We Reprint Excerpts from Most Outstanding Comedy Script As Chosen in Radio Life's Awards

(Last week in its fourth birthday anniversary issue, Radio Life presented its first annual distinguished achievement awards. Among the classifications meriting honors was the script section, in which the script which follows was chosen as the most outstanding comedy material of the year. It featured Bing Crosby as guest on "Duffy's" and is printed herewith, in part, for your enjoyment.)

Sound: Phone ring

ARCHIE: Hello, Duffy's, where the elite meet to eat—Archie, the Manager speaking—Duffy ain't here . . . Oh, hello Duffy . . . Tonight, well tonight we really got a big shot . . . Bing Crosby . . . Crosby! C-R-O-S-B—You know the guy—the straight man in the Bob Hope pictures . . . That's right . . . Bob Crosby's older brother . . . Mmmm. The crooner with the four sons. What? Was Bing always a crooner? No. He studied singing for eight years, before he found out he couldn't sing . . . But by that time it was too late. He was too famous to quit. Say Duffy, why don't you sell Bing a half interest in the joint here? No kiddin'—he could help us with the labor shortage. He grows his own bus-boys . . . Huh? Mrs. Duffy wants to meet Bing? EDDIE: You wrote it, huh?

ARCHIE: Yeah—it's gonna have the same flavor as his radio show.

EDDIE: He's on a cheese program, ain't he?

ARCHIE: Yeah.

EDDIE: Mmmm.

ARCHIE: Eddie, how could we get our band leader Paul Weston to look like that John Scott Trotter?

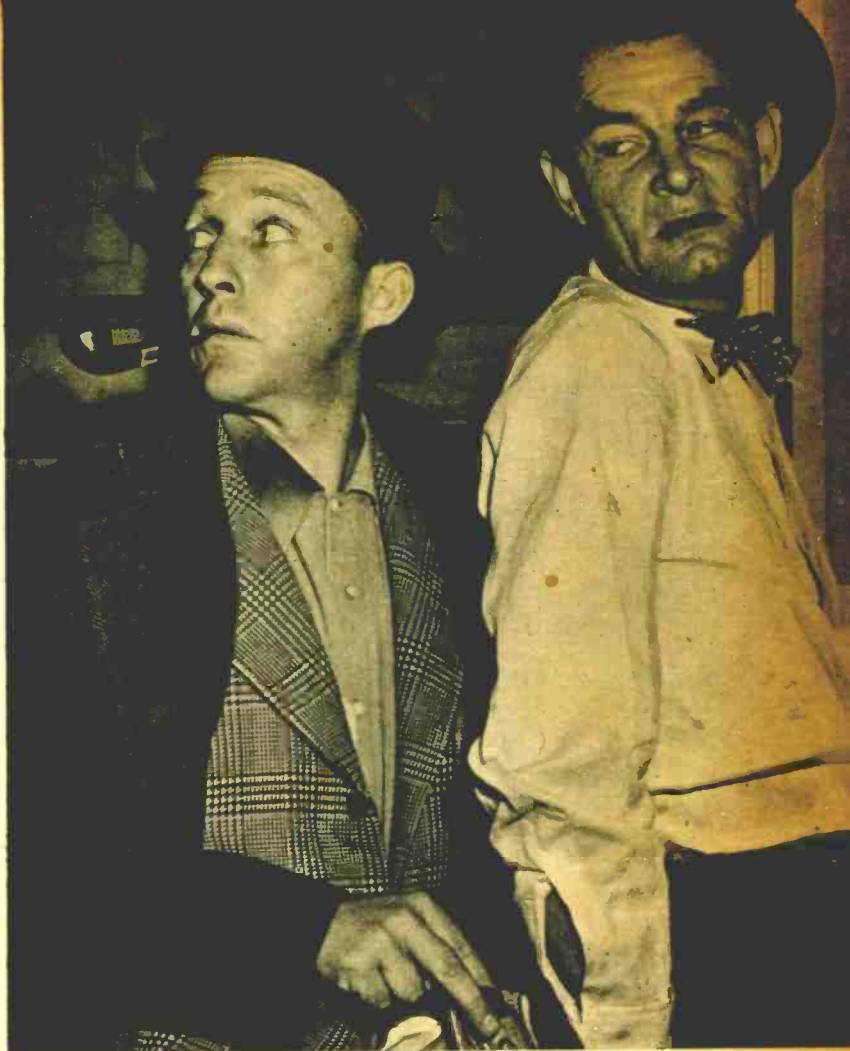
EDDIE: You could wait till inflation sets in.

