MY LIFE and How I Escaped With It!

MY NAME is Julius, but everybody calls me Groucho. That is, everybody except the people I owe money, and what they call me is not a subject that I would care to discuss in a family newspaper.

People keep writing to me, asking why I am called Groucho. If I get one letter a year, I get ten thousand, all asking the same

question. If I could only get one letter a year...

It all goes back to my childhood. I was born, as most people are, and with my brothers, spent a fairly hunderd boyhood. Chico would hum and I would drum. Soon the neighbors took notice of our musical talents. Both Chico and I still have the scars to prove it.

Adolescence caught up with me as I was in the middle of a Boy Scout

test. Instead of trailing a deer through the quiet woodland, I found myself trailing a dear down a quiet boulevard. She retained a firm grip on her handkerchief, but the occasion left its mark on me for life. Since that first mad day when the mating instinct was aroused, I have walked in a bent-forward position, so that I won't have so far to go if some dame drops her handkerchief.

I'll never forget that night. I donned my best Eton suit... moth Eton, that is... swirled my opera cape about my shoulders, then went down to the corner by the poolroom to see what fortune might bring my way. I was making a difficult four-cushion combination shot when love walked in.

Romance in Air

The birds were singing as we strolled out arm in arm. I forget what tune they were plugging at the time. Romance was in the air. My heart was in the clouds. And her hand was in my pocket. Before I knew it, she was gone, along with my wallet and seven greenbacks... and I had come to love those little frogs.

My adolescent preoccupation with women soon gave way to my love for the theater. It was the most natural thing in the world for me to go on the stage. I just couldn't see a thing from where I was sitting.

It is with a certain amount of pride and longing that I look back at those early days in the theater. If I could only recapture today the unusual something that was Marx, the actor! All that ham, and no ration points!

The drama was a new field to me, and I was inclined to ponder each entrance and exit, to plan each gesture, to weigh each word. As a matter of fact, I made it a practice to carry a scale in my inside coat pocket, just to weigh words. That is what my rivals mean when they insist that all my early theatrical enterprises were on a small scale.

Then Comedy

I entered the field of comedy quite by accident. I was playing the hero in one of those old-fashioned melodramas. That in itself was a novelty. Usually, I played the heroine, but this particular one was smart and would have nothing to do with me.

We had reached the scene in which the villain had me in the sawmill and was about to cut me in two. That night, the rescuing sheriff was a bit late in making his entrance.

"You'd say the words that would make Nell a free woman," sneered the villain, "if you were half a man."

"And in a minute I will be," I ad libbed, "if the sheriff doesn't pick up his cue!"

Instead of taking my hint and

shutting off the saw motor, the villain was amused by my quip, and laughed heartily. In fact, he laughed so hard, I thought I'd split.

It was not so long after this in-

cident that I developed my rapid-fire comedy style, which got me fired rapidly from more jobs than I care to think about.

Broadway was next on the Marx

agenda, and I am proud to say that my successes on the Great White Way never turned my head, which is more than I can say for that tall redhead third from the left in the

G ABULATE AS exciting a luncheon date with Chester Morris, who is holding down Amos 'n' Andy's summer spot with his "Boston Blackie" series. To movie goers, the "Boston Blackie" series with Morris is a familiar story in which Morris is sort of a modern Robin Hood, a little on the gangster side, wise to all the tricks, but always reversing to do a lot of good. It is this thrilling role that Morris is recreating for ether lane audiences for the first time this summer and it was because of his debut as a regular radioite that we were lunching with Star Morris.

The meal was interesting, not because handsome, five-foot-eleven Chester exuded his personal charm, but because he proved to be such an expert conversationalist. His theme, in our instance, was his legerdemain, which he performs so deftly that he could, if he so desired, be classed as a professional.

We almost expected rabbits to pop from his top hat as we ate our scrambled eggs. Instead, quarters disappeared into rare space and the luncheon check vanished into thin air.

Laughingly, Morris recalled the first time he guested on a radio program of a brother magician, Edgar Bergen. Ten minutes before air time, Bergen confided to Morris: "You'll do better if you make Charlie mad."

