WHEN CBS' "This Is My Best" closes its weekly air sessions, it's no surprise to producer Don Clark to find a

named writer Adele Rogers St. John or movie producer Sam Goldwyn on the phone. Miss St. John offers thanks for the clever ether adaptation of her story while Mr. Goldwyn, in turn, wishes to purchase it for the screen.

"That," explained Mr. Clark, "is purely a hypothetical case, but it sort of explains what happens each week. We buy the radio rights to a story for one performance and upon

its completion, it's often a rush to see which movie company is going to make the next bid for its services.

"Just as the motor industry has its multi-million dollar testing grounds, the screen's motion picture producers have their testing grounds, too—with radio playing an important part. This is the way it works."

Selective to "Nth" Degree

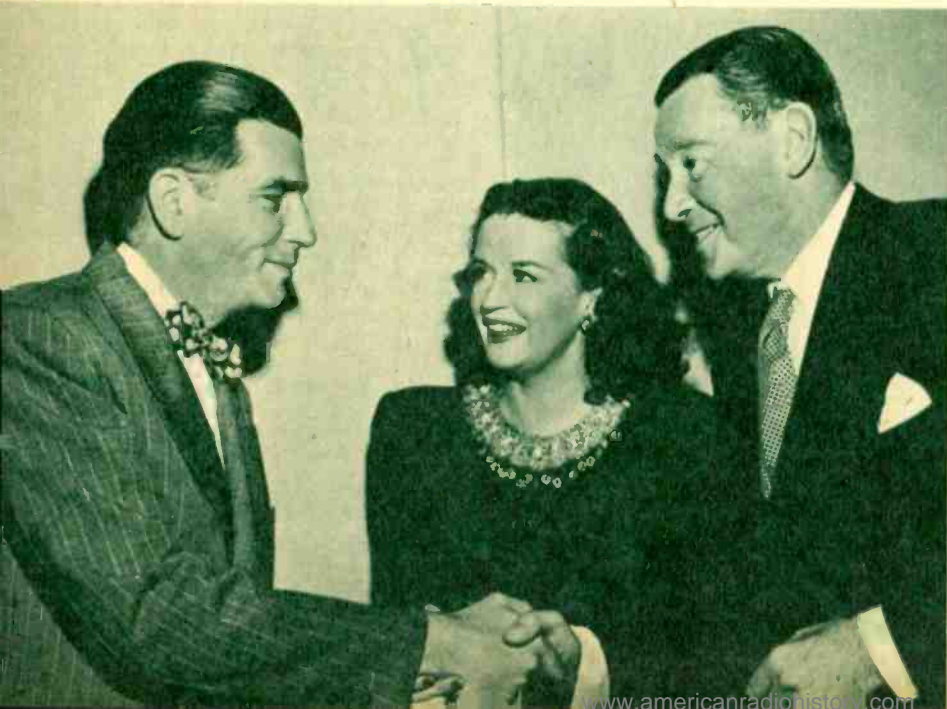
In line with its format of broad-

IF YOU ARE one of the countless radio listeners who demand the ultimate in thrills and chills in your "Crime Doesn't Pay" programs, we'll let you in on a parcel of information: "Rogue's Gallery", radio detective drama, stars Dick Powell, radio, stage and screen personality, in the apt role of Richard Rogue, Private Detective. If the listener isn't ready for a quiet week-end in the country at the finish of this thirty-minute adventure, we'll eat the dialogue, quote by quote... honest!

Producer Dee Engelbach seems never to be content to put anything on the air but the best; he even puts his cast through its paces for two solid days before the program goes on the air.

