His father was a noted bandmaster in Russia and started his little son to playing the snare drum in his band when only eight years old. Under the regime of Kerensky, Cherniavsky, with Vladimir Ba-kaleinikoff, of the Cincinnati Symphony orchestra, was an off-me of the Density cer of the Russian musical organization. Coming to America, he joined the Capitol Theatre (New York) orchestra as solo 'cellist. There he became intensely interested in American jazz and or-

ganized his own orchestra. With the advent of talkies, he went to Hollywood and for two years was movietone director for Universal. scoring their productions (in-cluding "Show Boat") and directing a jazz orchestra in the making of musical accompaniments.
