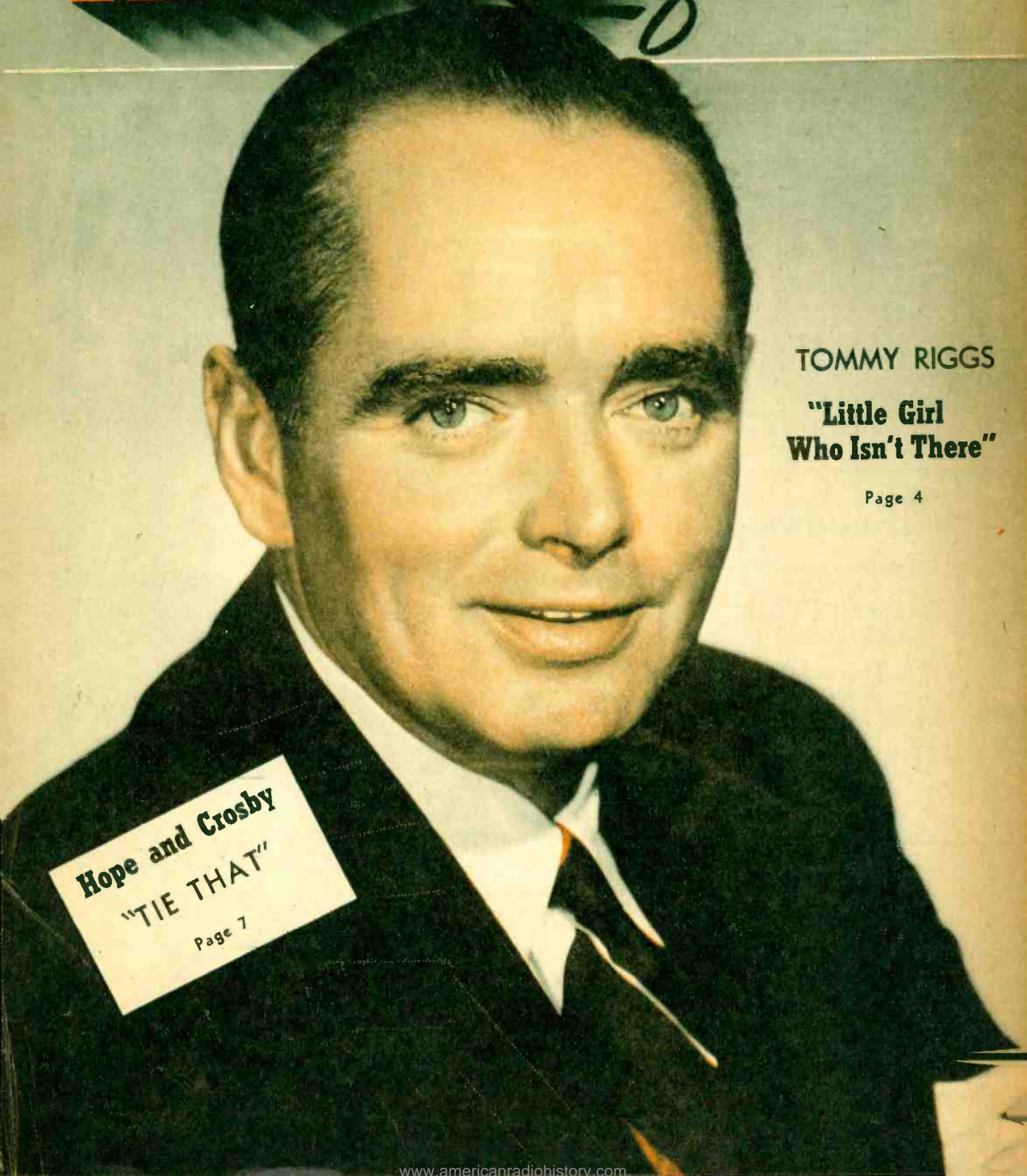

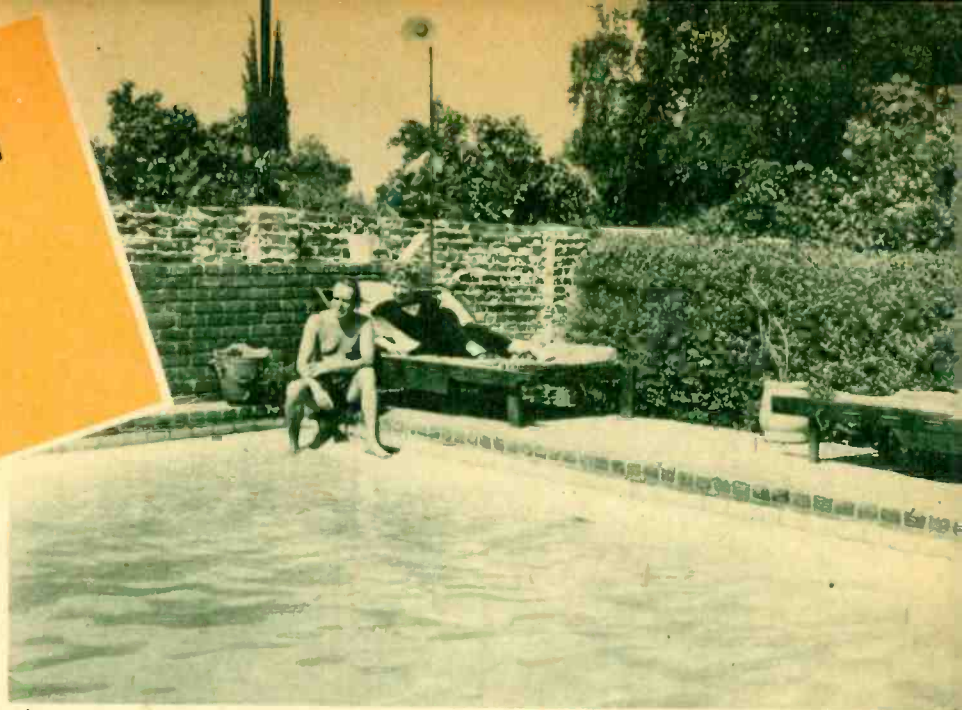

Although Absent from the Air, Tommy Riggs And Betty Lou Haven't Been Idle These Past Few Years; Now They're Back on the Ether, But Also Taking It Easy the California Way

TOMMY RIGGS grinned over the top of the mystery book he was reading and remarked, "You sure get lazy." We had come upon him at the rear of his attractive stucco home out Encino way, stretched out leisurely in a comfortable lawn chair beside the swimming pool. "It's not pretentious, but we have a lot of fun," he remarked, his arm indicating the inviting sweep of backyard patio and pool. "Had a gang of youngsters over here the other afternoon," he went on, his blue eyes twinkling. "Noisy!"

Not in evidence, however, was the childish treble of Tommy's special little friend, Betty Lou, the impish little make-believe girl who is Riggs' radio partner. Just a clever gymnastic of Tommy's own soft, deep-registered