FLO: Well, you remember my old singing teacher . . . Yasha Panyashovnik?

ARCHIE: Yeah, good old walk-up-one-flight Yascha. I thought he was in the Army.

FLO: They wouldn't take him.

ARCHIE: Why not?

FLO: Punctured ear drums.

ARCHIE: And I'll betcha you're the one that 4-F'd him . . . So he's tryin' to teach you again?

FLO: Yes. He has a new method now—the O.P.A. method . . . he says all you have to remember when singing is O.P.A.

# Juvenile Delinquency: Has Hollywood Found the Remedy?

*This Junior Night Club Caters To 'Teen-Agers, Is Conducted Like An Adult Amusement Place*

**A**N ADULT entering the dance hall might have had violent misgivings had he not known in advance what this gathering was all about.

The lights were low, and under-

neath a canopy of colored, crepe-paper festoons, 'teen age couples were dancing to a "hot" number banged and tootled by an energetic young orchestra. Adolescent tete-a-tetes were flourishing over candlelit tables and suspicious looking bottles. At a long bar attended by a white-clad tender, boys and girls perched on high stools to partake of refreshments. Everyone was chattering or laughing, completely at ease and unrepressed by stern, adult reprimand. In fact the half a dozen grown-ups flitting around in the background seemed almost apologetic for their presence.

This was the Junior Night Club

... one of Hollywood's best answers to the much-discussed juvenile delinquency problem. It started two months ago at the famed Boys' Club and it has been so successful that other communities harrassed by this new "where-are-your-children" problem might well initiate it. As might be hoped and expected, radio was not slow in seeing an opportunity, and after the club had been in operation only two weeks, Harry Koplan of KGFJ stepped in to broadcast a half hour by "remote" and stage a floor show in the most sophisticated tradition of adult night clubs.

**Is Invitational**

Every Saturday night, 250 'teen

age boys and girls stream to the club at 5619 De Longpre Avenue. They come from Marshall, Le Conte, Hollywood High, and other schools in the vicinity and are admitted by printed invitation sent out by the club to those desiring to attend. This invitation is retained by the young patron and used as a pass to return home when the dance concludes at midnight, three hours after curfew time. Hollywood police have instructions to honor the invitation accordingly.

Those eligible to attend the party are boys and girls from fourteen to eighteen. Even the band falls in this

*Helen Mack, Screen and Air Actress, Becomes Producer on Show Whose Writer, Star, and Sound Effects Head Are Women*

**N**OW I know why producers have ulcers!" Speaker was Hollywood-NBC's one and only woman producer, Helen Mack, who looks more like a petite little homebody than director of the coast-to-coast "Date With Judy."

She had just finished engineering her fifth show and went on to relate her troubles in filling a minute and 35 seconds which were blank when the program came off the air too soon.

"I had a hunch about it," she said. "I thought, at dress rehearsal, that I should write a little scene to fill that time. One minute and 35 seconds doesn't sound like much, but when it's time to fill on the air, it's an eternity!"

## Hubbie Is Producer

Dark-haired, brown-eyed Helen, who has a pixie-like expression, is new to radio producing in person, but vicariously she has run the destinies of many programs, because her husband, Tom McAvity, is one of Hollywood's best known air helmsmen. In fact, one of the busiest, and that's why he urged his actress wife to pinchhit for him on "Date With Judy." His time was too occupied with the Joan Davis show and "Corliss Archer."

