Fairy Princess

Shirley Mitchell Says That "Hollywood Is Much Like the Fairy Tales I Used To Read, Except That There Are No Handsome Princes on White Horses"

SHIRLEY MITCHELL "guesses" she's about the busiest radio actress in Hollywood. She thought this was the angle to be stressed in a Life "spread" which recently hit the stands, but instead, the clever blonde thespian was labeled as radio's "fidget" girl.

Shirley doesn't think she's an ex-

ceptionally nervous radio actress. She is always excited before she goes on the air, gets cold hands, but thinks the only fidget gesture she employs is twirling a lock of her yellow hair. "I used to get butterflies in my stomach," she admits, "but I haven't had any now for about a year."

Last summer when she was visit-

ing her parents in Toledo, she got a huge kick out of the cab drivers, who would interrupt the actress' ride to exclaim: "Hey, you're Shirley Mitchell, aren't you? I hear you on the radio!" Beamingly, the Toledo girl who has made good in Hollywood, would acknowledge the tribute to her work as Alice Darling on the "Fibber McGee and Molly" show, the Widow Ransome on "Great Gildersleeve," not to forget her characterizations on the Joan Davis, "Life of Riley," and "Nit Wit Court" programs, her Amelia Rhutassel on "Potluck Party," and her newest creation, Phoebe Peabody on the Jack Carson half-hour.

Dyed-In-Wool Actress

Shirley has been play-acting all her life. By the time she was in the fifth grade in Toledo public school, she had read every fairy tale in the library and lived the part of every character. To find more books to devour, she used to take the street car and ride to the West Toledo Library. Jouncing along on the car, she'd think about herself, wondering how she'd ever get to be an actress if she stayed in Toledo. So active was her imagination and real her play-acting of fictional characters ("I must have been a heck of an introvert!") that her parents became alarmed and when she was fourteen, took her to a psychiatrist, who pronounced her "an introverted introvert."

Today, Shirley believes she is an extroverted extrovert, except when she has to meet new people or make her entry into a crowded restaurant. Her life is so full that when she inherits an evening to spend at home as she wishes, she gets the blues and craves company. She considers herself a fairly good companion, with enthusiasm, keen sense of humor, and a nature sensitive to the moods of those around her. "I don't have to have a cup of coffee when I get up in the morning before I can talk civilly."

Making Money

Three years ago, Shirley came to Hollywood after working in little theater groups in the east, two years of university, a year at the Cleveland Playhouse, and minor radio roles in Chicago. Her talent has only begun to be recognized since she created the Widow Ransome and Alice Darling roles and if the work keeps on coming in the rest of this year as it has so far, she thinks her gross income for 1944 will run around \$2,000 a month. She is appalled that she has been able to save only \$3,000, when she feels that ten times that amount should be in the bank. But her apartment which she shares with Singer Kitty Kallen, costs \$100 a month, the maid charges \$190, her car eats up another hunk, and then she has to buy clothes for her various roles.

"How would this look for Leila?" she asks herself as she studies a dress at Saks. (Leila, or the Widow

Ransome as she is more formally known, likes glamorous fussy things). "This won't do for Alice," she pronounces judgment on a tailored suit. (Alice looks better in unsophisticated pinafores). With studied effort, Shirley manages not to wear the same costume more than once every two weeks. This requires a wardrobe of six dressy dresses, (costing from \$39.75 to \$89.95) half a dozen suits, a few pinafores, a dozen blouses, four pairs of gabardine slacks, plus sport coats and sweaters. She bought her mink coat about two years ago.

Sharing her six-room duplex apartment with Kitty, Shirley has additional advantage of being able to swap clothes with the dark-eyed chanteuse. Up until a few months ago this wasn't possible because Shirley, who stands five foot three, weighed around 140 pounds, took a size 14 dress. By watching her taste for starches and her penchant for snitching between meals (favorite night-time snack: cheese, peanut butter, and jam on crackers) she has pared her figure down to 110 pounds and can wear a size nine or ten dress.

Typical Day

During a typical day, she uses up an enormous amount of energy. Usually up at nine, she showers, gets into a pink crepe coffee coat, and then has breakfast of lemon juice in water, black coffee, and sweet roll. She slips into tailored clothes and packs her make-up kit, sponge for her leg make-up, and dressy dress for the broadcast.

