it put on the screen actor to lift briefly so that Americans can see how he is progressing.

Lew's commanding officer calls him "an excellent soldier." A junior officer at the post says, "I wish I had a whole battalion of men just like him

Lew has put on weight. He has come up through the grind of menial jobs to the position of hospital ward instructor. He has asked no favors.

Where and how Lew Ayres will finally serve his country neither we nor Lew know. He has said he

would welcome service under fire, but his fature is entirely in the hands of the military authorities.

Lew, a few months ago, was a symbol of the futility of pacificism in a world at war. Today he is a symbol of the unity of our nation. He is proof that, no matter what our differences, we stand together in the fight for freedom.

This much is sure—the screen's Dr. Kildare is doing his job as a citizen and as a soldier!


First Call With Beverly

VER since the blazing dawn of June 22, 1941, the steel and shell of Hitler's mechanism of destruction have sought to paralyze the world's toughest realists into a state of submission. What the Nazis thought would be just another campaign developed into a war; and two millions of the Aryan horde, their crumpled bodies deep in the earth of Russia, bear mute witness to that fact.

The race of Prussian steel to Moscow, we were told in Berlin, would take but six weeks at the outside. Flames of revolt would sweep the country; its "oppressed" people would welcome with open arms the "cru-saders" of the Hooked Cross! Come November 29, and the explosion at Rostov-on-Don. There the myth of Nazi military invincibility burst before the eyes of an incredulous world. The German flood began to recede. Hitler's war machine was being shot (Continued on Page 36)

There is a sign in a certain office in the War Department which says, "The difficult we do immediately. The impossible takes a little longer." Which pertains, in this instance, to the radio show called "Command Performance." No American listener has heard it unless he has tuned in on Sundays to those eighteen short-wave stations which beam it to our forces overseas, or unless he has attended the recording session at which the program is captured on wax.

We sat in the second row of the National Theater, in the midst of the greatest gathering of generals, admirals, senators, Government heads ever assembled during this war.

Bing Crosby came east to be master of ceremonies and to sing both as soloist and in combination with Con-nee Boswell. Kay Kyser brought his entire orchestra from the West Coast, paid all their expenses, to play "Jingle, Jangle, Jingle" for our troops. The stars all left comfortable, happy homes to fly here. It is no easy hop in bumpy air from Hollywood to Wash-

Paul Douglas opened the show with curtain-raising speech that got the distinguished audience in the proper mood. One star afterward confided, "I peeked through the curtain for ten minutes before the show started. I wanted to see what real celebrities looked like." Douglas introduced a sober, unsmiling Crosby, who looked scared for perhaps the first time in his life. But his clothes weren't scared. Even in Washington, the Bing lived up to his name for sartorial exuberance.

Hedy Lamarr did a short skit with Bing that was probably more interesting to us in the audience than to soldiers in Africa. She has developed a mannerism that the women seemed to like. Her hair-bob is long, at least four inches below the neck, and she wears it loose, one side droops down across her eyes and she shakes it back with a robust sweep of the head.

It was Abbott and Costello who almost doubled up Mr. William Batt, our production expert. Mr. Batt has a round, pleasant face to begin with, and when it is under the influence of the madman gags of Bud and Lou, it positively beams.

It was Kay Kyser who stole the show, however. Washingtonians had heard of his "talks," which he has delivered wherever he has appeared with his now famous Bondwagon. They asked that he give a talk to the Government officials. Now, Professor Kyser is an astute and engaging individual. He has turned buffoon only because that is the way in which he achieves the greatest personal success. For a buffoon to become serious is

usually fatal to enjoyment, but here

is one instance to the contrary.

I can still see Kyser shaking his long forefinger under the noses of a dozen great statesmen and leaders, telling them to get busy with their planning. Kyser may achieve greater personal success in other years, but he will never spend a more useful minute than that one in the National Theater at the conclusion of the "Command Performance" broadcast.

