To Mr. H. Baker F. R. S. of extraordinary Heat in Feb. and of the same Earthquake.

Dear Sir,

Read March 8. HE Temperature of the Air was found to be warmer by my Thermometer (abroad) feveral Days of the last Month at 2h p. m. than I had observed it to be some Days in June last, at the same Hour; but, on Ibursday Feb. 22. at 2h p. m. it stood at near 63; and toom after rose to 63 full; which is higher, as appears from my Register, than it was at the same Time of Day, 18 Days in the Month of June. And I find, by an Account sent me from Mr. Canton, of Spital-Square, that his Thermometer was at the same Degree at 2h p. m. the same Day.

This perhaps may be thought not unworthy to be register'd in the meteorological Accounts in the Phil. Trans. but is submitted to the Judgment of