At first she felt she couldn't produce. "They'll think I'm just an upstart," she worried. But being a good friend of Aleen Leslie, the lady who

### *Stickler for Realism*

Recent dramatic piece on CBS' "Calling Unlimited" program was "Going to Run All Night," the story of an American soldier, former marathon runner, who is ordered to sprint 35 miles to get help for his comrades.

Starting to run in G.I. shoes, he discards them for fear the Germans may detect him, ends up running in bare feet. While speeding on various surfaces, now and then slowing his pace, and toward the end breathing hard, the runner thinks out loud, his voice being heard against the background of his footsteps and breathing.

When rehearsing the radio production, Producer Thomas Freebairn Smith and Soundman Harry Essman tried every trick in their bag to obtain the desired effect. All lacked naturalness, so they decided Essman would actually do the running sequences. After testing Essman running without shoes, then without socks, running on concrete, rugs, and decomposed packed granite, the producer decided the best results were obtained from "running" in a shallow box on four square feet of packed surface. Two mikes were used—a tall one for the breathing and a short one for the footsteps. In the broadcast, Wally Maher did the runner's voice.

For the final sound effects, Essman "ran" for one minute in shoes. His second sequence, 40 seconds, was also done with shoes but a bit faster, with breathing deep and regular. The third, 60 seconds, was much faster, with an occasional short gasp.

The fourth sequence, 50 seconds, was done in bare feet. Essman's labored breathing wasn't faked. Resting a few minutes before going on with the last "cut," his feet showed signs of minor abrasions. Then, for 90 seconds, the sound man (wearing ear phones to take direction) faltered and staggered in the packed box to get the effects of running on hard road surface and soft shoulders.

Panted Harry as he finished: "And I had to plant peach trees all morning."

### *The Winnah!*

Jovial Harry von Zell has emerged the victor in the recent auditions held to select a suitable successor to Ralph Edwards, emceeding funmaster of NBC's "Truth or Consequences" who

leaves the airplanes for army duties. An experienced and resourceful mike-man, with a background of special events radio reporting and announcing, von Zell, who is also heard weekly as announcer on the Dinah Shore and Eddie Cantor shows, will surely add zest and gay spontaneity to "Truth or Consequences." Good luck both to Edwards and Harry.

### *Summer Funster*

Long, lean and laughable Charlotte Greenwood will begin her belated summer stint on NBC on June 13, after Bob Hope bows out for the season. Comedienne Greenwood, star of such stage successes as "So Long, Letty," "Linger Longer, Letty," and "Leaning on Letty," was scheduled to fill a summer replacement spot last year, but plans failed to jell.

She will now be presented in a tailor-made continuity script idea designed to fit her versatile talents.

The show will be called "Life With Charlotte," and the cast will include such popular airplane artists as Arthur Q. Bryan, Shirley Mitchell, Bea Benaderet, Pat McGeehan, and Sara Berner.

### *Ego Into Tailspin*

Ed Gardner (Archie of "Duffy's") was nursing an injured ego following his first broadcast in the spring series from Hollywood over the Blue. Guest on the initial show was Cary Grant, handsome cinemactor. During the studio warm-up, Ed, stationed behind his prop "bar," noticed a woman in the fifth row of the audience making enthusiastic gestures toward the stage.

"I thought she wanted my autograph," related Archie, "but she wrote and passed up a note."

The scribbled message on a corner of paper said: "Please move the bar. We can't see Cary Grant."

### *How To Be Happy*

KMPC has instituted a new series of programs, titled "I Want To Be Happy," which presents dramatizations of problems that arise in the lives of everyone. Suggested solutions are supplied by Dr. Paul Popenoe, director of the American Institute of Family Relations whose pronouncements are the result of painstaking analysis. Noted turf expert and sports announcer Clem McCarthy has joined NBC's sports staff, and is bringing listeners his rapid-fire coverage of April's races from eastern tracks, with the accompanying descriptive reporting of Bill Stern.

### *Real Gore*

The gore on most radio mystery programs is purely imaginary. But on the Columbia thriller "Crime Doctor" on a recent Sunday night, actual bloodshed occurred. Director Jack Johnstone was the offender and announcer Ken Roberts, the victim.