BERNARD HERRMANN EXPLORES NEGLECTED COMPOSITIONS FOR CBS SERIES

New Recording Company Debuts With Three Albums; Victor Records Grieg's "Peer Gynt" Suite by Indianapolis Symphony, Fabien Sevitsky Conducting

NE of the most unusual musical programs in radio is the CBS "Exploring Music," whose conductor is Bernard Herrmann, a young man of thirty-one. "Exploring Music" endeavors to do no less than its title indicates; that is, to bring forward works long neglected in the dustbins of time, unfamiliar contemporary works, and others that might properly be classified as having been "explored."

Mr. Herrmann is like unleashed lightning on this search of his. He haunts the musical dictionaries, the biographies, the encyclopedias omnivorously for clues to possible candidates, and after four years of doing that he can truly claim a musicologist's distinction—a musicologist of the unknown.

It would have been easier, no doubt, for the young musician to devote himself to all the well-known, almost hackneyed audience favorites for this program. His batonistic technique is good and his musical taste praiseworthy, so that the chestnuts of the concert repertory would have suffered no strange ills under his ministrations.

To the casual music-lover, such names as Samuel Butler, Samuel Pepys, King Henry IV, Henry of Navarre and others signify nothing musically. Yet these men, so eminent in other fields, have composed music that the conductor considers good. What's more, not too long ago he presented excerpts from Jean Jacques Rousseau's "Le Devin du Village," an opera which had a sixty-year run of success in France and environs. Mr. Herrmann considers it much better than some of the earlier dramatic pieces of Mozart.

Right here is where it ought to be told that Mr. Herrmann has done some extensive reading in his time. He can quote from memory whole pages from the great literary works—and with the proper cadences and subtle turns of phrase. His pursuit of the literary is avocational, but it has helped immeasurably in the uncovering of much hidden music.

who has ever heard of the Delius Violin Concerto? Certainly not this inveterate reviewer. And who has heard all the Miaskovsky symphonies, of which there are oodles. The answer is Bernard Herrmann. It is safe to say that if he did not have a program to devise weekly for "Exploring Music" he would do all those painstaking researches out of sheer fun just the same.

The proof of that might well be found in the fact that the programs

for his other broadcasts—the Columbia Broadcasting Symphony occasionally, the Columbia Concert Orchestra regularly—are as remarkable for their newness. If you were listening to the Columbia Symphony's broadcast of the thirteenth, for instance, you heard this unusual piece of program devising: Cherubini's "Medee" Overture, Roussel's "Le Festin de l'Araignee," J. C. Bach's Double Symphony in D, and the Sibelius "Swanwhite."

Mr. Herrmann admits that the radio and the radio alone permits of such a lavish experimentation. No concerthall symphony, no matter how heavily subsidized, could afford thus to indulge the insatiable curiosity of its conductors. And the beauty of it is that if the listeners to these radio programs don't like what they hear, they can just turn to another station.

Mr. Herrmann, of course, doesn't mean that his hearers can like it or leave it, and Tschaikowsky take the hindmost. He is too concerned with pleasing his audiences, with winning their good-will and their interest to dismiss them so blithely. His point is that the audience knows whether it wants to hear a certain number or not—and very likely after only a couple of bars have been played. But if that audience remains for the number and the next number and the whole program, he has won some converts to music that has been given the lordly snub by the concert-hall conductors.

He is thoroughly sympathetic, however, with the plight of said conductors. They must play what the public wants. An unfamiliar composi-

tion is scheduled once. If it does not meet with immediate favor, the chances are that it will not soon get a second hearing. Then, too, there are business and management problems connected with the maintenance of a great symphonic body that would not warrant giving the conductor unlimited freedom.

Mr. Herrmann, a New Yorker, who attended the Juilliard Graduate School, is a composer with several performances of original works to his credit. He did the scores, as you know, for the films "Citizen Kane" and "All That Money Can Buy." He has composed background music for a number of radio shows, notably "Suspense" and the Columbia Workshop presentations. And his "dramatic cantata," "Moby Dick," was given its premiere by John Barbirolli and the Philharmonic Symphony in Carnegie Hall two seasons ago.

Concert Records

A new company has recently made its debut. Its name is Bost Records and it proposes to "enlarge through the medium of active listening the knowledge of the music-loving world." In keeping with that worthy ambition it has released three albums, each of which, it appears, is the first of a service.