masculine voice, Betty Lou isn't anywhere to be seen. The only evidences we saw of her were the sketch of a sweet-smiling, curly-haired little girl on the wall of the Riggs' guest house and a tiny pair of wooden shoes next to Tommy's in front of the barbecue pit.

Tommy explained, "They were given to Betty Lou and me when we appeared in Holland, Michigan, one year, for the town's annual tulip

festival. That's certainly something worth seeing, incidentally."

Lazy Bones

Attired comfortably in brightly-patterned blue swimming shorts, Riggs yawned, stretched his sun-browned five feet, ten-inch frame still more comfortably, and said again, "You sure get lazy." He confessed that he's so happy in his new Valley home that he hates ever going to town, though he dutifully treks in regularly for rehearsals and airings of his Friday evening CBS show.

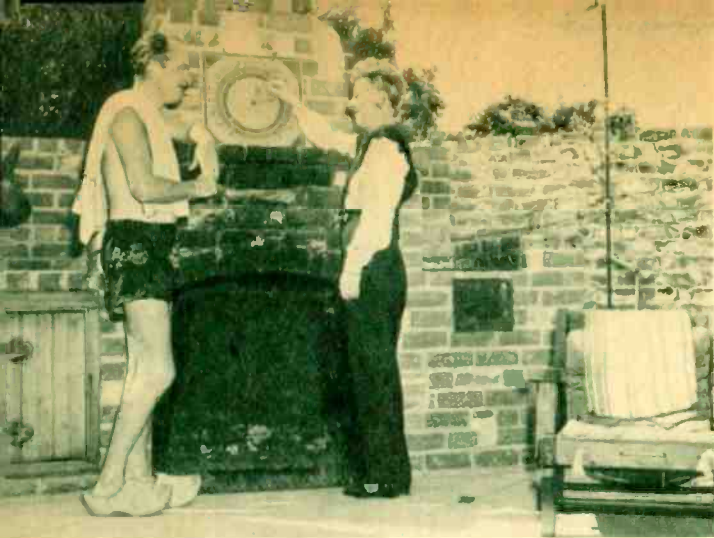
This series gives radio dialers their first opportunity (save for guest ap-