Let's take a peek through the doors of Studio No. 3 at KHJ-Mutual Don Lee and watch the rehearsal of "The Final Score", which proves to be winning unanimous hosannas for its thrilling sequence. It's 11:55 a. m. and the studio is deserted except for the usual broadcasting paraphernalia that lies about, waiting for the human touch to bring it to life. At 11:57 a. m. in walks Tony Barrett, just arrived from New York, who plays the villain, "Duke" Flynn, in this particular episode. Says Tony upon being questioned about his health, "I don't mind being killed in

"The Final Score" because well, after all, it's a living." A couple of minutes later in walks Dorothy Brown, the comely script girl, who immediately goes to work blue-penciling the various character parts on the scripts, and Tony wonders if he too will be penciled . . . at the stroke of twelve, the star of the broadcast, Dick Powell, comes in, usually accompanied by Mrs. P. (June Allyson); Ted Von Eltz (Lieutenant Urban), and Peter Leeds, who plays the part of "Eugor," Powell's alter-ego in the Rogue series. The cast now goes to work seated around a table

in the middle of the room. Lurene Tuttle runs in to fill the empty seat, explaining that she HAD found a box to live in, and it was moving day. Of course, she was excused for tardiness.

Does Own Effects

Dick Powell starts his opening line, and for the next hour, the volley of lines continues. At this time no sound-effect is used, and when Dick gets clunked over the head with a platter of bacon and eggs by his friend, Powell supplies his own ver-

Light in Darkness

The lights of Earl Carroll's glamorous Hollywood Theatre burned brightly last Monday night. The air was filled with excitement as scores of beautiful women, glamorous radio and film stars launched the nation-wide hat auction for the benefit of the blind, which had its inception in the Breneman-Hopper Hat Hunt. And what began as a joke on a movie set, when Hedda and Tom were filming a picture, resulted in raising \$30,000 toward the Building Fund Campaign of the Braille Institute of America, Inc.

The evening consisted of one exciting event after another. Following dinner, the packed house caught its first glimpse of the prize-winning hats as they were worn by lovely models. George Jessel acted as master-of-ceremonies; sequin-glittering Hedda Hopper opened the coast-to-coast broadcast over the American Broadcasting Company; speeches and songs were delivered by Mickey Rooney, Tony Martin, Edward Arnold, John Garfield and guest of honor, blinded Marine hero Al Schmid. Miss June Haver modeled the number one prize-winning hat.

Sharing the spotlight with Schmid was Miss Beverly Bilbro, blind girl, who read from a prepared Braille poem titled "Six Magic Dots". Upon completion of the broadcast, Eddie Cantor paired with Jessel to auction off the 50,000 home-made hats. In their first teaming since 1932, the comedians worked at a furlous pace for an hour and a half to bring about the best prices for the headgear. Top of \$4000 was paid by Walter Smith, prominent Hollywood businessman, who bought the "All Nations Hat."

Present plans call for raffles throughout the nation to dispose of the thousands of remaining hats entered in the contest, with funds raised to go to the Braille Institute, which is launching a subscription campaign for its building fund.

New KFWB Discer

KFWB chose a somewhat novel way to select the record-spinner for their choice three-and-a-half hour time slot for wax-whirling. Disc-jockeys the country over were considered, then sifted down to seven applicants. These seven were heard via direct private wire in live auditions by the leading agency people and members of the

press, who gathered in the Embassy Room of the Ambassador last Wednesday evening for a big KFWB fete. The group then cast secret ballots.

The winner: Platter-patterer Bill Anson of Chicago, who's known to mid-west listeners as jockey of the Windy City's WGN "Telephone Quiz."

Award For Mutual

For "outstanding devotion and distinguished performance rendered servicemen overseas in cooperation with the Armed Forces Radio Service," the Mutual Broadcasting System has been cited with a special award by the U. S. Army and Navy departments.

The presentation was made in recognition of the network's contribution of big-name radio shows six hours a week for every week of almost five years—a total of more than 1500 solid hours of entertainment for U. S. servicemen overseas.

frequently loan the program their pet properties, which are yet unfilmed, in order to see what can be done with the stories to "get them off the printed page." In movie jargon this is known as "testing a treatment", and the studios have demonstrated that they like the treatment "TIMB" gives their stories.

For instance, last spring Paramount loaned Thornton Wilder's "Heaven's My Destination" to the airshow to see what could be done with it. Van Johnson played the hero on the air, and Paramount liked the treatment so well that "Heaven" has been set for early production by the lot.

