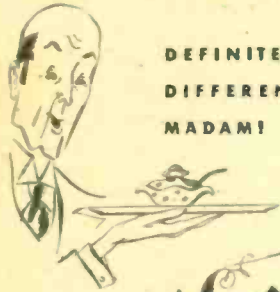

ANNE STONE'S husband is a hobbyist, and since their marriage, some six years ago, the versatile radio actress, who is the vivacious "Marie Duchene" of Mutual's "The Count of Monte Cristo," has become a hobbyist, too. Her husband is Major Ted Sherdeman, radio writer-producer who is now radio officer, stationed in New Guinea, in charge of radio operations in the Southwest Pacific.

The Sherdemans have collaborated on several radio scripts, among them "Latitude Zero," in which Miss Stone also played a starring role. The actress is a talented writer of poetry, in particular, and one of her poems, "The Brass Tag," was especially well received when read by Georgia Backus on Hedda Hopper's "Brent House" program.

But, in addition to their writing, the Sherdemans share other hobbies, including wood-carving, tile work and furniture refinishing. Frequent-

ly from his post in New Guinea, Anne's husband sends her water-color scenic views of the down-under country which he has painted during his off-duty hours. Anne also displays a flair for interior decorating, a fondness for antiques, and she has become quite an expert on Old English Bristolware.

Learned Golf

As for athletics, the actress again followed the lead of her husband and learned his favorite sport, golf. "But," she frowns, "I'm still better as an 'armchair' golfer than as a partner on the fairways."

When Anne Stone first came to Hollywood, she concentrated on screen work. Then radio beckoned when a friend asked her to take the dramatic assignments on the biographical "Coronet" series produced by Kay Van Riper. Since then, Miss Stone has become familiar to airplane audiences with her work on such airshows as Jack Benny, "Sherlock Holmes," "Mainline," "Red Ryder" and the aforementioned "Count of Monte Cristo."

AMONG THE GIFTS which Frank Sinatra received last Christmas from his wife was a gold cigaret case engraved:

"From your Number One Fan Club
President, Nancy
Secretary, Nancy Jr.
Treasurer, Frankie Jr."

That just about tells the whole story as far as life goes in the Sinatras' "Warm Valley" home. It's simple and it revolves around the master, who was bread-winner last year to the tune of a million dollars and who is beaming over a new one-year contract to broadcast for Max Factor.

Piquant-faced Nancy Sinatra deserves a generous back-pat for keeping home that way. Although fame has skyrocketed her husband and coincidentally, herself and their children, into a rarified atmosphere, she seems to have kept her poise and sense of values. She doesn't mind donning a kitchen apron when necessary and doing the cooking and she assumes the handling of all the family's personal finances. She may well be justly proud of the job she did redecorating (with limited wartime selection of materials and furniture) the recently-purchased, pale pink stucco whose nine rooms overlook spring-fed Toluca Lake. But primarily, she's the helpmate who has adjusted herself and her household's life to the requirements of her famous husband.