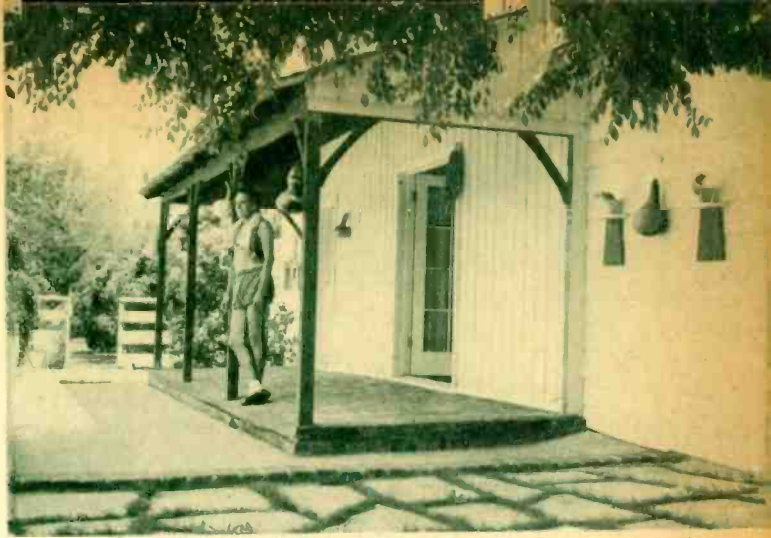

pearances) to enjoy Betty Lou's antics since 1943, when her creator exchanged his assignment on the ether waves for a wartime job on the salt water ones. Riggs entered the Navy as an apprentice seaman, was immediately placed in special services and spent more than eighteen months in the South Pacific, traveling with an entertainment unit that included pianist Claude Thornhill and actor-drummer Jack Cooper.

During this period, however, the voice of little Betty Lou wasn't stilled. She went right along with Tommy, and among other morale-building activities, she made recorded interviews with servicemen for them to send back home to their families. Riggs (and with him, Betty Lou) was discharged from the Navy in November of 1945.

Pennsylvania-born Riggs names Brown University as Betty Lou's birthplace. She made her advent in a locker room when Tommy, a quarterback on the college football team, scared his teammates back into their

shower stalls by asking, "Can I come in?" in his little-girl voice!

On Vallee's Show

After that, he and Betty Lou were always the highlight of college entertainments, and later, "they" made their microphone debut on KDKA, Pittsburgh. Nation-wide fame came in 1936 via Rudy Vallee, on whose program Riggs appeared as special guest for forty-nine weeks, the longest run of any act on the Vallee show.

Riggs' new radio series co-stars him with a popular feminine vocalist and features Wally Maher as "Wilbur," Jack Douglas as "Mr. Douglas," announcer Don Wilson and Frank De Vol and his orchestra.

But Tommy's favorite role these days was obvious as Radio Life chatted with him in the pleasant atmosphere of his new home in the Valley. It covers one and a quarter acres, and its owner proudly ushered us through a grove of twenty-nine orange trees.

"If I get tired of oranges, the neighbors have grapefruit," grinned

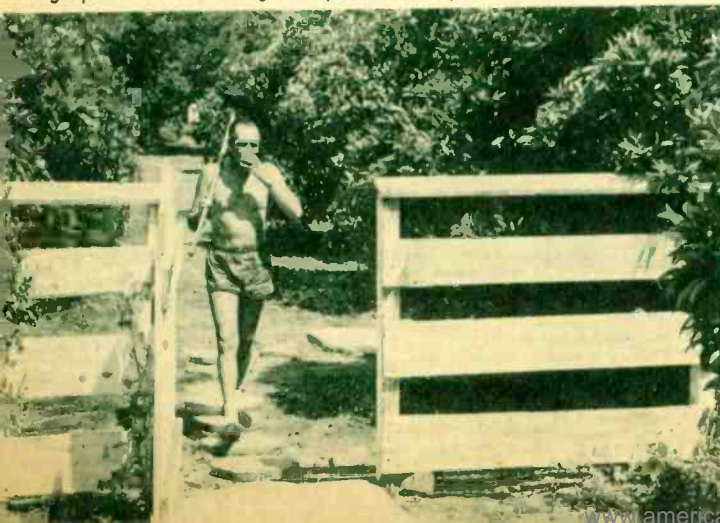
Riggs, indicating the yard on the other side of the rustic brick wall which surrounds his acreage. "I can get a spear and help myself," he jested.