Obeys Orders

Morris obligingly proceeded to call Charlie "Mortimer" and in swift retaliation, Bergen, or rather Charlie ad libbed such a heckling for Chester that he shook from stem to stern.

He has since made several appearances on the Bergen show, has guested on Lux five times this season, but just this summer came to radio regularly with his own program.

Morris, who stems from acting stock and whose Hollywood success was preceded by stage acclaim, became interested in magic when he was twelve and his father gave him a simple magic set for Christmas. Now, he has equipment valued at \$10,000 and a whole room full of large appurtenances which are in storage at Bekins. For the more than 800 camp shows he has played throughout the country with his lovely ex-Powers model wife, Lilli, as assistant, Morris has found it better to confine his tricks to those requiring small properties.

"One doesn't need to have elaborate equipment to do tricks," he pointed out. He expressed the opinion that magic and interest in it are on

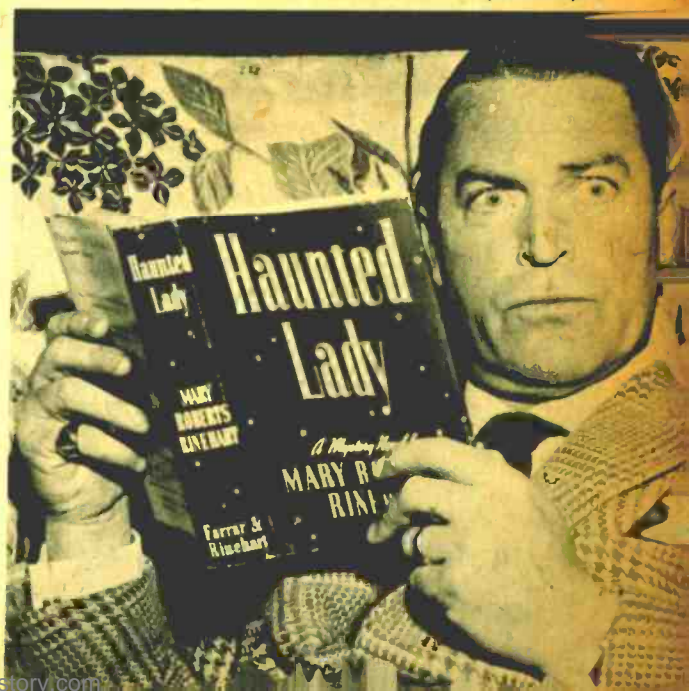

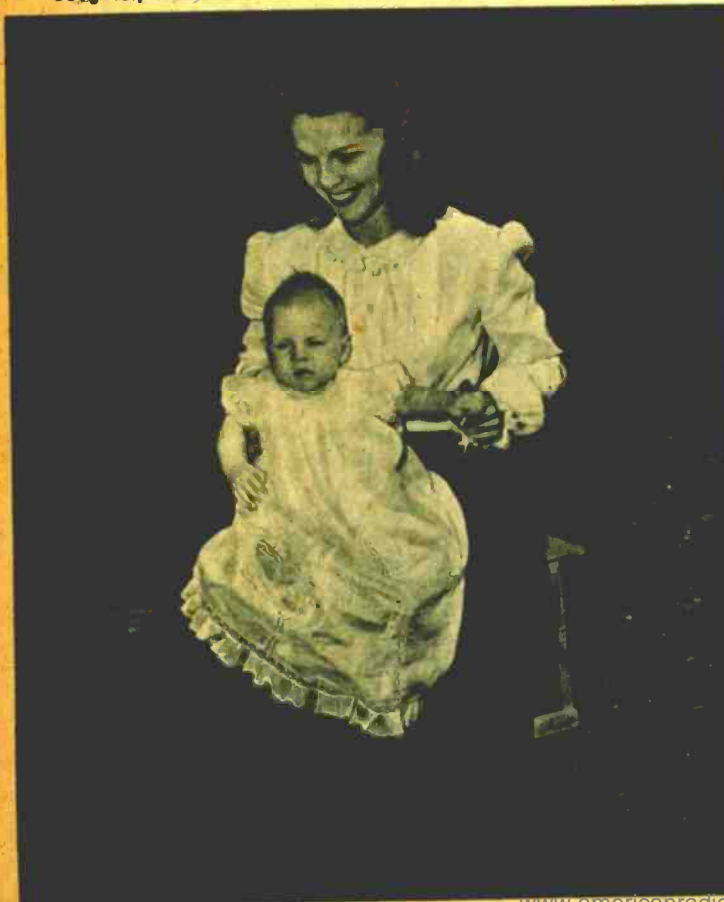

The "Wrong Crosby"

*That's What They Call Lou
Along Radio Row, But He's
Really a Very Right Guy*

WHEN Radio Life, interviewing Lou Crosby, asked him what was his most embarrassing moment, he gulped and said, "This is it right now! I've never been interviewed for a story."

Although we had been plenty long in waiting to talk to this Mr. Crosby, we were surprised that someone else hadn't beat us to quizzing the deep-voiced mikeman whom you hear on the Lum and Abner and Lionel Barrymore programs. Because he is not one of the fabulous Crosby brothers, they call Lou "the wrong Crosby" along Radio Row. That's all hooley.