The three albums consist of (1) "The Evolution of Piano Music," prepared by the noted musicologist, Curt Sachs, and illustrated on the harpsichord by Sylvia Marlowe; (2) "The Songs of Early America," as compiled and directed by Elie Siegmeister, assisted by Helen Yorke, soprano; Rebekah Crawford, contralto; Earl Rogers, tenor, and Emile Renan, baritone; and (3) "Latin-American Typical and Folk Songs," done under the supervision of Irma Labastille, aided by Carlos Spaventa and Graziella Parraga.

The merit of these recordings is not to be minimized. In the first place, the disks are particularly smooth-sounding, there is a minimum of surface noise, and the sound reflects in all possible ways an expert technique.

Victor presents one of the durable items of music, the "Peer Gynt" Suite of Grieg, which is performed by Fabien Sevitsky and the Indianapolis Symphony. It is program music of the sort that used to make the ladies swoon with delight once upon a time. Even now the piece has its qualities, and you can't dismiss Grieg's sure hand in the construction of his rather interesting trifle. The conductor and orchestra labor con amore to produce a very appealing recording.

Lovely Jane Froman forsook journalism for radio

T'S about time, I think, to take up the subject of vocalists—you know, the popular vocalists who are so heavily featured with the big bands or just featured. In general, I'd say that there is very little good singing going on in those departments. It must be admitted that these young

must be admitted that these young ladies and gentlemen who give us the sung choruses of the country's hits have certain individualistic qualities that are appealing.

that are appealing.

Of course, there is something to be said also for the musicianship of a goodly number of the vocalists. As a matter of fact, some of them are such good instinctive musicians that they put many of the highly trained concert and opera artists to shame.

But there is such a thing as a voice, you know. And lots of the popular singers sing without ever having given that a thought, it would seem. You hear cute little vibratos, you hear thunderous tremolos, you hear nice flatterings, you hear all sorts of strange sounds, and how they still can manage to convey sentimental ideas is beyond me.

There are exceptions. Ginny Simms has a natural voice. True, it could stand improving, but it is natively a voice, and the young lady knows full well how to use it, too. Barry Wood has a voice, what might be really called a well-emitted voice, though in his case, too, there are many things that could be done to it.

Jane Froman and Kate Smith both have lovely voices, particularly Miss Smith, whether you like her old-fashioned delivery or not. There is a singer who could have made the Metropolitan Opera grade if she had made it her business to do so.

made it her business to do so.

Bing Crosby, with that little sentimental slant of his, sings badly from the standpoint of tone production. His voice is throaty and he fakes a goodly number of high tones. And again, you have an especially gifted young man who could have done things in a serious way with his voice. At any rate, he is one of the most individualistic of popular singers. He has a style all his own and the truth of that is attested by the number of imitators he has had through the years.

There isn't room to go into the whole story. But these are some of the thoughts I have been mulling over. One of these days it might not be a bad idea to go into the subject thoroughly, pulling no punches.

NBC COMMENTATORS HEDGE ESTIMATES OF THE LENGTH OF PRESENT WAR

Earl Godwin Rounds Out Thirty Years on the White House Beat; Murrow's Victory Prophecy Hangs on Developments in Russia

A Question for the Third Year

THREE years ago this month our war began. We are still far from peace and victory. That fact raises to all commentators—as to all other citizens—the question, "What are we doing to bring victory?"

This question is closer to commentations—as to commentations—as to commentations—as the second of the fortune of the second of

This question is closer to commentators than to other radio folk for two reasons. First, they are the current historians of the war and the most powerful molders of public opinion on war issues. Second—and this is a brutal truth—commentators as a class are almost the only large group in radio to profit from the war. Look at an old issue of Movie-Radio Guide—say for 1935—and compare it with the current issue. You'll see how much more news commentary rolls over the networks—and how much more of it is sponsored!

Most, though not all, of our commentators can made a fair answer to the burning question. Not a few, like Murrow and Kaltenborn, were early prophets of the disaster to come. Some like Shirer, Dreier and Sevareid did their best, from posts in Axis lands, to squeeze the truth through the wringer of fascist censorship.

