That's What Seven-Year-Old Anne Whitfield Thinks of Radio Work



MEET ANNE WHITFIELD who made good in Hollywood radio at seven! Anne's newest part is that of Stuart Erwin's motherly little niece, "Bunny" in "Phone Again, Finnegan."

JUST ONE month after her seventh birthday anniversary, little Anne Whitfield made her radio network debut. Blonde, pigtailed Anne walked off with the roles of "Penelope" in "One Man's Family" and "Corny Smith" in "His Honor, the Barber"!

As "Penelope," Anne was called upon to read whole speeches in German, as, according to the script, she had been confined in a Nazi concentration camp. This presented no difficulties to the amazing Anne, who learned German for the occasion. As "Corny," she was strictly from Tennessee.

Anne and her mother, Frances Whitfield, came to Hollywood last August from Macon, Georgia, while Captain Richard Whitfield, Anne's father, was still with the 38th Division, supervising artillery fire on Luzon.

Back in Macon, Mrs. Whitfield was in charge of radio production for two radio stations. "Whenever a child was needed," she laughed, "it was a matter of convenience to use Anne. And she so thoroughly loved being used that I must admit I was often guilty of creating opportunities for her to appear!" This excellent training has given young Anne the ability to read, understand and interpret things that actors several times her age do not find easy.

As far as Anne herself is concerned, it's all child's play! Radio is still a great big game to her, and long rehearsals hold no weariness at all. "She'd be doing the same thing at home and calling it 'make-believe!'" exclaimed Mrs. Whitfield.

Many Activities

Aside from her talent at a micro-

phone, Anne has all the other interests that delight most seven-year-olds. She is in the B3 at school and is very absorbed in all her school work. Right now, her great ambition is to play in the school orchestra, and she is taking violin lessons in hopes of achieving a place in the string section by next Fall. She has taken piano lessons since she was five, and has sung for church and school entertainments. She ice skates, and takes ballet lessons. One of her favorite pastimes is "making things"—Christmas cards, Valentines and crowns for her favorite off-the-mike impersonation, "playing Princess."

Anne doesn't have too much time for toys, and last Christmas she told her parents: "I'm at a very bad stage—I'm too old for toys, and not old enough for grown-up things!"

"I guess you'd say Anne's in the book stage," said Mrs. Whitfield. "She's always reading. What are your favorite books, Anne?" she asked.

"'Alice in Wonderland,' 'Through the Looking Glass,' the Oz books and 'Andersen's Fairy Tales.'" answered Anne quickly.

In "Thumb" Wedding

"Anne started dramatizing when she started talking," Mrs. Whitfield replied when we asked her how she came to realize she had an actress in the family. "And when she was barely two she was in one of those 'Tom Thumb' weddings. Anne was the flower girl. Well, after the thing was over, all the other children left the stage except the flower girl. She just stood there, completely happy, gazing out at the audience in fascination while people called from the wings, and hands reached out trying to pull her off the stage. I guess I should have known then that Anne was an actress!"

denly dropped in the middle of Brooklyn. He was born and grew up in the Bronx.

This is one of those amusing facets to the Gorcey personality which provide almost as many laughs to associates off the program as on it.

Just before Christmas Leo was telling about the gifts he'd bought his wife at the Broadway-Hollywood department store.

Probably Right

"The clerk said, 'And where shall I address them, Mr. Gorcey?' and I said, 'Just address them to the Broadway-Hollywood because my wife will have them all back here the day after Christmas, anyhow'."

On the show Leo is represented as an amateur inventor and dabbler in animal genetics. Once he reported that he'd invented a suction-cup for wives' hats so that when hubby came home late and his wife hit the ceiling, she'd stay there.

In the interests of accuracy, that gag was not Leo's, but was cooked up by the program's writer, Vic McLeod. Leo took particular delight in it, however, for it brought him more comment, written and oral, than any he's delivered. He's acquired a lively correspondence from other amateur inventors as a result of it.

It wasn't much funnier, though, than one of Leo's own ideas for enlarging a room of his house out in

Sherman Oaks. He came to the program one day completely exhausted.

"What's the matter?" asked Burns.

"I just finished hauling 37 wheelbarrow loads of dirt from under the house," panted Leo.

"What for?"

"Well, one room is too cramped and I don't know how to lift the ceiling, so I'm lowering the floor!"

