Second U.S.-French Sponsored International Seminar On

Sigma Opioid/Phencyclidine-Like Compounds as Molecular Probes in Biology

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About 100 U.S. and international scientists, especially from France, gave oral and poster presentations covering various aspects of sigma opioid/phencyclidine-like compounds at a meeting held at the University of Michigan in Ann Arbor, June 29-July 2, 1987. The research reported herein suggests that some of these compounds are useful to define the nature of ionic channels coupled to a variety of neurotransmitters. Special emphasis was given to the biochemical, pharmacological, and behavioral relationships to N-methyl-D-aspartate (NMDA) antagonism. Seven sessions were held including: I. Chemistry, II. Interactions at the biochemical and molecular levels, III. PCP, NMDA and sigma interactions, IV. Pharmacological aspects, V. Drug metabolism and metabolites, VI. Immunological aspects, and VII. Possible therapeutic applications-brain protection.