After hearing the program's production of MacKinlay Kantor's "The Romance of Rosy Ridge," RKO-Radio Pictures bought the property for early filming, and the same thing happened to James Thurber's "The Secret Life of Walter Mitty", starring Robert Benchley—bought after the broadcast by Sam Goldwyn for star Danny Kaye.

Wanted to Buy

A question of "who owns what" came up when David O. Selznick heard Herbert Marshall and Rosemary De Camp give a delightful delineation of Rachel Maddux' "Turnip's Blood", and immediately called Producer Clark in the CBS control room, seeking to buy the picture rights to the story. However, screen rights were already owned by Sam Wood, who had bought it first for Columbia Pictures and then upon leaving the studio, bought it for himself.

"Not only are we a testing ground for the movies," averred Mr. Clark, "but sometime other radio programs as well. We aren't sure when the phone rings whether it will be a movie company or another airshow bidding for our stories."

Here again, perfection is a must, and the producer patiently explains that the audience must "get the horror of the thing".

At 11:00 a. m., the cast is again

assembled to work out the characterizations for two solid hours.

Three in the afternoon, and the time for the pre-broadcast moment which they have been building up to—yes, the dress rehearsal! Everything is going smoothly, and Powell's convictions are confirmed that pretty pretending is as exciting as any other game. Then they come to the scene where the sound-effects man is to crash a platter that, theatrically speaking, is to raise a bump on Dick's head, and the plate refuses to break! Engelbach, in the projection booth, roars, "Break the dish." Then adds, "Don't worry about it. Just put it on my bill!" Powell, amusement written all over his features, moans, "I don't know why he finds it so difficult to break those dishes; the cooks at my house don't have any trouble at all!"

War Worker

"I came back with a contract to make plastic backings for plane compasses. Sandra Gould jewelry took a back seat," she smiled. "It was a lot of hard work, but a great deal of fun, too. I donned overalls and protective goggles and worked at the machines with the other girls."

Eventually, however, as her activities on the airlines increased at the same time, the actress found it necessary to sell her interest in the factory and forego her pursuits in plastics.

A Reporter Remembers

By Edward R. Murrow

EDITOR'S NOTE

Edward R. Murrow, formerly chief of CBS' European News Staff and now Vice President and Director of Public Affairs for the network, said good-bye to England after nine years of reporting in the British Isles. Mr. Murrow now has his offices in New York, but he recently returned to London on a business trip. While there, the British Broadcasting Corporation asked Mr. Murrow to recount his impressions of nine years in Britain, in a special broadcast.)

Sunday, 10:45 a. m.
CBS-KNX

FIRST CAME to England sixteen years ago in the summertime. It rained for two weeks. Being just out of the university, I wore a straw boater and carried a cane. No one laughed at me—at least not openly. What I did see did not impress me. During the next seven years I was three times in England, always for a brief visit. I am Irish, French, English and German, a mixture that is not uncommon in my country. I knew something of your history and more of your literature but, to me, England was a small, pleasant, historical but relatively unimportant island off the coast of Europe. It was different and, therefore, interesting. Your country was a sort of museum piece, pleasant but small. You seemed slow, indifferent and exceedingly complacent, not important. I thought your streets narrow and mean, your tailors over-advertised, your climate unbearable, your class-consciousness offensive; you couldn't cook, your young men seemed without vigor or purpose. I admired your history, doubted your future, and suspected that the historians had merely agreed upon a myth. But always there was something that escaped me, always there remained in the back of the youthful and undisciplined mind the suspicion that I might be wrong.

About nine years ago, being persuaded that war was inevitable, I came here to live. Now I am going home and the BBC has asked this reporter to remember. This might go on for a week but I must try to speak of those things that are riveted upon my memory, not because they are important or profound but because they represent things of great

value which I shall be taking back with me.

England Decadent?

Let's first go back to nine years ago. I spent a lot of time on the Continent. Young Germans, Czechs, French, Dutch, Poles and all the rest were repeatedly saying, "Tell us, you know the British. You have lived there. It is true, isn't it, that they are soft, decadent, have lost faith in themselves and their destiny?" And I always replied, "Gentlemen, you may be right. There is evidence to support your point of view, but I have a suspicion you are wrong. Perhaps you misjudge these young men who are rather languid and wear suede shoes and resolve they will fight not for king or country."