As it is, the Riggses (Tommy and his pert blonde wife, Mary) do all right for themselves. In addition to orange juice for their breakfast, they're substantially supplied with eggs from their own backyard. Tommy proudly introduced his seven chickens. "They lay about four a day," he grinned. "That's just about right for us."

Before our departure from the Riggs residence, for our photographer's benefit, Tommy had progressively given us a sample of his skill at the dart game that was propped up above the barbecue, shown prowess in the swimming pool, then relaxed once again in the lawn chair with his mystery book in hand.

Marvin Miller Wonders What It Would Be Like to Take It Easy

▲ **MARVIN MILLER OF THE RADIO** looks like this. But the Marvin Miller of motion pictures may resemble a Jap or a strange character of mysterious descent. He doesn't care what he enacts, as long as he's allowed to act.

THE LAST TIME Radio Life lunched with actor-announcer Marvin Miller (then Mueller), he was thinking of simplifying his name. He did. He was interested in pictures and wanted to act. He did. He had come to California because he was working too hard in Chicago. He intended to take it easy. He didn't.

Lunching with Marvin is an experience in itself. This tall, dark and genial radioite calls himself an "amateur gourmet." But don't let that fool you. He should be in the professional class.

He knows more about food than the average chef. Marvin loves to eat and feels that most people regard it only as a necessary habit. But not Mr. Miller. He looks for exciting new ways in which to prepare his three a day. He confesses he doesn't cook.

Indefatigable

But that, undoubtedly, is due to his lack of spare time. Miller has twelve shows a week, which necessitates rising at 6:15 a.m. He realizes his desire for a fifty-hour day is hopeless, but he sometimes manages to put in a twenty-hour one. He detests sleeping.

His friends know they can always find him up at odd times. Consequently, his house is besieged by chums who have an urge to hear

symphonic or classical music in the wee hours. He loves to play one or one hundred of his fabulous 700 albums for an appreciative audience. And he thrives on arguments about music, on which he is well-versed.

He is five-feet ten-and-one-half inches tall, weighs 190 pounds, and prefers sports clothes. He has been married seven years to his beautiful artist wife, Elizabeth, and is the father of six-year-old Tony. He calls himself an eternal ham and in make-up presents an authentic-looking oriental. He was the Japanese chief of police in "Blood on the Sun."

Marvin thinks he is a far better actor than announcer. On his radio shows (KECA's "Coronet Story Teller," CBS's "The Whistler," the Billie Burke Show and the Frank Sinatra program, and NBC's Rudy Vallee show to name a few) his chores are mainly those of an announcer-emcee.

His movie roles are different. In his first he played a Jap. His second required him to be a weakling, and in one of his latest he portrays a blind pianist. Variety is the keynote of Marvin's life and he detests routine.

Radical Suggestion

He probably never does things in the same way. He is now advocating a new regime in the family's meal time. Do away with three meals,

says Marvin, and concentrate on two a day. The family hasn't decided whether this is a good idea or not.

Marvin is a clever raconteur and keeps his friends enthralled with his amusing experiences. He likes entertaining in his own apartment (he's a lucky landlord) but enjoys dining out. He knows every unusual restaurant in town.

He likes people and is quite good at caricaturing them in black and white. Another hidden talent of Miller's is handicraft. Tables, chairs and bookshelves are his specialty. On the bookshelves rest scrapbooks, compiled and hand-bound by Marvin.

He never writes letters, but composes jigsaw puzzles instead. Mrs. Miller has to unravel these to find out if the laundry was sent on Monday and if her husband remembered to put the cat out nightly. Son, Tony, thinks it's a marvelous idea. His letter puzzles contain pictures of all the beloved toys at home.

Marvin enjoys a tremendous capacity for living. He thinks there's nothing like it. He thinks his present schedule is a cinch. He's quoted as saying, "This is the easiest life I've ever led. I'm able to sleep until six every morning—well, almost always; I always have time for meals with my family—well, almost always; and I'm always through work by nine p.m.—well, almost always."

On Al Jarvis' "Can You Tie That?"
And You'll Find Out How Your Taste
In Records Compares with Theirs

RECORD ENTHUSIAST AL JARVIS GUIDES the experts on "Can You Tie That?" and admits that he enjoys every minute of it. Al got the idea for the Bing Crosby-Bob Hope appearance on the show for the clothing drive while he was in the hospital.

CAN YOU TIE THAT?" If you can, you're a very discerning record enthusiast and a lucky guy! Al Jarvis' unique record show gives platter collectors ratings by the guest experts and regular Dave Dexter, editor of "Note" magazine. And the average listener gets informal entertainment by some of the top stars in the theatrical world.

