A distinguished service medal for radio has been struck by the Columbia Broadcasting System to be given to celebrated speakers or musicians who appear before the microphone, and to those who conspicuously further radio broadcasting.

#### Locating Trouble.

Probably the most valuable instrument in the tool kit of the radio service man is a dentist's mirror. The metal handle of the mirror had better he wrapped with a layer of tape to prevent it from shorting wires when the mirror is used in a close place inside of a radio set. The mirror often proves invaluable for work on a radio set that cannot be taken to the shop for repairs. Inaccessible places on the inside of the set can be examined easily by aid of the mirror. If a flashlight is at hand the mirror can be used for deflecting a beam of light into dark corners in the set.
