Present work A base, mp 224-225°, was isolated from the red highly polar fraction C³ of the total alkaloids from the leaves and stems of Vinca minor L by countercurrent distribution and chromatography on alumina Picrinine C₂₀H₂₂N₂O₃, UV λ_{max} 236 nm (log ϵ 3 90), and 288 nm (log ϵ 3 50) m/e 338 M⁺, other major peaks at 320 (M-H₂O), 307 (M-OMe), 279 (M-COOMe), 261 (M-COOMe-H₂O), and the parent peak at m/e 239 ⁴ PMR spectrum 6 7–7 4 ppm (four aromatic protons), 4 92 ppm (NH-s), 5 45 ppm (vinyl q), 3 60 ppm (O-Me s), 1 50 ppm (d > CHMe) 5

The occurrence of picrinine was so far reported in Alstonia scholaris,4 and in Rauwolfia vomitoria 6 Vincaridine, isolated from Vinca erecta,7 was also shown to be identical with picrinine No picrinine was found in wild Vinca minor L collected in South Slovakia near Bratislava

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