But to these gentlemen, and to their colleagues, we have a right to say, "What are you doing?" We have a right to demand of these masters of radio news the kind of responsibility that is placed upon military commanders in the field—the responsibility that carries professional disaster as the penalty for error or weakness.

There must be no more blunders

There must be no more blunders like Cal Tinney's on the post-exchange story. There must certainly be no more tolerance of the kind of dithering that marked much of the commentary of last December 7.

last December 7.

The struggle to avoid such errors and to adjust to the straightjacket of censorship—which certainly is necessary in war—is no excuse for wishywashy stuff, for a play-it-safe line. The commentator is in this war up to his neck, and he must do his part to help win it. If he can't do it well, national interest demands his removal.

This is harsh. This is unkind. But it

This is harsh. This is unkind. But it is exactly the kind of burden that the humblest lad who wears a second lieutenant's bars carries on his shoulders. The only difference is that the officer who either blunders or fails in initiative may pay with his life as well as his professional standing.

well as his professional standing.
So, you gentlemen, the experts to whom we look for wisdom and understanding and information, settle down to your tough and professionally dangerous job. Let us get our humor from the good comedians. Let us get our sentimental relaxation from those able sentimentalists of the radio dra-

matic programs. Your job is facts and ideas—the arming of the American public with the knowledge our enemies dare not give to their people.

Above all, gentlemen, remember that, just as we forgave your sins of the past, so we have forgotten your good works. We must judge your service as soldiers in a war by tonight's broadcast and tomorrow's—not by yesterday's!


How Long Will the War Last?

NBC took a poll of its commentators on this question as the war ended its third year September 1. The results are worth consideration, though the experts hedged their answers with justifiable caution.

justifiable caution.

John W. Vandercook, Earl Godwin, Alex Dreier and Don Goddard all stress the importance of the Russian front. Best statement of the lot comes from Dreier, who says bluntly, "Unless pressure on Russia is effectively relieved as soon as possible, the war will last not years but decades . ." Vandercook simply reports the obvious facts that Germany and Russia have been weakening each other and that our resources are the United Nations' greatest hope. Godwin and Goddard stress the important difference between Russia "bending" and "breaking." Goddard makes the flat assertion, "I do not believe they (the Russians) will break, even if Stalingrad should fall."

H. V. Kaltenborn, off on one of those tangents he so loves to follow, emphasizes the single point of transportation and mobility of forces. He skips consideration of detailed situations. Cesar Saerchinger expects the Axis to

attempt to cut our communication lines by land attack while the United Nations hammer at Japan by sea and at Europe by air. He says, "The greatest single problem is to increase shipping by building more ships and by eliminating the U-boat menace."

Upton Close has his own individual ideas. He says we must, to win, have "a dominant American philosophy of the war, a professional American war command over industry and all fighting forces, and a strategy based on an American master plan rather than

merely keeping others fighting. In such a strategy the most strategic spots will be the Aleutian Islands, the British Isles, the bulge of China, and the bulge of Brazil." He is silent on Russia.

Cross Talk on the News

The Kaltenborn trip to London was smart journalism, a commercial exploit of real value, and good for the war effort. We need more of our commentators moving around, getting fresh impressions, keeping up with the situation at first hand. H. V. himself senses this, as witness his statement that reporters (which I take to include radio reporters) should accompany troops wherever they go. H. V. is a bit past the age for such arduous campaigning, but plenty of fine radio reporters are young and husky. American journalism has a grand tradition of war reporting—Richard Harding Davis, Floyd Gibbons, Vincent Sheean—but radio still has its mark to make in that field. The only case that comes to mind is that of Cecil Brown, who was aboard the Repulse when she was sunk off Singapore. And did that make a story!

gapore. And did that make a story!

Ed Murrow, CBS London man, spoke bluntly three years ago. He said, "This country (England) is not in a mood to accept temporary solutions." Recently he spoke again on this theme, saying, "That statement is as true now as it was then." His latest prophecy is worth noting: "If the Russians hold out for another two months, we may see something more tangible than the headline mirage of victory emerging before the fourth year of this war ends."