Do you remember the coronation in the spring of 1937, the organizational genius which moved hundreds of thousands of people without confusion round the heart of London, the little Gurkhas who were hard and fit, and where are they now? I remember little more than a year later being in Warsaw when the Germans marched into Austria, flying to Vienna and finding that everyone there was asking the question, "What will the British do?" I remember listening to the BBC that Sunday night, hearing a broadcast about the relief of Mafeking and remember my Austrian friends saying, "There they are, the British, living the past. Their future is all behind them!" And still I doubted it.

I went from Vienna to Prague and there again my friends were asking, "Do the British know what's happening?" And I could only reply, "Who knows what the British know?" You will remember Munich and Godesberg beside the Rhine; and aircraft flying hither and yon; and men, stripped to the waist, digging

trenches in green parks, having bothered to put up a sign reading "Westminster Strip Tease." Do you remember Mr. Chamberlain landing at Hendon with a piece of paper and "Peace in Our Time"; the great debates in the House of Commons, the clock above the speaker's chair ticking away the wasted minutes and the lost opportunities; Mr. Winston Churchill sitting there below the gangway like the conscience of Britain? And do you remember what happened in the next year? That was the period when, whether you liked it or not, you came into your full inheritance; that was the time when you demonstrated beyond all doubt that you understood, that the first duty of the state is to recognize its enemy. We will all remember the outbreak of war, but do you recall a broadcast made on August 31, 1939 which said, "It has been decided to start evacuation of school children and other priority classes, as already arranged under the Government's scheme, tomorrow, Friday, September 1st." I remember that London was a lonesome place when the sound of children's voices was no longer heard in the streets. It was about then that we began to hear a mediocre tune called "We'll Hang Out the Washing On the Slegfried Line."

Recalls Dunkirk

You will remember the "sitzkrieg" and the phony war during that first autumn. I remember flying to Amsterdam in December, '39, listening to my colleague, Bill Shirer, who had come down from Berlin telling me of German preparations, determination, rationing and all the rest. And when he said, "What are the British doing?" I had to reply "Very little." We all remember the spring of '40 and how the great German tide

Radio Queens Take a Dressing Down

From Dresser-Upper Ray Driscoll Who Has Fashioned Styles for the Swank International Set's Society Queens

▲ **RAY DRISCOLL CREATED** an atomic hub-bub in Hollywood when he named the screen's five worst-dressed women. He now turns a critical eye on radio row, says what he pleases about the first-ladies of the airwaves.

THERE IS no reason why a radio star should not be on the best-dressed list."

Speaking was Ray Driscoll, youthful internationally-known designer who created an atomic hub-bub in Hollywood a few weeks ago when he announced to the world the five screen stars who, in his opinion, were "the worst-dressed women" in the cinema capital.

In recent weeks, Mr. Driscoll (surprisingly, still alive) has appeared on the etherlanes, guesting with top

movietown commentators and on CBS' popular ladies show, "Meet the Missus." On the latter, he selects three women from the audience, courageously tells them what's wrong with them.

"They're never offended," smiled the self-assured fashion expert. "In fact, I once asked 'Will the worst-dressed woman in this room please step forward?' I was nearly mobbed with volunteers!"

Since his appearance on the "Missus" program, Mr. Driscoll has been receiving some two hundred and sixty letters weekly, from American

housewives who want to know what to do to give themselves glamour.

"One woman," laughed Driscoll, "even sent me a lock of her hair, and asked 'Do you think I need an oil treatment?'"