Johnstone, like all radio directors, was signalling cues to the actors, technicians and musicians, waving his arms and pointing his fingers this way and that. When the time for the commercial came, one of Jack's fists flew out to indicate Ken Roberts' announcement. But Ken was standing right beside him and Ken's nose and Johnstone's fist collided. Roberts completed the announcement, but with a bloody nose.

### *"Where-Is-I-At?"*

"Well, dat does it, gentlemen. Ain't dat somepin'!"

The speaker was Andrew H. Brown, Amos's Andy.

The audience: NBC engineers.

The setting: Studio B, Hollywood Radio City.

The engineers looked at the winking three-eyed gadget, shook their heads in amazement, and in awed voices echoed, "Yes, dat's sumpin'!"

Continued chesty Andy:

"I calls it da 'Where-Is-I-At? System.' It's gonna revolutionize da broadcastin' industry, gentlemen, dat's exactal what it's gonna do."

Amos nodded in agreement:

"Andy, you really gone an' done it this time. Dat's really sumpin'. Looka them eyes blink!"

And they were blinking. Electrical eyes—one red, one green, one white; they blinked on cue from the producer in the control booth.

As odd as it may seem, Amos 'n' Andy—really Charles J. Correll and Freeman F. Gosden—had an invention destined to revolutionize control room antics of radio producers.

The hand-waving, frantic arm signals of glass-paneled directors are on the way out.

And all because two hard-working comedians finally decided to open up the studio doors and allow an audience to witness Amos 'n' Andy, Kingfish 'n' Brother Crawford, Lightning 'n' Henry Van Porter, in action.

Having broadcast in exact exclusion for fourteen years, Amos 'n' Andy did the entire job all by themselves in a small studio. They were even screened from the engineer.

But a studio audience, a cast of supporting players and guest stars, musical bridges and sound effects all added up to detailed production problems,

the main headache being split-second timing.

Amos 'n' Andy work at one mike. This meant that one of the boys must have his back to the control booth, blind to the director's "on the nose," "speed her up," "stretch" signals. So they came up with their "Where-Is-I-At? System," a small box designed to tell them these things via colored lights. Placed at their feet, a red light means "speed up"; the green, "slow down"; the white, "you're on the nose" . . . all the answers to the query, "Where is I at?"

A. H. Saxton, NBC-Western Division chief-engineer, put the idea into working form. The "Where-Is-I-At? System" will be installed in all Hollywood Radio City studios.

## Hang Onto Youth

Bonita Granville, who guested recently on Jack Carson's CBS show, was reminiscing during rehearsal with Jack. She was talking about her early days in the movies.

"I remember you as a brat in "These Three," the daughter in "Cavalcade," and as Nancy Drew in that whole series," remarked Jack. "You were just a young girl then."

"Yes," Bonita, barely out of her teens, sighed nostalgically, "Oh, to be young again!" Whereupon Jack agreed: "Yes, a woman should hold on—to her youth—but not when he's driving!"

## Victory Auction

Dave Elman's Saturday night "Victory Auctions," over the Mutual network, have already summed up a record total of \$3,134,000 worth of sales in war bonds. Al Smith's famed brown derby was purchased for \$150,000; then returned to Smith, who declared: "I'll never wear it again. age group, while those participating in the floor show are youngsters who volunteer each week from the audience. Boys from eleven to fourteen may hold positions as waiters, dispensing the twenty-cent sandwiches and ten-cent soft drinks to the customers. These lads earn anywhere from a dollar and a half to two and a half nightly in tips.

Music is furnished by a live orchestra and also by a platter machine. The young people prefer a fifty-fifty combination of swing and sweet.

### Youngsters Behave

in the company of their kind, the boys and girls conduct themselves

with remarkable restraint. It is a fact that youngsters are candid, to the point of cruelty. The Junior Night Clubbers whistle and scream if they like a performance; they boo if they don't. But the general inclination is to behave; after all, they have paid to get in (couples 55 cents, unaccompanied young ladies, 25 cents). Two young men who started the only fight on record were hustled out in short order.

