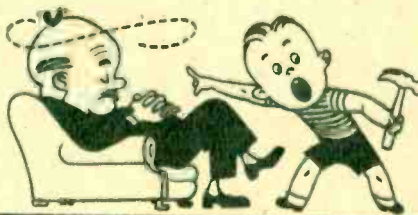

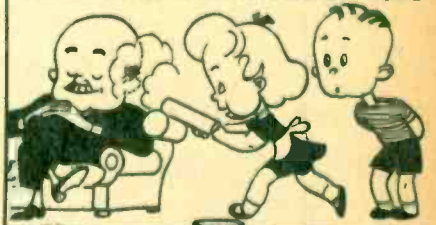

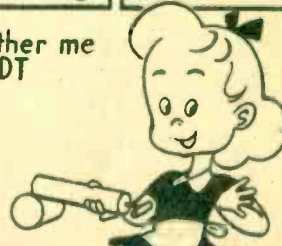

Friday—Questions selected from the mail. Guest star contacted.

Saturday and Sunday—Script polished into final form. Musical arrangements made.

Monday—Full dress rehearsal, 12:30 p. m. to 6:00 p. m.

Tuesday—Last-minute revisions of script, questions, music.

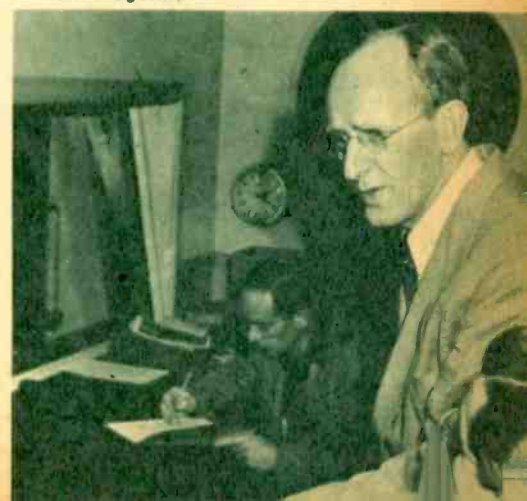

The Stories Behind Famous Names*

Dave Vail with music by Milton Charles, presents three five to ten-minute stories a program. Theodore Von Eltz narrates the stories and the identity of the historical character portrayed in each dramatization isn't revealed until the end. Mr. Hanna insists that he plays fair with his audience. "All the stories are true—the background and dialogue are imaginary, of course." Earliest period covered was in the story of Julius Caesar—latest has been that of Ernie Pyle.

Hanna, personally, is intrigued with modern history and particularly likes tales that deal with newspapers, music and the theater,

though what he principally looks for in a character is a good idea. Confronting Writer Hanna is the fact that, in deference to their audience, the sponsors, Forest Lawn, eschew any mention of death.

Approved for Young

"Tapestries" is one of the programs approved by the Parent-Teachers Association. "We've even had people write in and say that they keep their children up every Tuesday night to hear the program and several Boy Scout troops have requested copies of our scripts to be read at troop meetings."

"I know I've made a few errors—it's inevitable in historical drama," Hanna smiled, "and I really regret that no one writes in to correct me. I heard of a writer once who got so many letters correcting him on his data that he answered them all with a form letter: 'Dear Sir: You may be right. Sincerely—'"

That's such a good idea I'd like to use it. We often do get mail and phone calls from relatives of people we've portrayed on the air and they're always highly complimentary. We do try to be uplifting."

Five years on the Los Angeles Daily News as drama and movie critic have given David Hanna a great insight into the stories behind famous names. By this time he's a walking mine of odd and interesting facts about people. "I'm unscrupulous," he laughed. "If I hear a good story from someone, I use it. In fact, I got the story that led to my writing this series by overhearing a man relate it to someone else!"

"Family" To Screen

For fourteen years, more than ten million people have avidly followed the adventures of NBC's "One Man's Family." Within the next seven months, production on a motion picture based on the "Family" scripts will commence, bringing to the screen the nation's leading dramatic serial.

With Cinema Century's forthcoming screen version of the airer, emphasizing the irreplaceability on NBC's transcription library of all 741 programs to date, the discs are to be insured for \$100,000. A special planning board, including representatives of NBC, Standard Brands, J. Walter Thompson, Carlton E. Morse and Cinema Century Pictures, is meeting soon to discuss casting and story problems.

Daylight Saving Time

When Daylight Saving Time rolls around, it usually brings with it a big headache for many of the major networks. But the American Broadcasting Company has adopted a plan which, during the twenty-two weeks of DST, will maintain its programs in all time zones at the same hour the year around.

The vast operation, developed by vice-president Charles E. Rynd, involves the acquisition by ABC of special broadcast lines and the recording and rebroadcast of programs at the proper hours by the network. Through use of this plan, stations, listeners and advertisers will avoid the complex re-shuffling which occurs locally from the programming adjustments.