Records are played in advance of their release and judged on performance, production, interpretation and vocal. The experts score them on percentage, from one to 100. At the end of the program, the score is unannounced on the final record, and if you can guess the average struck by the four judges, you'll be the recipient of a radio phonograph combination. Jack, start sharpening our pencils.

Easter Sunday, at Earl Carroll's

in Hollywood, Al presented Bing Crosby, Bob Hope and Ella Logan in addition to Dave Dexter, as his panel of experts. The occasion was a clothing drive for Catholic Charities, and the seven tons collected just about measure up to the amount of hilarity served up on the discs.

Hope and Crosby jitterbugged their way through the first record played, Les Brown's "Good Blues Tonight," and each gave it 95. Ella Logan judged it at 67, and Dave Dexter granted it a tepid 59. At this announcement, Hope and Crosby got up to leave. "You can tell we're from the country," commented Bob sadly.

Second record played was "Who's Sorry Now?" by a singer named Bing Crosby. Crosby leaned back and listened in rapt attention with occasional murmurings of "Beautiful—beautiful. Turn it up."

Hope's first comment was, "Well,

I don't follow the singers much!" But he thought it was nice that Eddie Heywood let his father sing with the band. "After careful consideration, I give it six and one half points!" he decided.

From Singer Shirley Ross, Jarvis borrowed an old record on which she and Hope shared the vocal, "Two Sleepy People" (now scheduled for release). A stunned Hope recovered to find that on nostalgia value alone even hard-to-get Dexter had given him a satisfactory score.

One of the highlights of the show was the presentation to Crosby of a gigantic picture of Frank Sinatra. Bing countered by giving Bob an even greater enlargement of Red Skelton.

Jarvis admits that throughout the program, the boys kept him laughing so hard that he forgot about

"THEATRE GUILD on the AIR" GOES HOLLYWOOD

Radio Row Takes a Quick Look-See At Its Own "Legit" Airshow Which Has Come A-Calling from New York

RADIO LIFE Award Winner, ABC's "Theatre Guild on the Air," visited Hollywood for a brief week and brought with it all of the bustling excitement of a Broadway opening. We managed to sandwich in an informal chat with director Homer Fickett, watch a dress rehearsal of stars Charles Laughton and Elsa Lanchester, and meet the impressive

personnel at a "welcome to Radio Row" party before the airshow traveled to San Francisco.

The "Theatre Guild" didn't disappoint us. In fact, our winner more than lived up to its title of 1945's "most unique contribution to radio." It left us with that wonderful feeling (so rarely offered here) of having witnessed a legitimate performance from the first stages of inception to the final thunderous curtain call.

Launched during last year's fall

radio season, "Theatre Guild" presented something new to ether audiences. It offered the finest in dramatic entertainment from the greatest plays in legitimate theatre. If possible, the original cast was chosen. It often marked the mike debut or one of those rare appearances of some of the stage's most renowned names. The plays have been of diversified nature, featuring comedies, musicals, melodramas, and dramas.

Thrill to Present

"We're grateful for the tremendous response we've received from the listening audience," director Fickett told us. "We had hoped that our ef-

forts to bring something which everybody has not the opportunity of seeing—or hearing—into the homes of America, would be of value. It's just as much a thrill for us to be able to do it."

In answer to our queries of the show's past roster, Mr. Fickett named a few of the great who have contributed. Alfred Lunt and Lynn Fontanne have appeared twice together, with each appearing separately on other occasions. Burgess Meredith, Anabella, Louis Calhern, Oscar Karlwels, Walter Huston, Walter Abel, and Burl Ives are a few more of the top flight performers.

"What's it like," we wanted to know, "to direct some of the theatre's greatest artists?"

"It's nice—but it can be difficult," laughed the director. "It's impossible to develop a formula for such a task.

I must remember that I'm dealing with different personalities in different play situations."

When asked to name a favorite play and favorite players with whom to work, Fickett smiled and tactfully declined. "I like 'em all."

Wondering if it wouldn't be a little more difficult to give radio directions to a star thoroughly familiar with a stage part, we broached the question.

"Hmm um," he answered. "A good star *never* resents direction."

"Too Long" in Radio

And Fickett ought to know. He's handled top performers in every medium of entertainment. He's been in radio for seventeen years, an interim he dryly terms as "too long." He's a completely radio-wise man with a theatrical conscience. He loves legitimate drama and there isn't much he can't tell you about it.