The Man Behind

"The Voice"

Read About Axel Stordahl, the Thirty-One-Year-Old Bachelor To Whom Frank Sinatra Credits A Large Portion of His Success



AXEL STORDAHL, SINATRA'S ARRANGER for the past two years, is a modest man who likes to smoke a pipe, play gin rummy, and sail a boat. He and Frank met when both were working for Tommy Dorsey.

BING HAS his John Scott Trotter. Dinah Shore has her "Ticker" Freeman. The man behind "The Voice" is Axel Stordahl. Of him, Frank Sinatra says: "He is, in my estimation, the greatest arranger of modern times and I owe much of my success to him!"

Axel, who stems from Norwegian stock, is not as rugged looking a Viking as one anticipates. Although he weighs about 165 pounds and stands about five foot nine, his hands are small, his features are concise and neat on a head that is gradually losing its blond hair. Right now he is concerned about his "bay window."

Thirty-one-year-old bachelor, Stordahl met Frank when both were working for Tommy Dorsey, for whom Axel served as arranger for seven

years. He was impressed with Sinatra's attention to lyrics, a passion with Axel, who considers words the most important part of a song. The two got their heads together and made a recording of "Night and Day" on their own, assembling an orchestra for that one session. "The experiment satisfied both of them that they had found in one another their musical complements."

Axel, who has been Sinatra's arranger-conductor for the past two years, would have one believe that he doesn't work very hard, says he'd rather be lying on a boat deck than doing anything else. He sloughs off the actual arranging by mumbling that it takes about three hours to orchestrate a number and that he does his work from 2 p. m. on.

How He Works

Pressed further, the taciturn Axel claims he sometimes works out song ideas with Frank by striking a few chords on the piano, which Stordahl insists he can't play very well. Those who have penetrated his reserve assert that Axel is a fiend for concentrating, point out that he is all business during rehearsals, seldom leaving the podium until the show is off the air. So in accord are he and the singer that Axel anticipates Frank's every phrase, warning the musicians:

"He will take a breath here . . . he will slow down here." Possessing the quiet courtesy that accompanies his reserve, Axel treats his men with noticeable consideration, always worries about their welfare and comfort, seems to be at their disposal, rather than they at his.

Although he has been interested in music ever since high school days when he organized an orchestra and played trumpet, Axel lays no claim to a formal musical education. He prefers to direct with a pencil—a concession of his men who would rather have a baton, but compromise on anything to follow.

Perhaps more than any other person, Axel Stordahl is close to Frank Sinatra, spends much of his time with the family at their Toluca Lake home. In fact, he gave his penguin sail boat to "The Voice," then turned around and spends most of his time with Frank at the lake. He is especially fond of the Sinatras' little girl, Nancy Sandra, and recently gifted her with a bracelet dangling with two charms—a sailor (supposed to represent her daddy) and a small dog—the two things dearest her heart.

Axel has a place on Staten Island, where he used to keep a 42-foot sail boat. He is lamenting its crack-up in the recent hurricane on the east coast. Here in Hollywood, when he's not at the Sinatras', he makes his home at the Sunset Towers on the Strip. His schedule calls for a late bed-time, usually around two or

Norman Corwin:

Writer, Producer, Director,
Practical Idealist, Creative
Genius, Winner of Radio Life's
Distinguished Achievement Award

TOP HAT, white tie and sweat-shirt, Norman Corwin is setting new fashions in radio culture.

The guy is merely sensational!

He'll tell you, very seriously and sincerely, that his aim in life is to create radio programs that are both artistically and socially important.

And then he'll let go with a pun that is so strictly from corn that you turn green around the giggle!

Somewhere along in the middle, between the sublime and the ridiculous, you find radio's Wonder Boy... writer-producer-director, practical idealist, winner of Radio Life's Distinguished Achievement Award for 1944 and the industry's top-ranking creative genius.

Multi-Award Winner

Several years ago, Corwin made the statement that he would accept no assignment not directly connected with the war effort. He's clung to that promise, and out of it have come some of the most important, most inspiring and most talked-about productions ever to emanate from the field of radio drama.

His famous "This Is War!" series brought requests from radio stations around the globe for scripts and recordings. His "American in Russia" was rebroadcast from the shores of the Black Sea to the ends of the Siberian steppes. His "Words Without Music" won an award from the Institution of Education as the radio program "best demonstrating the cultural, artistic and socially important uses of radio." His famous broadcast of December 15, 1941—"We Hold These Truths"—won the Peabody Award for the outstanding dramatic presentation of the year.

