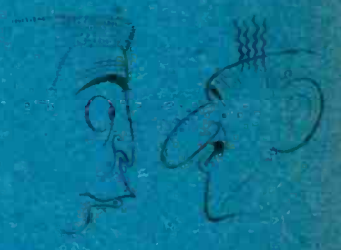

YES" grinned John Whedon and Sam Moore together. "We both have children." Family men, they willingly admit that they draw from their own home lives in assembling ideas for "The Great Gildersleeve's" antics which weekly amuse Sunday radio dialers and which won for these prolific scripters honorable mention in Radio Life's Distinguished Achievement Awards of 1943.

Take "Craig," for instance. Every "Gildersleeve" listener is familiar with the bothersome little boy who so frequently rings the doorbell of the Gildersleeve menage, only to be bluntly directed by Leroy to "Go home!"

"Craig" is the brain-child of writer Whedon. "Craig's" real-life counterpart is a curious little youngster who is always turning up on the Whedons' doorstep.

Then there was the sequence in the "Gildersleeve" script when Leroy was taking piano lessons, much to the distraction of the entire household. Leroy's tuneless, repetitious renditions of a Bach minuet enraged Gildy and had the audience rolling in the aisles with laughter.

Scripter Moore gave birth to that sequence. "When my family heard it, they nearly fell off the couch. We'd been going through exactly the same thing in our house with my own son. His Bach minuet was driving us mad."

Need A Marjorie

Moore has two boys—twelve-year-old George and fourteen-year-old Sam. Whedon has a son, Tom, aged thirteen; and a daughter, Jill, aged nine.

"We need an older daughter," they grinned, their thoughts on Gildy's niece, Marjorie.

Asked if they had any plans to

marry Marjorie off in some future "Gildersleeve" script, they countered, "Do you think Li'l Abner will ever marry Daisy Mae?"

The writers admitted that they keep no record of vital statistics for reference when writing new episodes of the "Gildersleeve" adventures. "We have all the back scripts, but never can find what we want in them. We're always forgetting things like Gildy's address or Mrs. Peavey's maiden name. We probably make plenty of mistakes."

In the main, the characters of the "Gildersleeve" show are not patterned from any of the writers' friends or acquaintances. "Although," they added, "we suppose most of them are really unconscious composites of people we know."



LOOKS AS THOUGH "Gildy" has a suggestion to make, but Moore and Whedon have to be convinced. The writing partners work together on the Monday preceding the broadcast, form a script outline, then split the sequences between them and work apart until the following Friday. "Sometimes," they confess, "we cheat by telephone."

The scripters don't call their writing "inspirational." "We call it desperational!"

The partners work together all day on Monday for the following Sunday's show, forming an outline of the script. The sequences in it are then divided between them, with each of them going to their respective homes to work on their individual assignments. They don't see each other again until Friday morning ("Sometimes we cheat a

had once been mine, the Japs had built a Shinto Temple—a room within a room—where they prayed for divine help for battles." The rubble heaps of the once beautiful Manila were appalling, according to Nelson. "It seems as if there's so much that there would be nowhere to push it aside or enough people to clear it away."

Double V-E Day

"What we were really fortunate to have," he said, "was a preview of a post-war tourist's air cruise. The public relations official who conducted the tour for us was an inveterate souvenir collector who took us to many unscheduled destinations. I told him that I thought he went to Suva for suva-nirs and stopped at Samoa for Samoa! Pun," added Mr. Pringle. The "itinerants" met MacArthur in the Philippines, where the General spoke to them for forty-five minutes. Pringle says that nowhere in the Pacific did he get the impression that anyone suspected that they were in the closing phases of the war. V-E Day arrived while he was in Sydney, Australia, and by crossing the international date line he saw the same celebration one day later in Wellington, New Zealand and the next day in Auckland.

Nelson's nickname is "Pete," which was hung on him while he was a cadet at West Point. He claims he has a "sort of silly card index mind," the result of having an educator for a father. "He used to try out all the intelligence tests on me," said Pete—pardon, Nelson—"Incidentally, he's retiring this year as Commissioner of Education of the State of New Hampshire. But about this mental filing system of mine. I'll read a little news item and something will click in my mind—a name—and I'll remember that somebody by the same name was arrested years ago in Cincinnati as a member of a Black Dragon society. I look it up, and what do you know—I'm right! It's very helpful in giving the background to the news. However," he added sadly, "I can't remember when or with whom I have appointments on the same day."