The "Theatre Guild on the Air" works as a unit. Necessary methods of establishing the mood of legitimate theatre are contributed by host Lawrence Langner, who introduces the plays and players, announcer Norman Brokenshire, and George Hicks, who reports for the sponsor, U. S. Steel. Supervisors Theresa Helburn and Langner work with Fickett, producer George Kondolf, musical director Harold Levey, and radio adapter Gerald Holland in getting the best out of what they present. After the committee has decided upon a play (not necessarily a "Guild" production) for next week's show, a cast is chosen. Fickett believes in many rehearsal hours and sometimes devotes four days to preparing a show.

Resembles Churchill

We watched and listened to him putting stars Laughton and Lanchester through scenes for "Payment Deferred," the Guild offering which Angelenos witnessed. Fickett directs with the minimum of effort and receives the maximum of artistry from his stars. The rotund, tall, balding director is as well known for his dry sense of humor as his resemblance to Winston Churchill. When we commented on it, he retorted: "Yes, I know. You're the first to remark about it—today."

Following a week's stay and a Sunday airing in San Francisco, Fickett and the "Theatre Guild" planned on an immediate return to New York for continuation of the series. "And then what?" we asked.

"I have three tickets awaiting me for 'Old Vic,'" smiled Fickett. "And I have some other shows to catch up on."

"Oh, yes," he answered in regard to our raised eyebrows, "I'm the original busman in the old adage. I love to spend my spare time in the theatre."

KMPC Disc Jockey Bob Gillen Admits That He Likes to Recognize the Tune

FRANKLY, I'm a sucker for melody," declared disc-jockey Bob Gillen. "But I guess most people are." Bob's record programs are heard both morning and evening and he admits that they are slanted toward a feminine audience. "I picture a gal in the morning, just after she's finished breakfast and gotten hubby off to work—maybe her hair is still in curlers—who sits down to have a cigarette and a little rest before she starts her housework, and I try to play something that has a memory value for her. I always remember what my grandmother—or somebody's grandmother—said, 'I've got a million things to do today, and rest is one of them.'"

Bob, a handsome, dark fellow with a resounding laugh, has an irrepressible sense of humor. He gave us two answers to most of the questions we put to him—the first was the one that was the most fun, and the second was what he really meant. For instance:

Us: "How did you first become interested in music?"

Bob: "One day when I was seven years old, I was walking through an empty lot and I found an old jug. I picked it up and played the Doxology on it."

Us: "Really?"

Bob: "No, not exactly. Well, I guess my interest started when I used to listen to my mother playing the piano. She played those swell old songs like 'My Silent Love,' 'You're Blase,' 'Hands Across the Table,' and so on."

Nucleus of Collection

Bob's a native of Long Beach who came to KMPC from KFOX. "In fact," he admitted, "that's where I started my record collection. Hal Nichols was reorganizing the station and he was going to throw out some of the records. I asked him if I could have some of them and he said, 'Yes, but don't rob me blind.' I got away with a stack that high of old Goodman and Dorsey records. M-mmmmp!" He measured out with his hands what must have been a sizable chunk of music.

What happens when a popular record comes along that the poor disc jockey can't stand? That's something we've always wondered about. According to Bob Gillen—"If it's number one on the Hit Parade, I play it," he said, gritting his teeth. "However, there is one that I can't stand and I can't bring myself to play. Don't you tell anybody!"

Another Gillen peeve is too many commercials on a program and announcers who shout at their audiences. On Bob's programs he uses just one commercial at the begin-

ning and one at the end of the show. "After all," he added, "I think that radio really has a terrific obligation to its listeners."

A current Gillen rave is the new, improved Sinatra. He thinks Frankie is getting better all the time and admits that he started out as something less than a Sinatra fan. "In fact," Bob laughed, "I actually get letters from irate bobby-soxers who don't like Frank Sinatra and who tell me that I play too many of his records!" Dick Haymes, Tommy Dorsey's band and the old Hal Kemp orchestra are also Gillen favorites.

Girl-Less?

Right about here the interview was interrupted by a phone call. "How about that?" said Bob as he finished the call, "an invitation to go with a party to the Palladium and I don't even know any girls! I've been up here for two years now and I haven't even met any girls."

We agreed that this was indeed a sad, if unbelievable, state of affairs. "Why don't you hold a contest and give yourself away," we suggested brightly, "the way Bob Phillips on KFI is doing?" Bob demurred on the grounds that he was looking for a girl with an apartment.