His "Passport For Adams" series, starring Robert Young, was an important step toward fostering United Nations unity and understanding through radio. His most recent series, "Columbia Presents Corwin," was cut short so that the master could

devote his entire time and talent to the writing of a special broadcast for V-Day.

Like a fond father worrying over the development of his favorite son, Corwin stews and plans and works over the future of radio. He is proud of radio but sometimes he'd like to turn it over his knees and paddle the life out of it! He sincerely believes that great things will come from the infant industry... and he's impatient for it to grow up. He thinks it's terrific... and he thinks it stinks.

Radio As Power

But like the old-timer who said "I don't care what they say, as long as they talk about me"—Radio doesn't care how Corwin thinks, as long as he thinks about it! Because out of his thinking has come a new, socially-conscious, adult type of radio that is not only here to stay, but is here to grow and mature into something that the world needs desperately, using a powerful, widespread system of communication that has the power, more than anything else known to modern man, to transmit ideas, to unify peoples, to spread creeds, to combat prejudice... and to maintain peace!

But Corwin is no high-brow. He is a firm believer in entertainment and in radio's duty to supply its listeners with laughs as well as with inspiration. He feels that the two elements can and should be combined, for the betterment of both.

He says: "Personally speaking, I want to write and produce radio programs that get undivided attention, with the listener's full concentration. And after he's listened, I want to feel that it was worth it. That is one of my primary aims... to present programs that are both artistically and socially important, and still entertaining in the process. And I don't confine that aim to myself entirely.

King of Hoboes

Art Linkletter brought out onto the Blue's "What's Doing Ladies" stage a small, 62-year-old man. His brown eyes twinkled wickedly and looking from the emcee to the audience he announced: "Americans is gettin' mighty independent since Independence Day. Sometimes I think since Columbus discovered us, we're goin' on th bum, but we 'Bo's' is glad to do our part in helpin' this great country of ours." The speaker was Jeff Davis, life-time president of the Hoboes of America, Inc.

The hobo-king was guesting on a recent program of Art's and Radio Life dropped in to watch the fun. Mr. Davis is in appearance a conservatively dressed gentleman, favoring a lumber jacket, a pair of tweed trousers, a dented-in brown hat, and a green plaid shirt. Incongruous to the rest of his appearance are his jewel-studded belt buckle and his gold tie-pin. The pin contains seven diamonds and a cluster of pearls and was presented to him in London as a symbol of the Hoboes, Inc. The ladies of the audience found partially-bald Jeff a very affable fellow full of advice and home-spun philosophy. He was more interested in telling them of the worthiness of the Hoboes Society than about himself, but was willing to answer all questions.

"Just what is a hobo?" asked Linkletter. A hobo, it seems, is a "boomer" and is often confused with a tramp. Whereas a tramp feels the world owes him a living, a hobo is a traveling worker who is always willing to do his share. Jeff began his travels when he was 11 or 12 and to date has six trips around the world to his credit. He has been married 44 years, has one son, and two grandchildren. His home, which he visits several times yearly, is in Cincinnati, Ohio.

His wife used to travel with him, riding the train while he rode the rods, but he says she got so impatient waiting for him to show up at the end of the trip that he now travels alone.

Emcee Linkletter was knighted into the Hoboes' Society and presented with a gold seal card enabling him to "hit the road" at any time. "I am afraid my traveling days are over," he sighed. "I have a pretty steady job now." Even if Linkletter never uses his membership card, there are some 1,200,000 who

will make up for his absence. Seventy thousand of the "Bo's" are in the armed services with 40,000 hoboettes taking their places.

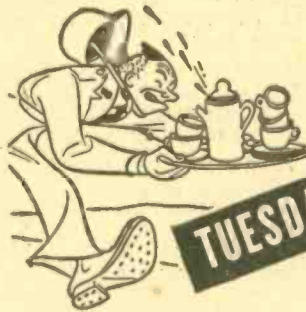

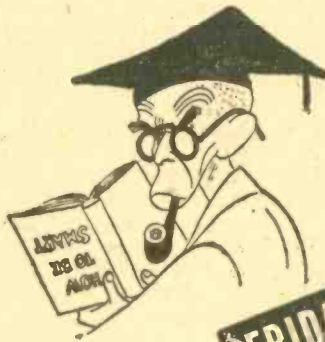

Radio Roundup from KFI

Bing Crosby comes back to his "Music Hall" program this week Nov. 2 after spending a few exciting and thrilling weeks in the European theater of war entertaining men and women of the allied forces. He looks slimmer than when he left, and he had a few close calls—like having bombs explode 50 feet away and passing through a town still in enemy hands... enough to make anyone lose some weight.

