Table, where sometimes one Engin or Instrument may minister Aid to discover a large branch of Philosophy, as the Baroscope, an optick Glass, &c.

And very particularly M. Rook's directions for Seamen, which spe-

cifies Instruments, may hereunto belong.

And sometimes in one of the Discourses herein mention'd, and abbreviated, there are almost as many Artificial Inventions, as Experiments; as in Mr. Boyle's Hydtostatical Experiments: Bessides all the Chymical Operations, recited in the Treatise of the Origine of Forms, &c.