So when April 29th booms upon the horizon, you can listen for your ABC programs at the same hour as usual.

Expecting

The Charles Corrells (he's "Andy" of NBC's "Amos 'n' Andy"), are thrilled over their expectant visit from the stork late this summer. If it's a boy, the Corrells will be the proud parents of a perfectly balanced quartet, two sons and two daughters.

Goodby, Hoagy

Pretty young Kim Kimberly, vocalist with the NBC Hoagy Carmichael show, is about to become a bride. A romance which started when Kim was singing with USO camp shows will climax in her marriage this month to Major James E. Johnson, U. S. Marine Corps.

The vocalist made her last appearance with Carmichael on April 22nd and sailed on April 24th for Hawaii, where Major Johnson is stationed. She was one of the passengers on the first liner to the Islands since the end of the war.

Like Father, Like Son

Ten-year-old radio veteran Jerry Farber, who's been emoting at a microphone ever since he was three, was chosen last week in a competitive audition to play the title role in "Oliver Twist" with Basil Rathbone on CBS' "Stars over Hollywood," in addition to waxing the story for Columbia Records. Jerry's father is CBS writer Les Farber, but, although his father is a professional scripter, young Jerry always writes his own audition material!

Remember the confusion which occurred twice a year in your radio listening schedule in those good old "before the war years"? Well, ABC-KECA has found a way this year to help you avoid that confusion!

The American Broadcasting Company has adopted a plan which, during the 22 weeks of Daylight Saving Time, will maintain its programs in all time zones at the same hour the year

round. The plan, which goes into effect on April 29th, has been developed and projected upon the Monday through Friday operations of the network by Charles E. Rynd, ABC Vice-President.

In other words, KECA fans will find their Monday through Friday favorites at their usual time, and very little, if any, change in their weekend listening. Through the use of transcriptions made on practically all the "headliners," ABC shows will be released to fit each separate time zone. So just keep your dial turned to KECA and avoid the confusion of the Daylight Saving switch!

MRS. ABE BURROWS was packing to go to New York to join her husband, fabulous wit and writer of "Holiday and Company."

"No," she said to son Jim, five, "we can't pack the bicycle in the suitcase." Ruth Burrows was supervising the moving men, worrying about trunks and trying to keep her children, Jim and twenty-month-old Laurie, from underfoot.

"This is no time," we thought to ourselves, "to ask a person to sit down and talk about husbands—funny or otherwise!" We must confess that we were awe-stricken by Abe Burrows' reputation as a humorist. When you consider that at private parties it's radio-writer Burrows who sends such high-priced talent as

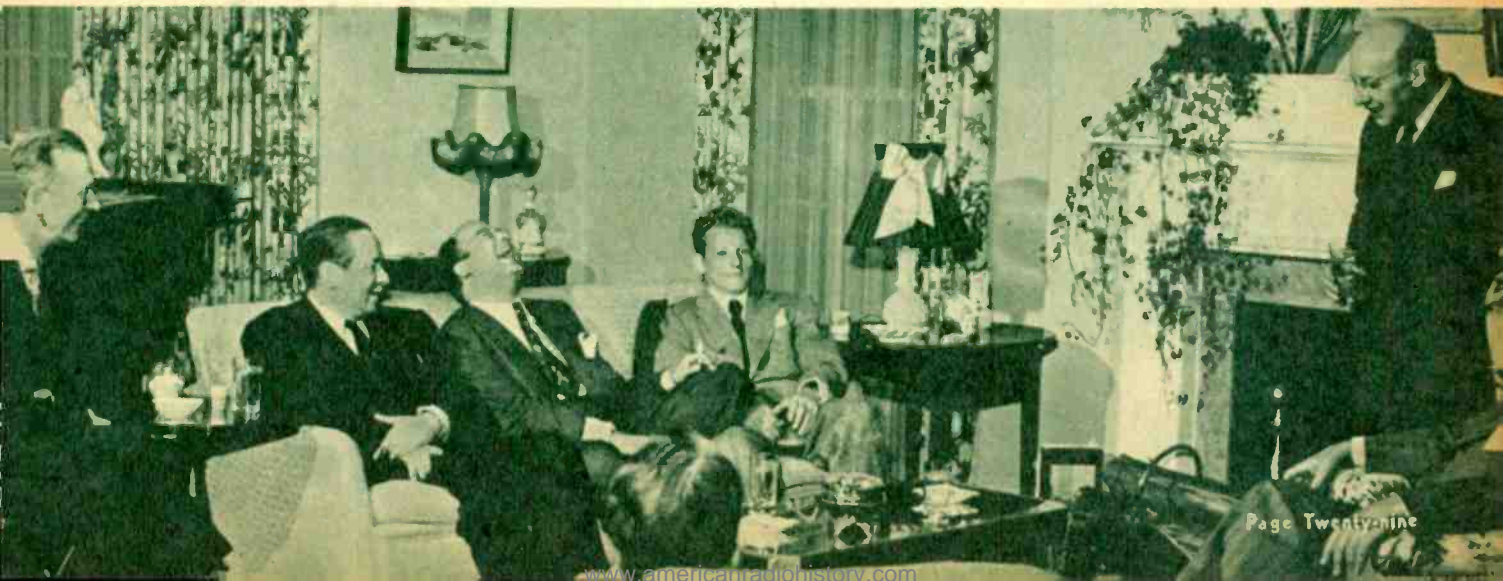
middle of the night to tell jokes?'" We countered that we know a comic who did just that.