The enthusiasm with which Bing was greeted when he appeared before thousands of service people was a tribute to him. But, in typical Crosby fashion, he passed it off with "a familiar face gives our men and women fighting away from home a tremendous lift."

In France Bing moved right up to the front lines, giving shows within a thousand yards of the front to the accompaniment of shells and ack ack guns. He recounts one incident which had a grim side to it. Once during a show in an abandoned factory, he kept telling different platoons and squadrons to meet their commanding officers for immediate action. The next day Bing was entertaining many of the same men at a base hospital. Showing their fine American sense of humor, the boys asked Bing to continue the show where he had been when they went into action.

Bing's Thursday night NBC program is heard at 6 via KFI.

The "General Motors Symphony of the Air" is now presenting noted instrumental and vocal soloists in a six-week Beethoven cycle under the direction of Maestro Toscanini. (KFI at 2:00 p.m.)

The 1944 Beethoven festival represents half of Toscanini's winter engagement—the remaining 16 weeks to be divided for Toscanini and two guest conductors—Eugene Ormandy of the Philadelphia orchestra and Malcolm Sargent of the London Philharmonic.

Here's one for oldsters and youngsters alike—it's the new NBC "Comedy Theater" which stars as emcee, Harold Lloyd, one of the cinemaland's alltime greats. After holding out all these years, Lloyd has finally agreed to head this new air series.

The program, which will be heard via KFI on Sundays at 7:30 p.m., starting Oct. 29, has Claudette Colbert and Robert Young in the starring roles of Preston Sturges' "Palm Beach Story" for the first vehicle.

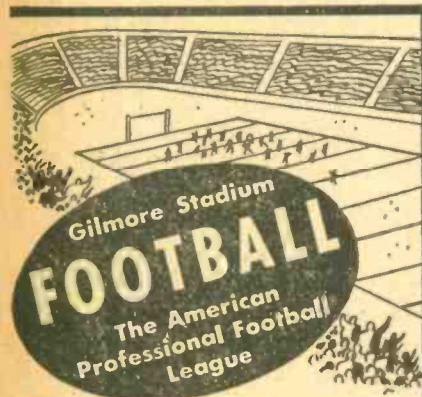

Transit to NBC is accomplished by means of a '41 Ford convertible (Shirley has a B card). She has had the Ford only seven months, before that, owned a convertible Buick sedan which she decided to get rid of because the horn started honking every time she turned the wheel to the left.

Arriving at Radio City, she rehearses for a couple of hours, then has time for salad and coffee at Brittingham's before "Potluck Party" goes on the air. Back to NBC for her first show, she completes her mike stint, then rests and reads a current novel or mystery story in her dressing room before time for the second performance. Dinner is usually enjoyed with other members of the cast, then comes time to read the newspaper before she's on the air again. After that, it's a date to go dancing at the Palladium or to the Players, or she goes home, so tired that it's an effort to hang up her clothes and take off her make-up before falling into bed.

More Personal Data

This past summer she attended the Bowl frequently, and always likes to take in a movie. On Friday nights, she and Kitty often entertain a dozen friends for the charade-type game, Indications. She drinks very little, smokes about half a package of cigarets a day, chews gum when she can get it. Saturday is her "free" day, when she shops and goes to Westmore's beauty salon for "the works," which includes a pedicure "when I feel luxurious."

Now definitely typed as a comedienne and sexy, Shirley still yearns to do dramatic parts. On her roles, she works out the characterization herself. Told that the Widow Ransome was "fortyish, scheming, and Southern," Shirley grooved the impersonation from there on out. "But it was six months before I felt she was someone I knew," she claims.