The young people seem to take a pride in something distinctly their own. Boys' Club Director Flack says the youngsters often resent older persons intruding on their night club, are happiest when left to run their own show.

Some of the supervisors of the Junior Night Club hope that it will expand to larger quarters. Invitations have been refused many boys and girls, some as far away as Pas-

adena and Long Beach, because accommodations are limited. Yet youngsters and grown-ups alike agree that one of the greatest causes of juvenile delinquency is lack of proper entertainment facilities and that delinquency will be a headache until entertainment set-ups function well and widely.

So far, the only complaints on Junior Night Club have come from neighbors who dislike the noise, especially at midnight when the party breaks up. Commenting on this, one adult remarked pointedly, "Wonder if the neighbors would prefer the noise of juvenile-fired machine guns?"

**R**EN DARBY called, "Come on in, Sally! You're in the first number."

Sally unintentionally several minutes late for the "Top of the Evening" rehearsal, explained apologetically that she hadn't known she was to sing a portion of the program's opening tune.

"Oh, yeah?" the boys in the chorus chided her. "You've gone temperamental on us! Just because your picture was in the Valley Times!"

Sally Sweetland, a slim, pretty, hazel-eyed blonde, has been seeing her picture in a lot of papers lately. Publicity men are on her trail. Her phone keeps ringing constantly.

"It just doesn't seem like it's really me," she exclaimed at the thought of all that has been happening to her in the past few weeks.

"All my life I've wanted to be a star," she admitted. "Then, a couple of months ago, I decided that it was silly. Nothing would ever happen to me."

## Chirped Long Time

For three and a half years, Sally Sweetland was the girl who chirped the bird-like notes of "Rinso White" over the airplanes. She didn't abandon this chore until just a few weeks ago.

"In fact," smiles Sally, "I kept right on singing that commercial up until the very week my little boy was born. The doctor said he wouldn't have been a bit surprised if the baby had made its-entrance into the world chirping the notes of "Rinso White."

In addition to being radio's Rinso girl, Sally was a valuable contributor to the outstanding choral work heard on such tuneful airshows as the Dinah Shore program, the Frank Sinatra show and Sunday morning's "Ceiling Unlimited."

She had been around radio row a long time. Gifted conductors like Andre Kostelanetz and David Broekman always personally requested her services for their west coast performances. She was recognized by musicians as "the top top soprano in

town." But airplane audiences had little opportunity to single her out for individual attention. Sally seemed destined to remain one of radio's unsung songbirds.

Then Westinghouse made the decision to present a new radio program. A number of the nation's outstanding musical groups bid for the coveted show—among them, the Ken Darby chorus of sixteen male voices. ## Capable, Dependable

Sally reads music remarkably fast, has played the piano exceptionally well ever since she was eight years old, and has a voice that ranges from low G to A above high C! It wasn't until about six months ago, however, that she began to make full use of her remarkable range by lending her lovely voice to the delivery of popular tunes as well as classical melodies. Now, on her "Top of the Evening" solo spot, she brings listeners the most enchanting renditions of their favorite ballads of the day.

Sally's ambition has always been to become "the next Lily Pons." In school, she took part in every musical presentation; then set out on her singing career, only to find her voice hidden behind the names of other personalities. She sang for Brenda Marshall in "The Sea Hawk," for

# The Other Side of John Scott Trotter

*No Jokes Intended—Bing's Maestro  
Is a Versatile Personality Whose  
Hobby Is Collecting and Refinishing  
Antiques for This Beautiful Home*

ANY are the listeners who admire John Scott Trotter for his superb orchestra work on Kraft Music Hall, but what some of his fans don't know is that the affable, ample baton-wielder has an avocation in which he excels equally well. His hobby is collecting fine Eighteenth Century antiques, with which he has furnished a beautiful home in North Carolina. Curiously enough, he has found a large number of the pieces right here in Southern California. Between sessions on old KMH, Trotter has helped refinish many of the articles which have been shipped back to fill places in the cherished home now occupied by his parents and his sister, Margaret. (John Scott, the home-loving home-maker, is a bachelor!)

