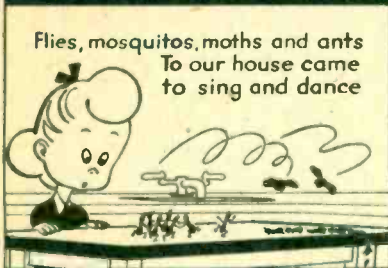

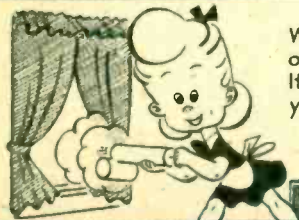

# The Amazing Miss Maxwell

Elsa Maxwell Manages to Be One of the Most Interesting Women in All the World Because She's Interested in Everything in the World

I WONDER where in the world people ever got the idea that I've been paid to give parties?" Elsa Maxwell queried. "In the first place—who'd pay me? In the second place, if I was paid to give a party, I probably couldn't do it! You can't pay for happiness. Br-r-r-r," she shuddered. "It would be awful. It would take every bit of fun out of it and be the biggest flop that ever was!" We assured her that she'd put the idea out of our head for good and all.

According to Miss Maxwell, building a good party is just like making anything else that must be built just right, but most people ruin their party before it ever gets started.

"Rule number one!" she emphasized. "(and everybody disregards it) is: never ask people to whom you are obligated. Don't pay debts with parties. Why, my New York ball on May third was a great success, but if there'd been two people, only two, out of the six hundred who came, who'd not been congenial—the whole thing would have been absolutely RUINED!

"Rule number two:" she continued, "Never, never, never allow party crashers! Can you imagine? People call up and say, 'I know you won't

mind, I'm bringing SOMEBODY.' Bringing somebody, indeed!" The idea filled Elsa with scorn. "You should take courage and give people like that a loud and emphatic 'No!' Why, do you know that the last time I gave a party here, everybody called up and asked if they could come. Really, everybody in Hollywood! I said, 'No, you may NOT come—the guest list is closed.' And, frankly, I don't care if they NEVER come!"

"Number three: participation. Make everybody do something. Dance contests, competitions, prizes, make everyone join in."

### No Intoxication

"Incidentally," she added, "the least important thing about a party is the food and drink. Really, it is! At my parties, no one ever gets intoxicated—they're too busy having a good time. When people are having fun, they don't want to get drunk!"

Elsa, who's enthusiastic about everything that passes within her ken, is more deeply interested than ever in her daily column and her radio show. When we spoke with her, she was newly returned from covering the United Nations Security Council meetings. Of U.N. she says, "It's got to work—it's the only thing that will save us." She's thrilled at the interest in it that her radio fan letters are showing.

Elsa's also pleased at proving an important point about her feminine radio audience. "You know," she confided, "before I went on the air for the first time, I was told that I must talk about the things that would interest the housewives—home-making, cooking, cake-baking. Isn't that ridiculous? Why, I've never baked a cake in my life and everybody knows it. I've always been a nomad—lived in hotel rooms all my life. Wouldn't I look silly telling a lot of women who baked perfectly marvelous cakes how to do it? They'd switch me off in a minute, and quite rightly. That's what I told them on my first broadcast!"

### Adult Mail

As a result of telling people about the things she does know about, Elsa says her radio mail is "thrilling!" "The idea that the average radio audience is made up of a bunch of morons is a very outmoded theory," she said emphatically. "The letters I get are very intelligent, very adult. They want to know about everything—government, politics, post-war planning. Why, I'm amazed at their interest in serious things, and at the young people's interest, too." Some of Elsa's programs are made up of the mail she's received. She thinks her listeners like her because she doesn't gossip and never tells anything but the truth. She's proud, too, that her radio delivery has improved since her earlier broadcasts. "I've learned to speak more slowly—it's a great improvement."

The last time Radio Life talked to Miss Maxwell, she gave us a fascinating list of "most charming people." We asked her if she would like to bring it up to date for us.

spells the difference between regular jobs and occasional work, a contract or a bit. Sometimes it's the difference between complete success and total failure. Once the call came too late for a member of the Call Club. A talented musician was waiting for a contract to materialize with a major network. Growing despondent because he thought he wouldn't get the job, the man committed suicide the same morning the Club put through the call to tell him he was wanted at the radio studio.

Among the many radio personalities who depend on Call Club to reach them, wherever they are, are Mel Blanc, Helen Forrest, Lurene Tuttle, Bill Thompson, Shirley Mitchell, Dennis Day, GeGe Pearson, Dave Rose, Kay Kyser, Ishkabibble, Bea Benaderet, Dave Forester, Spike Jones, Ken Christy, and Leone Le Doux. Many of these "name" members use Call Club's facilities as a convenience. They don't depend on calls for work exclusively as lesser lights do, but they know messages of importance will reach them faster and more dependably.