Bob's ambition is to be a big commercial announcer on the order of Harlow Wilcox and Harry von Zell. "You know," he added, "with lines

Mitchell's Back

Director Now Heard on Four of
Station KFI's Leading Programs*

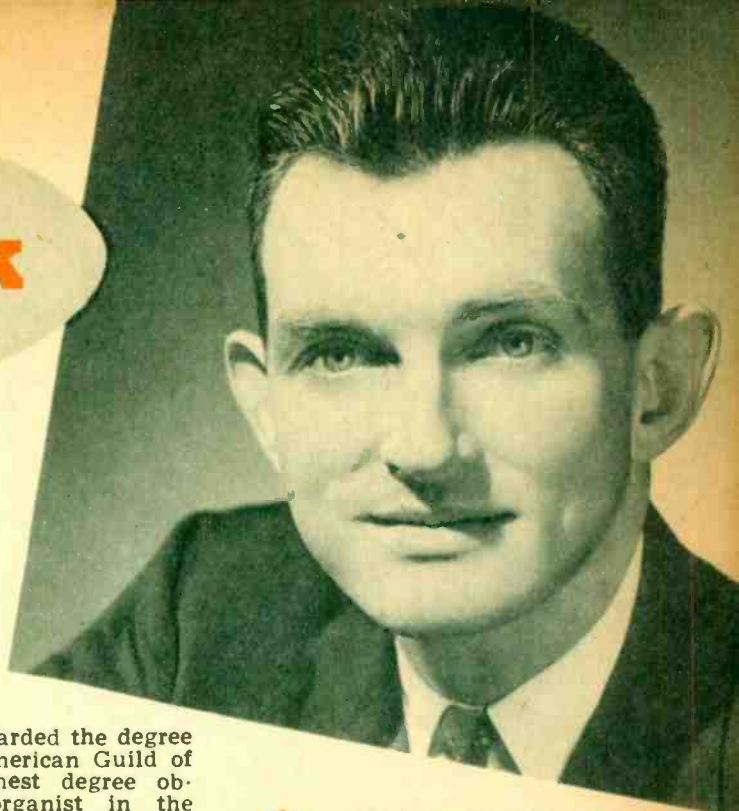
LENDING BRILLIANCE to many of radio's finest shows, you'll find Bob Mitchell back on the air after almost three years—sometimes playing the electric organ, sometimes at the piano and sometimes with his famous Mitchell "Boychoir." But then, it really doesn't make much difference where or what he's playing, if he's in there at all you can rest assured the show will be well worth hearing.

A piano scholarship winner at the Eastman School of Music at Rochester, New York, and the New York College of Music, Bob was an honor student at both institutions. At

eighteen he was awarded the degree of Fellow of the American Guild of Organists, the highest degree obtainable by an organist in the United States. He's been in radio since 1935, with the exception of the two years and seven months he spent as a Seaman First Class in the Navy, part of this on Guam and part with Armed Forces Radio in Hollywood.

Choir of Sixteen

On Christmas of 1934, Bob founded the Robert Mitchell "Boychoir," an organization made up of sixteen boys between the ages of twelve and sixteen. A true cross-section of American youth, the boys have ap-

peared in many important motion pictures at every major studio, as well as on numerous transcontinental broadcasts. Recent pictures in which Mitchell and the boys played important parts included "Goin' My Way" and, soon to be released, "The Life of Al Jolson," "Song of Arizona" and "Night and Day."

On the personal side, Mitchell is a most genuine person. Watching him work with the "Boychoir," one notes the respect and admiration he commands, seemingly without effort, from these teen-agers. But Mitchell is not always serious—oh no, definitely not. He has a sense of humor, a wit that would make any pixie self-conscious, and nothing in the way of last-minute script alterations, or even changes in tunes or keys, ever throws him.

Currently Bob is featured on four of KFI's top programs. One, in particular, is "Ladies Day," on which he, Bill Stulla and Bill Shirley share honors. The program, directed toward a feminine listening audience, features special arrangements by Mitchell of well-known tunes, songs by Bill Shirley, handsome young tenor who was runner-up in the "KFI-Hollywood Bowl Auditions" last year, and much entertaining chatter between Mitchell and Stulla, who writes the program. It's heard Monday through Saturday at 9:45 a.m. "Melodies by Mitchell" and "G. I. Theatre" share the benefits of Bob's talents on alternate Thursdays at 11:30 p.m., and the "KFI Scout Jam-boree" presents him with the "Boychoir" each Saturday at 3:00 p.m.

SOMETHING'S going on at Don Lee's "Cisco Kid" rehearsals. Something different in the way of Westerns.