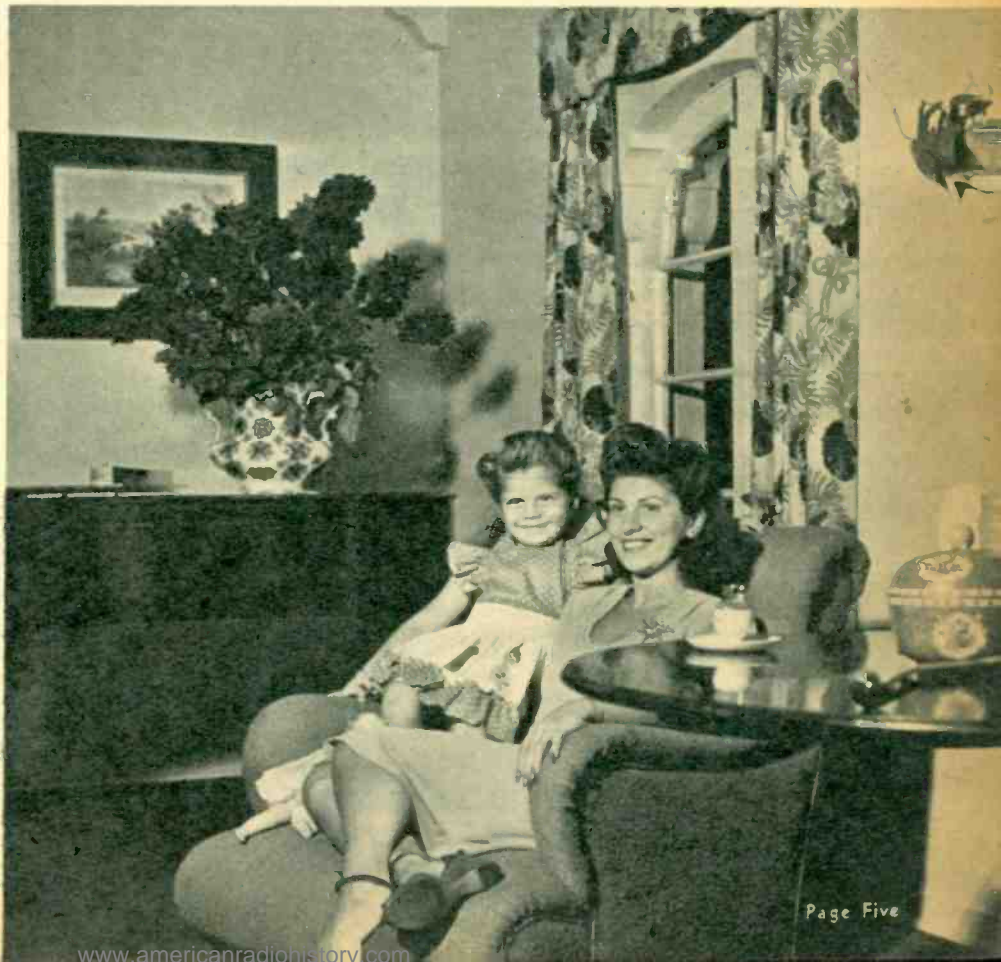

Murrow Here

Edward R. Murrow, chief of Columbia Broadcasting System's foreign correspondents, sat down the other day in a CBS studio opposite News Analyst Harry W. Flannery and painted a vivid picture of wartime London that listeners won't forget for a long time.

The broadcast was "ad lib"—a momentous thing for Murrow who reminded Flannery, former CBS Berlin correspondent, that in Europe broadcasters use written scripts which are scrutinized pretty carefully in advance by censors.

Said Murrow: "London is tired, terribly tired. Something happens to people just as the result of that heavy sky when you're not certain whether bombs are coming down or whether it will be V-1 or V-2. And the rations have not improved much. The weekly meat ration is twenty-five cents a

week. The clothing ration has not been relaxed. People on the street appear rather dull and, to me at least, it's surprising that they still seem neat... for most of the women have not been able to buy new clothes... since the war began. I should say that while people's nerves are rather on edge, their tempers a little shorter than they used to be... they are not depressed, they're still as dogged and determined as ever and... the people, not just the Parliament or the Prime Minister, are also determined that they are going to play such a part as they can in ending this war with Japan."

Murrow said that "the seriousness of discussions on international planning" in the United States... "Not only in Congress, but in the country" ... is one of the most encouraging and exciting things he has seen since his return.

Crepes Visual

Maestro of the chafing dish, Pierre, heard every Wednesday on Marion Lee's KPAS "Woman's World," is going to have a lot of folks in New York drooling.

Last week, the famous concocter of crepes suzette left for the east, where he will compete in the national contest to crown the king of crepes. Pierre has come away with national honors for the past three years.

But this year something new has been added. The chef will make his "pancakes" for the television camera and we'll wager a lot of video fans will wish they could jump a magic carpet and come back with Pierre to eat crepes at his San Marino restaurant.

record to play on the little white machine which was also all her own.

In the flagstone fireplace, soft flame licked at a giant eucalyptus log. "Frank loves a fire," laughed Tina, "and he nurses one along while there's anything left to burn."

He happened to be in Palm Springs and talking to his wife on the phone, so while she was tied up, Tina took us on an inspection tour of the house. We noted that the living room was furnished in bright, warm colors, accentuated with deep dubonnet, rich green, and soft yellow and blue. From antique shops, Mrs. Sinatra has collected semi-precious pieces of China, including a number of Dresden objects, a Meissen and several blue and white English china pieces (like the large old-fashioned basin on the piano in which flowers are arranged). On the piano, too, were busts of Chopin and Gershwin; on the coffee table was a Bavarian candy dish; and on the mantel was a set of old apothecary tools in burnished brass.