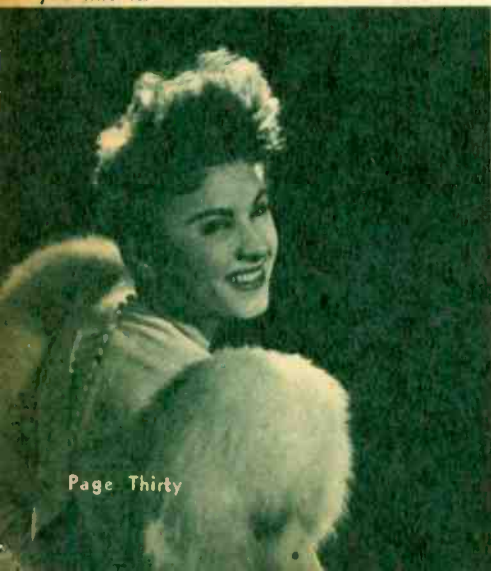
Not content with going out on one limb, the pleasant mannered, soft-spoken stylist went out on another recently when he guested on cinema-city commentator George Fisher's airshow. Asked who was "the worst-dressed woman in radio," Driscoll opined that it was a well-known songstress.

Two other microphone songbirds

have been verbally trounced by Mr. D. for their sartorial taste—or rather, lack of it. With respect to one of them, he advised she should “wear her clothes a little looser.” To extremely tiny Connie Haines, he suggested: “Wear solid colors so you are seen as a unit. Always wear hats with high crowns, and your clip at the very top of them on the side, so that the eye will be carried to give you height.”

Dress for Audience

Ether performers, declared Mr. Driscoll, should dress for their studio audience. “Movie stars, making guest radio appearances,” he went on, “too often rush in looking like the maid’s night off.”

Warming up to his subject, designer Driscoll expounded: “It’s about time to jump on the fashion carousel again, and make your clothes speak for themselves.”

To radio’s ladies, he specified as follows: “If you’re a blues singer, wear something in a pale blue crepe, draped on one side, with a very high neckline, and a score of music shimmering across the shoulder and down the back. I’d call the gown ‘L’amour the Merrier.’

“If you’re a dramatic actress—maybe, say, ‘John’s Other Wife’—dress to feel the part. Perhaps you are not too happy. Wear gray, but with some mad accessory—just for John! I’d call this dress ‘Man Trap.’

“If you’re a comedienne, employ the French idea of underplaying in their clothes. Wear, preferably, something in a red shade—perhaps a deep pottery red. The gown should be split on one side, with an embroidered leopard creeping from the hem. This one I would name ‘Are You There?’”

Designer for Famous

Designer Driscoll, while still in his early twenties, had become one of Europe’s leading couturiers. Before the war, he was with Worth in London and with Gaumont-British in Paris. He has created exclusive fashions for the world’s most famous women—the Duchess of Kent, Magda Lupescu, Lady Bridget Poulet, Diana Churchill, Mrs. Frank Buck, Mrs. Eduardo Villaseñor, Princess Faustino, and a lengthy list of other society queens.

Driscoll-designed specialties have included a dancing dress with swirling skirt sewn with elastic thread (for the Duchess of Kent), a miniature replica of a dish-dryer complete with tiny table tools (for Diana Churchill’s back hair), a lapel-pin rabbit who pops out of a silver top hat with a tug of its gold-plated ears, revealing a seven-jewel watch where his tummy should be (retail price, thirty dollars plus tax).

Most remarkable phase of the Driscoll career is the period following his arrival in New York, after the war had curtailed his Continental capers in the field of fashion. Out of funds, he went to work as a waiter in Manhattan’s swank

Hotel Pierre, where he had once had an expensive suite. He spent six months serving in the establishment’s smart Cotillion Room.

New Yorkers took delight in this waiter who was wearing the late Duke of Kent’s jade cuff links. The hotel manager eventually accustomed himself to having this waiter serve some distinguished guests, then sit down and partake of the meal with them. Columnists gaily garnered items about this waiter who rubbed elbows with his regal customers (he was among the selected few invited to one of the Duchess of Windsor’s exclusive soirees). Mrs. Phil Plant, it was noted, blossomed forth about this time in a new Driscoll-designed ensemble which strikingly resembled the Cotillion Room decor.

Designer Driscoll is thirtyish now, of slight build and average height, young-faced with a thick thatch of dark brown hair and a trim light brown moustache. He dresses conservatively in a business suit, tie and black oxfords.

Of the Hollywood male, he muttered: “I believe they have a secret passion for the Aurora Borealis. After all, they can’t use the excuse that they are afraid of something new in fashion, for these men get used to new hats on their wives, new hairdos—and even new wives! So why not some new ideas in their manner of dressing—even something so revolutionary as wearing a tie!”