Until war put a crimp in civilian travel, Trotter used to fly back to visit his dream house at every opportunity. The residence is set in 50 acres of wooded land, mostly white oak, and comprises four bedrooms, three baths, living and dining rooms, playroom, dinette, and kitchen. It was built four years ago with Trotter formulating the plans and doing all his own interior decorating.

Becoming interested in architecture and furniture while in college, he has read extensively and attended scores of auctions in his search for authentic pieces . . . keeps his fingers crossed because he hasn't been gypped, not yet. In fact, the other day, soon after he picked up a Sixteenth Century Italian chair for \$15, he saw a picture of one just like it in the Metropolitan Museum catalogue. He claims that good antique dealers are by far

the easiest, the 2000 is the in-betweenest, and the 3000 one is the toughest. If the contestant answers the question correctly, he is privileged to send his chosen quantity of cigarettes to anyone in the armed services, anywhere in the world. A survey recently concluded indicates that most cigarettes have been sent to relatives of contestants, the next highest quantity to their personal friends, and the third amount to famous war heroes. Contestant Kenneth Scott of Osborn, Ohio, asked that his 3000 cigarettes go to "General Jimmy Doolittle for distribution to his brave boys."

When a contestant fails to supply the correct answer to one of quizzer Hawk's questions, his cigarettes are deposited in the "Thanks to the Yanks" Duffel Bag, which is later sent to the most obscure service camps which can be found in the United States. It is from these camps that Hawk gets his most sincere notes of appreciation.

Away from the mike, Bob Hawk's personal activities are quietly and conscientiously devoted to the war effort. Each Monday night he entertains with an impromptu quiz at New York's famed Stage Door Canteen. He tours with the USO units, for which he acts as emcee and closes their programs with a miniature version of "Thanks to the Yanks," giving cigarettes to the boys. Every Friday night he works at the Manhattan Interceptor Command and is as happy in his obscure CDVO post as he is in the broadcasting limelight.

#### In Radio 17 Years

Hawk's radio experience dates back to 1927 when he got his start in radio by reading poetry over a small Chicago station. Previous to that he had started out on a teaching career and at eighteen, had been English instructor in the Junior High School at Lindsay, Oklahoma. He turned down an offer of a professorship at Northwestern College to turn his talents toward radio. Receiving no cash for his artistic labors at the microphone, he spent his free time

We want to thank you, not only for the smokes, but for letting us know that we are not the forgotten men of the service. We can't blame the entertainers for selecting the larger camps, when they set out on a camp tour, but we fellows at the more obscure camps are the very ones who need some sort of 'lift.' Scores of other bomb-

ing ranges, like this one, are situated at great distances from urban areas, and to be remembered in this fashion is a great thrill, indeed. Thanks a million from everyone of us."

working as a piano salesman, soda clerk, and teacher of dramatics.

When he finally obtained a paying position on the airlines, it was for the munificent sum of \$18 per seven-day work week. Recognition came fast, however, and from 1933-1938, Hawk was kept busy free-lancing, doing everything from sports announcing to emceeing quiz shows.

Since 1938 he has specialized as a quizmaster and has had his own programs on all the major networks, among them the "Fun Quiz," "Name Three," "Take It or Leave It" and "How'm I Doin'?" Now his "Thanks to the Yanks" on Saturday night over CBS is proving to be one of the most popular quiz shows on the air, largely because he's such a fine comedian.

Hawk keeps the program moving at a fast pace. He has more than one way to make listeners laugh. For instance, contestant's question concerned pants, he declared the query was sent in by "Phil A. Knickerbocker, a big Laplander from Pennsylvania." On one broadcast there was a question involving a weight falling from the top of a building. Submitted by "Eileen Overstreet Kerplop," said Bob.

When a high school teacher who was also a scoutmaster, appeared as one of his contestants, Hawk quipped: "I was a boy scout until I was sixteen. Then I became a girl scout!"

