"Louise," continued Dix seeming to ignore his radio sister, "doesn't like to be kidded."

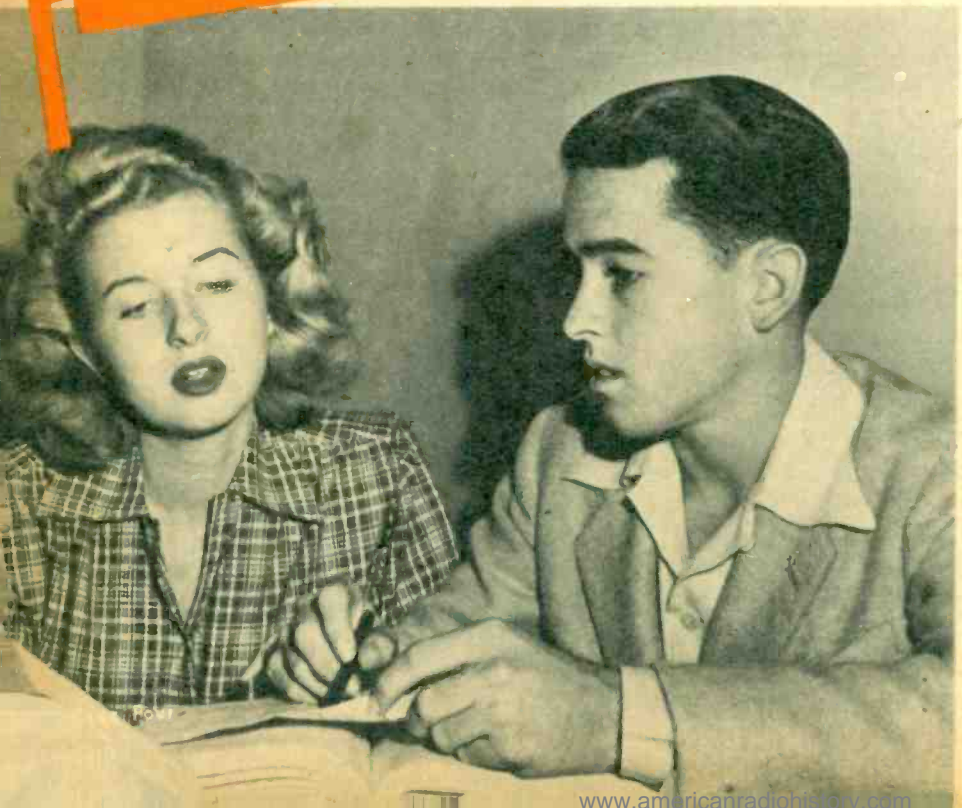
"You mean I'm sensitive?", queried pretty Miss Erickson.

▲ HE ASKED TO BE INSULTED and look what happened! Benny's buried with insults—only a part of the tremendous response which totaled 150,000 letters by the end of the second week of his contest, "I Can't Stand Jack Benny because . . ."

**F**OURTEEN years ago, Jack Benny pulled a comedy switch in radio. Instead of having a cast full of stooges, he became a stooge for his cast; instead of telling jokes on the other fellow, he let the other fellow turn the joke on him.

A few weeks ago Benny pulled another switch. This time, instead of conducting a contest on "I like Crunchy-Munchies (or) Soapsy Sudsies (or) Itsy Bitsies in fifty words or less together with a box top or reasonable facsimile" contest, he launched a "Why I Can't Stand Jack Benny" deal with no tops, no wrappers, no facsimiles—no, not even a strand from a 1945 model Benny toupe. It was a contest to satirize all contests, an insult routine to end all insult routines.

But to fifty-three winners it will pay off in \$10,000—a first prize of \$2,500, a second of \$1,500, a third of \$1,000 and fifty added awards of \$100 war bonds each.

Proof that the radio fans can go along with a gag was the mail response, which, it is estimated, will finally tabulate at between three and four hundred thousand letters. Final judges Fred Allen, Peter Lorre, and Goodman (Easy) Ace will name the winners.

## *Art Gilmore Has Returned to His Radio Assignments, Relates for Radio Life His Experiences Aboard Pacific Carrier*

**G**ALL (6', 2"), lean (190 lbs.), good-looking Art Gilmore greeted us at the door of his attractive Valley home. He was looking comfortably casual in civvies ("I'm lucky. The moths left 'em alone!"). Peering shyly from behind Art's long legs was a little blonde moppet of about two years.