### Helps Producers

Casting a radio program is a production—leads to be contacted, orchestra, vocal groups, and supporting players must sometimes be summoned quickly. But when a producer contacts Call Club, gives the operator a list of names to be reached, it's

often a matter of mere minutes before the entire group is corralled.

Here's how the idea started with Owner-Manager Carl Crawford. Sixteen years ago as an actor-musician he was doing a radio program six days a week over KGER in Long Beach. But away from Hollywood, he was losing calls for motion pictures.

Carl and an actor friend decided to maintain someone to receive telephone calls at their apartment. Eventually, they were taking messages for all the entertainers in their building.

Today, Crawford's organization has twenty operators, 100 trunk lines into their building at 5855 Hollywood Boulevard, and a telephone bill that runs between \$5,000 and \$6,000 monthly. His Call Club, the first telephone exchange for the entertainment industry, is now the largest private exchange west of Chicago.

Minimum charge for service to a member is \$7.50 monthly, or a cent an hour, figures Crawford. "And we

give minimum members just as much attention as maximum. It may cost us \$75 to contact a \$7.50 member for one call."

Crawford, a personable chap in his middle thirties, was recently discharged from the Navy, where he served as a Pharmacist's Mate. To give his staff a rest, he takes over the four-position multiple switchboard every Sunday. He's expert at handling two to six calls at once.

#### Elaborate Files

To keep calls straight, Crawford has developed a unique system, whereby messages are dispatched, (Please Turn to Page 28)

## RADIO: West ★ National and International

### Bock On Television

"All those people who were saying that television was just around the corner and that black and white (as against color) didn't amount to anything had their theories shot to pieces when the Louis-Conn fight was telecast", said Hal Bock on his return last week from New York. "Television is here!" Bock, NBC Western Division head of television, already enthusiastic about television when he left for the East, came back glowing.

Along with 400 other lookers, he saw the fight in Radio City's 8H Studio, where twenty-five sets were reproducing an image so clear that according to Bock, lookers applauded the

action of the fighters. "We could see the expressions on the fighters' faces very clearly", he related. "I've never seen such audience reaction."

The fight was telecast over television's really first big hook-up—New York, Washington, Philadelphia, Schenectady. Billboard Magazine estimated that there were a half million lookers, not including those in taverns and other public places. Two RCA Image Orthicon cameras (the latest word, according to Bock, and capable of picking up action in a candle-lit room) were used to televise the fights.

While in New York, Bock's previous arrangements in Hollywood to telecast "People Are Funny" bore fruit and Art Linkletter put on a special show of four stunts, suitable for both eye and ear.

"Old hands who've seen lots of shows go past the cameras said this was the best audience participation show to be telecast", observed Bock.

Other programs being televised in New York on regular schedule are two done by Mrs. Carveth Wells, in which she is using some of her valuable travel film. Standard Brands is putting on a weekly one-hour variety show, emceed by Helen Parrish (of "Three Smart Girls" renown). Virginia Sale and Dennis Day both appeared on this program recently. Tennis matches, midget auto racing, and newsreels are also being seen.

According to Bock, the promise of television was indicated by NBC's telecast of the Staten Island fire.

"Within an hour and a half after the fire started, we had a newsreel of it on the air", he announced.

Bock thinks that the public in Southern California will get receiving sets about the same time the television stations are ready to operate. "It'll be a happy wedding", he smiled.

### De-Throned

Mutual's "Queen for a Day" almost didn't get on the air the day it emanated from the Monterey Centennial.

Wealthy Monterey resident Mrs. Andrew Stewart, who owns property both opposite and adjoining the old Customs House where the broadcast platform had been erected, perched herself on the "Queen's" throne a half-hour before air-time and refused to be budged. Her claim was that she had not given her permission for the two

broadcast engineers to use the roof of the adjacent building for their equipment. Said she, sitting tight: "If there's a 'Queen for a Day' today, it's going to be me!"

Arguments and pleas by the mayor, the police chief, the Centennial committee chairman and program officials were unavailing — until, eight minutes before air-time, it was agreed to pay the woman \$300 to vacate her perch. She did—and "Queen for a Day" took to the air as scheduled with a deserving lady on the throne.

### Too Close for Comfort

Contrary to most of the newspaper and radio reports, Rosemary De Camp, the absentee "Judy" of CBS' "Dr. Christian" (she's "blessed eventing" this month), wasn't present when the Howard Hughes plane crashed into her mother's home in Beverly Hills last week. Rosemary was at her own home in Redondo when the accident occurred.

Occupying the room through which the giant skyship passed, however, were Rosemary's brother, Jerry, and his wife. Miraculously, both escaped injury.

