VIII. *Part of a Letter from Mr. George Howell, Surgeon, at Haverfordwest, to Mr. W. Watson, F. R. S. concerning the extracting a large Stone by an Aperture in the Urethra.*

Read June 5. 1746. **J**OHAN COD, of the Parish of *Rock*, in the County of *Pembroke*, aged 40, was from his Infancy troubled with nephritic Complaints, and frequent Obstructions of Urine. He, at 25 Years of Age, had a total Suppression of Urine for some Days; when, upon a Stone's rushing out