"That's Barbara," smiled the mike-man, and as he ushered us into a living room bathed in the glow of a cheery wood fire, we noted another little blonde moppet (aged five and a half) peeking with curiosity around the door.

"That's Marilyn," grinned Gilmore. "I have 'em all over the place." The roll call ceased there, however, save for the charming Mrs. Gilmore who made her appearance several minutes later, chiding Art with a choice bit of reminiscing: "Tell how you were always at the microphone with your shoes off!"

"That was during our college days," her husband elaborated. "I was tired."

"He waited tables and did all sorts of odd jobs," Mrs. Gilmore interpolated.

"What wore me out was watching all those pretty girls," was Art's explanation, which won him a scorching look from his missus. Mr. and Mrs. Gilmore were high school sweethearts. "Another girl turned me down, so I took Grace instead, and never went with anybody else afterward," Art summed up.

### "Personality Announcer" Aim

At the time of our visit with the Gilmores, Art had been a civilian for just a few short weeks, but was already busy testing for prospective screen assignments (film acting is one of his chief aspirations), and preparing for his return to the microphone on CBS' "Dr. Christian" and "Stars Over Hollywood," KFI's "Bullock's Show" and Mutual's "Red Ryder" series. His radio goal is to be a "personality announcer"—one who delivers dialogue as well as commercials (a la Bill Goodwin, Harry von Zell and the like).

"It's a funny thing," Art laughed. "Even in the Navy, I didn't get away from the microphone." The announcer served as a fighter director aboard a carrier in the Pacific, and participated in the landings on Luzon, Okinawa, Iwo Jima and Leyte.

"Before every big maneuver, the rumor would circulate that 'after this one, we're heading home!'" Gilmore smilingly reminisced. "But

there always seemed to be one more job to do.

"We were expecting to go into the northern seas to join forces with the Russians, when the word of the war's end came through," he went on to relate. "Were we glad! We didn't relish the thought of swimming around in those icy waters if our ships should be hit."

The carrier on which Art was stationed was struck just once, by a Jap kamikaze. No one was killed or critically injured, but Art grimly recalled that one man, a gunner, had a very narrow escape. A part of the fallen plane flew toward him, missed his face by mere inches, knocked the sights off his gun and landed over the side of the ship into the ocean.

During far more quiet moments on board ship, Art told us then, he and his shipmates gathered together "for what we laughingly termed 'our happy hours'". Gilmore emceed the "home talent" shows, played his guitar and sang.

### Started in Seattle

Born in Tacoma, Washington, thirty-three-year-old Gilmore started his career as a singer, studied opera, doubled as a vocalist and dishwasher to pay his way through col-

### March of Dimes

On Wednesday, January 30th, KFVB has canceled all regular programs to present a nineteen-hour broadcast on behalf of the "March of Dimes." The program starts when the station goes on the air at six a.m. and continues without interruption until the sign-off at one a.m.

Many prominent personalities will be heard during the long broadcast (among them: Bette Davis, Helen Hayes, Greer Garson, Shirley Temple, Jack Carson, Errol Flynn, Frank Sinatra, etc.), as will leaders in civic, medical and health fields. Music will be supplied by two symphony orchestras.

President Truman, Basil O'Connor (national head of the Infantile Paralysis foundation), Bob Hope, Edgar Bergen and Dinah Shore will be heard on a special program (aired also on the networks). Speakers will include a large number of prominent Washingtonians, and a round-table discussion of infantile paralysis will be re-broadcast several times throughout the long program, because of its special importance in acquainting the public with this dread disease.

A special tribute to the late President, Franklin Roosevelt, will also be heard. This will be written and produced by Norman Corwin. The Breakfast Club program and the Al Jarvis shows will be heard as usual, but their broadcasts will also center on the "March of Dimes" campaign. Jarvis' program will emanate from hospitals and feature interviews and the favorite recorded music of the polio patients.

The giant KFVB program has been arranged by program director Bill Ray and produced by Charles Lewin.

### Radio Classes

A course in television under Cameron G. Pierce opened Friday evening, January 25th, at the 813 South Hill Street classroom center of the University of California Extension, and a course in General Survey of Television with Don C. McNamara of KFI as instructor opens Wednesday evening, January 30th, on the Los Angeles campus of the University.