Nelson still gets up at 4:00 a. m. "The most important news breaks in the morning between 4 and 8, and I want to be on hand when it comes over," he explained. Now that there's a peace on, Nelson thinks that the news should be doubly important to everyone. "The war news traveled in Patterns, but peace news will travel in no familiar patterns and will personally affect every man, woman and child in the world. News

Peregrinations of Pringle

Nelson Pringle's Report of His Pacific Air Tour Included Some Miscellanea on The Habits of Koala Bears and What to Expect of News Analysts in Television

YOU WOULDN'T think so to hear his news broadcasts, but Nelson Pringle, news analyst for the Columbia Broadcasting System, admits to being a hobo. Jeff Davis, King of the Hoboes, made him an Honorary Hobo in Good Standing; but that's another story. Pringle considers himself an itinerant correspondent because of his seven weeks' trip through the Pacific War theater this summer by

C-54. His tour covered 25,000 battlefront miles throughout the Pacific. Nelson was the only radio man in the group of 15 press syndicate members on the tour. He had spent many years in the orient and the Pacific as a newspaper and radio man, so most of the territory was as familiar as home base. "When I saw the terrible destruction that had happened in Manila, I went to the Army and Navy Club to see what was left of a room that I had once occupied. The building was still standing, but in the room across from the one that

Silver Anniversary

KNX, the 50,000-watt key station for the Columbia network in southern California, last week celebrated its twenty-fifth anniversary.

The event was observed with a series of special programs, and a display in the Columbia Square lobby which showed interested onlookers a tiny fifty-watt transmitter, crystal sets and other early style radio equipment.

Station KNX first went on the air with a ten-watt transmitter—at that time one of the largest sets in the west.

Polly Patterson

Polly Patterson, well known to radio audiences and newspaper readers, died Friday, October 5, at her home. Miss Patterson was 49 years of age.

Born in Fort Wayne, Indiana, and graduated from Milwaukee-Downer College, she has been professionally engaged in the field of home economics for the past thirty-two years.

She was formerly known as Prudence Penny of the Los Angeles Examiner. As Prudence Penny she made seven pictures with Pete Smith at MGM and won the first academy award for shorts several years ago.

In addition to authoring two cook books, the "Prudence Penny Cook Book" and "Victory Vittles by Polly Patterson," she had her own syndicated newspaper column, "Polly Patterson's Pantry."

Collins' Aid

Chuck Collins, NBC blind pianist and philosopher, has offered his years of understanding for the need of veterans to acquire knowledge and confidence, despite their handicaps, to the patients at the Veterans Hospital at Sawtelle.

Sorely in need of occupational therapy and entertainment for some time, the veterans of World War I and II will, through Collins' efforts, benefit by his shows in the separate wards and for the overall ambulatory personnel in the recreational hall. He will hold classes for the blind in Braille reading, Braille typing, and piano-tuning, in all of which he is a master, having been without sight since the age of five. It is expected that these sessions will give a new lease on life for those who have never

had the encouragement or will to overcome their outlook on what the future holds for them.

Claudia's Return

"One Man's Family" fans were thrilled and delighted to learn of Claudia's return to the fold of the family. Claudia, who was formerly portrayed by actress Kathleen Wilson, had not been heard for several years. But with her reappearance last week, fans were happy once more.

Only it was not Kathleen whom they heard. It was Barbara Fuller, a young and clever miss from Chicago. Selected from several aspirants, Barbara fulfilled the requisites required by writer Carlton E. Morse to play Claudia. Mr. Morse was pleased, "the Family's" fans were pleased and Barbara was thrilled at the chance. "I hope they'll like me," she modestly stated.





little by telephone!") when they get together with their completed work "to see how well it fits." On Friday, the entire cast assembles for a script reading and preliminary rehearsal. "We don't wait until Saturday," they pointed out. "We save that day for an emergency—which so far hasn't happened."

Whedon's Background

John Whedon is a former member of the New Yorker's editorial staff. Dramatic skits for the Rudy Vallee program, then script assignments on several top variety shows preceded his writing contract for "The Great Gildersleeve." Born in New York City on November 5, 1905, John attended schools there and was graduated from Harvard. He lives in Brentwood, is happy in California, but misses New York.

Sam Moore was working on the New York Herald-Tribune as a reporter when he was offered triple the salary to work for an advertising agency. His first broadcast writings were for "The Davy Tree Surgery Hour." Later he wrote for such network shows as the "Kraft Music Hall" before taking the "Gildersleeve" assignment. He is a native New Yorker, born on November 2, 1904, and is a graduate of the University of Michigan. He now lives in Hollywood, is happy in California and does not miss New York.