Leo's experiments on the program with crossing various types of animals are always good for laughs. Once he announced he'd crossed a kangaroo with a beaver so he could raise fur coats with pockets. Then he was working on crossing a carrier pigeon with an owl so it could deliver night letters, and a snake with a rabbit so he could get an adder that would multiply.

Out at his home Leo's interest in nature takes only a slightly different turn. He's been collecting rocks from all the states in the Union (did you know that a rock from Maine looks just like a rock from California?) He recently pulled up a collection of 150 dwarf cacti on which he'd spent years, because he'd developed an interest in cement-work and wanted to lay a sidewalk right across the cactus bed.

No Help Problem

Funny things always seem to happen to Gorcey. One night a colored man crawled in an open window of his house, liked the layout, stayed over until morning and announced to Leo that the place was rundown and he ought to hang around and clean it up. He did, too; for three months.

Leo comes to rehearsal the day of the broadcast in rough clothes and a day's growth of beard. When the show is all ready for the mike, he dashes over to his favorite barber, then knocks off a couple of fast games of pool and returns for the broadcast refreshed in mind and body.

Once the barber turned up sick and caught Leo flat-footed. He scoured NBC until he located an electric razor, then discovered five minutes before air time that the thing wouldn't work. He wanted to drape the razor and cord around his neck, so the audience would know his intentions were good, but calmer heads prevailed. Anyhow, when he put on his ragged hat with the brim pinned back, the customers probably

a sensitive delight in make-believe—the kind of imagination and sensitivity which, fed rather than stifled, contributes today to her signal ability as an actress. Her weekly characterization of "Marilyn" on Lionel Barrymore's "Mayor of the Town" is well-known to all dialers. She recently became star of her own Sunday show, "Calamity Jane" on CBS.

Her sensational acting in "Suspense's", "Sorry, Wrong Number" has attracted national attention and repeated clamorings for re-enactments. No sooner had she performed the fourth repeat broadcast last August than enthusiastic listeners were asking for a fifth.

Said Miss Moorehead of "Sorry, Wrong Number": "It's tremendous

exercise, both mentally and physically. After the last broadcast I was so keyed up nervously I didn't sleep a wink that night."

Exciting Background

Not until we'd interviewed Agnes, lunched with her and husband Jack Lee, and visited their Cheviot Hills home did we begin to grasp the variety and complexity of elements comprising her make-up. We'd always considered her a well-dressed, extremely competent actress and knew she was a bosom friend of Orson Welles. We didn't know her father had been a Presbyterian minister, that Aggie and her small cousin had been spanked when they were five because they'd entertained at a medicine show, that she'd started in radio in St. Louis in 1923

as "the girl baritone," that she'd landed a job with Seth Parker because she could repeat the books of the Bible in less than twenty seconds, that the first year she was in college she'd planned to be a missionary. "I could just see myself on the Nile," Agnes recalls, amused.

Much of the excitement in her life, it seems, goes back to her sprightly imagination and the fact that her father and mother understood, rather than discouraged it.

Agnes remembers the family's Dickens plates—very lovely pieces of English china used on special occasions. Each person at the table was always required to weave a story about his or her plate.

She was raised on Grimms' Fairy

Star-Gazer

Five-A-Week Ether Chatterer Frances Scully Gives Listeners Close-Range Glimpses of Stellar Personalities

MANY OF THE stars themselves are regular listeners to "Star Gazing," and are pleased and surprised when they hear Frances Scully's chatty little thumbnail sketches about their doings. For instance, recently she "star gazed" at Charlotte Greenwood, including a humorous little story on the shoes of the stars. Back came the following note from Miss Greenwood:

"Dear Frances: I heard you today tell your radio listeners that I had the biggest feet in Hollywood. It has one compensation, it's hard to knock one over, with such an understanding. And it's so seldom that I top any other girl in anything! Boy—to top Garbo—even in feet—is fine and dandy. Thanks, Frances. From Frances C. Greenwood."

Frances' consistently large bag of fan mail is proof that her air friends set great store by her opinions on a variety of subjects. Questions range from such varied feminine matters as the selection of a suitable school wardrobe for a young daughter, or problems of home-making, to what to do for skin blemishes or how to give a dry shampoo.

When queried on which questions are most frequently asked by her

listeners, Miss Scully prepared a list of those which are often asked, complete with brief answers which interested us, and we believe will interest the reader.