But Carlos doesn't want anyone to

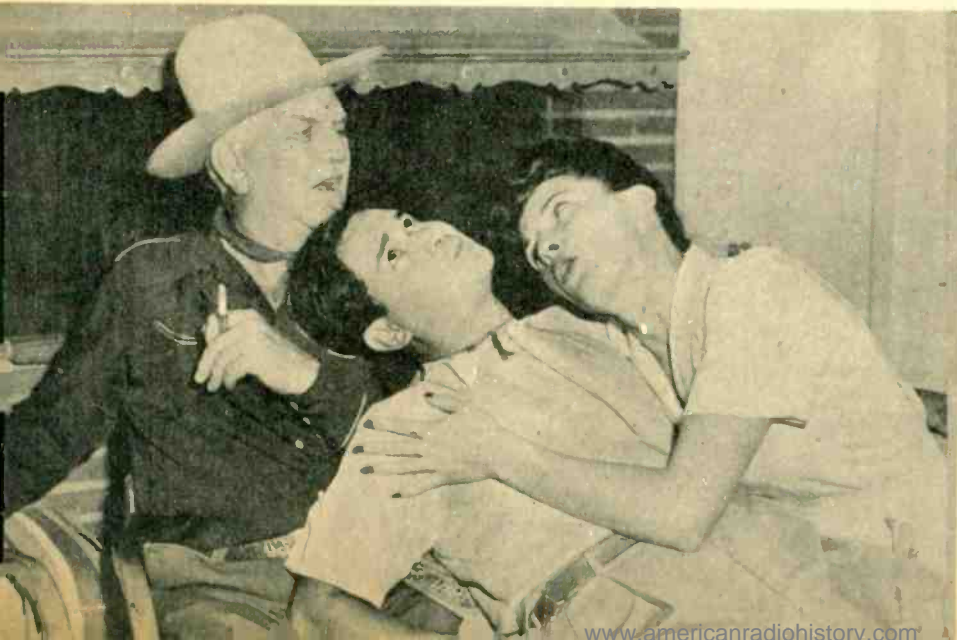

Golden-Voiced

Now, he is delighting nightclubbers, moviegoers and radio-dialers with his distinctive delivery of top romantic ballads, demonstrating the full flexibility of his voice after having already carved a career for himself in the realm of the opera.

Born in Bogota, Colombia, Carlos started singing, at the age of seven, as a boy soprano in a church choir. His father, a jeweler, had plans for his son to take over his own trade, and was not sympathetic to young Carlos' singing ambitions. So Carlos studied secretly at the National Conservatory in Bogota.

By the time he was thirteen, he was singing professionally, and his father was proud. "All the time, I vied for singing honors with another boy in the choir," Ramirez related. "He was more clever, musically, but today, he is still singing in the church. I was more clever, financially!"

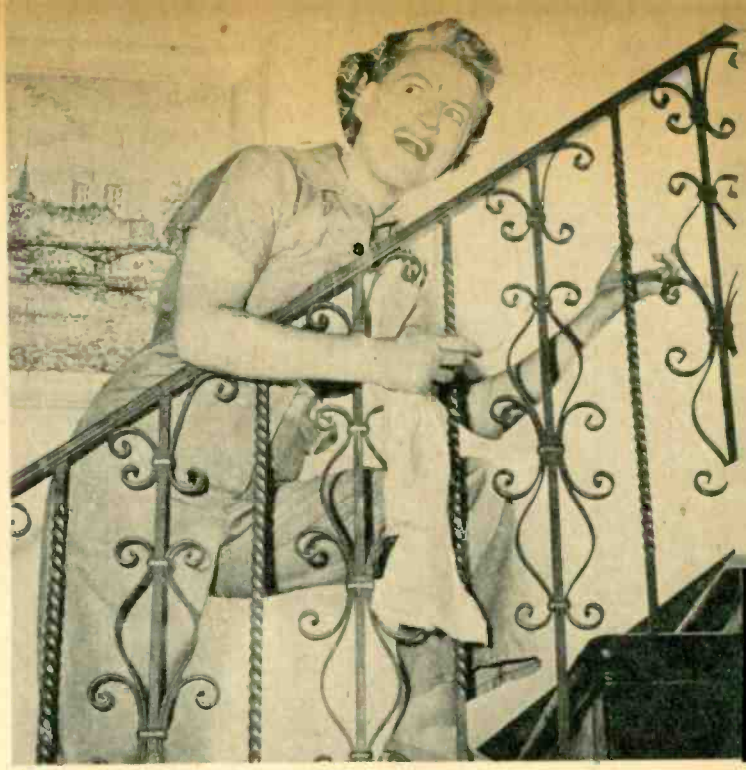

cheerily chirped on. "'e's doin' the plasterin'." She told us her husband and her father were doing most of the remodelling.