A course in radio speech training, with Patricia Challgren as instructor, will open at the downtown Los Angeles center on February 1st. Morning and evening sections of a course in radio dramatics are planned to open

March 5th and 6th, with Norman Field as instructor.

The novel restaurant is the realization of a dream born many years ago and threatens to be more than a chip off the old Billingsley block.

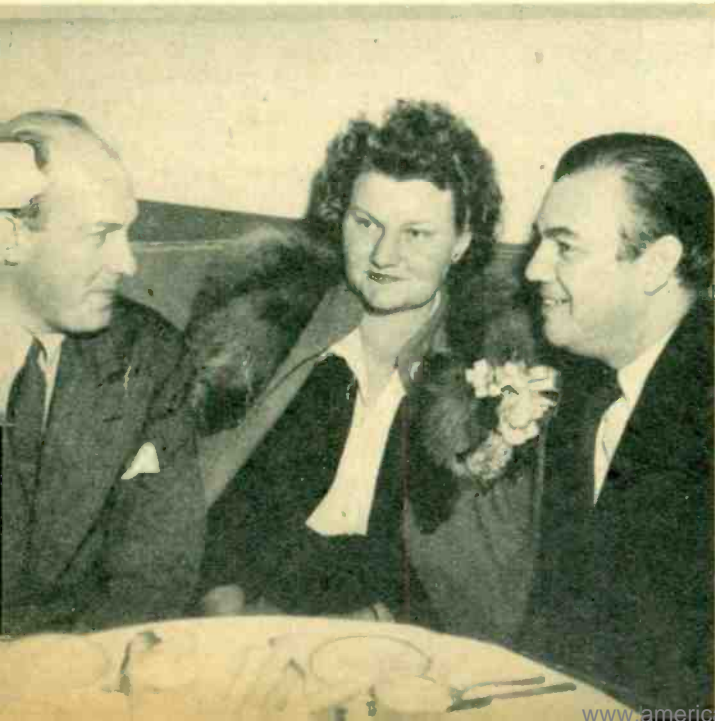

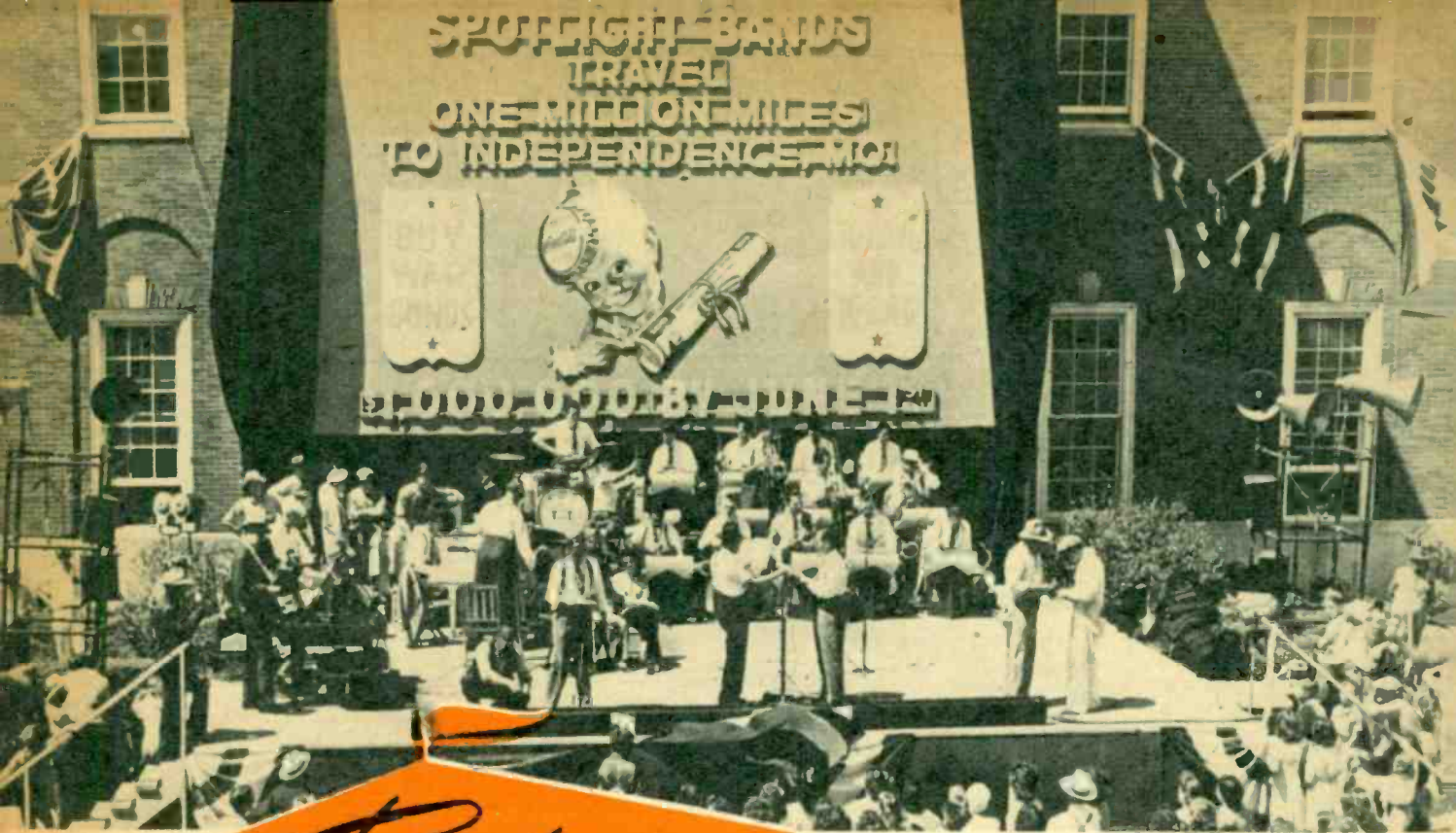

zied activities that accompany a travelling big-top.

In the summer and down South, all broadcasts are put on outdoors, usually in a stadium or amphitheater with a specially-constructed stage for the occasion. Frequently, temporary bleachers must be built to accommodate the onlookers. Tent-like dressing rooms are set up overnight and drinking fountains installed for the use of the visiting artists.

During the war it became more difficult to move the bands and technical crews from one part of the country to another. Trains were late, reservations hard to get, and the

transportation facilities acute. It has not been uncommon to have the technical crew of the show carry some of the baggage with them in pullmans. Certainly it was not novel for musicians to sleep with instrument cases stored in their berths.