Typical Questions

Q. How can I remove cigarette stains from my fingers?

A. Lemon juice should do the trick . . . for stubborn stains try powdered pumice or peroxide.

Q. How can I care for dry skin?

A. First of all, the water which you are using should be checked for hardness. Hard water is a definite factor in creating a dry-skin condition. Use distilled or boiled water for cleansing your face. Suggested nightly routine: Two applications of cleansing cream, remove with tissue, then wash face with warm water and mild super-fatted soap. Pat face dry with towel, then apply a rich emollient cream. It is not necessary to allow it to remain overnight. Twenty minutes is sufficient time for the skin to absorb as much as it will! Remove surplus with tissue.

Q. Which is the most important thing to consider when selecting colors . . . hair, eyes or skin coloring?

A. I advocate following the color of the eyes. Skin tones can be changed by makeup, and natural hair colors will be complemented by

Tales and the Oz stories. Often in the mornings she would descend for breakfast and haughtily announce: "Today you may call me Guinevere." On days she chose to "play queen," no one was supposed to speak to her.

The public was her "meat" from the start. When she was barely three she made her first appearance singing the solo part in a Children's Day anthem. Agnes' mother dressed her in white with bows in her hair. "I can vaguely remember mother put books on a chair (I was fat and pudgy) so that when I stood on them my hands and head just came up over the choir loft rail." Opposite the loft was a stained glass window of The Good Shepherd. "Watch the Shepherd and keep your eyes on the sheep," admonished Mrs. Moorehead, apprehensive lest her child become so interested in the congregation that she forget to sing.

Although Agnes never jabbered baby talk, she sang from her go-cart days and loved to dance. The year she was five she and her mother visited Aggie's aunt in Pittsburgh, where there was a boy cousin about Agnes' age. Together they were sent on an errand one afternoon, but on the way they became interested in a big tent swarming with people. They decided to investigate.

"It was simply fascinating," actress Moorehead remembers. "Reflectors in the aisles and a man on the stage giving a spiel about salve and an elixir."

Cousin Volunteered

Finally the man stopped talking and asked, "Is there anybody who'd like to come up and perform?" Before Agnes could volunteer, her small cousin was on stage and she was left standing agape, while he sang and danced amidst thunderous applause from the crowd.

Suddenly the cousin stopped and announced: "I gotta cousin—she can sing and dance, too!" So Aggie joined him in old songs like "The Lemon Tree" and "Melancholy Mose," interspersed with Irish jigs.

Their pay, for a lengthy show, was armful of salves and elixirs. Proud-

ly clutching their loot, the pair walked into the house hours late. After Agnes had worked so hard to bring home all those beautiful

He acquired it nine years ago at Universal studios by the simple method of forgetting to return it to the property department and it's been with him in 44 pictures out of the 51 he's made, as well as on more than a half dozen radio series and innumerable camp visits.

That hat covers a very active brain. Leo not only stars in his pictures, but he also helps write and produce them. The poor man's Orson Welles—but he doesn't throw his knowledge around. Kidding his radio producer, Sam Pierce, about Sam's duties, Leo said, "It doesn't take brains to be a producer. All you need to know are the rules of gin rummy."

ARTHUR Q. BRYAN is one comedian without a "Hamlet" complex! "In fact," Arthur admitted, "I don't even like Shakespeare—except for 'Midsummer Night's Dream'—it's nice and wacky."

"There's just one role I would love to play—and what a part that is!" he continued. "It's the lead in 'Harvey'."

On a trip last year to open the War Loan drive in Toronto, Arthur managed to go to New York and in ten days he saw seven plays. Frank Fay in "Harvey" was one—the one that Arthur can't forget. Arthur is morose about his chances ever to play the part because Joe E. Brown is winning new acclaim in the West Coast company and Bing Crosby has been mentioned for the picture. However, if the chance ever presents itself—Arthur will put in his bid to play the part of Elwood P. Dowd, the lovable inebriate whose closest friend is an invisible, six-foot rabbit.

"What makes you desire the 'Harvey' part above others?" we wanted to know.

"Well, it's wonderful fantasy, and it's so terrifically sympathetic. Of course anyone who plays it will have to do it the way Frank Fay does, because he does it perfectly," Arthur answered.

Arthur Q. is equally enthusiastic, however, about his part as "Doctor Gamble" on the "Fibber McGee and Molly" show. "Don Quinn (writer of the show) is wonderful," he said. "Every part he writes is a good one. 'Doctor Gamble' is a real person—when I step up to the mike to do the 'doctor' I feel subconsciously that I am him. Don Quinn studies the character and your voice and writes for you. I feel that the characters on the show are all drawn by him and we just sort of aid and abet him.