Driscoll happily selected the handful of women whom he considers to be radio’s best-dressed:

Gracie Allen—“the only girl in show business who dresses for l’amour and she has fun doing it.”

Hildegard—“combines the chic and the chic and makes you like it.”

Mary Livingstone—“subtle in her dressing; her clothes don’t scream for attention.”

Agnes Moorehead—“dramatic simplicity is her forte.”

Joan Davis—“a surprise to find America’s No. 1 knockabout comedienne such a chic woman.”

Mr. Driscoll conceded that there were a number of others who come close to making the best-dressed list. “It is usually the case that they overdo something,” he told us, citing a couple of examples.

Harriet Hilliard—“why not a change in her hat fashions?”

Ann Sothorn—“one of those most fortunate small women who should be very sophisticated.” Apparently Mr. Driscoll feels her wardrobe is topheavy with pinafores.

To radio’s feminine performers, Mr. Driscoll extended a final reminder, “Remember your audience. Your clothes should not only be smart, but also harmonize with their wearer and with the background setting. Also, keep in mind that simplicity is the watchword of today’s fashion.”

ABC Mikemen Step Up and Take a Bow As Radio Lifers Are Introduced to This Network's Broadcasting Staff

FOURTH in our series on the staff announcers, this article introduces you to the American Broadcasting Company's mikemen. You know their voices, but their faces are probably new to you, and you'll find their stories of interest. They are radio's "staff of life"—these men who are never at a loss at a microphone.

▶ **DRESSER DAHLSTEAD IS** head of the ABC announcing staff, and has been since 1942. For three years, he served with the Armed Forces Radio Service, returning to the network and civilian life just a few months ago.

▶ **ABBOTT TESSMAN WAS** one of the original ABC announcers when the American became an independent network. During World War II, he served as instructor with the Aero Tech Institute under Army supervision. He and his wife, Marie, and their daughter Susan, live in Burbank.

▶ **GEORGE FENNEMAN WAS** born in Peking, China. He started in radio in San Francisco in 1942, the same year he was graduated from S. F. State College. He came to Hollywood in 1945, and has made the San Fernando Valley his home. He is married, has a one-and-a-half-year-old son.





↑ **PIERRE ANDRE WAS FIRST** heard on the air in 1927. He won both state and inter-city oratorical contests and made the 'varsity debate team in his sophomore year of high school at Superior, Wisconsin. After service in World War I, he attended Minnesota U. Andre has been heard on all major networks and came to Hollywood in December of 1945. He is married, has a seventeen-year-old son, David.

↑ **HARRY WALSTRUM** of the ABC staff was born in Alabama in 1899, became interested in the theater during his service in World War I. He has been announcing since 1932, and has been heard on every major network and on every station in Los Angeles. He is married, has a 17-year-old son.

↑ **PAUL MASTERSON DECIDED TO** become a radio announcer when he finished school in 1937. He worked first on a local station in Long Beach, joined ABC's staff in 1942. That same year, he joined the Army Air Corps as a control operator. He was one of the first AFRS program directors and was stationed in the Philippines, then in Tokyo. On last March 10, he married Nancy Adell Leonard of Long Beach.

↓ **JOHN M. KENNEDY CAME TO** California when still a child, attended Los Angeles Junior College, then went to the Pasadena Playhouse. He entered radio in 1933, and has been a busy top-flight announcer ever since. He is currently heard on ABC's "Hollywood Music Hall". He is married, has a four-year-old son, John Ernest Kennedy.

↓ **MIKE STOKEY STARTED IN** radio as an emcee of a school show when he was only eleven years old. In 1938, he won an announcer's contest on an L. A. station. He joined ABC in 1942, and in the same year, joined the Army Air Corps. He was commissioned nine months later and assigned as a B-17 instructor at Roswell, N. M., then a B-29 instructor at Tucson. He is married to Pamela Blake.

