Producer Al Kaye presided in the control booth, and the young Williams Brothers stood by awaiting their cue to try out the show's sign-off lyrics, which are a take-off on "You and I," the popular melody composed by Major Meredith Willson, well-known Maxwell House alumni.

About the Maestro

Carmen "Cover Girl" Dragon, as announcer Harlow Wilcox heralds him, replaced Willson on the wintertime Maxwell House show, when the latter joined the army. Dragon, incidentally, is married to Eloise Rowitzer, who has been featured as "The Voice of Eloise" on many "Coffee Time" programs. They have two children, five-year-old Douglas and two-year-old Daryl. The handsome, thirty-year-old Carmen is a homebody who likes to garden, make movies of his family, and take occasional golf and fishing trips.

The Williams Brothers quartet, four real brothers who range in age from sixteen to twenty-six years, are the sons of a musical family, and first started in a big-time radio on Chicago's National Barn Dance.

Featured soloist of this new Maxwell House show is Carlos Ramirez, the flashing-eyed, sleek-haired South American singer who has achieved prominence in every field of the musical world from night clubs to opera. A gay, friendly fellow with a wide ready smile, Ramirez sat on the sidelines during much of

MANY A wintertime show has received a sudden shot in the arm this past season when zany Cass Daley burst upon the scene to delight radio-dialers with her own inimitable brand of raucous comedy. She has been radio's busiest guest star.

Now, with the "regulars" off the ether for a summertime breather, the airwaves have been sprinkled with the brilliance of new stars and new shows, among them a Friday night CBS comedy program that brings the daffy Miss Daley to the

microphone for a weekly riotous round of slap-happy hilarity, in which she is aided and abetted by the able Mr. Charles Ruggles, and a musical crew consisting of Carlos Ramirez, Carmen Dragon and the Williams Brothers.

Radio Life made it a point to be on hand to watch final rehearsals for this bang-up CBS summer show, to bring our readers an eye-witness account of the gay goings-on. But when we first arrived, the tenseness and uncertainty that always accompany a premiere performance predominated.

Carmen Dragon was perspiring over the program's theme, gesturing

the rehearsal, enjoying his fellow performers, laughing loudly, and doing little offstage vocalizing.

Cass came in wearing a trim sport dress and looking very attractive but only for a fleeting moment, since mugging is her specialty and she went right at it. There's never a dull moment on or off the mike when Cass Daley is around. She executed a comical curtsy, flashed her famous buck-toothed grin, and stepped to the center of the stage to sing the song that she's made famous, "I'm Getting Corns for My Country."

Husband, Best Critic

Her handsome husband-manager, the very blue-eyed Frank Kinsella, sat down in a front seat to watch, registering disapproval at her first delivery of the number. "Pick it up, honey, pick it up," he shouted. "You're too slow!" Cass brandished her fist at him, and sneered, then obliged him with the "punchy," energetic Daley delivery he was asking for, finishing the tune with a blaring flourish on the words, "Just ask for Daley at the Stage Door Canteen!" Her husband beamed, "Honey, you're wonderful!"

Later, Kinsella told us that the song, "Corns for My Country," was written especially for Cass by a young stenographer named Jean Barry. "I like to look over the work of talented young tunesmiths," he declared, "if they've written something that's especially suited to Cass' style."

While we were talking, the dauntless Miss Daley sat herself down at the piano to play a loud rhythmic arrangement of a familiar tune, well-camouflaged by Cass' flexible fingers striking every note off-key.

Ruggles A Contrast

In contrast to his irrepressible co-star, suave, gray-haired, twinkley-eyed Charlie Ruggles puffed on his pipe and appeared quite serious-minded between his sessions at the microphone. Away from the airwaves, Ruggles is an enthusiastic rancher, owns acres of citrus fruits and still retains an active interest in the famous dog kennels which he established a number of years ago.

Guest stars on the initial Daley-Ruggles show were Diana Lynn, dimpled, sweet-smiling, sixteen-year-old movie starlet who played a combined classical and rhythmic modern arrangement of Greig's Piano Con-