"For instance, when the 'McGee

and Molly' show was in Toronto, nobody knew or cared what our real names were. In the morning when I'd come down into the hotel lobby, people would say, 'Good morning, Doctor' . . . 'How are you this morning, Doctor Gamble?'"

Prefers Comedy

Arthur admits that he enjoys doing comedy more than any other type of role. "I think most comics really enjoy being comedians," he confided, "because of the instantaneous response to humor. We revel in laughter and can actually have fun with the audience. That's something you don't get in drama. I guess a comedian has to have a touch of conceit to be a good comic—but perhaps I shouldn't say that!"

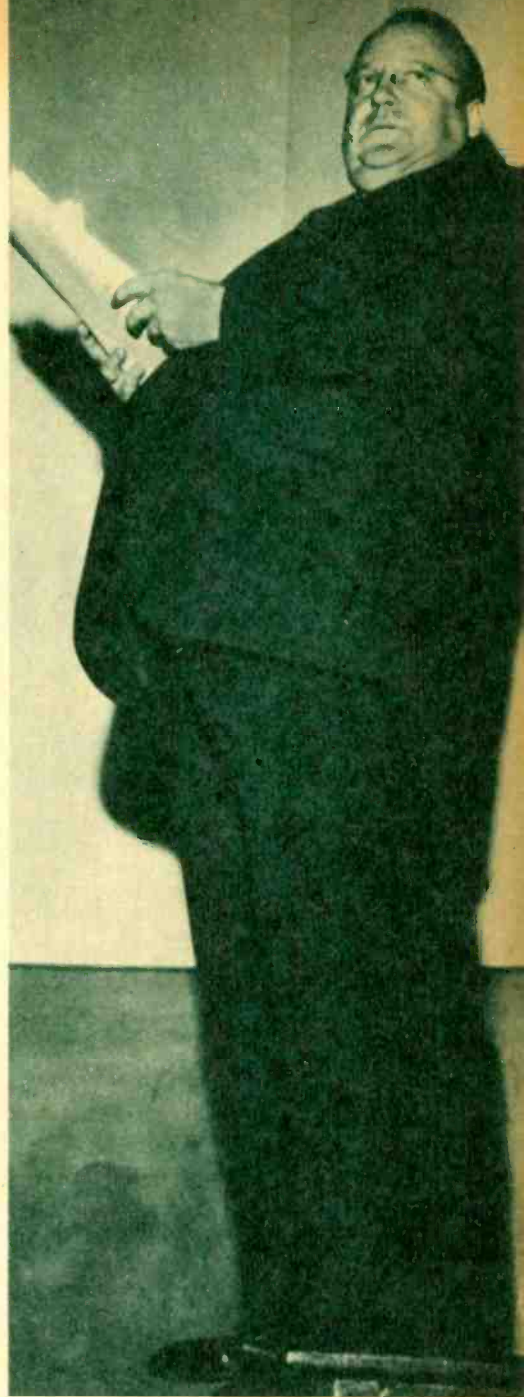
"Is it harder to make people laugh or cry?" we wanted to know.

Sings for Stars

This is songstress Sweetland's first real radio break since the sterling Westinghouse musical of several seasons ago which starred Sally and Ken Darby's choristers. Since then, the pretty blonde, hazel-eyed singer's exceptional musical talents have been somewhat concealed from airdialers who have heard her, virtually incognito, doing choral work and singing commercials on the "Radio Hall of Fame," "Forever Tops" and the Bob Burns show. Movie-goers have heard her voice, also, but her identity remains concealed—behind the faces of such screen heroines as Brenda Marshall, Joan Leslie and Martha Vickers, for whom she has

supplied singing voices. Her most recent "dubbing" job was for the latter actress in the movie, "The Time, the Place and the Girl."

Whenever Paul Whiteman, Andre Kostelanetz, David Broekman or any other perfectionist conductor is in Hollywood, they summon Sally to contribute to their West Coast performances. Versatile Sally, in addition to her remarkable range as a singer (she has rendered every type of number from the lowest jive to the highest coloratura), is a skilled pianist and a thorough musician.

"She reads music so well and so fast," her husband related, "that once, during a recording session out at MGM when she somehow happened to make a mistake, they called a five-minute recess to get over the shock."