#### Missed Only Twice

Yet, with the many handicaps that faced the radio troupes, only twice did the broadcast have to forfeit its scheduled program. Once, in a snow-storm, while members had to drive from one town to another by car, one of the orchestras was unable to reach its destination, and a substi-

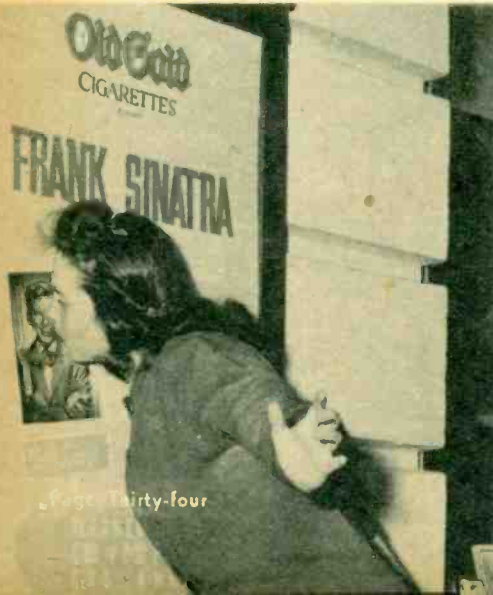

tute program had to take over. Another time, down South, the government switched a baggage car of a train which was carrying musicians' instruments to make way for army troops, resulting in another substitute show for the original "Spotlight" broadcast.

Not one show has ever been missed out of the one thousand broadcasts due to engineering failure. More than half a ton of broadcasting gear travels with the production and engineering crew to every city, since many cities and towns are not equipped to handle the supplies needed for a network show. The heaviest pieces are dismantled so that no item weighs more than fifty pounds. The smallest is the three ounce microphone plug, which is so delicate that it must be carried suspended in a felt-lined case reinforced with both oak and metal.

On Sept. 21, 1945, "Spotlight Bands" celebrated its third birthday anniversary. By the end of the year it will have been heard well over one thousand times on the air. It would take an ordinary one-time-a-week program nineteen and a quarter years of broadcasting to be heard one thousand times.