Den Is Mannish

Next, we inspected Frank's den, very mannishly done in red leather upholstery and redwood panelled walls. In the adjoining dining room, gay with rose-sprinkled wall paper relieved with soft green rug and draperies, there stood a large silver bowl brimming with fruit. The table was set with Rosenthal china and the silver, Tina said, was George and Martha pattern of the House of Westmoreland. Chairs of the Chippendale dining set were covered with a rose material to complement the wall paper. Through the window we could see the sloping yard and Frank's boats.

Very jolly was the next step—the playroom, with jaunty plaid curtains, bar, pin ball and fortune telling machines, record changer, and rough-hewn round tables mounted on small barrels to match the barrel-seated chairs. Decorating the walls were some of Frank's pet clown cartoons, effectively framed on green linen. In this warmly informal room the family, when alone eats most of its meals and at dinnertime, small Nancy's pajamaed figure is usually perched on her daddy's knee.

Go Upstairs

The upstairs was just as homey. The master bedroom was carpeted in blue and had a blue quilted bedspread which went happily with the blue-striped wall paper and the rose-figured curtains. The entire bedroom set was brought from the Sinatras' Hasbrouck Heights home. The night stands on either side of the master bed were done in beige leather to match the bleached effects contrasting throughout with the rich mahogany furnishings.

The nursery was a dainty delight

with its waxed birch miniature furniture, the wall paper in circus motif, and the red gingham flounces bordering the bed and crib. Sharing a room are Nancy Sandra and Tina, who, as Frank's secretary and general aide around the household, is indispensable.

When Frank is not making a picture, home life, of course, is much better regulated than when he is on the set. Because Nancy and Frank became accustomed to late bedtime when he sang with dance bands, they still find their most companionable hours chatting or playing records after the rest of the house has settled down. Consequently, they sleep a little later in the mornings, thanks to Frankie Jr's capable nurse, Miss Quall, who gives the baby his early breakfast and sends small Nancy off to school.

After Frank has gone to the recording or radio studio, Nancy busies herself with her executive chores, supervising a gardener who comes regularly, a washwoman, and a three-times weekly general help girl. Otherwise, she and Tina manage all the work. Sinatra's long-time helper, Ritchie, attends to the three cars—the town car and convertible, both Cadillacs, and the station wagon,—and helps wherever else he's needed.

Nancy Is Practical

Nancy likes to go shopping, but she seems to have inherited from her frugal Italian parents a fortunate practicality that refuses to go wild on lavish purchases. She buys simple frocks, but don't be misled into thinking that her things are cheap. In fact, both she and Frank have always insisted on getting good merchandise. It was Frank who bought Nancy a mink coat when he was still singing with Dorsey's band. With some of the first money he made as a star, he bought her a handsome baquette diamond ring. On his last trip to New York he purchased a stone marten jacket for her. At Christmas time he gifted her with a ruby pin and was radiant with little-boy pleasure because he'd designed it himself.

But as much in contrast to expensive jewels are the two wedding rings Nancy wears. One is a plain gold band; the other plain white gold. She told us, that Frank had found it impossible to wear his white gold wedding ring when he started working in pictures. So he had it sized to fit Nancy's finger with the idea that she could have a wedding ring in each color to match her costume jewelry. She's so tickled with it, and sentimental however, that she usually wears both rings all the time.

Nancy likes to do most of the cooking because she flavors things as Frank likes his food. She spices sausages and cooks spaghetti with a special sauce, keeps desserts simple on account of the children. A year in stock followed, and a trip to Hollywood resulted in an assignment to a Warner Brothers picture with the late John Barrymore. Soon after, she turned to radio.