There's a background of cactus instead of sage . . . sombreros instead of ten-gallon hats . . . "amigo" instead of "podnuh" . . . and "si" instead of "yup!" "Ahhhhhh, what a lovely *senor-eeta!*" has taken over for "say naow, that's a right purty gal" and "Careful, *senor*, or Ceesco weel have to keel you" for "Hold it, podnuh, or I'll pump yuh fulla lead."

Half the fun in "Cisco" is its fresh slant on adventure. Where most of radio's gun-totin' heroes are paragons of the right thing at the right time, "Cisco" is unpredictable. Far from being hand in glove with the law, "Cisco" spends half of each episode eluding the sheriff at every turn. Whereas "Tom Mix" has his special girl friend, Jane; "Red Ryder" manages not much more than an

"Aw shucks, ma'am, tweren't much" in his bashful retreat from the ladies; and "The Lone Ranger" rides alone . . . "Cisco" is a heartbreaker, a real "love 'em and leave 'em caballero."

Kisses and Pearls

Let a *senorita* drop her eyelashes and "Cisco's" red blood rises to the

challenge. For each dark-eyed conquest he has a string of pearls ("they belonged to my sainted mother") and a kiss, before he rides with Pancho off into a blazing desert sunset.

Never a man to let a gag go by, Jack Mather, who stars in the series, makes life miserable for each "sen-brita" producer J. C. Lewis hires for the show, using "Cisco's" technique off mike as well as on, that is, as long as the lady in question will stand for it.

Rehearsals have been cut to a fine science by producer Jay, who gets everybody in a huddle for the first reading, which he does himself in a sort of "Uncle Bob" fashion, while the cast listens and chops lines . . . struggling to keep a smooth face on such interpretations as "You killed him!" and "He-won't-be-needing-guns-any-more-I-guess." Through with this (hindered by occasional wise ones by Mather) "Cisco" goes directly on mike for one take, then the dress.

Big wheel in the studio is Jay, who is just an inch or two over five feet, has six-footers soundman Norm Smith, writer Larry Hays and star Mather jumping at the cock of his eyebrow (a trademark). A dry-mannered individual with a never-crack-a-smile sense of humor, Jay rarely fails to get his ideas across, with such neatly-pointed suggestions as "Don't go by the script, dear . . . Just talk when somebody stops" . . . "Just a minute, Jack, will you make that work grub? Courtesy Mr. Turnbull . . . (bow to soundman Turnbull) We give credit where credit is due." and "That mike doesn't seem to be hooked up. I just *don't* understand it . . ." . . . this last interpolated by Mather, who quips "Just like my bustle" as an engineer hustles to remedy the deficiency.

A strictly cooperative character is Harry Lang, who plays "Pancho" to Mather's "Cisco." Harry's streak for the burlesque adds many a lighter moment to the project in process, but catching his lines and watching his role is a serious business with him. But neither Mather nor Lang could be called shy and retiring. Mather currently holds a featured comic spot with Edgar Bergen and Charlie McCarthy, and Lang is Joe Giletti, the Italian on the Jack Haley show.

Aside from Mather's "Cisco" and Lang's "Pancho," there are three other top performances affecting every airing of the series . . . those of Norm Smith, Bob Turnbull and Gordon Phillips, comprising the sound department. On a dramatic program such as "Sherlock Holmes" or "Rogue's Gallery" sound supplements the narration, but on "Cisco" it carries the program.

Yes, there's a new man in the saddle on the trail of right and justice, a dashing caballero with an ever-hungry pal named "Pancho," and a Robin Hood appeal for young and old alike. O. Henry's rascal-ban-dit rides again!

to say, worked into the script, and everything? I guess it's a hangover from my wanting-to-be-an-actor days. I was a member of the Long Beach Community Players and serious about acting until I found out that actors didn't eat very frequently and announcers ate occasionally. Anyway, I always knew I'd have to be in the entertainment business because I like people so darn much."

Melody man Gillen emphasizes that he's out to play the tunes that the other disc jockeys haven't played so often. "Some of the most beautiful tunes in the world were written between 1925 and '35, and so many of them deserve reviving."

"Such as?" we prompted.

"Oh, such as 'My Future Just Passed,' 'I'm in the Market for You,' 'I Guess I'll Have to Change My Plans,'—there's a wealth of them."

And if the nostalgic Mr. Gillen has his way, you'll be hearing them on his record programs, "A Song for You."

It's only fair to add that that same evening after the interview we went to the Palladium and whom did we see but one Bob Gillen—sitting at a table with two beautiful girls. Yes—two!