Lou is one of the nicest fellows projecting commercials over anybody's mike. He's a rugged chap who crowds six feet, is 33 years old, and when he plumps on the scales he shoots the indicator up to 165 pounds. His hair is thinning, his brows overhang, his smile very genuine and generous. You probably know all about his rich-toned voice, so we don't need to go into that.

If he is "the wrong Crosby," how did he ever get into radio? That's a question that carries us back to his college days in Colorado Springs, when he started working around a radio station because, in his own words, he was "starving to death." When a NAB (National Association of Broadcasters) convention met in Colorado Springs, Lou did some news broadcasts for Transradio Press and as a result, he was offered a job at KNX.

Many Years Experience

His other local assignments include KFWB, KMTR, KTM, KGFJ, then, finally KFI. Ken Carpenter and Tom Hanlon helped him land the appointment on the station, where he worked for two and a half years. His ensuing free lance work

Lou doesn't take Hollywood too seriously. Apparently, his own values are too discriminating. He waited a long time for his break, he's grateful for it, but he's the kind of man who will turn down a week-end announcing assignment if it interferes with his fishing. Lou is an enthusiastic angler and hunter and likes nothing better than to sneak away with his charming wife, the former Linda Hayes, and outwit a few finny specimen. He has taught her to be such an expert shot that his skill is almost eclipsed. Then, too, Lou has taken considerable ribbing ever since the day, about a year ago, when he was cleaning his gun and shot off the great toe on his right foot. The index finger of his right hand, noticeably crooked, was not injured in hunting, but in a school football game.