Neither of the writers' wives is a professional. "Just understanding," grinned the boys.

Both Whedon and Moore work at typewriters—Moore employing the professional touch system, Whedon struggles along with his middle finger hunt-and-peck method.

Going Crazy

Neither works without interruptions. Moore writes in his study with two phones at his elbow "and people going up and down the stairs all the time." It was formerly the office of a psychiatrist, "and sometimes I think I'm going crazy. I am."

Whedon recently moved and has no study in his present house. "The other day I even had a piano tuner to cope with. Also, there's 'Craig,' He keeps ringing our doorbell because he likes to hear it chime."

"You can see why our scripts sometimes sound so disconnected," the writers chorused. "That's why they're full of so many exits and entrances."

Asked if either of them aspired to more serious writing, they grimaced, "If you think this isn't serious, you're crazy!"

from the Pacific will be especially important. Watch China—she's coming up from the canvas, and our help in her recovery will aid in her future greatness."

Bottom of Class

Nelson went to West Point for two years. "Yes," he sighed, "after two years I hit the bottom of my class in mathematics and then the bottom dropped out. I guess they figured I'd be the kind of an officer who would miscalculate everything and turn the artillery on my own men." Douglas MacArthur was Superintendent when Pringle was a cadet. MacArthur had the highest grades in all subjects, not only during his years at West Point, but for all other years, too. He holds the record.

The Pringles live in the Valley in an Hawaiian type home. Though he was originally a downeast Yankee, Nelson loves the Pacific islands, particularly Hawaii, and right now is engaged in planting tropical shrubs around the patio of his home. His son Robert, 18, is in the army, and he has two little boys, Jimmy, 5, and Peter Michael 3. Until he left, Robert was his dad's authority on ships and planes. "I'd hear of the sinking of a British cruiser and in the middle of the night I'd dash in to Bobby's room and say 'what do you know about such-and-such a boat.' 'Oh, Dad,' he'd say waking up, 'for heaven's sake!' and he'd reach into his bookcase, pull out a book and show me a page telling all about the boat I was interested in. Then he'd go back to sleep." Pringle brought the little ones animal books and geographies from his Pacific tour. We were treated to an excellent imitation of a lackadaisical Koala bear in the Sydney zoo, eating his special eucalyptus shoots and being blase about visitors. "They're so darned snooty," exclaimed Pringle.

Television Comments

When asked to explain what he thought would be the news analyst's place in television, Nelson laughed. "Well, I don't think any audience is going to want to sit and stare at any newscaster full in the face for fifteen minutes. I guess we'll come equipped with charts and maps and pictures to illustrate our commentary. It would really be a good spot for a chalk-talk artist. I've got a fine big stack of old National Geographics—I guess I could bring them along to use. I'd say to the folks, 'Remember what I was telling you about yesterday? Well, there it is!' And I'd ruffle through my Geographic and hold it up to let them read it!"

At the office every morning at 9:30, Hedda works on copy until one, then lunches and heads for the studios to gather news. She always checks back into the office—is usually the last one to leave at night.

Her average bed-time is midnight. Because her evenings are so crowded, the picture studios usually arrange a special showing of their previews for Miss Hopper's convenience. Saturdays she reserves for shopping and the beauty parlor. Since the war, she's done all her own marketing (at a Sunset Boulevard mart and the Farmers Market).

Typical Saturday

On a recent, typical Saturday, Hedda also gave an interview and busied herself pretty-ing up the dining room, which was being photographed for Vogue. "Did it up stinkin'", she exclaimed, "Had to light candles."

Rushing around like a mad jeep all week, she sloughs off informal entertaining by saying "Why don't you drop in on Saturday?" When Saturday afternoon arrives, an amazed Hedda greets her guests: "What are you doing here?"

"You asked us to drop by on Saturday. Remember?"

"As long as you're here," answers the hostess, "you might as well come in."

So "unexpected" friends filter in for tea.

Hedda is enthusiastic about radio, claims if she had to give up all her activities but one, she'd stick with it. She likes to listen, but naturally her opportunities are limited. However, her morning drive to the office is always negotiated to the accompaniment of "Big Sister." "It's the only soap opera I've ever listened to," remarks Miss Hopper. "I won't listen to another—I might get the habit and then I'd be out of luck."