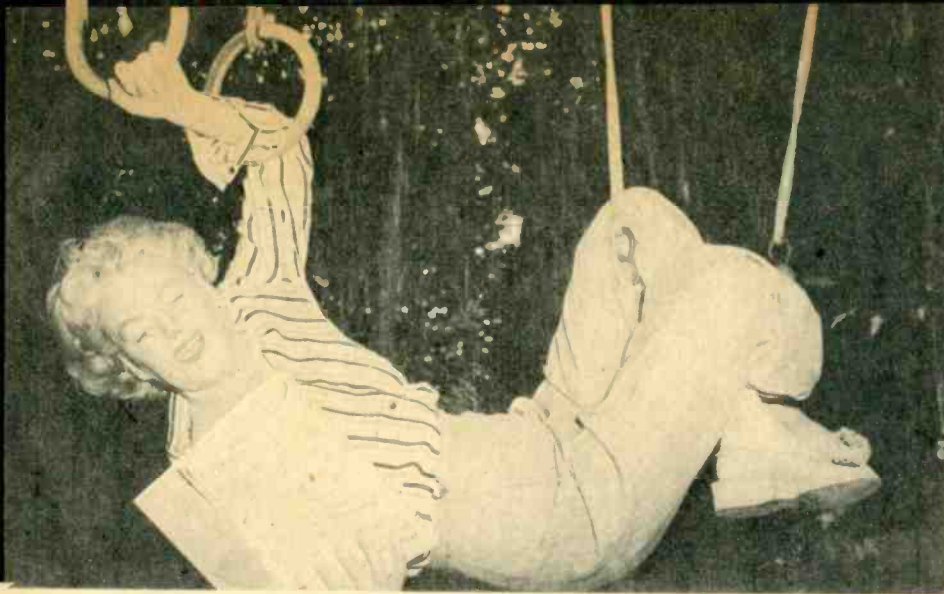
"We're always decidin' on somethin' new to do to the 'ouse," she chirped again. "Bein' English, I like doors. I've added three to this 'ouse already."

A LITTLE thirteen-year-old girl heard her favorite movie star panned by a famous Hollywood commentator and became hopping mad. "Hollywood Trends" is made up of movie colony chatter and includes humorous and interesting incidents, but excludes vital statistics—marriages, divorces, etc. Betty always features a guest star on her program, has introduced people of varying ranks in the indus-

try from producers to propboys. Among her interesting guests have been Willie DeMond, who makes everything from flesh mesh to diamond studded stockings for the stars, a masseur from Paramount, who helps keep the stars in shape, a lady production estimator, plus dozens of stars themselves: Belita, Eleanor Powell, Dick Crane, and many others.

Sometimes It's Hectic

A one-woman show can be quite a nerve-wracking proposition, some of Miss Phillips' experiences in broadcasting would lead one to believe. Once she was half way through the program when she discovered that almost a third of her script was missing. At the last minute she had been switched to another studio, had left part of the script in the other room. So, to the amazement of the boys in the control booth, who saw with dismay what was happening but too late to do anything about it, she proceeded to ad lib the rest of the fifteen minutes. It wouldn't have been so amazing if she hadn't done it almost word for word like the original script. "That's the beauty of writing your own," she averred.

Another time a well-known character actor was so beset with mike fright, was so pale and shaking with nervousness that little Miss Phillips, she's only 4 feet 11 inches tall)

frantically gestured, finally got someone to bring in a chair for him. She was afraid he'd faint. A bit on the bulky side, the actor, when he saw what was happening realized the ludicrousness of the situation, snapped out of it in a minute. The picture of the alarm which his huge prostrate frame before the mike would have caused the little girl must have done it.

Is Dual Person

Betty is a dual personality in a way. Not only a capable compiler of choice Hollywood chatter, she is a college girl. This year she graduated from UCLA with her teaching credentials. Drama was her forte while on the Westwood campus—she was active in Campus Theater. Her education prepares her to teach dramatics, but these long years of radio have made their mark and she thinks she'll stick to that exclusively. She hasn't missed a broadcast in nine years, and hasn't had a real vacation in all that time because of her weekly program. "Now that I've made up my mind that it's to be radio, I hope I'll continue to be so busy I'll have no time for vacations," she told us.

Betty Phillips is engaged to a college sweetheart, Dave Kaplan, now a sergeant in the Army Medical Corps. They plan to be married as soon as he comes home from the war.