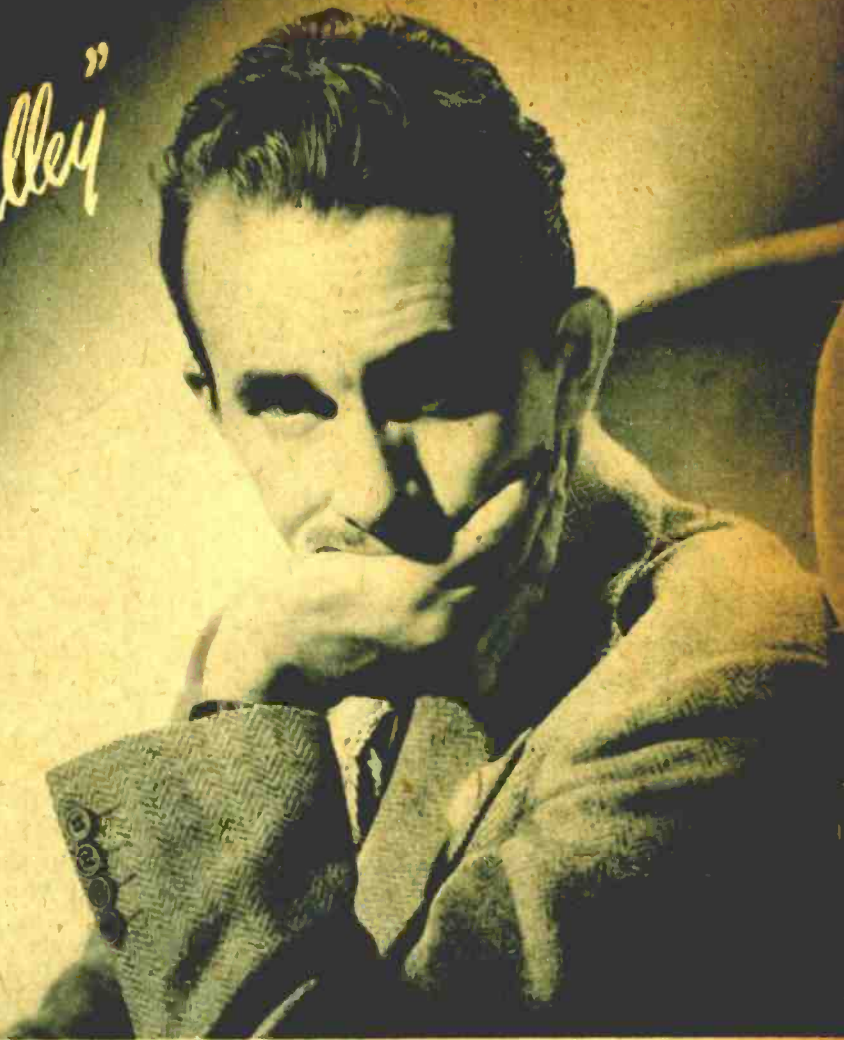

He Won Radio Life's Award For All-Round Arranging-Conducting, Penned Hit Tune, But Has Never Had A Lesson In His Life

FOR eight months, I couldn't think of a word to rhyme with 'home,' chuckled Gordon Jenkins when we asked him for the story behind his hit song, "San Fernando Valley."

Jenkins says he wrote both the words and music of the tuneful little melody, the first sixteen bars one afternoon as he was returning from a trip to Palm Springs, and the remainder eight months later when he was recovering from a severe case of the "galloping hives."

"I got up out of bed the next day," he related. "I was still pretty 'lumpy,' but I went down town to sell my song."

In the past he has had notable success composing such popular tunes as "P.S. I Love You," which he wrote with Johnny Mercer. "We wrote it and had it sold in just a couple hours time," smiled Gordon. Then, among others, they wrote "When a Woman Loves a Man"

which they thought would be a sure-fire hit, but it just didn't click.

Won Our Award

Now the gifted Gordon Jenkins is distinguishing himself further in the realm of more serious music. This year Radio Life bestowed its first annual Distinguished Achievement Award for the most outstanding all-round arranging and conducting on this thirty-four year old, slim, rather quiet young man with the tousled head of brown hair and matching mustache.

But the day we decided to bring you the story of this man behind the baton, we found him looking pretty glum. He had failed to break 100 in his golf game that afternoon. So we quickly turned the conversation toward more pleasant subjects, such as his NBC summer show with Dick Haymes. He was plenty happy about that and told us so.

"It's been such a long time since I've done a musical show," he pointed out. During the past season, he has handled the beautiful musical scoring for the Broadway show, "The Band Wagon."

Arch Oboler presentations on "Everything for the Boys." He likes doing the musical background for Oboler dramas, because, he says, Oboler appreciates the full value of an extensive musical score and makes use of it.

One of the most remarkable facts about the talented Mr. Jenkins is that he has never had a lesson in his life. He played the piano by ear at the tender age of four, and acquired a reasonable amount of skill on almost every other instrument during his early youth. He quit high school to play with a dance band.