↓ **REED BROWNING WAS BORN** William C. Livesay, in Decatur, Illinois. After graduation from I. U., he sent a recording of his voice to KGMB in Honolulu, and spent two years there as staff announcer. He served during World War II as a Radio Officer in the Merchant Marine in the Philippines. He is married, has two children—Wendy, four, and Billy, one.

▲ **SANDRA'S SON IS** twenty-two months old at this writing. He has brown eyes and white hair that's perfectly straight. They call him "Curly".

GHAT JUST goes to show you!" smiled Sandra Gould. "The last time I talked with Radio Life, I said there were four things I wanted—to live in California, and have a house, a baby, and a dog. Now, everything's come true! Isn't it wonderful?"

Tiny Miss Gould, brown-eyed, round-faced and auburn-haired, had stopped by our office for a visit on a sunny, spring-like California day. "If anybody told me I had to leave California now, I don't know what I'd do!" she declared, eyeing the expanse of clear blue sky from our window. "I love New York—but just for visiting."

About that four-way dream that has evolved in the past few years, Miss Gould elaborated happily: "We've just bought our new home. It's on the valley side of Coldwater Canyon, and is typically Californian,

U-shaped with every room opening out onto the patio. And," Sandra smiled broadly, "it has a swimming pool. I always leave that to the end to tell," she laughed. "It sounds so chi-chi, it's kind of embarrassing. I can hardly believe it's me.

"As for my baby," she continued. "Michael is twenty-two months old now. He has brown eyes and white hair that's perfectly straight. We call him 'Curly.'

"He already shows signs of going into show business," Sandra noted, laughing. "He loves to listen to the radio and learns to sing the songs he hears. He sings and dances, applauds himself, then takes a bow."

Sandra has been married eight years to Larry Berns, producer of the Jack Carson program. "We give each other the Croix-de-Guerre every year," she grinned. "Last year, in fact, Larry tried to find a real one, but couldn't, so we settled for paper medals again. We think we really deserve them. We're both maniacs to live with. We're so busy we have to make appointments to see each other.

"It's wonderful, however," she went on, "to be in the same business. We always understand each other."

The next day Sandra took her wooden pin down to Saks. The store's buyer looked at it, and ordered six gross. "I didn't even know what a gross was," Miss Gould recalled, laughing.

But she immediately set about filling the order. She looked under "Woodcarvers," found two Czechoslovakians who couldn't speak or understand English, but who carried out her designs with fine precision. spread like a stain over Western Europe. And there was Dunkirk, a name which will last so long as the English language. The sea was calm and the little ships went over and brought the boys back, and how many of them brought their rifles back with them—and defeat was not in their faces. And there was Mr. Churchill who mobilized the language and made it fight. Then came the days when Englishmen dug deep in their history and were worthy of their ancestors. Those were the days when most men, save Englishmen, despaired of England's life, and when, according to reports that came down from the North, they were saying in Scotland, "If England is forced to give in, it will be a long war."

I remember a weekend spent with General Alexander up on the Wash, seeing seven miles of open beach covered by two antiquated naval guns, the young gunner explaining that he had exactly twenty-seven rounds. He proposed to use the H. E. on the barges as they came in and reserve his seven rounds of shrapnel till the enemy reached the beach. His ancestors were looking down at him and he knew it.

I remember Mr. Churchill walking to the East End the morning after a heavy raid. The people cheered him and he said, "They act as though I had brought them a great victory." And there were tears in his eyes.

You were all alone, and rather proud of it.

Remember the morning they hit Biggin Hill and a company of WAAFs marched through the gates while the buildings were still burning? They marched like the Guards. The swarming dog-fights over Dover, the black scars on green turf where the planes crashed. There was mine-sweeping with the Dover patrol, the skipper who said fishing was more fun, and his war aim was to tie up again somewhere north of the Tweed. He brewed the strongest tea I've ever tasted. There was a taxi driver bringing me up from Liverpool Street, a near miss rocked the cab. The old man slid back the window and remarked, "You know, sir, he'll do that once too often, once." The big raid of December 29th when the city burned and, as I walked home at seven in the morning, the windows in the West End were red with reflected fire and the raindrops were like blood on the panes. That was the Christmas you sang carols in the shelters, you were living a life, not an apology, and the defenders of the realm were the people who worked with their hands. And

it was then that I learned the meaning of that great word "steady," in places like Bristol, Plymouth, Coventry, Southampton and Manchester.

