CURT P. RICHTER PRIZE IN PSYCHONEUROENDOCRINOLOGY

Through the generosity of the Institute of Clinical Pharmacology, Dublin, Ireland, an Annual Prize has been established for meritorious research in the area of Psychoneuroendocrinology. The sum of US \$1,000 will be awarded annually at the International Congress of Psychoneuroendocrinology for the best essay or manuscript (original research or review including original research) submitted by a scientist or physician under 40 years of age by January 1, 1985. In support of the winner's travel to the Congress, a travel grant of max. US \$1,000 is also provided. The winning paper will automatically be considered for publication in the iournal Psychoneuroendocrinology and should be prepared according to the journal's instructions to the authors. The aim of the prize is to encourage younger scientists to contribute to this interdisciplinary field.