"She often helps me practice—accompanies me on the piano, and sings all the other parts in any of my operatic scores," Lee continued, "but she gets disgusted because she reads music so much faster than I do." soon as Lee's career has gained a new foothold.

Speaking of a singer's unsmooth path, Sally recalled her rough routine of some years ago, which had her appearing on NBC's Union Oil show from 7:30 to 8:00 p. m. in formal attire, followed by an immediate appearance on a CBS program at 8:00 p. m. in street dress!

"I've never moved so fast in all my life," she recounted, laughing. "In the first place, to solve the dress problem, I always wore a suit under my evening gown. Then, Lee would meet me at the artists' entrance of NBC, and I'd jump in the car and peel off my formal while he careened madly through a parking lot to land with screeching brakes at CBS, a block away, in time for me to rush in the back door and onto the stage, completely out of breath, but somehow still able to sing!"

Sally's off-mike interests? "I love to cook," she exclaimed with real enthusiasm. "I like to get new recipes and try new dishes." Her husband quickly vouched for this.

Pie or Ade?

"Sal's a great cook," he praised, but specified mischievously, "except when it comes to lemon pies. Sal's lemon pies always look like lemon pudding—practically lemonade, in fact."

In the time that has elapsed since his previous ether assignment, Jimmy Cash has been working as an expeditor in an airplane factory, a job he took during the war. In addition, he has been making personal appearances, and recently gave a concert of Stephen Foster music in Burbank, where he now owns his own home.

It is his house and his family (Camille and daughter, Berta Sue) which give the greatest pleasure to this blond young man with the quiet, matter-of-fact way about him.

"Berta Sue," he informed us with smiling pride, "just had her ninth birthday. She's studying music. Likes to play the piano, especially boogie-woogie."

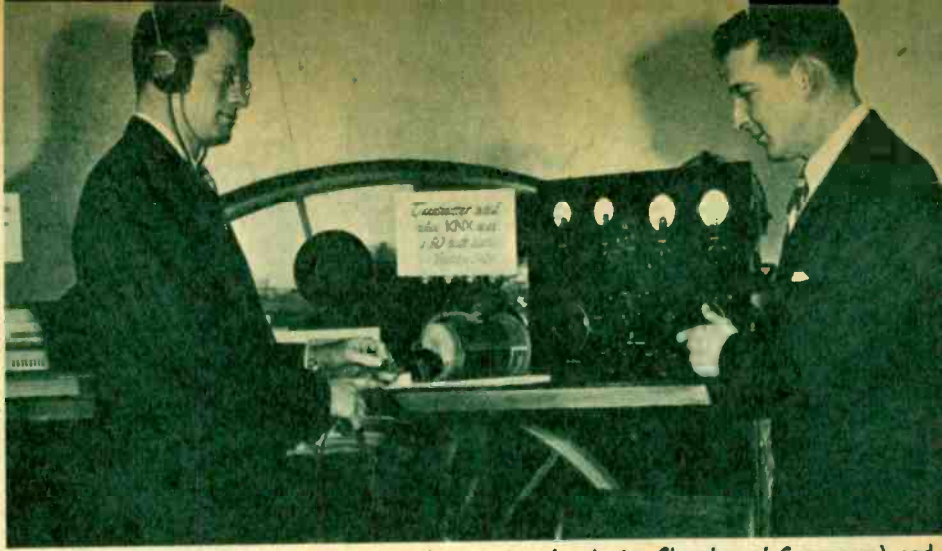

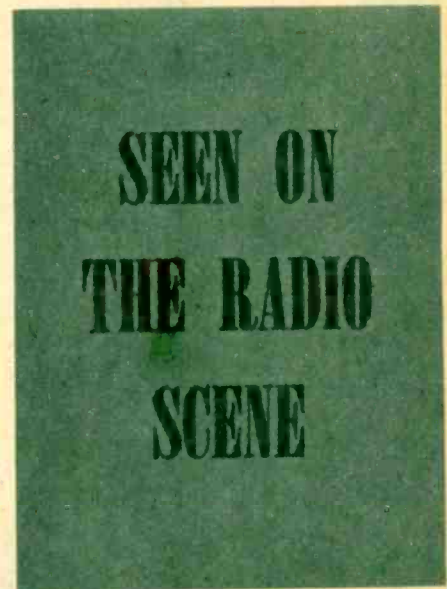

bottles, her mother spanked her and promptly sent her to bed. "How unfair!" she thought.