But in typical Hopper style, Hedda doesn't let "Big Sister" take over completely.

"I talk back to her," snaps the columnist.

MMMM—this is gonna be fun! My first interview!"

We soon discovered that being interviewed is about the only thing that hadn't happened to Betty Russell, but even that wasn't foreign to her. "It used to be me who wielded the paper and pencil," she recalled. "The last time I did, Gracie Allen was my victim."

This occurred during the time the persevering Miss Russell worked for columnist Mayme Oberpeak. The road to singing stardom, Betty has learned, is not a smooth nor straight one—but if one is a courageous "character" (the latter term is Betty's own), all the by-paths can be fun.

Definitely "fun!" is blonde Miss Russell's current air chore as femceeing-songstress of KFI's nightly (save Monday) "Curfew Club."

"We don't even have a producer on the program," Betty grinned. "We mess it up together." ("We" being Betty, announcer Jim Berry and engineer Ernie Tavares.)

Full Session

Nighttime dialers who tune in on the "Curfew Club's" midnight fun sessions take delight in the merry banter by Betty and Berry (and anyone else who happens to drop in), top tuneful recordings (with such specified departments as the "Memory Corner" and the "Swinging Gate"), novel contests in which the listeners are invited to participate, a letter from home to a serviceman (as composed and read by Betty—"with no one in particular in mind"),

IN SPITE OF all this evidence to the contrary, Betty Russell insists she is "as sophisticated as a kitchen apron." The songstress cooks, too, boys!

and songs by the versatile Miss Russell (delivered in a lilting, listenable style to the accompaniment of recorded melodies).

It is this latter feature that is the most rehearsed portion of the program. Choosing suitable records ("played somewhere in the vicinity of my key") and synchronizing her voice to them keeps Miss Russell occupied a full two hours before broadcast time, plus still another hour's rehearsal with announcer Berry and engineer Tavares, who aids in technically enhancing the vocalist's "canned" accompaniment so that it sounds "almost like a live orchestra."

Besides her regular radio stint, Betty Russell also does "dubbing" for films—supplying a singing voice for such screen beauties as June Duprez, Virginia Mayo and Joan Caulfield.

In addition to singing, Betty likes to write. "Poetry, too!" Her favorite form of relaxation is listening to records. Her pet destination at vacation time—the mountains. "I'd get to them more often if I had a

EVERY Monday Hedda Hopper eats a special lunch. It's not at any of the spots swarming with Hollywood folk.

It's eaten from two paper sacks she's brought from home and opens in her lively office on the seventh floor of the Guaranty Building at the corner of Hollywood Boulevard and Ivar Street. In one bag there are deviled egg sandwiches and in the other there is a thermos bottle. And if Hedda's too hard-pressed for seconds, she doesn't bother to take off her hat while she munches.

Monday is fast and frantic for Hedda because that's the day she broadcasts her weekly program for Armour. It's the only day of the week her business manager, Dema Harshbarger, will consent to Miss Hopper's doing an airshow, because Sunday presumably offers the colum-

nist a chance to relax and get in shape for her mike job.

"Rests"

Trouble is, Hedda's ideas about resting are as unconventional as some of her others. She "rests" by hanging on the telephone for a couple of hours garnering choice items which will come out on the kilocycles as "the low-down on the higher-ups." Then she calls her dog, "Wolfie" (named after her ex-husband, De Wolfe Hopper) and goes out on a two-hour tramp into the slopes near her Beverly Hills home. The hike calls for a swim. Dinner-time calls for the invariable social or business engagement, and before Hedda knows it, it's Monday and she's driving her car to the office with her lunch sacks perched right alongside her on the front seat of her Cadillac—"and usually," laughs Hedda, "In my free hand I'm juggling a hat that I didn't have time to put on."

Anybody who can afford to shower a birthday present of a \$1000 check on someone else, as Hedda did recently, can certainly afford a chauffeur. But Hedda doesn't want to be bothered with one—besides, she gets a kick out of pitting her wits against traffic and coming out intact.

Sometime it would be interesting

to see Hedda Hopper tired. Too tired to burst into her office with the familiar morning greeting, "Hello, slaves! Anybody call?" Too tired to skirmish around the studios for news, to scribble down the 40-odd pages of hieroglyphics which she collects daily as substance for her syndicated column and airshow, too tired to make with the wise-crack and the colorful expletives with which she sprinkles her spirited conversation...too tired, even, to try on a crazy new hat.

Yes, to see that would be interesting, but a droopy Hedda is highly improbable.

