CANADIAN RADIO AT WAR

JANUARY, 1942, found the Canadian broadcasting stations already at war a little over two years. The pattern of their contribution had already begun to take form.

To understand the contribution broadcasting is making toward the part Canada is playing in the United Nations' fight for victory, it is necessary to know the set-up of the industry. There are eighty-eight licensed broadcasting stations scattered across Canada from the Atlantic to the Pacific coasts. Ten of these stations are owned by the Canadian Broadcasting Corporation. The remaining seventy-eight are privately owned.

CBC National Network

The Canadian Broadcasting Corporation controls and operates the only National Network. It consists of nine Corporation and twenty-six privately owned stations. On various occasions and for some Government programs, all but five of the licensed stations have been hooked up to form an all inclusive network. From the outbreak of the war, the Canadian Broadcasting Corporation and the Canadian Association of Broadcasters, representing the private stations, have worked closely and harmoniously together. Officials of the Corporation and of the Association are members of the various committees organized to carry on the radio requirements of the war departments of the Government.

Shortly after the outbreak of war, the Government of Canada decided to purchase time from the radio stations just as it purchases space from other media. Thus, radio's function falls into two classifications: (1) as a vehicle for Government sponsored and paid-for programs at regular commercial rates, and

(2) free time contributed by network and individual stations and by commercial sponsors.

As an example of the amount of free time contributed by the industry, the figures for 1941 are given. The CBC network and privately owned stations gave over \$1,500,000 of free time, or between two and three times the expenditures by the Government for the same period. Commercial sponsors are estimated to have contributed over \$2,000,000 of time to Government promotions during the same period. When the figures for 1942 are compiled, it is estimated they will exceed 1941.

War-Time Users of Radio

During 1942, the Department of Finance, the Navy, the Army, the Air Force, the Wartime Prices and Trade Board and the National Selective Service Department have been the principal users of broadcast time. In addition to the war agencies various patriotic organizations such as the Red Cross, Canadian Aid to Russia Fund, the Navy League, the Milk Fund, and the Chocolate Fund have all been users, most of which has been contributed free by the National Network and individual privately owned services.

This radio time has taken almost every form available to programing—namely, network shows, transcribed fifteen and five-minute dramatic shows, serial dramas, dramatized spots, local community shows, and actuality broadcasts.

Victory Loan Campaign

The Department of Finance, through its agency, the National War Finance Committee, has been the greatest user of paid time during 1942 and the recipient of the largest amount of con-

tributed time by Network stations and sponsors. Two Victory Loan campaigns were launched during 1942 by the National War Finance Committee, one in the spring of the year and one during the autumn months. Specific shows for each of these drives were the All-Star Variety hour shows on a special network of some fifty stations. During the spring campaign, there was, in addition, a special orchestral half-hour show on Monday nights and a dramatic all-star show on Wednesday nights. In addition to the all-star show in the autumn, there was a special "Nazi Eyes on Canada" dramatic show and, running steadily during and between campaigns, there is a five-day-a-week roving reporter fifteen-minute show entitled "They Tell Me."

Reference to the All-Star shows calls for a tribute to the many stars of stage, screen, and radio from our comrade-in-arms, the United States. These stars contributed freely and most generously in helping by their superb entertainment to sell Canada's Victory Bonds to her people. Canada is proud of the great part which these famous stars have played in her war effort.

All of the National War Finance Committee's radio programs have been developed and directed by a committee known as the National War Finance Radio Committee. The Committee consists of three representatives from the Canadian Broadcasting Corporation, three representatives from the Canadian Association of Broadcasters, and three representatives from the Advertising Agencies of Canada War Finance Group. Serving with and under the direction of this Committee there are several working committees on which are to be found the best experts from the advertising agencies and the radio industry.

Armed Force Shows

Once a week, the Navy, Army, and Air Force have a combined show on the National Network entitled "Comrades in Arms." The Army has a special "Army Show," staffed, directed, and operated by men and women in the Army. During 1942, the Army has also supplied individual stations with a transcribed show entitled "Badge of Honour." Permission was granted for local commercial sponsorship and over fifty-eight

broadcasting stations carried the show in 1942.

The Air Force, during 1942, ran a commercially sponsored program entitled "They Fly for Freedom." In addition to these shows, there have been special dramatic presentations for recruiting in the Navy, Army and Air Force. These presentations have been on both the National Network and over the local community stations.

In addition to many special short campaigns, broadcasting stations in Canada carried throughout 1942 a dramatic serial five times a week for the Wartime Prices and Trade Board. This program is entitled "Soldier's Wife."

French-Language Campaigns

In the Province of Quebec where the majority of Canadian citizens speak the French language, the Canadian Broadcasting Corporation stations and the privately owned stations have paralleled the work of the English speaking stations with special French programs designed and developed to meet the requirements of the Province of Quebec.

No story of broadcasting in Canada under the wartime conditions of 1942 would be complete without special reference to the constant and creditable job which the privately owned stations have done in their local communities. Most of the local work has been completely contributed without cost to the war agencies for time, talent, or ideas. The local community stations have produced programs for local committees, developed special campaigns for recruiting, and wherever there is an Army or Air Force camp near a local broadcasting station, weekly shows by men in the armed forces are the order of the day.

Continued Effort

When the story has been fully told, the Canadian broadcasting industry has every right to be proud of its contribution during 1942 in helping to get on with the war. In spite of problems of priorities and manpower, the Canadian Broadcasting Corporation and the privately owned stations working together are geared up to carrying on with increasing effect until the day when the United Nations will have achieved victory and put down aggression.