In the early days of radio broadcasting, he applied his varied talents to being a one-man staff of a radio station. He would open a day's broadcasting, being Gordon Jenkins at the piano for fifteen minutes, then introduce himself as Joe Doakes, the Ukulele Whiz or Senor Somebody, the Accordion Virtuoso. He would keep up this broadcasting marathon until somebody else showed up at the studio to relieve him. His salary then was fifteen dollars a week.

More Tips ON Radio Tickets

Here's How To Get Ducats To NBC, Blue And Mutual Shows

Editor's Note

A few weeks ago, we published an article on how to obtain tickets for CBS-KNX broadcasts. At that time, we promised our readers a follow-through story on NBC, the Blue, and Mutual. Having accumulated the proper data, we present the second article of the series herewith.

THE National Broadcasting Company accommodates some 35,000 to 40,000 servicemen monthly with tickets to its leading airshows. In addition, during each month, five or six thousand soldiers, sailors and marines are admitted minus ducats. The most popular programs, such as those of Kay Kyser and Bob Hope, often originate from service camps, and when they are being broadcast from NBC's Hollywood studios, every seat is occupied by a man or woman in uniform.

That is why, as much as the network would like to oblige all of you who daily request tickets to top shows, it is impossible to do so.

Ticket requests for such shows as Bergen-McCarthy and Kraft Music Hall have remained unfulfilled for the past six months, due to the overwhelming popularity of these programs plus the fact that large sections of the studios are roped off for men and women in uniform.

It's the combination of these two things—that NBC leads the field in most-in-demand-to-see programs and apportionings such a huge amount of tickets to service men and women, that makes it so hard for civilians to obtain cardboard. So points out NBC's Guest Relations Department.

USO Serves

Mrs. Tracy Moore in charge of

RADIO-DIALER. Mrs. May Sperry, steps up to the ticket desk in the lobby of the Mutual studios to receive free ducats to network shows from Lou Arterburn, assistant in public relations. Popular Mutual audience airshows include "Point Sublime", "Quiz of Two Cities" and "What's The Name of That Song?"

NBC's USO desk, further emphasizes this statement. She supervises a staff of thirty-five women who take turns attending the USO desk in the foyer of Radio City. Here, the requesting service men and women are obliged with free ducats to their favorite airshows on any of the four big networks. "I don't think a single man or woman in uniform has come to the desk asking to see a show but hasn't been accommodated with a ticket to some broadcast", averred Kenworthy.

Civilians, however, are not left entirely out in the cold. Among the NBC shows available to ticket-seekers are the following four fine programs, for which ducats may be obtained simply by writing to the National Broadcasting Company's Sunset and Vine studios:

"Pacific Story", Sunday, 8:30 p.m.

"A Song Is Born", Monday, 6 p. m.

"A Date With Judy", Tuesday, 5:30 p. m.

"Scramby Amby", Wednesday, 9 p. m.

Be sure, however, when writing to request tickets for these programs, to enclose a self-addressed, stamped envelope.

Blue Ducats

The Blue Network ticket department wants the following facts stressed:

Ticket requests for the Blue's most popular local audience broadcast, "Breakfast at Sardi's" must be sent from four to six weeks in advance, and should be addressed to Raymond R. Morgan Co., 6362 Hollywood Blvd. Requests for reservations with enclosures of money are not accepted. "Breakfast at Sardi's" ticket-seekers are asked to remember the fact that a minimum of 100 requests per morning are received, for this broadcast. Listeners everywhere want to celebrate birthdays, anniversaries and reunions over a table at Sardi's with genial Tom Breneman.

"Duffy's Tavern", with the inimitable Ed "Archie" Gardner and his celebrated guest stars attracts a large number of the Blue Network's ticket-seekers, but "Archie" asks that a sizeable section of the studio be reserved for servicemen. Two other top Blue shows, Horace Heidt's and Joe E. Brown's, are special soldier shows, with particular appeal to men in uniform who flock in weekly to witness the broadcasts.

It should be noted that the "Radio Hall of Fame" and Milton Berle's "Let Yourself Go" shows both originate from the eastern coast. Other popular Blue programs, including

"Andy and Virginia," "Lum and Abner" and "Red Ryder" are not aired before an audience at all.

Here's How

The following are the shows to which you may usually obtain tickets by writing to the address given, enclosing a self-addressed stamped envelope. Blue Network broadcasts take place in the Radio City Sunset and Vine Street building, or occasionally in the Hollywood Radio Playhouse at 1441 North McCadden. Ticket-holders should arrive at the studio before the door time printed on the ducats.

nonchalance while making an apologetic speech to the servicemen.

Does Lux Gag

The favorite trick he performs during the Lux warm-up is done with a Lux box. Into one end of it, he stuffs several gally-dyed handkerchiefs. Then, out of the opposite end, he is seen to draw them out as immaculate white ones. The baffled audience clamors for more every time.

Questioned as to what he considered was the hardest feat to perform, Morris replied he thought it was the hoop trick, in which rings pass around persons seemingly suspended off the floor.

"Of course," he explained, "magic is not predicated on the fact that the hand is quicker than the eye. It isn't. The principle of the whole thing is distraction. While I'm doing a trick, I act as if I'm not doing what I am. You are looking at what you think is going on while I'm really doing the trick on the side." He paused here and demonstrated with a quarter.

Patter is very important in putting over this principle of distraction, according to Morris. Most tricks are accompanied by written patter, but Morris recommends that the performer learn his own line. "Never say 'I have here an ordinary, unprepared drinking glass' as preface to a drinking glass trick," he advised. "That's the mark of an amateur to point out such an obvious thing."

Morris' son by his first marriage, Brooks, does not evidence any special interest in magic as yet, although he frequently dresses as a page boy and assists in performances. His daughter, Cynthia, likes to get in the act, and his wife, Lilli, is extremely wrapped up in it and has learned to do some tricks quite well. On the whole, though, women do not make very good sleight-of-hand artists, asserted Morris.

Belongs to Club

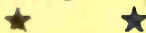
Until recently, he used to make a regular visit every Saturday to Thayer's shop out in Beverly Hills, when all the magicians would gather to inspect the week's shipment and compare notes. Camp appearances have more or less curtailed this pleasure for Morris, but he still delights in the monthly meetings of Los Magicos. This comprises a select group of 27 men, mostly professional men, who are expert magicians on the side and who meet to discuss and perform tricks. Both Morris and Bergen belong to this society, whose initiation is a thing fearful and wonderful, according to Morris. Initiates are always assigned certain ordinary tricks, amplified by twists which make them next to impossible to execute. In Morris' case, he managed to make a huge bird cage disappear by hooking it into an accomplice. The customary feat is to make a small cage vanish.

Morris chuckles, too, in recalling the magicians' conventions which used to occur before the war. "Your life wasn't your own," he remembered. "Set your suit case down and when you'd go to pick it up, it would explode. Or start down the hall and someone would pelt you with bricks. When you'd turn to holler a protest, you'd get one smack on the face. The other bricks were real. This one proved to be a sponge."

After the war, Morris has dreams of resurrecting his pet trick.

"It's a wonderful one," he said enthusiastically. "The equipment alone cost \$250. It consists of setting up three chromium poles and a small curtain, and describing a movie starlet's routine in preparing for the set. At the end of the act, a beautiful girl steps out from behind the poles and little curtain.

"But I can't tell you how it's done. A good magician always leaves his audience guessing."

But playing with dance bands earned him much more. Then, in 1933, his talent for arranging was uncovered and during the following four years, he did the arranging for every leading eastern airshow, including the much-lauded Andre Kostelanetz program.

Tough Slodding

Jenkins came to west coast in 1937, and has handled the music on many of Hollywood's leading shows since then, as well as having been NBC's Musical Director for three years. But before the breaks came, things were tough.

"It was like the two times I tried for a break in Chicago," he explained. "I starved — or came as close to it as I ever want to."

Asked what his special likes are, Gordon smiled and replied, I like to eat—mainly, meat and potatoes." He also likes good musicians, and dislikes bad ones.

He comes from a musical family. His father was once Dean of the American Guild of Organists. His mother, however, was the only non-musical member of a family of thirteen children.

Jenkins considers Martha Tilton the best girl vocalist and the incomparable Bing as the tops of the male crooners. "I've yet to meet somebody who *doesn't* like Crosby," he remarked.

Gordon Jenkins is married and has three children, all of whom are musically-minded. Aged four, five and eight, their names are Page, Susan Ann and Gordon Jr. They all play the piano.

Working on Symphony

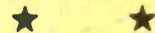
Gordon has his own studio in the rear of his home, where he is working on his serious symphonic arrangements. His first finished work

is now in the hands of conductor Frank Black who intends to use it on a future broadcast. Currently, Jenkins is reorchestrating the score he did for one of the outstanding Oboler productions called "The Fountain of the Dancing Children."

"It's just about ready now," he told us, adding with a modest smile, "but it will probably end up being stacked behind my piano."

Since the spectacular success of "San Fernando Valley," Gordon Jenkins has been made an honorary member of the North Hollywood Chamber of Commerce, and—yes, his home is in the San Fernando Valley.

"But," he maintained jokingly, "when the song became a success, I was going to take the money and move back to New York!"

This program should not be confused with "Pay Day Quiz" which originates from the Paramount Theater. To attend this latter show, you must purchase a theater ticket at the Paramount box-office. "Quiz of Two Cities" is a quiz program between San Francisco and Los Angeles, and not audience participation except for the selected organization contestants. Each week contestants are chosen for this program from certain organizations in the city. The organization chosen for each particular week receives 200-250 tickets for the broadcast date on which it has contestants participating. Tickets are also always available to the public, however.

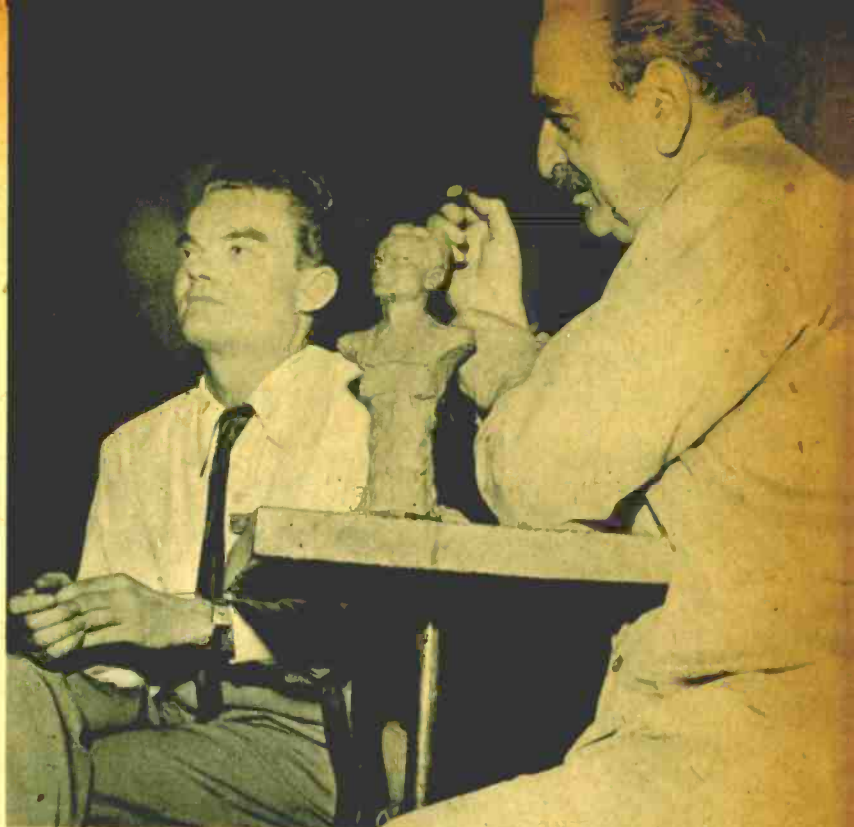
Homemaker's Club
