper should be submitted to the Awards Committee by April 1, 1984. All correspondence should be addressed to:
