WHICH SHOWS WHAT TO DO WITH A FOOLISH HUSBAND

KISSING IS A LOT OF FUN for vivacious Claudette Colbert, shown above in a scene from her "Skylark," which will provide plenty of laughs for her host of fans. The bashful suitor is her screen husband, Ray Milland, whose expression is anything but pleasant as he squirms on the davenport at Miss Colbert's advances; however—

UN-"LUCKY" RAY is anything but successful in his frustrated attempt to prevent the determined, fun-loving Claudette Colbert from kissing him, begins struggling to wriggle away from her embrace (imagine that!), therefore—

MISS COLBERT, not heeding her bashful "husband's" struggling attempts to evade her romantic attentions, manages the situation very well, succeeds in her determination

"DARLING," shouts Lydia Kenyon (Miss Colbert) as she rushes into the arms of her husband, Tony (Ray Milland), on the eve of their fifth wedding anniversary in "Skylark"—

To Feature Desk:

FRANKLY, I never cared much for Claudette Colbert. Every time I tried to see a Colbert film in the making, it seemed I got the same answer, "The set is closed, as Miss Colbert is doing a very difficult love-scene." Could she be THAT temperamental. I decided to find out.

Well, the other day I dropped in on Colbert's "Skylark" set at Paramount with a great big chip on my shoulder—and was I disillusioned! By golly, I had more fun than a barrel of men. Claudette and Ray Milland were in the midst of a kissing-scene. They were on a davenport and he was struggling bashfully (imagine the dopel) against her "advances." When director Mark Sandrich yelled "Cut," Ray and Claudette laughed at one another, and he said to her, "Do you call that a hot kiss? It was about as hot as a kiss on the back of my hand." Colbert eeked back, "Not hot, huh? Well, if there had been any snow around, I could have skied on your cold kisses!"

Milland "Falls" for Colbert

Another time, she rushed at him for another kiss, bumped him into a chair and knocked him down. As he stumbled, she loosened her embrace and let him fall. 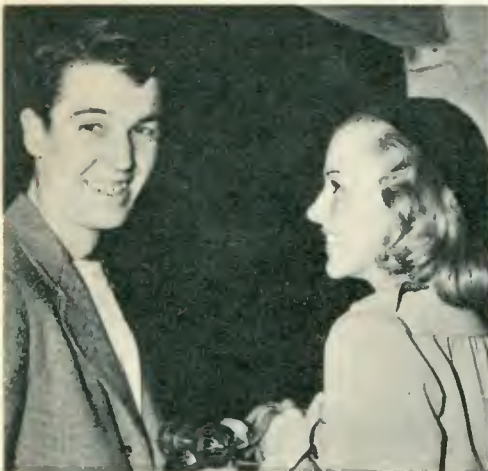

Report on Clark Gable:

IT'S tough to get up at 5:30 in the morning, but I never mind it on a Gable picture. For Gable, it's soft. His ranch is only over the foothills from Calabasas, the spot for this location. He was on hand when I arrived to watch them film the "war" scene for "Unholy Partners," and Gable in uniform is enough to upset all the women on the set from script-girl to wardrobe women! Cameras started to roll around nine o'clock on the first day of this two-week stint. Not real war scenes, but pretty thrilling for all of that.

The story has Gable as a jewel-thief trapped into the army when he dons a uniform to get out of a jam. In helping to evacuate the women and children from a Japanese settlement his truck rolls over a tank and the fighting starts.

It was as hot as blazes on the set, but the action was good. Thing I like about Gable is that he really leaps into a scene. Where the vitality comes from I don't know, but he snaps back into it every time, and there's very little of the thrill stuff that a stuntman has to do except when the studio insists on it for safety's sake.

Gable's private war was a good one. If it looks as good on the screen as in the filming, "Unholy Partners" will be another hit for Mr. G. —B. B.

Report on Betty Grable:

STRANGELY, I haven't seen Betty for more than a year. The last time I dropped by her home she was a bitter young lady. "I think I'll quit this business, she said, "I've been in it nine years. I'm twenty-three and getting nowhere." Next thing I knew Betty had landed in "DuBarry Was a Lady" on Broadway with a big role in one of the biggest musical shows of recent years. Today she has been on the 20th Century-Fox lot for exactly eight months. In that time Shirley Temple has left the studio; Sonja Henie is doing what probably will be her last picture. Betty Grable is now number two star on the lot, a seant box-office pae behind Alice Faye. *That is some going!*

A strange fact is that on the same movie lot which now pays her \$1,250 a week, Betty once earned fifty dollars a week as a chorine in the line. She has had only a few pictures to her credit in big roles—including "Down Argentine Way," and now "Moon Over Miami."

In this, her latest picture, Betty, as a carhop in a glorified Texas drive-in stand, uses a four-thousand-dollar legacy from an Iowa relative to finance a journey to Miami, where she hopes to bag a millionaire, thus to put her family on easy street. In spite of amazing complications, she succeeds—and finds love. "Moon Over Miami" looks like one of Betty's best!

On the personal side, I don't think you have to worry about Betty getting married tomorrow. Of course she's everywhere with George Raft, but believe me, "going with somebody" in Hollywood is almost the same as anywhere else. It gets to be a habit. And if it gets to be enough of a habit, they marry. —C. S.

The marriage followed a whirlwind courtship. Phil gave Alice the engagement ring on her twenty-sixth birthday, May 5. They were married May 12. Harris was previously married to actress Marcia Ralston, Miss Faye to Tony Martin.

WE MET a really disturbed little man the other day. He had just been signed to his first movie-writing contract. Rushing into swank new offices, he leaped for the typewriter with all the eagerness of a neophyte desperately anxious to do noble things for the screen. "Hey, wait a minute!" his collaborator yelled, "Don't write anything yet. We got to think." Now, this little man can't think unless he's writing. Because his collaborator and producer want him to think first and write afterward he's in an awful quandary. "Gosh," he told us, a pitiful tone in his voice, "if they'd only let me use the typewriter!"

Our little man will get over that. He'll discover that most producers don't want their writers to turn out a story in twenty-four hours. If they do, the producers get mighty suspicious, figuring that it takes much longer than that to "lift" ideas from similar pictures which have already made a lot of money and therefore are safe sources. As a result, many a movie writer does his story in a couple of days, locks the door and goes to sleep until he figures the producer has waited long enough to be happy with the result. It's crazy. It doesn't make sense. Ask the little man who is getting one thousand dollars a week for thinking and not writing. Ask yourself next time you see a super-Hollywood epic that reminds you of ten others you've seen before.

Personal Tips: "A Woman's Face" is solid entertainment. Opposite Melvyn Douglas, Joan Crawford does as fine a job of acting as you'll see this season. There's a "chase" sequence in which a madman whips down an icy mountain-side in a sleigh with a child he plans to murder. It will have you leaping up on the stage! "Redhead," featuring June Lang, Johnny Downs and Eric Blore, is the story of a drunken wastrel who reforms; it is highly uninteresting. "Scattergood Pulls the Strings" is another in the series of Clarence Budington Kelland pictures, featuring Guy Kibbee. It's homey and well done.

New on the Movie Lots: Biggest news of week is that Fred Astaire and Bing Crosby will shortly begin work on a co-starring picture for Paramount called "Holiday Inn." Astaire is now before the cameras with Rita Hayworth in "You'll Never Get Rich."

SAY it was the heat (over ninety degrees at the preview). You say it and your critic will say he still can't whip up affection for "Affectionately Yours." The title smacks of a sweet romance. Don't believe the title. The story is one of those ex-husband-wants-to-get-his-wife-back routines. You've seen it with Irene Dunne and Cary Grant. You've seen it with Merle Oberon and Melvyn Douglas. You see it all the time with Ralph Bellamy as the stupid suitor who won't win the girl, as everybody in the place knows, including Junior, who is three years old.

Oh, it's not all sour. Dennis Morgan looks good as the daffy war correspondent and there's the Rita Hayworth scenery, plus George Tobias doing a fine bit as the confused cameraman. You laugh for a little while at the two colored maids you'll remember from "Gone With the Wind," but the whole thing is labored and too familiar. It's as though the producers figured they'd do one "super" triangle comedy to top every gag ever filmed.

VERDICT: By this time you gradually get the idea. If you haven't seen the other half-dozen pictures just like this, some of which Merle Oberon has played in, "Affectionately Yours" may not make you want to throw rocks at the screen. Otherwise, we can't say. —C. S.

As an American aviator whose job it is to fly bombers to England, MacMurray looks more logical than he did as the southern gentleman, suh, in "Virginia."

VERDICT: Instead of assiduously avoiding pictures with war backgrounds because the public turned thumbs down on those early, dreary efforts, producers can take a lesson from "One Night in Lisbon." It is breezy stuff from start to finish in tempo with the times. —C. F.

Sponsor gives time to federal government; Ezra Stone drafted; "Quiz Kids" plug defense bonds

RADIO VIEWS

by Martin Lewis

THERE are three things that are of interest to the radio listener at the present time.

The first of these is the FCC's ruling issued May 3 which would force NBC to relinquish one of its two networks and cause general readjustments through the broadcasting industry. Under the ruling NBC must either sell or disband one (most likely its Blue) network within ninety days. Affected by this ruling are some of radio's most outstanding programs, such as the Toscanini Symphony Hour, the National Farm and Home Hour, the Town Meeting of the Air, the NBC Music Appreciation Hour and the Metropolitan Opera. Loss of even a portion of these programs would be no small catastrophe.

Of course the networks aren't going to take this ruling lying down. Already NBC and CBS have protested. They assert that the regulation will destroy a good part of what took fifteen years to develop. Chaos, they say, will be the inevitable result of the action if it is upheld by the courts.

We don't know who is right and

who is wrong. But we do know this: The listener stands a fine chance of losing some outstanding radio programs now being heard on the air. That is why the issue is an important one to him.

The other items of current interest to the listener are the go-ahead signal for commercial television and the return to the airwaves of ASCAP music. Regarding the first, it seems that at long last television will get under way on a big scale. The greatest handicap to television until the present time was the FCC refusal to permit commercial sponsorship of programs. Without that commercial sponsorship the program end of television has lagged far behind its technical progress. Look for television to go ahead by leaps and bounds now.

Ancient the return of ASCAP music to Mutual's airwaves, we have this to say: We're glad. ASCAP certainly has not been the victor. Instead it has had to make concessions which mean that the alleged monopoly it once held will no longer be possible under the terms of the new agreement. We did not at any time want to see ASCAP's former practises reinstated, but we did want to see the fight settled. You may shortly hear ASCAP music on the two other networks, for negotiations for its return are under way. It will not be too soon for us. And we believe it will not be too soon for you either.

CBS Reporter Wounded

ATHENS, GREECE.—Leigh White, CBS war correspondent, who has been missing for two weeks, is in a private hospital in Argos, Greece, recovering from wounds received when a German Messerschmitt machine-gunned his train. On April 16 White and other reporters left Belgrade, Yugoslavia, for Athens. Between Patros and Corinth a Nazi plane swooped down and fired on the train. White was wounded in his right leg.

Broadcasting "Fritz" Caught

PEORIA, ILL.—Through perfected detecting equipment that can determine within 150 feet where a transmission station is located, United States agents recently arrested Charles W. Johnson, senior electrical engineering student at a midwestern institution, for violations of the U. S. Communications Act. Johnson, who claims he was a cryptographer in the German Army, illegally operated a station, called himself "Fritz" instead of using call letters, and trespassed upon government frequencies. Because of the intense world situation the National Defense Operations of the Federal Communications Commission is keeping a sharp watch for Nazi agents and sympathizers who illegally attempt to broadcast Nazi propaganda in this country.

Right Beats Might on Air

NEW YORK.—The reason CBS failed to carry Hitler's address to the German Reichstag Sunday, May 4, was

that it was broadcasting a devotional program at that time. "We believe," a CBS spokesman said, "that the word of God in English is more important than the words of Hitler in German."

New Song Sensation

HOLLYWOOD.—"The Hut Sut Song," written by Ted McMichael of the Merry Macs with Jack Owen and Leo V. Killion, promises to be a real sensation. Published less than a month ago, it has been featured on the air by Kate Smith, Bob Hope and Alec Templeton. Benny Goodman wants to buy an interest in its profits for five thousand dollars.

"Miss Babe" Found

NEW YORK.—"Court of Missing Heirs" has settled its most unusual case—locating an heir who didn't know the radio program existed or remember the man who left her a legacy. Last year the show broadcast the will of a Toronto plumber who left an estate to a "Miss Babe," whom he had met when she played in vaudeville in Fort Wayne, Ind., years ago. Three "Miss Babes" showed up, including Mrs. Edith Collins Stewart, whose friends recalled that she had borne that nickname when she toured vaudeville circuits with her parents. In a Toronto trial Mrs. Stewart received a settlement of \$1,775.

President, International DX'ers Alliance

ARMED with several copies of MOVIE-RADIO GUIDE, a blank note-book and a pocketful of pencil stubs, your columnist recently grabbed the Capitol Limited for Washington, D. C., to take a look at new short-wave activities and to chat with leaders in the international broadcasting field.

Readers of this department will know that I have been greatly interested in the development by our government of its own short-wave Monitoring Service. The headquarters of this new service is in an unnamed and neat but unimposing brick building in a quiet residential section of F Street. Its spacious rooms are filled with long rows of desks, which are soon to be occupied by stenographers, translators and propaganda analysts. The foreign broadcasts will actually be picked up at four monitoring stations (listening-posts)—the closest at Laurel, a suburb of Washington, D. C., the farthest on the West Coast, manned by a field force of expert observers who will record all foreign programs of importance. The recordings will then be rushed to Washington for handling at headquarters by the trained translators and analysis experts. Broadcast material of timely importance will be extracted from the recordings and immediately sent from the field monitoring stations to Washington by teletype. According to Henry Graves, well-known propaganda analyst from Princeton University, now senior administrative officer in the new Government Monitoring Service, the primary objective of his department will be to analyze the propaganda content of all foreign broadcasts, then to pass on the observations and conclusions to various Government officials and to the President.

G. E. Sterling, chief of the National Defense Systems operation of the Federal Communications Commission and a capable radio engineer with many years of experience in the Government service, has actual control over all FCC monitoring stations, including those in the new foreign monitoring service. His office in the new Post Office Building is in constant touch by teletype, telegraph and telephone with all of the monitoring stations.

In New York City I hied myself down to Radio City to see what was new in NBC international broad-

casting. I learned from close friend Jules Van Item, supervisor of NBC's monitoring service, that this service is being definitely expanded and given greater official recognition. The listening-post at NBC is in the news room, not twenty feet from a battery of busily clicking teletype machines from which unroll foot after foot of news dispatches from all parts of the world.

Director Ellwood, in charge of NBC's international division, unfolded tentative plans to put NBC broadcasts from international stations WNBI and WRCA on a possible twenty-four-hour basis. He told me that the service to Europe was being intensified and that a daily transmission in Spanish for Spain and one in Portuguese for Portugal had just been added.

Had luncheon with busy, enthusiastic Walter Lemmon, the guiding genius back of the World Wide Broadcasting Foundation at Boston. Although WRUL and WRUW are now broadcasting with 50,000 watts power each, tentative plans call for an increase in power to 100,000 watts for at least one of the stations. A new aerial beamed on New Zealand and Australia has just been completed and a special daily transmission for this part of the world will soon be inaugurated. WRUL-WRUW, although primarily directed to Europe or South America, are also well heard throughout America.

Over at the New York City headquarters of the British Broadcasting Corporation in the British Empire Building, I had a chance to gather some very important information from my friend, D. G. Rowse; also to talk with W. M. Newton, who had just Clipped in from the BBC in London. Mr. Newton informed me that Broadcasting House, London home of the BBC, had been badly torn up by air raids and that several staff members had lost their lives in the explosions. All of the studios are now underground, as are many offices which house thousands of BBC employees.

To summarize my recent flying trip to the East, I might say that everywhere I found a greatly increased interest in all phases of short wave. Almost everyone that I talked to expressed the belief that international broadcasting with its attendant propaganda factor might readily become one of the decisive factors in this war.

YOU have to hand it to Kay Kyser. He's one of the amusement world's greatest drawing-cards. Neither rain nor sleet nor snow nor the most strenuous sort of competition can keep the "Ol' Professor" from packing 'em in on the dance-floors. 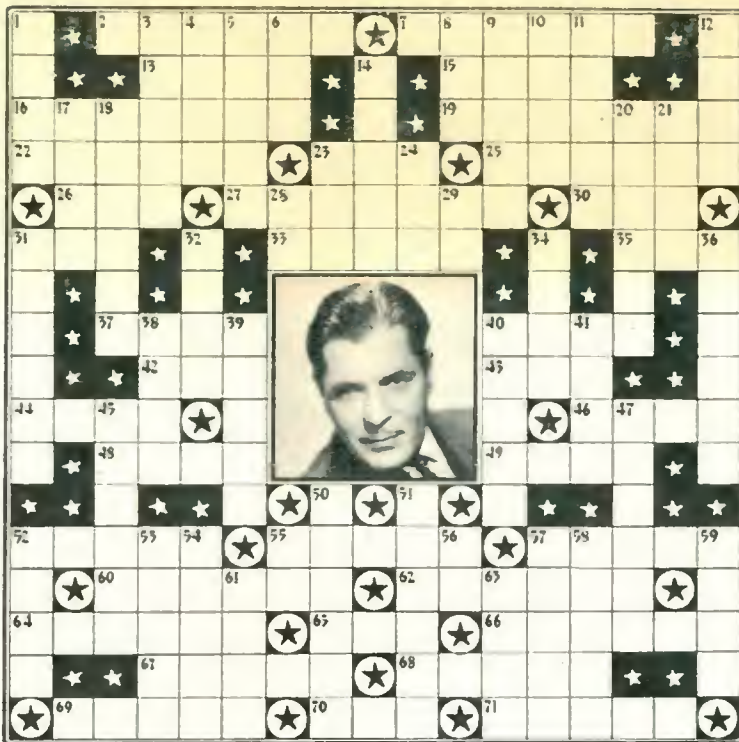

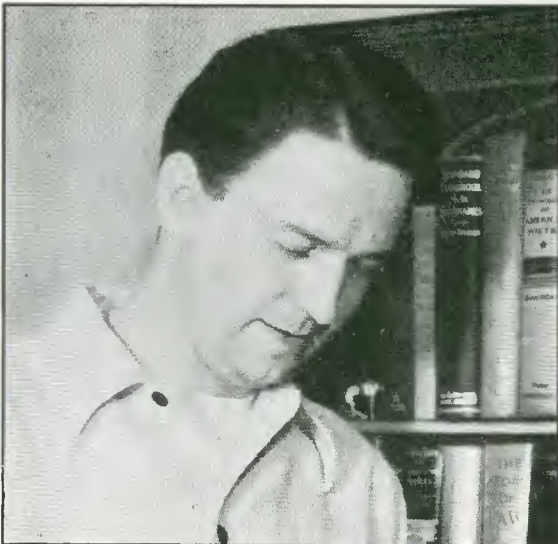