One of the prime factors in Bob Hawk's success as a quizmaster is his refusal to poke fun at his contestants or to gather laughs at their expense. But, on a recent show, when Cpl. Irving Hopkins, former CBS producer, appeared as a contestant, Hawk couldn't resist putting his old pal on the spot. He asked Hopkins to stand by while Peter Van Steeden's orchestra played a tune which was sung by the beautiful Lynn Gardner. Then the grinning Bob queried his friend Hopkins: "Who is prettier—Mrs. Hopkins or Lynn Gardner?" The contestant, whose wife was sitting in the audience, gave Hawk the look of a dying man, and exclaimed with a moan: "I shoulda stayed at home."

"Thanks to the Yanks" adds a new twist to quiz shows—a twist with the essence of timeliness, because foremost in the thoughts of every American today is concern for our men in the armed forces. The contestants on this program do not win prizes for themselves, but are paid off in cigarettes for their friends in service. During the first ten weeks of the program, 611,000 cigarettes were forwarded to Yanks all over the world.

On one broadcast, when Bob Hawk asked a contestant to whom he wanted his cigarette prize sent, the contestant replied: "I'm going into the Army in a few days. I'd like to send them to my ten Sergeant!"

The McAvitys recently re-occupied their Longridge Avenue home in the Valley after leasing it to John Garfield for two years while they were in New York. "We have some very tony neighbors," the lady producer exclaimed. "Costello lives down the street, and I understand Roy Rogers has bought a house near us."

For Helen's first show on her own, her husband helped in rehearsal and sat in the control booth while they were on the air. The next time, he failed to show up until broadcast-time, his own way of putting Helen on her own.

### Can't Use Watch

She thinks she has a lot to learn and worries because she can't use a stop-watch. Arch Oboler told her to forget it and advised that the only time he had used a match, he miscalculated the time, rushed out on the stage too early, pushed the players away from the mike, and announced breathlessly, "This is Arch Oboler, folks. We're a little late, so good night." There were four minutes to go before sign-off time! Now he lets the network producer worry about the stop-watch, and advised Helen to do so, too.

Besides her actual work in the control booth on Tuesdays, Miss Mack interviews actors who are seeking roles on the show, superintends correspondence, and keeps buzzing all week. When she was a homebody and her husband's time used to be interrupted by telephone calls and other business matters, she would say, "You're stealing time from me!"

After she started producing "Date With an American Radio History" com-

became few and frenzied. Now it's Tom's turn to complain.

Someday, Miss Mack would like to produce dramatic shows. But for the present, she is happy with her assignment. Her greatest difficulties, it seems, are inroads of mumps in the juvenile cast. It has kept her busy rushing up substitutes.

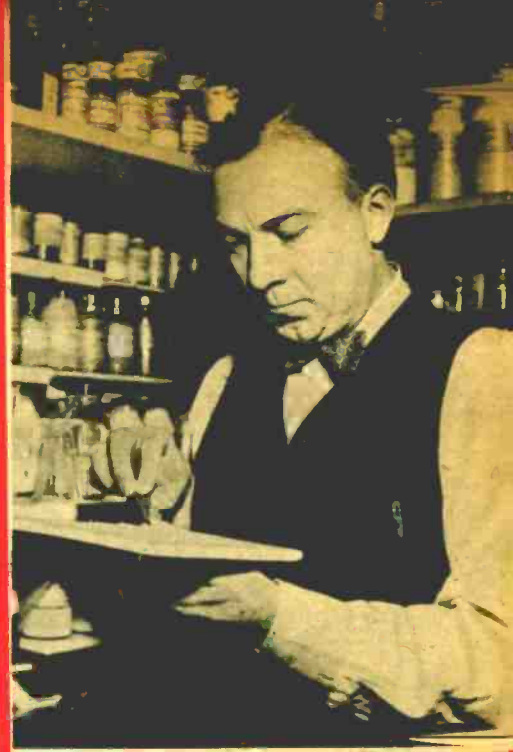
