

TATE AND LYLE AWARD 1984. CALL FOR NOMINATIONS

The Tate and Lyle Award was instituted in 1975 through the generosity of Messrs Tate and Lyle Ltd. It is awarded annually to a European investigator who is judged to have made a significant contribution to phytochemistry/plant biochemistry during the previous 5 years. The award takes the form of an inscribed silver tray and three books from the PSE Symposium Series. The recipient is required to present his/her recent results in the form of an Award Lecture at a meeting of the Society. The expenses of the lecturer are paid by Tate and Lyle Ltd. and publication of the lecture in *Phytochemistry* is encouraged. **Non-members of the Society are entitled to make nominations for the award.** Selection is made by a committee consisting of the Hon. Chairman, one Hon. Vice-Chairman and one Hon. Secretary of the PSE, one Executive Editor of *Phytochemistry* and one representative of Tate and Lyle Ltd.