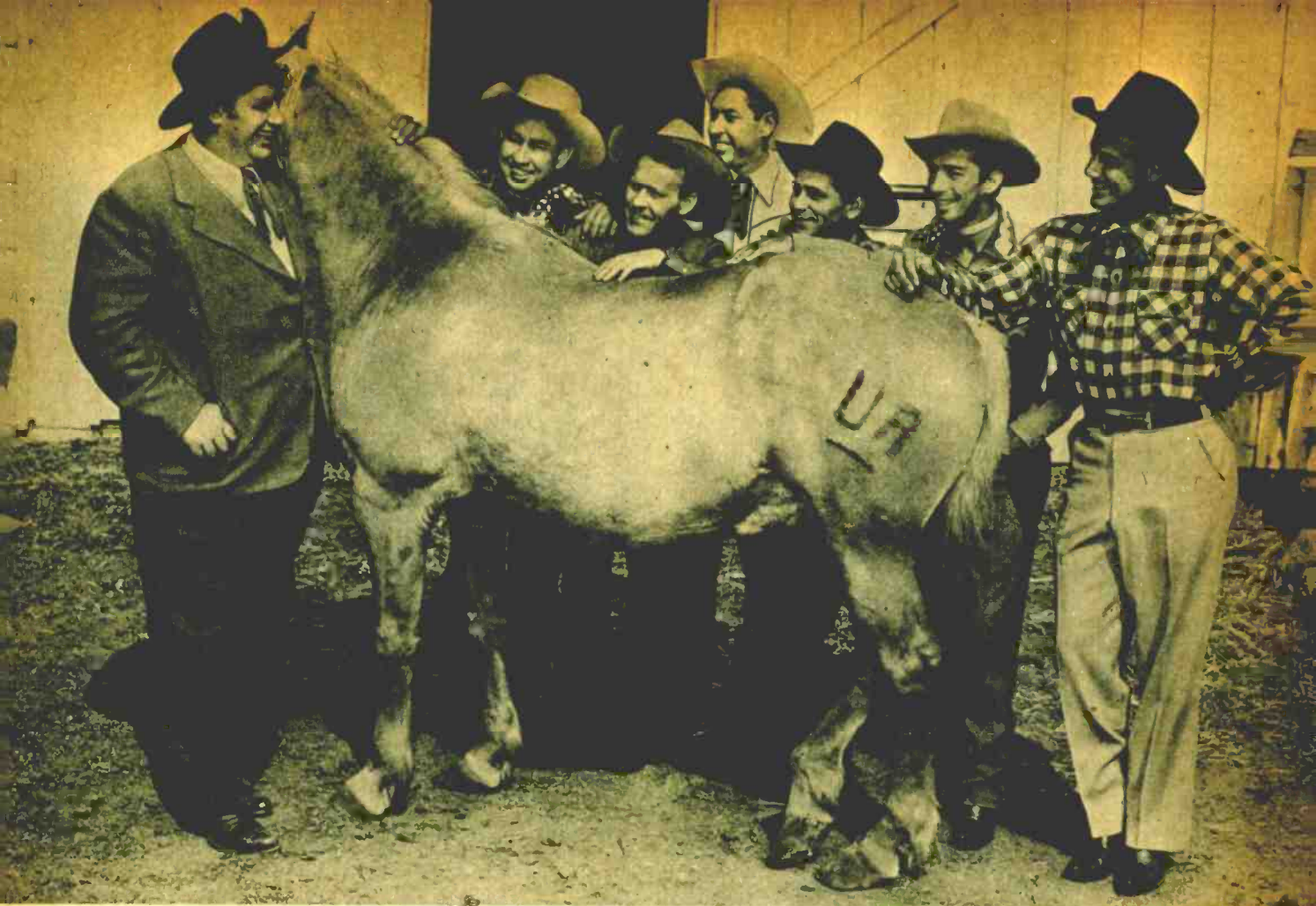

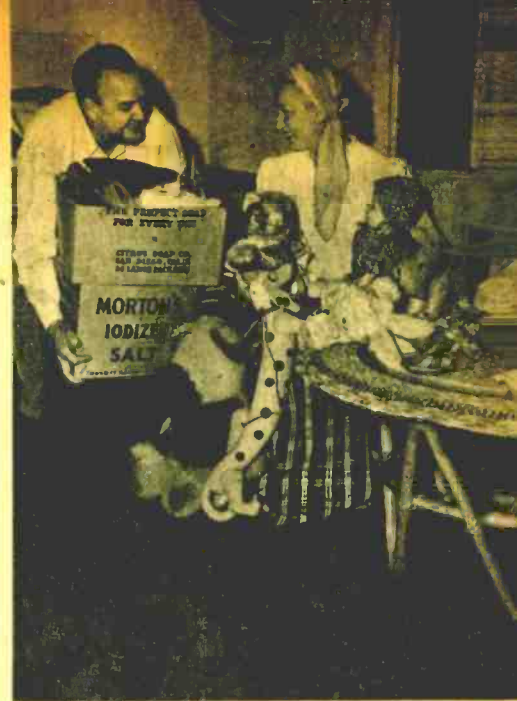

When we arrived, the jovial announcer greeted us at the door with his customary hearty hello, and ushered us into the warm, "homey" atmosphere that pervades his home. With walls of yellow, the living room is bright and cheery, and overlooks a patio done in a colorful Mex-

ican motif. A spacious green lawn spreads across the rear of the house.

As soon as we came through the door, we could hear a woman's voice talking rapidly in a foreign tongue. "Marusia's on the phone," explained Don, adding with a twinkle, "She must be talking to one of her Polish friends."

Marusia ended the conversation, however, in a strictly American vein. "Oo-kay!" we heard her exclaim as she put down the receiver.

She entered the room then, a tall, blonde, fair-skinned woman wearing a full, floor-length, gaily-colored skirt, a white blouse, and a pale pink and green scarf about her head. She smiled graciously as Don introduced her.

Then they both entered into an enthusiastic account of their current activities with the "Friends of Poland," a charitable organization which is devoted to the aid of Polish refugees, and of which Mrs. Wilson is vice-president.

Gathering Contributions

For weeks, she has been phoning and calling upon people who are willing to contribute to the organization's current drive for clothing and toys. Rallying to the cause with equal enthusiasm, Don has been siding in his wife's charitable work. "He's carried" so many bundles, it's a wonder he can still stand up straight," Marusia smiled, then cast a sympathetic look toward her husband, and exclaimed, "Poor boy!"

Pool Opening

When Tom Breneman casually mentioned on the Blue's "Breakfast at Sardi's" program one morning that 7,000 towels would be needed for the opening of the Hollywood Guild Canteen's new swimming pool, little did he dream of the barrage of bath towels which was to follow.

Immediately after the broadcast towels started pouring into the Blue Network's offices—towels, one at a time, in crates as large as an office desk, and finally a Bekins storage truck full of them. One department store sent 53 towels—one for each employe. Contributions came from every state in the union and Alaska. And checks. Emcee Breneman took a look at the 11,000 towels that poured into the Blue from out of the blue and packed three rooms to the rafters, mused amazed "and I wasn't even hinting!"

The pool that started this unforeseen landslide was opened July Fourth with a big splash before two thousand servicemen and women, for whom it was built, at the Ann Lehr estate in Hollywood. Tom Breneman acted as master of ceremonies for an aquacade that starred Johnny Weismuller, the Hopkins twins, a water ballet put on by six Los Angeles Athletic Club mermaids, and pin-up girl Chili Williams.

Mrs. Lehr, affectionately known as "Mom" to most of the fellows on furloughs who bunk down at the Canteen (800 of them every week night, 1,500 on weekends), welcomed civilian and military guests, led the way to a barbecued sparerib spread.

The necessary \$10,000 to build the pool was contributed in part by Sardi's restaurant, the rest was made up of surplus donations to "Breakfast at Sardi's" fund for servicemen—every army and navy man present on the program receives \$5.

Busy Days

That man who delivers those enjoyable, easy-to-listen-to commercials on the Fibber McGee and Molly show, Harlow Wilcox, will not be taking it easy during vacation-time, it seems. He has taken over the announcing chores on several of the top summer replacement shows, among them CBS' "Meet Corliss Archer."

Sad World

If there was sadness the other afternoon in the voice of Leah Ray, the "listening lady" of the Blue Network's Morton Downey program, it was because tragedy had struck. Before the broadcast the cook had called from Miss Ray's country home. In heavy voice she said "they" had fallen from the window and landed in the chicken pen. And the chickens had pecked up the remains.

The unintentional chicken feed? Miss Ray's nylons!

Maestro Abroad

With CBS' "Pause That Refreshes" now being conducted by the gifted Canadian, Percy Faith, it has been revealed that the musical program's regular maestro, Andre Kostelanetz, and his famous wife, diva Lily Pons, are abroad in the Persian Gulf area where, during the summer months, they will entertain American and Allied servicemen.

Tom Comes Through

Tom Hanlon, record-twirler of the KNX "Midnight Merry-Go-Round," conducting one of his novel contests on a recent broadcast, offered as the prize an original drawing of filmdom's famous "Bugs" Bunny. He was stumped, however, when no less than five listeners came through with the right answer. Result was that cartoonist Leon Schlesinger got a midnight phone call to come through with four more original drawings of the irrepressible "Buggs," so that Tom wouldn't have to let his listeners down.

100,000,000 to 1

The odds were 100,000,000 to 1 against it happening—but it did! On a recent "Take It or Leave It" broadcast, it was discovered that one of the contestants (Pfc. Beatrice Bridges, a WAC from Burlingame, Calif.) had appeared on the same show during a previous broadcast—despite the fact that tickets to the show have been made available to 50,000,000 people, of which only about 400 can be accommodated in the studio.

genuine realism and gripping drama. Ashmun, tall, gaunt and slow-speaking, stepped forward to talk to the sailors before him, his voice breaking with emotion before he left the stage.

"There were tears in his eyes when he wished those boys' smooth sailing," Culver told us later.

In the control booth, at the side of the stage, the behind-the-scenes drama of production was taking place. Soundman Sid Brechner was producing the effects of hissing steam, roaring water, burning oil and bursting torpedoes which had to be intricately regulated to go out over the ether waves by the skilled hand of engineer Dolph Alexander. Producer Del Castillo and

script girl Anita Weber kept their eyes moving swiftly from the stage to their scripts and stop watches.

Castillo rushed from the booth to the stage at one point during the program to join narrator Culver in leading the assembled men in song.

There is intense tension during each "We Deliver The Goods" broadcast, for with the exception of narrator Culver, one or two actors who dramatize the tales of heroism, and the behind-the-scenes crew, the program's entire personnel is made up of the men inexperienced in radio broadcasting.

When the program finally came to a successful conclusion, going off the air directly "on the nose," the Maritime men cheered and applauded, Castillo and his crew breathed a sigh of relief, and seamen Arthur Ashmun, survivor of five disasters at sea, mopped his brow and smilingly exclaimed, "I'm glad I'm not in radio. I wouldn't want to go through this all the time!"

and he has 110 bushes about his house. One of them alone, his "Gold-Emblem," a climber, had 500 blooms at once, and it's not unusual in the spring of the year for over 3,000 roses to be blooming at the same time about the place. Roses line the gravel driveway, hedge part of the premises, and a special bed is set aside for them by the swimming pool. Some of the plants in this bed have three different varieties grafted onto them!

Abundance of Fruit

In addition to their apricot tree, which last summer had 2,000 pounds of fruit on it, the Rosses have every kind of fruit tree from Tragedy plum and Mandarin bush cherry to pecans and pineapple guavas. Each tree and plant gets individual attention from Earle and his wife ... they've had the tree surgeon out twice to doctor the apricot, and their success in raising a bush of fragrant Eastern lilac is due only, they're convinced, to having placed ice-cube packs around its roots every day during the first summer it was started!

Unlike any of his characters, "Howie MacBrayer," "Judge Hooker," or "John Barton," Ross is happily married and will celebrate his 33rd wedding anniversary soon. Tanned, white-haired and black-eyed, he's proud of his Sioux Indian blood which he traces to the same family tree as the famed chieftain, Sitting Bull. He has had a fabulous life as playwright, producer, actor, and dean of a dramatic school, including twenty years of stock company production under the banner of the "Earle Ross Players." But he enjoys his radio work best.

"It gives me time to enjoy my home," he says. "Everyone appreciates a home ... but one who has been through barnstorming days appreciates it most of all."

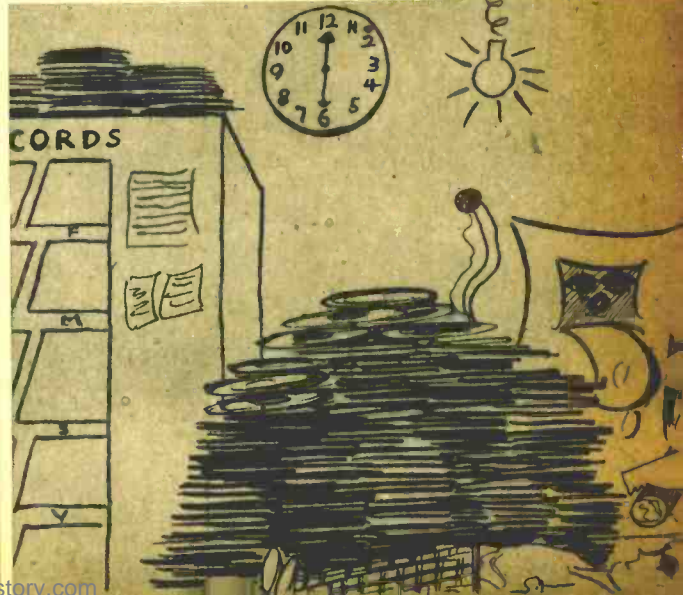
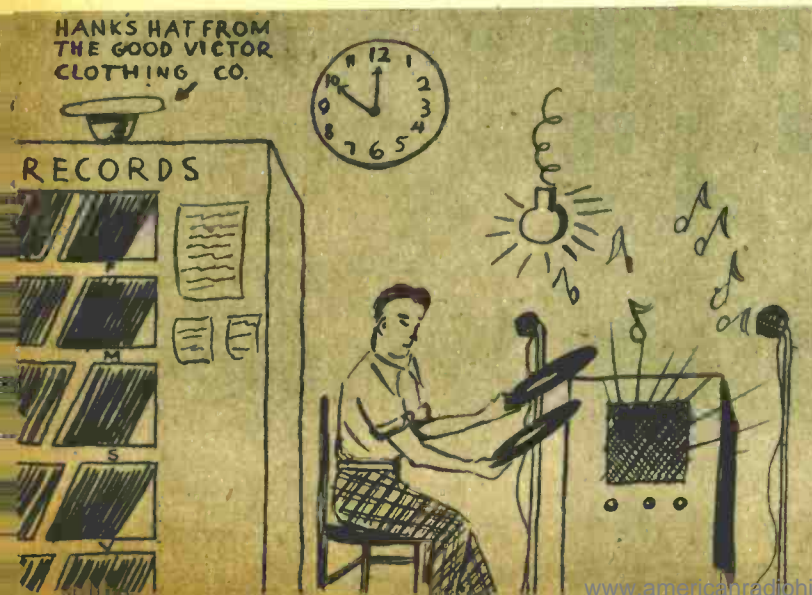

EARLE ROSS is a radio producer's dream of a rich man. He plays wealthy, Texas multi-millionaire "Howie MacBrayer" on Robert L. Redd's "Point Sublime" over KHJ-Don Lee, Mondays at 8:30 p.m., and war plant tycoon "John Barton" five days a week at 9:45 a.m. in John Boylan's "That Amazing Jennifer Logan" on the same network. Earl Ross in the flesh resembles "Howie MacBrayer" of "Point Sublime" and would like very much to have a hand in changing

the character of "John Barton" of "That Amazing Jennifer Logan," of whom he does not wholly approve.

"Barton is ruthless and dominating," says Ross of the character. "No one has ever said 'No' to him and he's convinced that no one ever will. He's positive, aggressive, stops at nothing. 'Howie' on the other hand, is a loving, sweet Texan, who's strictly on the level and is always out to help his friends."

Yet, although Ross counts his riches off stage as well as on, the ones he finds at home have a different set of values. "Mrs. Ross and I find our riches in the things we get out of life, and we get out of it just what we put in it," says Ross, who also plays Summerfield's substantial "Judge Hooker" in "The Great Gildersleeve."

That philosophy is evident in every foot of Ross' acre home in the San Fernando Valley, where he and Mrs. Ross started with nothing but a vacant lot and an apricot tree seven years ago and ended with a garden paradise which is practically self-sustaining and a home which accents warm hospitality.

Share Their Pool

The Rosses believe in sharing . . . and share they do. Mrs. Ross has taught all the neighborhood youngsters how to swim in their swimming pool . . . but that wasn't enough. There's a high cypress hedge around the Ross home, so in order that the youngsters wouldn't have to go clear around by the road and in the front gate, Ross built a wooden stile across the hedge.

There are quantities of fruit trees on the place now, besides that original apricot tree . . . and they all contribute to the Ross plan of sharing. Dozens of friends and neighbors have pints of fruit they have put up from the Ross' trees. Vegetables contribute to the same exchange . . . the Rosses grow beans; their neighbors grow squash, and everybody shares.

But vegetables and fruit and the more practical things of life are not the boundaries of the Ross philoso-

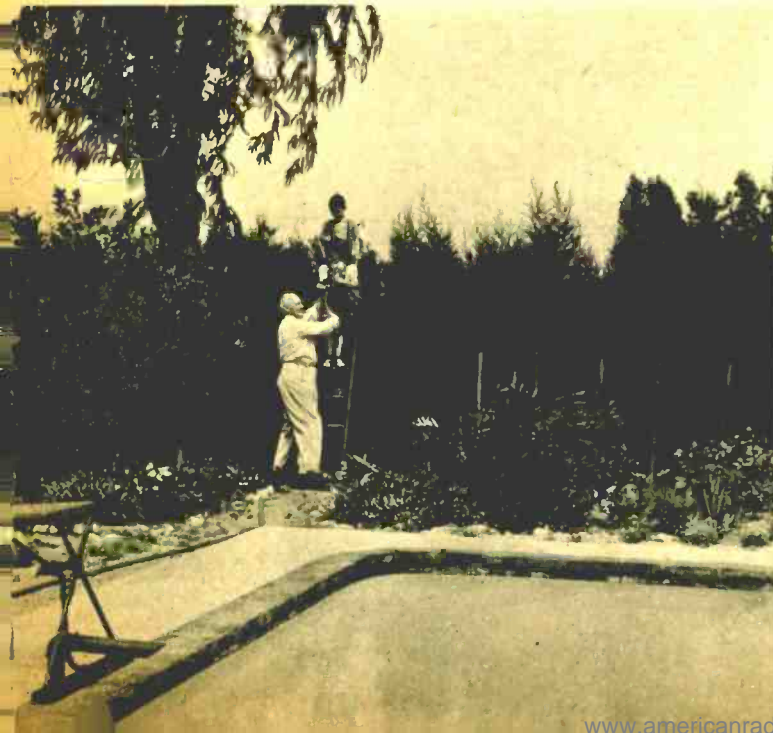

Radio Life Takes You To Catalina To View Thrilling Airshow That Salutes Gallant Men of the Maritime Service

WE DELIVER THE Goods" is much more than a radio program. Emanating weekly from the United States Maritime Service Training Station at Santa Catalina, California, it brings to the airplanes real, living drama—the inspiring story of men who sail the stormy seas, who bear the brunt of a torpedo attack, swim through burning oil, and brave all the terrors of weather and war, shipping out again and again to *deliver the goods!*

Catalina has changed. Even the sky and the sea were a wartime gray the day your Radio Life reporter entered picturesque Avalon Bay with the CBS production crew of this Sunday evening radio program which tells of these courageous merchant marines and the service they

perform for their country. Where once curious tourists and carefree vacationers walked along its shores, everywhere we looked now could be seen the trim blue and white uniforms of the Maritime Service.

The colorful St. Catherine Hotel has become the St. Catherine Barracks. The Island Villas that once housed the summer vacationists are now living quarters for apprentice seamen during their preliminary training period. The Catalina Casino is used today as an auditorium for the men's study and recreational activities.

On Sunday, they assemble there in the spacious theater to see a movie, and to view their own transcontinental radio program, "We Deliver The Goods." During our visit to the island, we entered the Casino theater at five on Sunday

afternoon to watch the show's rehearsal.

At Rehearsal

Lt. Curt Roberts and the 25-piece USMS Training Station Band were playing a rousing rendition of "Heave Ho, My Lads, Heave Ho." The stage was filled with men in nautical blue, among them, Bosun's Mate Second Class Sam Brandt, the program's announcer; Chief Petty Officer Ray Buell and Ship's Cook Third Class Joe Sylva, the show's vocalists; and Commander Christian W. Schmidt, Superintendent of this USMS Training Station at Avalon on Catalina Island.

Announcer Brandt is a tall, dark, handsome lad with a rich, resonant voice, who puffed on his pipe and stated modestly, "I'm just a novice in radio." His professional experience at a microphone numbers nine months. He calls San Francisco his home, but has spent the past four years in New York. He entered the Maritime Service fifteen months ago.

Vocalist Buell, a smiling-eyed, deep-voiced baritone, stepped to the microphone then to sing heartily of "Tramps At Sea," and later, his partner in song, lean, youthful, dark-haired Joe Sylva, rendered a lilting

number from the tuneful score of "Hit the Deck."

Thrillingly and completely nautical, this particular broadcast commemorated National Maritime Day, and Commander Schmidt was on hand to speak in tribute to the one hundred twenty-five thousand officers and men of the merchant marine who are today sailing America's freighters and tankers, to deliver the goods! Schmidt related these statistics: For every man shipping overseas, ten tons of equipment must go along with him. For every man already stationed on foreign shores, one-half ton of replacements a month must reach him.

The Lifeline

"It is only through the unflagging courage and determination of our seamen to keep the lifeline of war material flowing to our fighting men that we can achieve victory," the commander gravely declared.

Howard Culver, "Your Maritime Narrator," stood by to tell the thrilling story of a gallant seaman—Second Assistant Engineer Arthur Ashmun, who has been awarded a Distinguished Service Medal for his heroism at sea above and beyond the call of duty.

Merchant Marine Ashmun, a sailor for the past seventeen years, has shipped out eleven times since the beginning of the war. Six ships came through to deliver the goods; the other five were bombed, torpedoed or mined.

"But what's a little thing like a torpedoing or bombing," exclaimed Ashmun quietly. "It doesn't bother us. Nothing can keep us merchant seamen at home until this war's won!"

The actual broadcast of "We Deliver the Goods" was an inspiring sight to see. Men from everywhere, with uniforms identical but faces distinctively different, were gathered together in the spacious darkened theater to applaud their performing buddies, to cheer for their fellow heroes, to join their voices in songs of the sea.

Narrator Culver, familiar bearded radio thespian who is also heard on "Great Short Stories" and "Lady of the Press," related the evening's tale of breath-taking heroism with

show. Since then she has been a regular on the CBS broadcast.

Chance to Sing

One of her nicest bits of luck occurred just a few weeks ago when author Miss Leslie, with song-writer Lew Pollack, wrote "Bobby Socks Blues."

Both Producer Helen Mack and Miss Leslie had known of Louise's life-long ambition to sing over the air. Here was her chance, they thought.

"I never was so thrilled in my life," says the lucky girl with sparkling eyes. Now Aleen and Lew have written another number titled "Date With Judy." Incidentally her song-debut was so well liked by her listeners that Louise has repeated the "Bobby Socks" song a second time, and the "Judy" club has requested the number as their theme melody!

Before her "career breaks" had taken root in Hollywood Louise lived in Oakland, California, where she was born February 28, 1928. A few years later her family moved down the Peninsula, south of San Francisco, where Louise attended her first classes at the Little Oxford School.

There at four years, her histrionic ability first began to blossom in a Christmas play. There, too, she had her first chance to sing (her one ambition is to become a creditable vocalist.) She warbled a ditty titled "I'm a Little French Doll," apparently with much abandon, for according to Mrs. Erickson neither the audience nor her offspring seemed to pay much attention to the words or music. She was too interested in buttoning and unbuttoning her little jumper dress as she sang.

She was eight when the family motored south to Los Angeles. She immediately began taking piano lessons, simultaneously humming and singing popular tunes. After school Louise used to read aloud to her mother, who would sit by while her ambitious offspring would dramatize not one, but all characters in a book of one-act plays.

"There was no limit to what I thought I could do," grins Louise.

It wasn't long after she started radio work that she learned more and better work was available for those who could do dialects. She promptly signed up at a local radio school for that purpose. Schedules were so arranged that she could keep up her school curriculum and also pursue her career. She appeared on many sustaining programs and eventually in "Confessions," a program biography of the life of Lord Byron.

Frantically she hailed a taxi, and with her hair still in curlers, she plunged into the studio ten minutes later just in time to hear her cue. Another girl, about to read Louise's lines, suddenly found herself mirus a script, as young Miss Erickson grabbed it in transit to the mike.

After the broadcast, Louise learned that the bus she had missed had collided with a vegetable truck and that several passengers had been seriously injured.

This is just one example of why they call this budding young actress "Little Miss Lucky." Dame Fortune seems to be keeping a particularly close eye on the star of NBC's "Date with Judy."

Lucky Again

Thanks to Aleen Leslie, writer of the "Judy" show, Louise recently was given her first break in

pictures. The casting director from the studio called Miss Leslie and asked her about talent for their picture, "Rosie the Riveter."

"Why not Louise Erickson?" said Miss Leslie.

That night the director listened in on the broadcast, called Louise later for an appointment at the studio. Shooting on the film was scheduled within twenty-four hours.

"In ten minutes," exclaimed the blonde actress, "they told me I had been given the juvenile lead."

When she accepted a last-minute call to appear with John Howard in "This Is Our America," some time ago, it was one of her luckiest breaks. She was scheduled for a history exam the next morning and on that account almost turned down the radio assignment.

"One hour before the broadcast I was handed the script and discovered it consisted of three pages of straight reading on the subject of legislative bills," she tells. "Most of the words were unfamiliar to me and 'tongue-twisters.' It was a miracle that I didn't fluff a word on the air."

If Louise's decision had taken another course that night she would not have been heard in that performance by those connected with the production of "Corliss Archer." They immediately decided Miss Erickson was a "must" for their

don't even leave the studio for a cup of coffee," Hank stated. "I have it sent up to me."

Last week, he told Radio Life that he never plans his programs. "I just choose records to suit the mood," he commented, and when we protested that such a haphazard scheme was apt to ball up a program, Hank smiled: "The listeners like my spontaneous programming. When I plan it, they complain: 'I don't like your music.'" "Yes," he continued, "the whole continuous broadcast is unplanned and ad-libbed. Only half of the commercial is written. I compose the rest extemporaneously."

Hank, the Nightwatchman's program has been on the air for three years. Joseph Anthony has been Hank for a third of that period. He has been in radio for two years, was nine months on the staff at KGFJ when Victor asked him to be its nightwatchman. Before he entered radio, he lived in Grand Rapids, Michigan, where he was born Joseph Blazak, one of a family of four children. "My mother," he said, "was a duchess in Poland. I'm a Catholic. I come from Polish-German stock. I don't know whether it's so good to mention that right now . . ."

Had Night Club

Before deciding to come to California, Hank, as we shall call him, owned a hotel and night club in Grand Rapids, and after he arrived in California, he owned and operated a catering business for three years before entering radio. The motive behind his trek to Hollywood was his ardent desire to break into pictures. Hank is a dialectician of ability, can offhand deliver some 30 or 40 characterizations. His talent along this avenue was demonstrated last summer when he exceeded a daytime show on Sunday afternoon, in which he played five characters including that of "Hank," a much-heckled guy, wise, in a dumb way.

Hank also writes songs, says he collaborated with Jackie Camp in the lyrics for "What the Sergeant Said." He used to sing tenor, but his announcing work has brought his voice down into the baritone register.

Every night he receives between 300 and 400 telephone calls and his fan mail runs around 750 letters weekly, except when he has a contest on, when it practically doubles. "I can't attempt to answer my mail," he said despairingly. "If I'd answer it, I'd get more letters."

His mail comes from all types of fans. One man wrote: "I am a swing shifter at Douglas—get home at one a.m., eat, read the paper, and listen to you until two or three. Your program is the only one I can depend on to have some of the music I like."

Another Letter

From a private overseas came a missive that said: "I haven't heard

any real jive lately but I'm looking forward to the day when I can listen to your program again. I want to ask you for one favor and that is to play 'All or Nothing at All' and 'You'll Never Know' and dedicate them to the old gang in Glendale."

From a male patient at Cedars of Lebanon: "I am awake a great part of the night and have formed the habit of listening to Hank. I thought you would like to know what a great comfort the program is to people who are ill."

From a young girl: "Nine months ago I hurt my back and now I'm in a cast. When I get well, I'll have to go down to the good Victor Clothing Company and tell them what a swell program they are sponsoring."

Most of the persons calling Hank on the phone are lonely—fans who "just want to talk," in Hank's words. Between 10 p.m. and midnight, the majority of his callers are girls of high school age. "After that, the swing shifters call," he remarked.

Once, he saved a sick girl's life. A constant fan, one night she called Hank and said: "The nurse has gone to the drug store and I'm going to end my life!" Hank communicated with the police and they arrived in time to prevent the suicide. "I never heard from her since," the radio samaritan said briefly.

Every night, Hank checks into the station about half past nine.

Lives in Valley

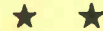
He lives in the San Fernando Valley, but when we asked him if he were married, he just smiled quietly and didn't answer. Before he leaves for KGFJ, he has stowed away a hearty dinner. When his night-long vigil is over, he streaks out of the studio (about 6:01 a.m.) and makes for home where he tumbles into bed for a long sleep. Once or twice a week he rides. He owns two horses which he keeps in the Valley.

Up shortly after noon, he devours breakfast—bacon and eggs, coffee. "I don't like toast, but I drink coffee continually. Also beer." If he's short on shut-eye, Hank rests during the afternoon before dinner. Before the war, he used to indulge in his favorite hobby: "filling the car with gas and driving like mad."

Hank, who plays about 160 records every night, selects them from a library containing 2,000 discs. His favorite record is his theme which he plays four times nightly—Bing Crosby's "Sweethearts." "Bing," sighed Hank. "I think he's wonderful. He's my ideal." When his last "Sweethearts" record became too worn to spin, Hank substituted one of the same song, recorded by Allan Jones. "I had a call about every five minutes protesting the switch," he said. Incidentally, it was Radio Life which finally succeeded in unearthing a new copy of the platter for Hank.

In physical appearance, the watchman is an even six feet, weighs 190 pounds, has blue-green eyes, a moustache, and soft wavy brown hair.

When we asked him if he was wearing a Victor Clothing suit, he chuckled: "Sure. I have nine of 'em, all from Victor. They're good clothes."

"Peoples are calling me on the telephone all the time," Mrs. Wilson enthused in an excited version of the English language. "Everything is going around into circles!"

The Wilsons lead an active social life, too, and entertain often in their pretty valley home. It covers an area of two acres of fruitful ground. Last year, they informed us, they sold some seven thousand pounds of tomatoes, and gave a thousand pounds away in addition. Now, an abundant apricot crop is expected.

Sold the Horses

In the rear of the Wilson home, the stables still stand, although it recently became necessary for the prize Palomino horses that were housed in them to be sold. "They were beautiful animals," Marusia sighed wistfully. "I wish we could have kept them." But their stable boy went into the Army, she explained, and in addition, the cost of the horses' care and feeding was becoming too high. "Petty," an aristocratic russet-brown Irish setter, is now the sole family pet.

The den of the Wilsons' ranch offers obvious proof of Don and Marusia's love of dogs and horses. It is filled with pictures of the animals, and trophies which theirs have won. Other trophies include those which Don has been awarded for his skill and popularity as a radio announcer.

With precise pronunciation a vital part of his work, the genial miker is often amused by his wife's occasional difficulties with English language. "She always says 'Zzzz' for the sound of 'ith,'" he chuckled.

"Don loves to clowning," Mrs. Wilson declared with an indulgent smile. Most of the time, however, she seemed to speak English very well, with a trace of intriguing Polish accent. Her home is at Lwow in Poland, where her family is still located, as far as she knows.

Marusia met the affable announcer two years ago at a dinner party, and they were married on December 17, 1942.

With one of his familiar hearty laughs, Don told us the story of their first meeting. Jello was served at the dinner, it seems, and at that time the product still sponsored the Jack Benny show.

Unfamiliar with the American delicacy, Marusia studied the dish intently, then inquired eagerly of Don, "Is this the stuff which you are laughing for?"