Improved Real Estate

When the Americans began to arrive I stood at the rail as a liner came into Greenock. A boy from California looked at that green and pleasant land and remarked, "Boy, that's a piece of real estate!" And a young Scot in RAF blue replied, "Aye, we've spent a thousand years improving it." I remember how the Americans drank up your beer, monopolized the taxis and made loud noises in the street, and how most of you gave us a staid demonstration of native good manners.

No one who was there will ever forget the cold and the heat of North Africa or the team spirit that developed between the British and Americans. The London Irish in front of Long Stop, the Guards' Armor going in at Fandouk, the gunner shooting the tops off mountains north of Enfidaville and, high overhead, Spitfires flying cover for American bombers.

The memories all merge together but the clearest is the spirit that pervaded an advancing army, the nearer you were to the front the less differences in uniform and accent seemed to matter. I remember one morning just off the Dutch coast, at about 12,000 feet, we were leading a formation of Marauders when German fighters came down out of the clouds and Spitfires flown by British and Polish boys beat them off and, when the show was over, a sweating turret gunner opened his microphone and said, "Brother, from now on I'm pro-British! Next to them I like the Poles best." And just before we bombed, he pointed again to the Spits flying on our wings. "Ain't they pretty. That's life insurance, that is."

Once we were going out over East Anglia on the way to drop a lot of brave men around Arnhem and Nijmegen. A big American sergeant sitting next to the door pointed down to the men and women working in the fields and said, "You know, those are our kind of people. It'll be nice to come back and see them." I wonder if he did?

Said "Please"

In my youth I was told that you were a sea-faring people and I have no reason to believe that I was misinformed. But you carry with you in the air a degree of casual confidence, courage and courtesy which is altogether remarkable. There was a night over Berlin when we were coned in the lights, the Lancaster was corkscrewing. The pilot said, "Window like mad." He meant to throw out those metallic strips used to confuse the enemy radar and the bomb aimer. One of the crew said to me over the intercom, "Mr. Mur-

row, would you please pass me another package of window?" That is what he said—please, and it seemed so natural that I forgot about it till we returned to base. Then there was the Halifax pilot on the Rhine drop who asked me just before we crossed the river whether it would be all right if I stepped on my recording gear in case we had to bail out. Even after nine years I can't always be sure when an Englishman is being serious.

Since this is a purely personal broadcast—a sort of farewell and hail—you will permit me to acknowledge the debt I owe to colleagues in the BBC, especially the engineers. I believe that I have learned the most important thing that has happened in Britain during the last six years. It was not, I think, the demonstration of physical courage. That has been a cheap commodity in this war. Many people in many nations were brave under the bombs. I doubt that the most important thing was Dunkirk or the Battle of Britain, El Alamein or Stalingrad, not even the landings in Normandy or the great blows struck by British and American bombers. Historians may decide that any one of these events was decisive, but I am persuaded that the most important thing that happened in Britain was that this nation chose to win or lose this war under the established rules of parliamentary procedure. It feared Nazism but did not choose to imitate it. The Government was given dictatorial power but it was used with restraint and the House of Commons was ever vigilant. Do you remember that while London was being bombed in the daylight the House devoted two days to discussing conditions under which enemy aliens were detained on the Isle of Man? Though Britain fell, there were to be no concentration camps here. Do you remember that two days after Italy declared war, an Italian citizen, convicted of murder in the lower courts, appealed successfully to the highest court in the land and the original verdict was set aside? There was still law in the land, regardless of race, nationality or hatred. Representative government, equality before the law survived. Future generations who bother the official record of proceedings in the House of Commons will discover that British armies retreated from many places but that there was no retreat from the principles for which your ancestors fought. The record is massive evidence of the flexibility and toughness of the principles you profess. It will, I think, inspire and lift men's hearts long after the names of most of the great sea and land engagements have been forgotten. It was your answer to the question that was asked all round the world in the decades before that Sunday in September of 1939. The question was: what has happened to the soul of Britain?