Announcements to the contrary notwithstanding, the Upton Close weekly series, "World News Parade," will originate from Chicago, at least for the first few weeks. Close will present a guest commentator each week to help him present a digest of world news. Series begins September 20 at 3:15 p.m. EWT on NBC . . . Frazier Hunt is scheduled to circle the Midwest the first half of this month. His Tuesday-Thursday-Saturday broadcasts will come from various points at 6:00 p.m. and 10:45 p.m. EWT on CBS . . . Blue has reorganized its staff for the "Weekly War Journal," putting in Roy Porter (who spells Godwin on the Ford news programs) as editor of ceremonies in place of Morgan Beatty. Other newcomers are Major General P. B. Malone (retired) and Deane Dickason, authority on oriental and Pacific problems. MacVane, Tomlinson and Baukhage remain on the show, heard at noon EWT Sundays . * . Earl Godwin recently completed his thirtieth year as a White House reporter.

PRESENTING PLAYS FOR CHINA POSES PECULIAR PRODUCTION PROBLEMS

Britons Report on War Production; Ankara Station Back on Regular Schedule; "Voice of Free India" Uncovered as Nazi Station in Europe

England's War Production

T SEEMS to be the consensus that Britain is doing all she can in the way of producing the materials of war. "England has reached her peak of production and can expand no more," says H. V. Kaltenborn, who recently returned from a flying trip to Great Britain. "Manpower," according to the analyst, "is Britain's bottleneck today."

Captain Littleton, speaking from London the other night, had this to say: "I don't think the extent of our war effort is fully understood in America. We want you in the United States to know that although our population is only one third of yours our war effort is at least equal to your own. Out of every one hundred men and women in England fifty-five are working directly in war industries. To reach our present level you would need 40,000,000 working in industry. Guns are manned here up to over seventy percent by women. The average working week for men here is 56 hours. Our industries are not only turning out huge masses of material but most of it is of very high quality. For example certain types of our ackack guns are equal or better than anything in the world. Our latest tanks have no superior."

Sir Walter Citrine, famous British labor leader, put it this way: "Practically all of Britain is mobilized in the war effort. Vast numbers are also employed part time. Some six million women are now in war industries. In some factories seventy percent of the workers are women. Production in this country is comparable to any in the world. In addition all of these people are working under far from ideal conditions. On account of blackout regulations it is necessary for many to work constantly under artificial lighting and with poor ventilation. They work long hours, and in addition most of them spend at least one whole night a week at civil-defense jobs. Despite the strain they are under, they carry on. One can not pay too high a tribute to the common men and women of Great Britain."

China Hears Pearl Buck Plays

"Lao pai hsing," the man-in-thestreet in China, will learn about America's man-in-the-street through a series of eight plays by Pearl S. Buck, entitled "America Speaks to China" and broadcast to the Orient by KGEI in San Francisco.

In these plays Chinese students in this country take the parts of such typical Americans as "Tony, who builds bombers," and "Freda Borsch, a German refugee who is now an airraid warden."

The series was arranged by the East

and West Association and translated into Mandarin for use by the Chinese cast of the Office of War Information.

Production of the plays for radio transcription at NBC gave rise to many unforeseen problems. While the cast, composed of Chinese, understood what they were reading, the American engineers and directors in the studios did not understand a word of Mandarin. They were forced to memorize sounds to get the proper cues for music or sound-effects in the plays.

One helpful actor developed the habit of breaking the continuity of the play by turning to the production men and shouting "Music" so they would know when to bring up the background effects. Before he was broken of the habit, three records were ruined.

"Through Eastern Eyes"

Princess Indira of Kapurthala broadcasts every Monday at 7:15 a.m. EWT in the Eastern Service of the BBC. The program, called "Through Eastern Eyes," consists of a weekly summary of proceedings in the House of Commons. Musical programs are also frequently presented by Princess Indira, who is the daughter of His Highness the Tikka Sahib of Kapurthala, son and heir of the present Maharajah. The program "Through Eastern Eyes" is best heard over GRE (15.39).