This Time Radio Life Takes You to NBC To Meet Another Staff of Men Who Stand Vigil Day and Night at the Microphone

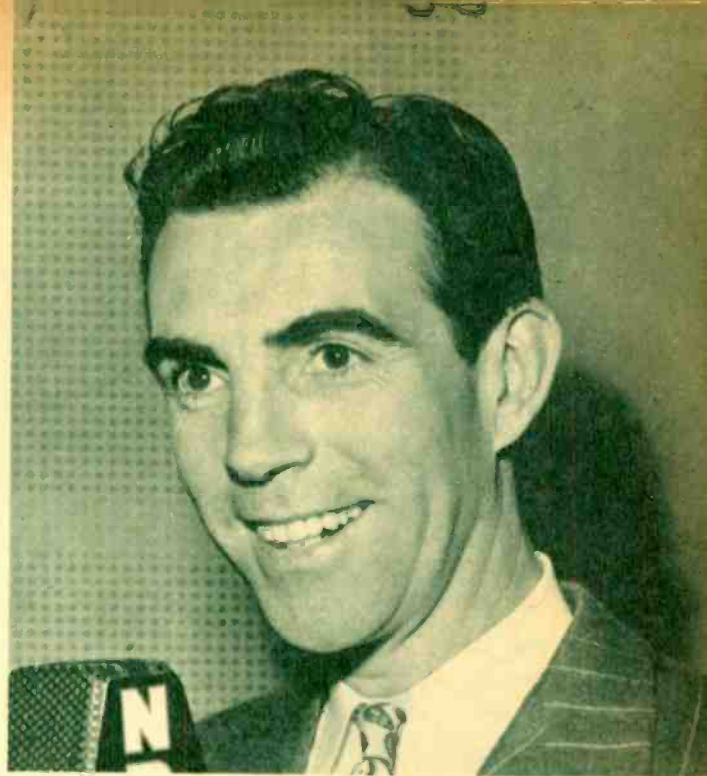

When Agnes White left, I continued at KHJ and was soon assigned to the Publicity Department, and from there to teletype operator and secretary to the Traffic Manager.

When the Traffic Manager resigned, I was promoted to that position, and have continued in that capacity ever since (except for the three and one-half years with OWI doing my bit).

I assure you all of the above was not accomplished in months, or a year, but years. Therefore, if you have decided upon radio as a career, but are not sure which branch to specialize in, I would suggest: get into it; take the first available job; work hard; take advantage of every opportunity to learn more; don't stay in one department too long unless you decide that's it—then stick; learn all you can about that particular phase of radio . . . and you will find yourself well on your way to a successful radio career.

about hats, but those entering this contest had to demonstrate their fondness for frills and feathers. They had to sit down and make a hat . . . one that would capture the gazes of such judges as Lilly Dache and John Fredericks.

Tom told his fans about the contest on his ABC "Breakfast in Hollywood" program. Hedda announced it on her Monday night ABC Chatter show. In her wildest dreams, she said, she expected perhaps fifteen thousand chapeaux. Tom didn't expect that many.

Hats Rained

Three days later the cartons started trickling into the warehouse which had been rented for the contest. Within three weeks the place was inundated . . . hats were raining onto the receiving platform at the rate of fifteen truckfuls a day. A huge tent was rented and staked behind the building to accommodate incoming packages and sixteen workers were hired to open the hat boxes. Hedda Hopper and Tom Breneman were shown in no uncertain terms that they weren't the only lid-conscious citizens in the country.

Although gag hats were ineligible, some ladies couldn't resist whipping up something funny. One woman submitted a sky-blue baby pot ornamented with lush pink roses. Others made hats to look like Easter baskets . . . hats from buttons . . . from stockings . . . from shells, pine needles, bottle tops, phonograph records. One insouled milliner fashioned a blue globe with continents outlined in sequins, on top of which rested a dove of peace.

Another sponsor-conscious designer sprinkled Kellogg's flakes on the brim of her creation and edged a tiny veiling with kernels of corn.

One practical-minded contestant arranged the crown of her hat as a kit. The lid, when opened, showed all milady's beauty requisites. Several women had the same inspiration: to make the crown of the hat look like a clock, with the hands pointing to the time of Tom's broadcast.