"To think," grimly commented Rosemary, as she viewed the wreckage of the room, "Jerry came home from the war in Germany to this!"

### Wishes Come True

You could have knocked us over with a wave-length when we heard that Hal March and Bob Sweeney were back on the air in their own program on KNX, 8:30 p.m. Thursdays. Tact and good judgment are necessary qualifications for a Call Club Operator. Much of the work is confidential. Habits of members are closely studied. Lurene Tuttle, for instance, is known to have pet eating places like Chasens, La Rue, and Romanoff's where she is often paged. Some radio actors frequent the Derby, others eat hurried snacks at Thrifty. The Derby Club (pool) near CBS and the pool hall on Selma have often yielded a wanted radio-ite to answer a Call Club summons. Others

wanted for studio calls have been located under hot towels in the barber shop, in the dressing rooms at a fashionable modiste's, on the golf course, in the swimming pool. Once Crawford even overcame the seemingly impossible and put a call through to Hollywood Park while a race was on. (Incoming calls are barred to prevent "bookies" from checking.) As a result, Fred Shields landed a job on Lux.

The slogan, "Get through to them," was carried even farther one recent morning when Barry Fitzgerald was needed for an early studio call. It was indeed a poser to contact the phoneless Fitzgerald. So, stopping at nothing, Crawford called police, who cheerfully cruised up to the actor's door and delivered his Call Club call.

"Each week we try to cover five categories, with at least ten people taking part in each. Our guest stars have included Bill Bendix, Martha O'Driscoll and five 'movie mothers'."

We asked Jay to relate a few of the show's anecdotes he had found most humorous. "The topper of them all," he roared, "concerned a little drama which came under the title of 'embarrassing moments.' One lady participant told about the time she stepped out into the hall of her apartment to put out the ice sign for the iceman. I forgot to mention she was nude and realized she was taking quite a chance, but she carefully looked up and down the hall before stepping out. Of course, she no sooner had closed the door than she heard footsteps coming up the stairs. Ducking into the dark gas meter room, she huddled there waiting for the passerby to pass. Only he proved to be the gas meter man, who threw open the door and stared speechlessly at her. 'Oh,' she gulped, 'I was waiting for the ice man.'"

"Another night," he continued, "we asked for kids' gripes against their parents. A seventeen-year-old lad reminisced about the time he was driving to school and a car suddenly cut in front of him. His mother leaned out of her window and gave the offender a thorough verbal trouncing. Too late, the boy realized it was his sociology teacher. 'And,' the boy added wistfully, 'I didn't pass sociology that year.'"

Life isn't the do-nothing-at-all luxury Jay kiddingly pretends. He's constantly on hand (and in demand) to emcee and host banquets and charity functions. His generosity with time and effort keeps him busy all hours of the day and night.

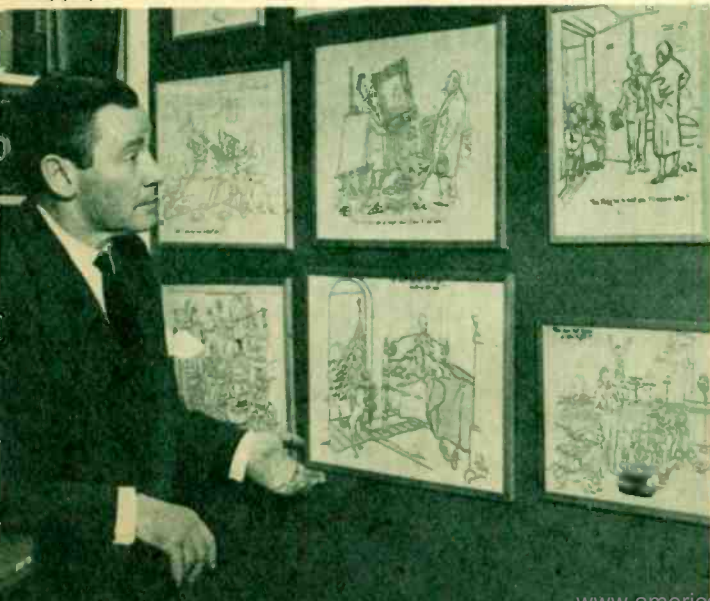

Highest peak Wallace has ever ascended was Mt. Rainier (14,408 feet). Skis were used for approximately 11,000 feet.

The singer and his wife live contentedly in a flower-surrounded, sun-kissed California home in Brentwood Heights. Their intimate friends are the Nelson Eddys and the John Charles Thomases.

Wallace hopes to go on with his radio work and still has his eye on opera. But with his dark, Tyrone-Powerish good looks and smooth voice, he'd be a terrific bet for pictures and popular type music. Right now he's anxious to serve as technical advisor on filming of "The White Tower."