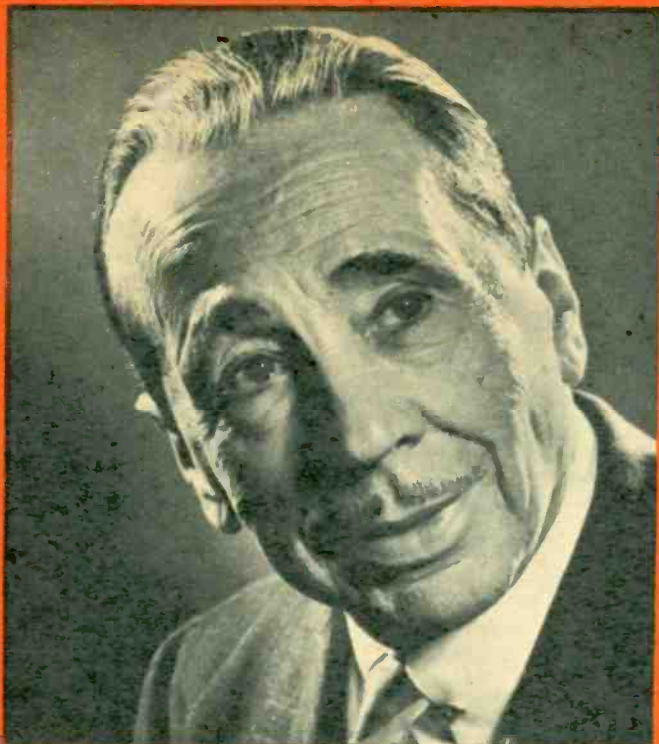

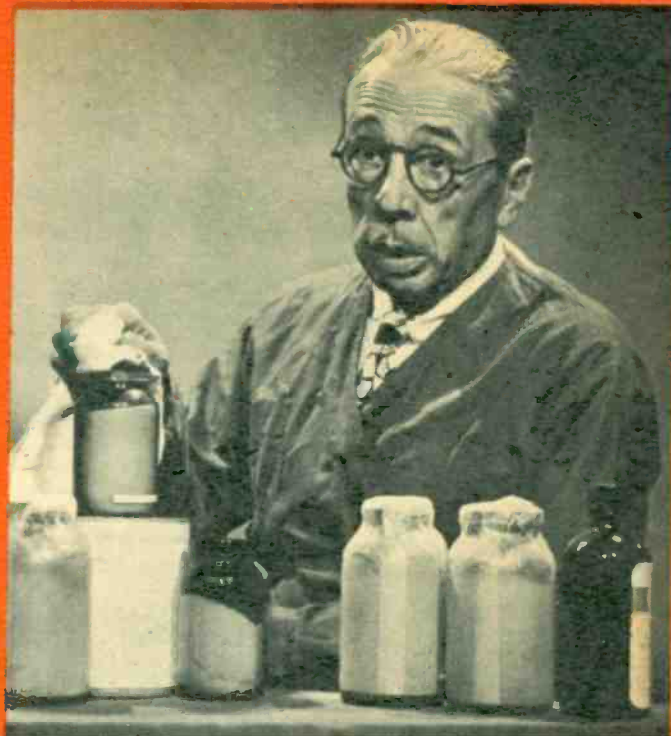

"Ump" we grunted as a strange object came flying through the air and landed somewhere in the region of our middle. "Peavey" was only welcoming his guests in his best cocker spaniel fashion.

"He's the only real 'Peavey' I know of," laughed Alice LeGrand. "He got his name because he looks like Dick sounds. Come on in and see 'Peavey's Drugstore'."

"The Drugstore," it seems, is Mrs. LeGrand's ornate dressing table which is covered with every shape, size and kind of perfume bottle in

existence. "Now," pointed out the actor's wife, "you can say you've seen everything."

In addition, it disproves any ideas one might have that radio is an easy game. For most of your airplane favorites, it is a long, exhausting grind.

Jim Doyle doesn't have any day off. His many air activities leave him little time to enjoy his charming home and family.

interests to save as much as possible when the handwriting appeared on the wall. The Nazis, on the other hand, know that when they quit fighting, they are all through. So it's a fight of self-preservation for them. As long as the Nazis can control the people and make the German soldier fight, the war will go on. There's not much use," Pierce emphasized, "to cease what you're doing if the alternative is worse."

Japanese View

As far as the Japanese war is concerned, Pierce expressed the belief that the Philippines could have been circumvented, and that it might have been better instead to have made straightaway for the China coast. "In my opinion," he said, "the ultimate defeat of Japan is going to be sealed on the battlefields of China and Manchuria. From a military standpoint, Germany was defeated the day she started to invade Russia. But we can still lose this war," he warned as his weather-beaten face clouded. "We won't lose it from a military standpoint, but through the apathy of the American people.

"I'm wondering," he concluded on a grim note, "whether I'll live to see the end of it."