"Spotlight" has visited forty-seven States, Canada, Mexico and Hawaii. During its lifetime more than one hundred and twenty-five topflight bands have appeared on the program. Such name bands as Gene Krupa, Frankie Masters, Xavier Cugat, Tommy Dorsey, Harry James, Jan Garber, Les Brown and Louis Prima, have been called back for dozens of repeat performances.

### Hold Dances, Too

To the men and women of the armed forces and to the war workers, "Spotlight Bands" has offered a means of perfect relaxation from grueling, hard work. In most of the camps, bases and production plants it has visited, "Spotlight" has given the weary men and women a really good time. Often the broadcast emanated from towns so small that no other coast-to-coast network program had ever visited them. For many persons, it was their first time to see a major broadcast in action.

More than that, the sponsors of the show made it possible for each of the audiences to dance to the music of the band featured on the show as it visited each locale. Usually, a three hour dance follows each visit to a camp or base and members of the audience stay for the added entertainment.

Frequently, too, "Spotlight" hires extra talent to amuse its audiences. For example, not long ago "Spotlight Bands" played at the huge Rubber Bowl in Akron, Ohio, when it saluted the entire rubber industry. Harry

James and his orchestra drew a record crowd of some 50,000 persons. Before the show, the American Legion had a parade into the Bowl, followed by a company of Wacs and Waves marching in formation.

After this, one hundred beauties, picked from the war plants, participated in a pageant on the grounds as part of the impressive spectacle arranged for entertainment. Two high-ranking officials from the Army and Navy gave addresses, and then the program introduced several extra acts to amuse the enthusiastic audience before the regular broadcast took to the air. After the performance, James and his orchestra played dance music for the crowds while the jitterbugs who attended the show "went to town." It was a party not to be forgotten.

On June, 1945, in Independence, Missouri, President Truman's summer "White House," was saluted. Tommy Tucker and his orchestra gave the townfolk something to talk about for many months. The orchestra, after the broadcast there, played for three hours while the crowds danced in the streets which the Mayor of Independence had blocked off for just that purpose.

It was a gala event and the occasion marked the *millionth* mile of travel for "Spotlight Bands," radio's travelling "big-top"!

As many children as the time allows come up to the microphone to sing, play or recite. It makes no difference whether or not they are talented. If they have made the effort to learn a song or poem they have their chance.

Nicholas Bradford Nelson, alias Uncle Whoa Bill, is a fellow who has always worked with children, likes them, and thinks he understands them. When the depression cut short a legal education at Loyola University, Nick took to giving puppet shows. In fact Bullocks, the sponsor of the Whoa Bill Club, have had these puppet shows for children practically every Saturday for fifteen years.

After this length of time in enter-

taining and leading children, Uncle Whoa Bill's observations have been that they may not know as much as you because they lack experience and schooling, but what they do know they are just as well aware of as you are and you would better not try any foolishness.

The person who uses the approach, "and now little kiddies," isn't going to get anywhere. The opposite is evidenced on the Monday meetings of the Whoa Bill Club. That's new member day and when the little pig and the rest of Uncle Whoa Bill's cohorts get to whistling the new members into the Club, it's reminiscent of the Pied Piper.

a month. He figured six girls, working without too much pressure, could handle perhaps 20,000 letters a week. By the end of the second week, the mail was 150,000 for seven days and it was necessary to add three girls to the day staff and to put on a night staff of nine—workers who hurried into the room at nightfall like little gnomes, slit open the letters, and segregated them as to categories for the workers coming in the morning to read.

About half of the replies came in rhyme. As for the reasons people can't stand Benny, they were divided between stinginess, ill-treatment of Rochester, ill-treatment of Fred Allen, fiddle-playing, and miscellaneous. In the miscellaneous category was a certain group which seized the contest as an opportunity to write nostalgic and "Hello, I haven't seen you in a long time" letters. Some letters went even so far as to include foot notes telling Benny they really loved him and that he shouldn't take the entry reply as anything more than a chance to latch onto some money—as who wouldn't, including Jack Benny?

The accompanying box contains quotes which were chosen while the contest was still in progress and which were picked because they were typical replies. Some, sent in by Benny's friends, were not trying to compete, but were intended as gags. Radio Life will print the winning answers as soon as they are released.