Meet Braddon Mitchell

Born September 14, 1910, spent childhood on farm in Victoria's fertile Upper Murray River Valley, educated at Wesley College and University of Melbourne, graduated in law March, 1934.

Spent three years on London stage, appearing with Nancy Price's People's National Theater productions—including "Lady Precious Stream."

Returned to Australia at end of 1937; in radio, ran popular children's session, and was heard often in plays. Now announces in American short-wave transmissions from Australia, does "on the spot" broadcasts, arranges and introduces boys in "American Voices Calling Home from Australia," and answers letters from listeners to Australian short-wave broadcasts.

Has been married five years; has one child—Martha, aged two; likes fishing of all descriptions but, till end of war, hobbies restricted to "digging for victory" in kitchen garden and growing flowers for fun.


Nazis' India "Freedom Stations"

The "Voice of Free India," supposedly a clandestine station operated from "somewhere in India" by those Indian elements opposed to British imperialism, is actually a Nazi-sponsored-and-operated station which is

located somewhere in Germany or occupied Europe. It is now broadcasting on a new frequency of 15.22 megs from 10:00 a.m. to 12:00 noon EWT. An English period is broadcast from 11:30 a.m. to 12:00 noon EWT. The station also broadcasts nightly on 9.40 megs from 9:30 to 11:30 p.m., with news in English at 11:00 p.m. EWT. J. W. Young of West Lawn, Pennsylvania, informs me that within the last few days another "phony" Indian station has taken the air. This one, identified as "National Congress Radio," is also being heard on 15.22 from 12:15 to 12:45 p.m. EWT. Axis propaganda in English and Hindustani is featured. Since it uses the same frequency, it is probably the same transmitter as that used by the "Voice of Free India." It is possible that these broadcasts are being radiated over Nazi-controlled station DXL15 (PCJ) of Huizen, Holland, which broadcasts afternoons on 15.22 megs.

Heard on Short Wave

Frederick Kuh, head of the London office of the Chicago Sun, made the following prophecy concerning the coming year: "This fourth year of war will be much tougher than you think. Russia will still be a great offensive striking force and not just a small an-noyance beyond the Balkans. Hitler will awaken this year to find that his worst nightmare, a war on two fronts, has happened" . . . Frank J. Cuhel, speaking from Australia about the recent Milne Bay successes: "There have been land successes here and the Aussies are receiving congratulations. The lads from Australia did the work of pack-mules before the Milne Bay offensive. Everything was in readiness and for once the Japs were beaten at their own game of jungle fighting. This is a strange kind of a war in which the real stuff men are made of comes out. In this jungle fighting it is up to you to take care of yourself. The heat is insufferable. It is dripping wet above you and below you. You wear little clothes. You can't sleep at nights. Even the bombers have trouble here on account of the ever low-hanging clouds and fogs."



After some weeks off the air, TAP (9.465), Ankara, Turkey, is again broadcasting regular programs, daily to 3:45 p.m. EWT, at which time the national anthem is played. This station also broadcasts program pick-ups for American networks, irregularly between 6:30 and 7:30 p.m. EWT . . . Tokyo's latest propaganda stunt is a telephone conversation between Charlie and Ray, alleged Americans, which is heard two or three times a week at 2:15 or 2:45 a.m. EWT over JZK (15.16) and JZJ (11.80).







full of holes; the death toll was appalling. The Nazi blitz had washed out. Farther to the north, in the hardpacked snow before Moscow, the Reds had counterattacked, threw back the vaunted mechanized divisions of Germany's Panzer wizard, Guderian. The home front reeled. Goebbels, for once, was speechless. The German High Command sputtered apologies, said that a defensive period had set in. Hitler shouted: "We are fighting not men but beasts!"

Prior to the advent of the Russian war, the two years of Hitler's military adventures were to the German people but sideshows scarcely reverberating in the Nazi nerve-center. They had never felt the full impact of war until their Fuehrer wheeled his armies around from the southeast, chose the morning of June 22 as the date to herald "Europe's salvation." Then it began.