One invariably receives the impression that Hedda Hopper is a self-winding proposition and that she'd rather fall apart with a bang than run down in slow ignominy.

Paradox

In general, she's decisive in conversation, in dress, in demeanor, but, paradoxically, forgetful and vague about details. Bewildered girls in her office have to possess a sixth sense to grasp Hedda's meaning when she shouts: "Bring me that whatchamacallit—that story we did for whoozit last year—you know the one that's in the doohickie—well, don't stand there. Get it."

Yet a corner of her mind is so

habituated that she can waken herself every morning at seven without aid of an alarm.

For two years a young man named MacGregor (called "Spec" for short) worked in the Hopper office. Every week Hedda signed his check. Then one day she blitzed the check-book in a wave of business-like inquiry. After thumbing over a few stubs she looked up querulously to demand: "What the heck is this MacGregor? What are we paying him to do?" (She still doesn't know his first name!)

But Joan Blondell won't forget that Hedda Hopper didn't forget. One night at a party, a producer entered the room. Hedda hurried up to him: "You're the very man I want to see. You know Joan Blondell. You're producing the picture, 'Cry Havoc'—seven parts in it and Joan could play any one of the seven. She's a fine actress. Why don't you give her a part?"

Next day the producer called Hedda: "You really set me back on my heels last night. But I'm glad you did. We're testing Joan Blondell today." (Joan got the part and started her come-back in pictures).

When Miss Hopper dictates her script and column, she walks nervously about her office with two secretaries taking down what she says. When Hedda thinks she has enough, she pauses: "How many pages have I got of that stuff?"

If it's six, she clips, "That's enough."

After the copy is typed, it's submitted to la Hopper to edit. "The ham in me makes me read it out

Freed has always liked radio news reporting better than any other side of broadcasting. "I can remember when press radio news came in by

THE ONLY announcer in radio who makes a career out of being a substitute newscaster is KHJ - Don Lee's Bob Freed.

For Bob has done and is doing more news stints as a fill-in than any other radio man in Hollywood ... and the catch is that his schedule is so packed with substitute jobs he has a hard time finding a spot for news work on his own!

Around the Don Lee headquarters news room it's a standard gag: Here comes Freed, the Poor Man's Glenn Hardy!

newscaster to originate from Don Lee's Hollywood studios.

Own Shows, Too

In addition to his substituting, he has two news programs of his own: 7:45 a.m. and again at 3:00 p.m. At one time when Fuller was on vacation and Hardy got sick at the same time, Freed went on the air every day for four days with his own news at 7:45 a.m.; took Hardy's 10:00 a.m. broadcast; went back for Fuller at noon; did his own news at 3:00 p.m.; back again at 9:00 p.m. for Hardy and at 10:15 p.m. for Fuller.

Freed's news substitutions are in addition to his regular work which includes announcing the commercials on the Fulton Lewis program at 4:00 p.m. and sharing the dialogue with Ruben Gaines in "The Frolics" at 12:45-1:00 p.m.

code, and every station had to have a good Morse man who decoded it and then gave it to you to release over the air," he says.

Asked which news broadcast stood out most in his memory, Freed picked his description of the Hauptmann execution. "We did a dramatic job on that one," he says. "As each sheet came out of the typewriter describing Hauptmann's death in the electric chair, we read it over the air page by page. It was the most dramatic single news event I have ever broadcast."

But like all good newsmen, Freed keeps looking for a topper ... and when it comes, he hopes it will break right in the middle of whatever quarter hour some day may be assigned to "Bob Freed and the News!"

She mimeographed a flock of I.O.U. notes, which she planned to distribute among her father's friends as raffle tickets—ten dollars apiece, double your money back if Russell scored a success. The third friend she approached benevolently loaned her the entire amount she needed.

Deciding that going alone to New York would be a selfish treat, Betty invited her whole family to come along. Seven people—her mother, brother, two cousins, aunt, uncle and herself—thereupon climbed into one lone automobile and started off.

In New York, Betty was auditioned by Whiteman, who seemed impressed with her ability but ad-

vised that she study for another year.

"First, however," he smiled, "stay and enjoy New York."

"Seven people—on what's left of two hundred dollars?" laughed Betty.

"At my expense," grinned the affable "Pops."

The Russell family, en masse, saw New York—with the compliments of Paul Whiteman.

Later, when they returned to Denver, Betty took an interest in the lavish nationwide contest being sponsored by the motion picture industry to boost their medium of entertainment.
