

In the third and last Book, our Author gives some farther account of the *Cochinale*, proving it to be of animal production, and that it is not any of *English Lady-cow*, as some have affirm'd : The *Glossopetra* he believes to be the petrified Teeth of Sharks. Concerning the *Serpentine stone*, he takes notice of the difference in Authors about it, *viz.* whether it is a Natural or Artificial production, and whether it hath the Virtue to expel Poison in Venemous bites or not? He enumerates the several assertions of the Learned *pro & con*, quoting divers of their Experiments, and at last concludes, that both Natural and Artificial are to be met with, and that the different operations must arise from thence. *Pedro del porco* our Author affirms to be only an *Aegagropila* found in the Stomach of a *Porcupine*. To these he adds some Observations taken from *F. Camilli* his Papers, not only concerning this Stone, but likewise *Bezoars*. The whole Book abounds with many Curious Observations, for the farther dilucidation of the *Materia Medica*, which we recommend to the perusal of the Curious:
