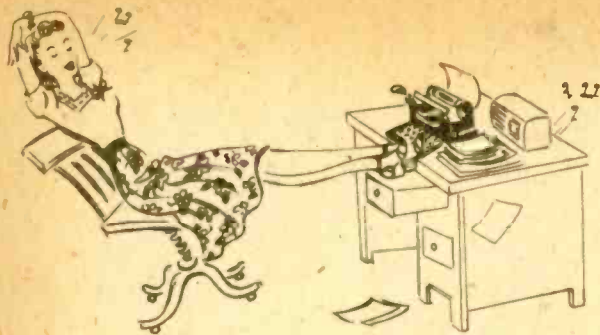

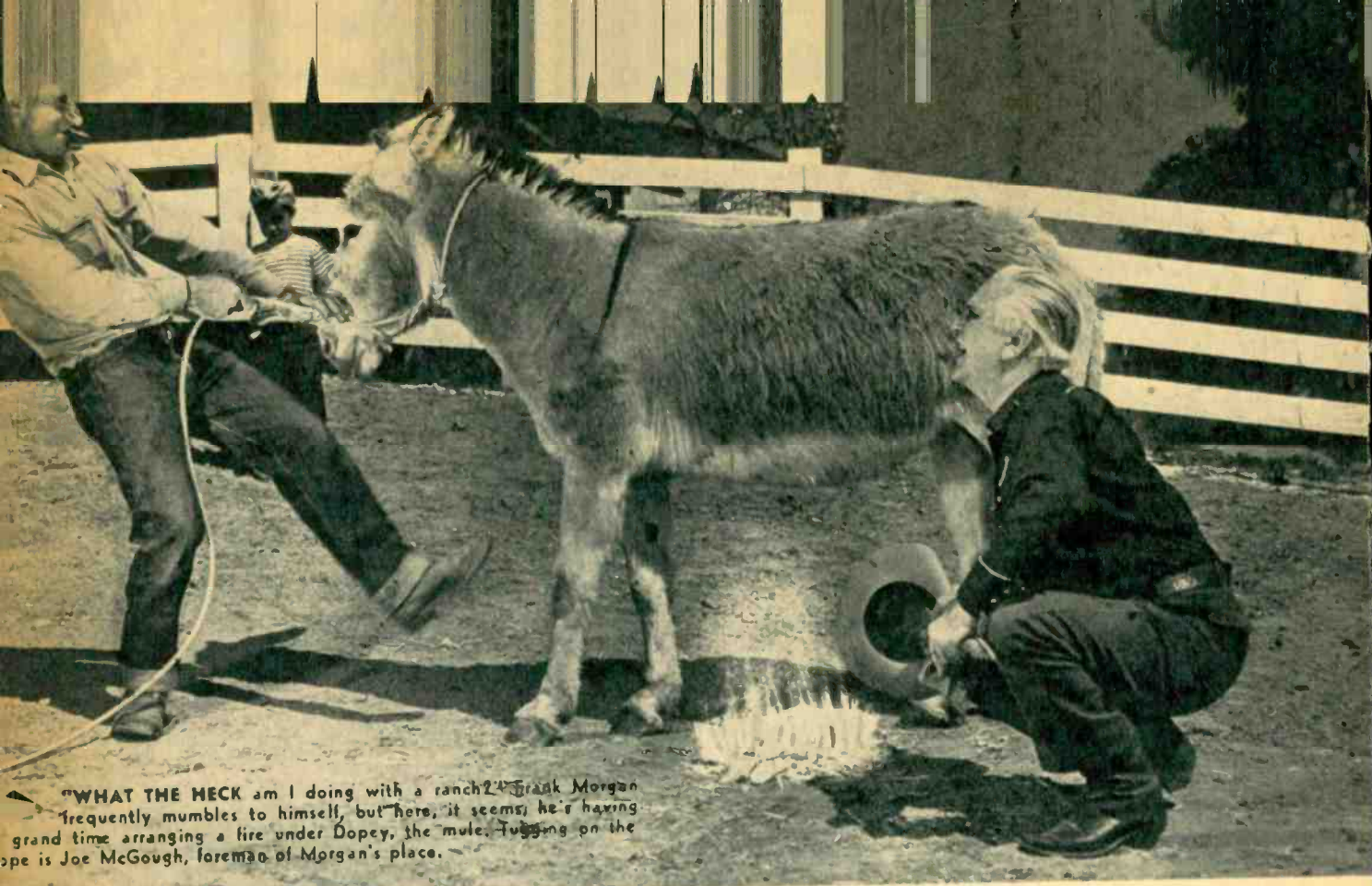

Miracle of Morgan's Ranch

Master of Mendacity "Plays It Straight" When It Comes to His Newly-Acquired Acreage at Hemet

IDROLLED Frank Morgan, "grow the world's finest coffee on my Brazilian plantation. Since coffee arabica, a Rubiaceae plant, was first introduced into Brazil in 1727, the House of Morgan has devoted itself to its cultivation, from my great-grandfather Senhor Dregs Morgan to my paternal gaffer, Silex

Morgan—always in his cups and a bit of a drip.

"When I reached man's estate I began looking for untouched soil on which to found my own coffee dynasty, and explored Brazil from the Amazon to the tip of South America. There I encountered a tribe of wild and beautiful women bearing that name. What a race! But I finally caught one. I was welcomed by the simple aborigines, save for a dark-

skinned tribe of Indians, who were jealous of my light complexion.

"I took out my dice and faded 'em. These amenities over, I set about planting the fertile soil and soon had a bumper crop. Learned the intricate art of planting coffee by just using my bean! As a matter of fact, I developed a coffee that won international acclaim—a special hybrid which I named Gypsy Rose—it outstripped all competition.

Raised Cream

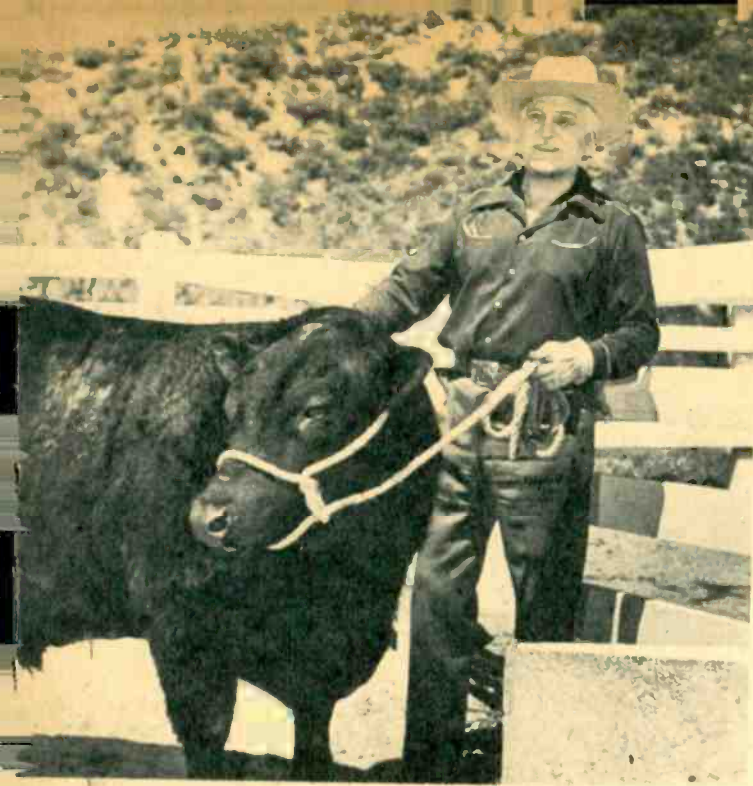
"Later, I expanded my operations to include the raising of cattle—what good is coffee without cream? Giving free reign of my ingenuity, I fed the cattle on the surplus coffee, and they thrived until I could scarcely handle the demand. When I wasn't busy roping the steers, I was over-seeing the shipping. In other words, when I wasn't throwing the bull, I was peddling it!"

A typical Morgan whopper! The kind that has made Morgan the radio fans' master of mendacity and star of his own, bright new show.

In real life, Francis Phillip Wupperman (his real name) "plays it straight," but so accustomed have his friends become to his fabulous ether falsehoods that he has difficulty in making himself believed.

This is especially true of his latest venture, a 600-acre ranch near Hemet.

Until the war, Frank Morgan's favorite pastime was his yacht, The Dolphin. When the Coast Guard took over the yacht, Morgan puzzled

for awhile, then brought to surface a thirty-five-year-old ambition—to own a ranch.

"When I was nineteen or twenty," the distinguished looking, fifty-four-year-old actor remembered, "I came west and spent several months in Nevada. Before that, I'd never been as far as Jersey, but life in the open made such an impression on me that I always yearned for a place of my own. Now that I've got it, though,

I sometimes 'come to' and think, 'What the heck am I doing with a ranch!'"

Breeds Cattle

Because his place is "small," as ranches go, Morgan devotes most of his efforts to breeding fine cattle, the pedigreed Aberdeen-Angus, and to raising Duroc hogs. But there's room, too, for barley and alfalfa, four or five cats, four dogs, three milch cows, peaches, apples, plums, apricots, almonds, cherries, and avocados. Morgan, himself spends the days from Thursday to Wednesday at the ranch, living a typical farm

life (up early, hearty breakfast, outside all day, big lunch, early to bed). A foreman and one helper knuckle down to serious work, the foreman's wife helps Mrs. Morgan to put up fruit—last year about twenty cases.

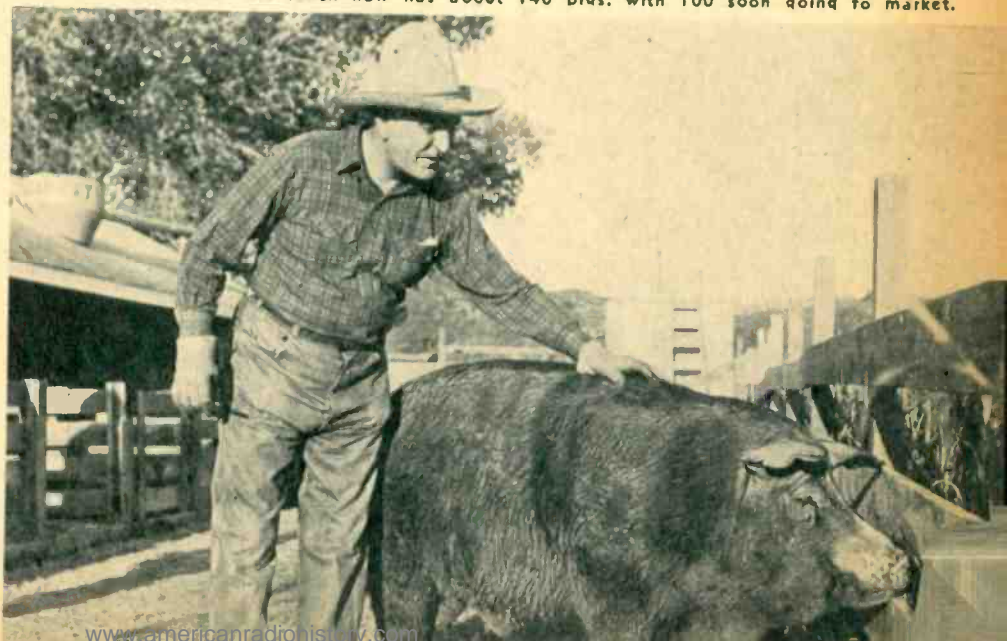
Then, there are horses, which Morgan enjoys. "I've fallen off from every possible direction," he chuckled. And comedy is introduced by Dopey, the mule . . . which doesn't "do anything but eat" . . . Morgan bought Dopey for Mrs. Morgan, who is, incidentally, a great horsewoman.

The ranch house is small—priori-

Hoagy Carmichael Is Likeable Chap With Knack for Making Music; Radio Dialers Meet Him, As He Is, On His New Airshow

THE TROUBLE with Hoagy Carmichael, general Harry Evans, the composer's long-time friend, exploded in our direction, "is that he's too doggone modest!

"Put him at a piano, just singing and playing his own tunes in his own way, and you've got something that can't be beat," Mr. Evans went on with enthusiasm. "That's the way it is, here in his own home, when he's holding open house—but what happens? He always gets the idea that he needs fourteen pieces to back

him up in order to put his songs over for the public."

"I haven't got a voice," protested honest Hoagy.

"But you've got *style!*" countered the indefatigable Mr. Evans.

We agreed, as we stood beside the piano in the living room of Hoagy's beautiful Bel Air home and listened to the "Stardust" man presiding over an impromptu jam session with the cast of his new Mutual airshow, "Tonight at Hoagy's." He was playing and singing two of his own tunes that are much less well known than his immortal "Stardust"—namely, "Judy" and "The Bee." His fingers danced in a nimble pattern over the keys and he threw back his head in animated motions to the lively rhythm of the numbers. We surmised that nobody enjoys music more than this prolific melody-maker who has turned out such all-time favorites as "Lazy Bones," "Blue Orchids," "Little Old Lady," "Two Sleepy People," and "The Old Music Master."

Jam Session at Home

A jam session at Hoagy's house is something to be remembered. Radio listeners who tune in to the composer's Sunday night program get a good idea of what it is like.

But to bring our readers a still more intimate visual view of the goings-on, Radio Life joined the "party" one recent afternoon when Hoagy was holding open house. Our host, himself, met us at the door with his wonderful "make yourself

at home" welcome that puts a person promptly at ease. We found the famed composer to be a pleasant-voiced, lean-faced fellow with a wide, ready smile and a quiet, unassuming manner. He talked with a slow, easy drawl.

"It isn't finished yet," he apologized as we walked through his spacious attractive home, expressing our enthusiasm over its warmth and charm. "When it's finished," he assured us, "it'll be pretty nice."

The Carmichaels purchased the house some time ago, and have been having it redecorated. Although the rooms, in themselves, are especially lovely, the real charm naturally lies in the furnishings that have a sentimental attachment to Hoagy—novel pieces such as the lamps which have been fashioned from trumpets, the wooden wall piece that is carved in the shape of a bar of music, each note holding flowers.

Friend Montgomery

There are two pianos—the small one in the den where Carmichael does most of his composing, and the large one in the living room, which bears a framed photograph of handsome film actor, Robert Montgomery, standing erect in his trim Navy uniform. Now *Commander Montgomery*, on active duty with Uncle Sam's sea forces, the actor has autographed the photo with the words of a catchy Carmichael tune, "The night is damp . . . I'm overdue at camp . . . And it's twenty-two miles from town." At this writing, Hoagy hasn't yet had this number published, but he has presented an autographed original copy to actor Montgomery's twelve-year-old daughter, Elizabeth. Montgomery, we learned, considers it the best of all the tunes this war has produced.

Also on the piano, we found a bound volume containing a stack of Hoagy Carmichael compositions, among them, "One Morning in May," "I Walk with Music" and "Hong Kong Blues." Inscribed on the cover of the volume are the words, "It's Not Commercial." The numbers contained inside, in spite of their popularity, Hoagy calls his "no-hit parade." The inscribed volume was a gift from his wife, Ruth.

The Carmichaels have two boys, Randy and Hoagy, Jr., aged four and six. The youngsters have their own suite of rooms in the Carmichael home, and we weren't at Hoagy's long before he showed us some new

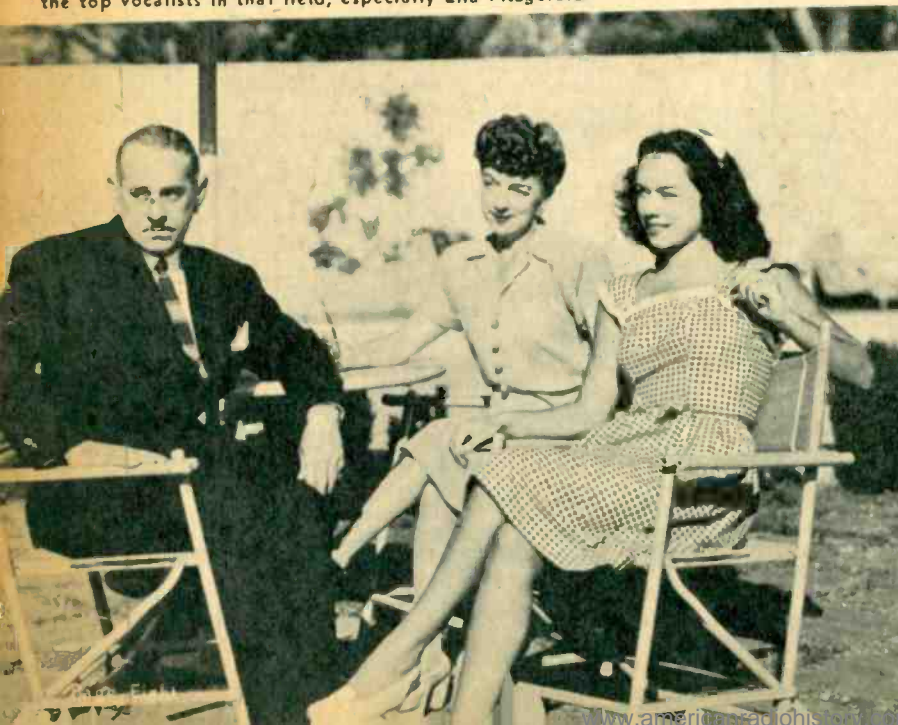

THE ROYALTY of America's entertainment world has a new princess. She is Patrice Munsel, nineteen years old and beautiful. More important, she is possessed of one of the most thrilling voices of the day. A year and a half ago she became the youngest singer to sign a Metropolitan contract and now she is brought to the radio public as star of "The Family Hour" every Sunday afternoon.

Princess Pat is two girls. A poised young lady, with her unusual beauty and voice, she is quite capable of holding her own amidst the most sophisticated of adult groups. Music, of course, is her favorite topic of conversation, but she is well-versed in most popular subjects. Although still a child, she is an unobtrusive intruder in adult life. The reason for this, according to Pat's mother, who is her adviser, manager and constant companion, is that the young singer was always taken on her parents' trips and constantly in the company of older people. Too, since the age of fourteen, especially, Pat has been ultra-serious about voice study—a task that necessitates many hours a day with mature instructors.

Started in Spokane

The year of her fourteenth birthday, Pat was working with a teacher in her home town of Spokane, Washington. One day during a lesson she was overheard by the music director of the CBS radio station and he suggested she sing for Vladimir Bakaleinikoff, the associate conductor of the Pittsburgh Symphony, who was finishing a summer course at the University of Idaho. Bakaleinikoff pronounced her voice "the most beautiful I have ever heard in a singer so young."

The following January Mrs. Munsel took Patrice to New York. The youngster began her study with William P. Herman, a voice teacher who once had won a Caruso scholarship. Also in preparation for a career she studied French, Italian and role in-

portraits of his sons. "They're swell kids," he said proudly.

Hour for Sons

Walter Snow, producer of "Tonight at Hoagy's," told us that the composer abides by a strict rule concerning his boys. The hour before their bedtime is devoted exclusively to them. "I called Hoagy a few minutes before seven one evening to talk over a very important problem about the program," Snow related. "But promptly at seven, Hoagy called a halt to our conversation. He said, 'It's time for me to join the boys now, Walter. I'll call you after they've gone to bed.'"

Carmichael considers his home "the most perfect place in the whole wide world." He smiles, "It's where we have more fun than any place!" The house has a swimming pool and a spacious lawn devoted to the game of croquet.

Before our afternoon's visit drew to a close, our host had been steered to the piano while his guests gathered around him, among them, Harry Evans, Hollywood columnist identified on the show as Hoagy's "permanent house guest"; the Thrasher Sisters, new swing trio heard on the program; Producer Snow; Opie Cates and his inevitable clarinet; Jimmy Briggs and his flute; that suave mikeman, Larry Keating; handsome vocalist, Dave Marshall; that big bundle of rhythm, PeeWee Hunt; and jolly Ruby Dandridge, who fulfills the role of "Ella Rose" on the airshow. The whole room seemed to dance at the command of Hoagy's flying fingers. Everything was very much as it is when the "Stardust" man holds open house on Mutual's airplanes, and radio listeners have the opportunity to join the party.

"Except that, here at home," beamed Harry Evans, "Hoagy has not got his fourteen pieces." Evans told us, too, about the composer's delight in dreaming up children's songs, some of which he has introduced to his airplane audience—tunes such as "The Whale," "Washington" and "Merry-Go-Round."

"What's more," Evans went on, "he wrote a piece for his wedding that is so beautiful, they should toss Mendelsohn out. It's entitled 'I Take Thee,' and I'll bet there's nobody who could listen to it without crying!"

Paints, Too

Modest about his music, Hoagy Carmichael is equally so about his paintings. Of haunting beauty is the portrait of a young boy which he is working on at present. He calls it "The Yearling," and explains that it is somewhat of a composite picture of his two sons.

He waxed enthusiastic about the snow scene, done in water colors,

which adorns the entrance hall of his home. "It's the first one Johnny Mercer painted," he explained. "I think it's very well done."

But when his own paintings were praised, he wrinkled his nose in a frown, and scoffed good-naturedly, "Aw, whaddayuh mean, they're no good!"

ties have prevented more than necessary improvements. The place is equipped with its own light plant, but nary a telephone.

"Whenever an urgent call develops, the studio has to get in touch with me by calling the sheriff. He comes up to my place, flashes his badge, and says 'I want you' and I always answer, 'What have I done now,'" laughed Morgan.

Willing to Learn

There's an encyclopedic lot to learn about cattle breeding and Morgan has assumed the attitude of willing student. Journals on livestock have bolstered his knowledge, and visiting shows and talking with other breeders have been beneficial. His stock now numbers twenty-one, including the prize, 1400-pound bull, J. Bordolier, which he purchased at a Chicago livestock show. (Cost ran into four figures and a bargain at that.) Hercules, the big boar (weight about 900 pounds) came from Pennsylvania. Morgan now has about 140 pigs, with 100 going to market soon.

So fine are his Aberdeen-Angus that two of the heifers from the ranch were solicited as anniversary presents for Fibber McGee and Molly when the Wistful Vista couple recently marked the start of their tenth year on NBC.

Sounds Natural

White-haired Morgan, whose ranch-provoked tan accentuates his handsomeness, has apparently gone overboard in enthusiasm for his land venture. Speaking pridefully as a breeder of prize stock should, however, he is met with quizzically lifted eye-brows and grain-of-salt acceptance of his Morgan's Ranch miracles. It is all so tremendous, it sounds like one of his Maxwell House fabrications. . . . "I have a ten-thousand-acre farm carved from the productive soil of the most fertile and lush valley in California! My farm is a very scientific establishment—the envy of agronomists all over the world. Do I go in for animal husbandry? Well, I never found one that was pretty enough to marr—oh! Animal husbandry! You mean livestock! My herd produces milk with the highest butter-fat content in the world, each cow a pure-bred offspring of Craig's Cutie of Buck's County. I have a thousand pigs who've won blue ribbons at every state fair, including one sow who is so intelligent she can make known

her wishes by simple communications—I receive a litter from her once a year!

"I raise very large potatoes.

Morgan: You've never seen anything like them.

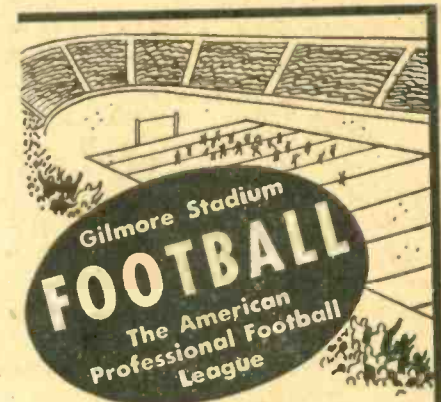

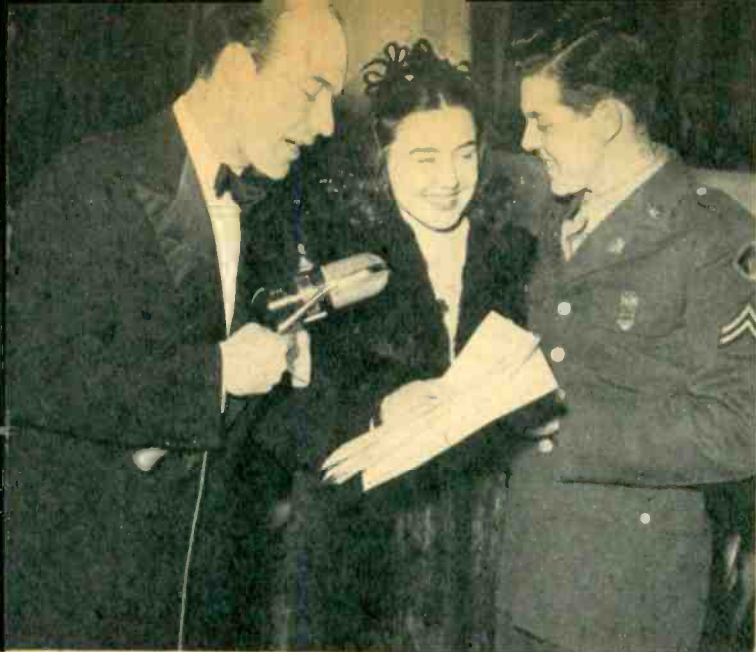

The Ladies Let Their Hair Down

Audience Loses Inhibitions in Wacky Stunts, Songs, and Old Fashioned Slapstick on CBS' "Meet the Missus"

MADAM, have you ever been so mad at your husband you wanted to spank him?" Emcee Jack Bailey asked the buxom female contestant standing before the mike with her somewhat smaller spouse. In response to her giggled "yes," Jack brought forth a paddle, Announcer Jay Stewart drew up a chair for the lady, and a hilarious studio audience watched "the Missus" turn "the Mister" over her knee and administer a good old fashioned walloping.

Such goings-on imply, and rightly, that you should check your dignity at the door when attending a performance of "Meet the Missus," half-hour audience participation show broadcast five afternoons a week from the Earl Carroll theater-restaurant in Hollywood.

Jack Bailey, whose life, one might say, has been one continual question

mark for the last six years—he's quiz-mastered one show after another continuously in that time—pilots people selected at random from the 1000 daily spectators, switching them from one aerial stunt to another. The usual headaches of an emcee on an audience participation program Bailey handles neatly and with abandon. He persuades nervous victims not to freeze up and unbudgingly clutch the microphone, meanwhile to tongue-tied, eases too-garrulous amateurs off the air in time for the show to go on in a very smooth manner.

Questions Purse Articles

More often than not "the missus" will claim that every last article in her usually bulging purse is an absolute necessity. Bailey frequently takes proponents of such claims up on what they say, pays them what he thinks each necessary article is worth, exhibits each item for the amusement and amazement of the other 999 guests. One ordinary-sized

bag was found to contain, in addition to things deemed "necessary" by the master of ceremonies, three half-full packages of cigarettes; five books of matches, two of which were empty; a lipstick case, also empty, which the lady claimed she had been carrying around for a year; a card with a man's name and address written upon it—but whose, she hadn't the faintest idea; and one unmentionable—a garter! Going one even better, a participant on an earlier broadcast, was found packing a hardboiled egg in her pocketbook.

Often the owners are as surprised as the audience over some of the oddments that lurk in the depths of their pocketbooks. Bailey's bizarre evaluation of the trinkets that turn up is always good for a laugh—e.g., 50 cents for a picture of a serviceman, 2 cents for a powder puff.

Approximately \$200 worth of prizes are given away every afternoon on "Meet the Missus." Blankets, dishes, small change, cosmetics, and other sundry articles are generously doled out to contestants, as "thanks" for participating.

Sometimes Sing

Sometimes Jack Bailey whips up a brief community songfest in the middle of the program, other times he wanders around among the tables at Earl Carroll's interviewing and joking with people at random

among the audience. Mrs., Miss and Mr. all unbend, join in the impromptu spirit of the thing, and have a great time.

Bailey's long experience as a quiz-master will crop up, and occasionally a zany little brain teaser on meat points or just about anything creeps into the show. Bailey also has a wide and varied theatrical background—something many a missus would like to have had. When Bailey thinks he has found a frustrated Garbo or Grable he gives her or him a chance to do his stuff, usu-

ally asks a lady to laugh, then to cry into the mike (the two hardest emotions not to "ham"). The results are usually cause for riotous laughter—but all in generous fun.

Servicemen always have a spot on the program, and so does the Mister and Mrs. combination. Longest married and most newly wed couple in the audience are both brought up on the stage on the "Lovers' Lane" part of the show, frequently oldsters volunteer advice to youngsters about "how to hold your man for 49 years" or the like, gifts are

distributed all around, and on with the funny business again.

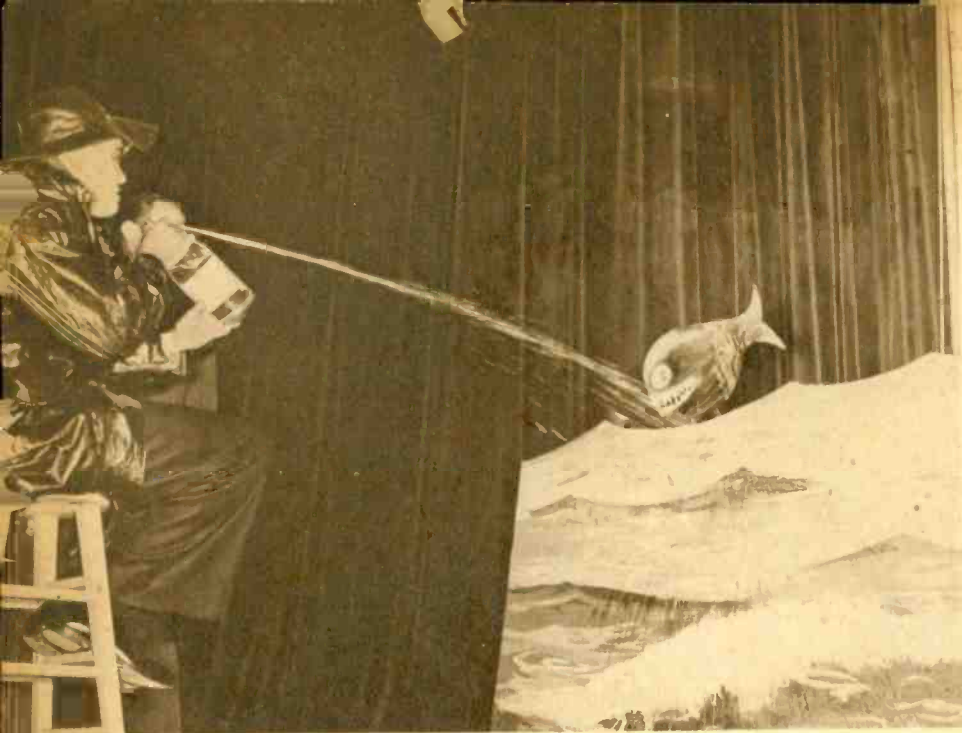

D ID YOU ever try sitting on a radio studio stage before a packed theater, encased in a huge raincoat and a floppy rain hat, and, armed only with a syphon bottle, try to hit a miniature papier mache whale every time it bobbed from behind a cardboard "ocean?"

Sounds screwy, doesn't it? But that's typical of what goes on on the Blue Network's newest and zaniest audience participation show, "Darts For Dough," aired each Sunday over the coast-to-coast hook-up.

"Darts For Dough" is the brain child of Orval Anderson and Bert Mitchell, two Texas radio men. It went on the air over station WFAA, Dallas, a little more than a year ago. During that year the program became the station's most popular offering and as a result won the summer replacement assignment for the Al Pearce-Dr. Pepper series.

Since starting on the air, however, Mitchell was inducted into the army and is now a private stationed at Fort Knox, Kentucky. His wife, Jill Mitchell, has replaced him on the program. She handles the distribution of the cash awards during the broadcast and assists in planning the comedy situations used.

To get back to the whale gag, J. C. Maranto, a Galveston, Texas, sailor, was assigned this stunt after he failed to answer the question given him by Anderson.

"Whale" of a Routine

He was dressed in the oilskin slicker and hat, placed on a stool before the cardboard "ocean" and, every time Dartmaster Anderson blew on a studio sound foghorn, the whale, steered by a Blue prop man, would bob up above the waves. It was Maranto's duty to hit the whale with a squirt from the syphon bottle. And every time he squirted at the whale he was belted in the back of the head with a squirt from another syphon bottle by Frank Graham, Anderson's chief stooge on the show.

Maranto succeeded in hitting the

Ready, Aim, Jackpot!

A New Type of Audience Participation Show That Gives Contestants a Chance To Win Cash Prizes By Tossing Darts

whale six times during the broadcast, thus winning six chances at the dart board. He garnered \$42 in cash with the darts.

Briefly, this is how "Darts For Dough" works. Contestants are selected from the studio audience before the program's start. Each is given a number and is called to the microphone for a routine question. After answering his question correctly, the contestant is given three darts

to throw at the ten-foot-high Dr. Pepper dart board. The board is marked off in circles, each circle representing a cash award ranging from \$2 to \$16. Thus, the contestant can pull down a total of \$48 by hitting the \$16 bulls-eye three times. At the conclusion of the program all the contestants are lined up and are given a numbered dart. The one hitting nearest the center of the bulls-eye is given a \$100 cash award.

If the contestant misses the question he is given a forfeit stunt to perform in order to secure the darts. And that's where the fun comes in.

On Soldier's Lap

Mrs. William Ball, an El Paso, Texas, school teacher, was another of the contestants to miss her question on the premiere broadcast. Anderson called on Private Alphonse Allert of Philadelphia to come up from the audience to assist in the gag. Allert sat on a chair a few feet from the dart board and Mrs. Ball, sitting on his lap, threw her darts. Slightly flustered (to put it mildly) at having to sit on the lap of a soldier, Mrs. Ball threw wildly but managed to hit the \$4 circle.

Picture a half hour of such goings-on and you have an accurate conception of "Darts For Dough." Anderson always manages to hit a fast pace at the start of the program, and he never lets down until the final "this is the Blue Network" fades the program off the air.

Anderson works the show easily and with rapid-fire delivery. His assistants during the broadcast are the pretty Conover model, Poni Adams, who steers the contestants around the stage; Frank Graham, half-pint announcer and actor who is his chief stooge; Ted Meyers, the commercial announcer, and Jill Mitchell, in charge of the awards.

Servicemen and women walk away with a major portion of the prize money, since Anderson selects the uniformed spectators in preference to civilians.

Others Win

One of the contestants on the initial broadcast was Petty Officer George Hodgskin of the British Royal Navy. Hodgskin, whose home is in London, answered his question correctly, threw his three darts and walked away with \$10 in cash.

A sailor, Leon Shulman of Newark, N. J., copped top money on the first program. He won \$10 throwing his darts after answering his question, and came nearest the center of the bulls-eye in the free-for-all, winning the \$100 grand award.

A WAC Sergeant, Ruth Hines of Pulaski, Tennessee, won \$14 after answering her question correctly. She hit the \$10 circle once and the \$2 circle twice.

Private Allert, the soldier who helped the Texas teacher with her penalty stunt, was given a chance at the dart board and won \$4.

Private Harry Kowalski of Chicago hit the "10-2-4" combination—one

dart in each circle on the board—and got \$16.

Listen in on "Darts For Dough." You'll enjoy it—if you can hear the proceedings over the roar of laughter that is almost constant from the audience.

terpretation. In addition, a course of academic studies was prescribed which included history, biography, the classics and English poetry.

By the time she was sixteen she had a range from G below middle C to G three octaves above and was capable of soaring to a B above that. The next year in March 1943 she entered the Metropolitan's Eighth Annual Auditions of the Air and as winner of the finals (at which she sang the Mad Scene from "Lucia di Lammermoor") she was presented a contract with the Opera House to appear in leading coloratura roles.

Will Tour

The following summer she appeared in concerts in Atlanta, Chicago, Denver, Portland, Tacoma and Seattle. This fall she will include a tour of three Canadian cities—Montreal, Quebec and Toronto—in her radio commitments. For this Pat is readying a role she has never performed—Rosina in "Barber of Seville."

But, the sophisticated, poised opera star is not Pat Munsel exclusively. Around girls and boys of her own age she unconsciously drops her adult demeanor and, again according to Mrs. Munsel, giggles with the best—or worst—of them. For all her technical, long-haired knowledge of the opera, Pat is "crazy about" boogie-woogie and is an admirer of such singers as Ella Fitzgerald.

With child-like faith that what is now will be always, Pat doesn't worry about keeping her excellent figure. She indulges in desserts and has frequent chocolate sodas. The most paradoxical thing of all about young Princess Pat is that she doesn't play the piano. With all her musical talent there had to be a good reason. And there is—that age-old child melody: Too lazy to practice!
