### Society Officers and Committee 1975-6

## Tate and Lyle Award in Phytochemistry

This new award was instituted by the Society Committee, through the initiative of Prof. L. Fowden, F.R.S. in January 1975 and is offered through the generosity of Tate and Lyle Ltd. According to the terms of the award, it will be presented annually to the European investigator judged to have the most significant contribution to phytochemistry during the previous five years.

The name of the first recipient, announced by the chairman Professor John Friend at the Annual General Meeting in April, is

of the department of Botany, University of Durham. He received the award for his eminent contributions to the biochemistry of plant proteins and for his distinguished work on the molecular evolution of cytochrome c and plastocyanin.

#### A. C. NEISH MEMORIAL LECTURE

The first A. C. Neish Memorial Lecture will be given in Halifax, Nova Scotia during the week commencing October 20, 1975 by Dr. R. H. Manske, Adjunct Professor, Department of Chemistry, University of Waterloo, Ontario, and will be sponsored by the Nova Scotian Institute of Science. The exact date and title will be announced later. Arrangements are being made for him to give the Lecture also in Ottawa and Saskatoon.

Dr. Manske is a graduate of Queen's University, Kingston, Ontario and the University of Manchester, England. He was formerly with the National Research Council of Canada and research director of the Dominion Rubber Company, Ltd. His distinguished career includes an honorary D.Sc. from McMaster University in 1960 and an honorary LL.D. from Queen's in 1967. He was medallist of the Chemical Institute of Canada in 1959 and its President during 1963–64. He is a Fellow of the Royal Society of Canada.

The Lecture is to commemorate the work and life of Arthur Charles Neish, F.R.S., O.C., formerly Director of the Atlantic Regional Laboratory, National Research Council of Canada, who died in 1973.