Agnes' choice of an acting career was deliberate. Schooling completed and a short term of teaching already behind her, she decided to attend the American Academy of Dramatic Arts in New York. This horrified her father's mother, who telephoned Rev. Moorehead to protest.

"New York," said Grandmother Moorehead emphatically, "is a den of iniquity. I don't think it's wise for Agnes to go there."

"She knows right from wrong," Agnes' father stated calmly.

"Yes," replied Grandmother. "But there are too many temptations there. Some of these days she's going to get her name in the paper!"

In New York, young Agnes studied at the Academy, met another young actor, Jack Lee, whom she married, enjoyed some successes and suffered as many hardships. By the time depression days fell, she and Jack were willing to take a one-day job acting in pantomime in Bamberger's window, for it meant \$40 a piece. "We grabbed our money and ran to the nearest Italian restaurant to eat

spaghetti—it's so filling!" laughed Agnes.

First Sight of Orson

In New York, too, she met Orson Welles, in itself a story. It began when Agnes was in her 'teens and spent an Easter vacation in the big city, staying at the Waldorf. Agnes was fascinated by this child, who was sitting at a nearby table discussing a concert with his father and two elderly women.

Several years later Agnes worked with a man in radio—a man whose face seemed vaguely familiar. She liked him—he had ability and a fine sense of humor. He invited her to work with him in his Mercury Theater of the air and then on "Columbia Workshop." She was in the cast the night he presented his "Man from Mars" broadcast (she did a woman's scream, then spent the remainder of the half-hour answering frantic telephone calls). When he went on to Hollywood to make the picture, "Citizen Kane," Agnes was asked to join the cast.

After the "Mars" broadcast and before "Citizen Kane," Welles was written up in the Post. Accompanying the articles were pictures of him at various ages—one at the age of seven. Agnes happened to see the story and the picture, immediately recognized it as that of the little boy she'd seen at the Waldorf.

Checking later with Welles, she confirmed the fact that he'd spent that certain Easter vacation in New York. Now when he's asked how long he's known Agnes Moorehead, Welles answers: "Ever since I was seven!"

Deserts New York

After working in "Citizen Kane," Agnes returned to New York, where she was established on stage and in radio. Then Welles asked her to return here for a role in "Magnificent Ambersons." Again she suspended her career in the east. The third time she was summoned west, she decided to stay.

Miss Moorehead's well-regulated life is consumed with many interests—friends, Spanish lessons, collecting theatrical magazines, Staffordshire houses, lava cameos, and antique jewelry. She is presently occupied redecorating and furnishing a newly-purchased English-Victorian house overlooking the Rancho golf course. Her servant, Frank, a mild-mannered Mexican, is an excellent cook, but occasionally Agnes likes to make Spanish dishes, especially one with shrimp. She shops twice a week at Farmers Market and plans the menus. Has a massage two or three times a week... gets up at 7:30 a.m. ... has an excellent assistant, Georgia Johnstone (wife of radio actor Bill Johnstone) who capably channels phone calls, notes, appointments, and spends an hour or two daily with Miss Moorehead an-

swering fan mail and planning schedules.

Agnes and husband Jack like cribbage, backgammon, Russian bank... attend early evening movies and "everything in the flesh from ballet to ice shows."

She reads a lot—biographies of actors and actresses, picture material: "I have thousands of books—Mother has about four hundred of mine, I don't know how many are on our farm in New Concord, Ohio."

With her reddish hair, the actress steers away from ruddy reds in her attire, prefers purple, blue, and fuchsia shades, also pink. "I always manage one black dress," she shrugged.

Needless to say, she adores working with Barrymore and always, with husband Jack, accompanies him to dinner at the Colony House on Saturday night after the broadcast.

She sees Orson sporadically. When he's low he calls her and they have lunch. When she's low, she calls him and he talks her out of it. Agnes is a rabid perfectionist and consequently, extremely critical of her work and apt to deprecate her talents. She rehearses tirelessly and feels that every detail, whether or not noted by the public as a whole, contributes to the effectiveness of her performance.

Her marvelous mimicry is probably best appreciated over the luncheon table as she colorfully relates some bit of conversation. Her imitation of the bird which roosts on her roof is priceless. Although she indicates she might be "temperamental" on provocation, she's essentially an unusually kind person and one who doesn't like "high-hat," either in herself or others.

On her piano is a large picture of Orson Welles, which he autographed: "For Calliope Aggie: The devil is in her figure, but the Good God is in her heart. All my love to her always..."