German stomachs, never too full, yet much fuller than those of the people of the conquered countries, shrank painfully. The precious points of the food-ration cards steadily yielded less than they promised; and what they got wasn't as good as before. Hitler had set into motion the "greatest mass movement of men in world's history" never before were so many German killers on the loose. Nazi propagandists, mindful of empty cupboards, apologized, bellowed to the people: An army marches on its belly! The cry recalled Napoleon's dictum, and with it that ambitious little corporal's fate. As the winter drew near, Goebbels ordered that the nation strip, give up every piece of warm clothing that it didn't need for the shivering men on the front, and hinted that good Germans would even give up what they did need! The loot of the conquered countries wasn't enough.

The dogged Russian resistance had done all of this and more. It visibly shook German morale. Once the people were simply indifferent to the trade of butter for cannon; but the rising thunder of bomb and bullet in East shattered their nerves.

Where was victory? Certainly not in the reaches of that vast enigma which daily drains more of their fathers, husbands and sons; certainly not in the person of the Fuehrer, who had promised so much, delivered nothing but more suffering and hysterical out-

Hitler admits having miscalculated the degree of military preparedness of his foe. What he hasn't admitted is the classic revelation of a people who would rather die on their feet than live on their knees. The war of "weeks" is now in its fifteenth month -what further proof?

The high morale of the Russian people and the valiant fight of their army in this global war for survival has its roots neither in socialist nor communist theories. Their homes, the lush fields that feed them, the young industries that hold forth the prospect of a better future—these are the things which inspire them, not Marxian slogans. They call this war Otechestvennaya Voynah, the War for the Fatherland. It's the same name they gave their war against Napoleon when history, as today, threw upon their shoulders the task of halting world's arch aggressor-this for their own sake and for the sake of freedomloving peoples everywhere. That is why Russians, the world over, including those who fled the Reds, support the armies of Stalin. This is a war of the people.

Morale has been kept high by a leadership which not only understands but applies the principles governing a total war. The Soviet is the only nation among the United Nations that has gone really total. Those not killing the enemy work for the industrial machine, and even they are trained in the art of guerrilla war-

But now Russia is gasping for breath. Hitler's offensive might is again in high gear. Nazi claws of steel threaten to choke off the lifeblood of the nation's industry and collectivised agriculture. If the invaders succeed. Russia as an offensive power would be a thing of the past.

It was wishful thinking to contend the Soviet, after the loss of the Texassize Caucasus, could effectively fight on with the resources east of the Urals. Defense alone never won a war. This the Russians know, and so their de-mand for relief, for time to get their second breath that they may once again strip the gears of the Nazi Juggernaut.

The Russian battlefront is the critical front of this war. There will fall the decision determining the duration of this global struggle-years or decades.

The Russians have blasted more of the enemy than all of the United Nations put together, and their resistance has given us much-needed time. Now they justly demand that we draw off the Nazi leeches, effect a phalanx of diversions melting into a second front before that crucial moment of history arrives which would make a second front meaningless.

Once Hitler is able to swing his

armies from the East to the West, a successful invasion of Europe would no longer be a probability but would become an extremely remote possibility. A breaking of the Russian back could sufficiently fire the Nazi machine to make Europe virtually impregnable to land assault. Food and oil Hitler would have in abundance. His slave-labor market tremendously boosted, his industrial machine could soon outproduce Britain and United States. Stating it bluntly, a breaking of the Russian back could spell eventual defeat for the United Nations, place this globe under the complete sway of the Axis, smother liberty for all time. Such might well be the consequence of a Nazi triumph in the East and it is not defeatism to reckon with a collapse of the Russian position. The Russians themselves, weighing their chances coolly and soberly, have plainly indicated time and time again that such a possibility not only exists but may well materialize in the near The Russians, unlike the rest of the United Nations, never have committed that unpardonable military sin of underestimating the enemy.

Axis ruthlessness must be met by a ruthlessness just as vigorous and heartless. This nation of ours, as the pivotal arsenal of the democracies, must strip itself to the bone—this if we are to survive and to maintain our way of life. Sacrifice or slave, there is no other choice.




